
The students of Cranford High School are representative of students throughout the country who, having been misjudged, hope with this year's edition of the *Golden C* to "set the world straight."

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# DEDICATION

It is to the Peace Corps that the Class of 1963 dedicates its senior annual, the *Golden C.*

"I recommend to the Congress the establishment of a permanent Peace Corps — a pool of trained American men and women sent overseas by the U.S. government or through private organizations and institutions to help foreign countries meet their urgent needs for skilled manpower." With these words, President Kennedy, on March 1, 1961, signed an Executive Order establishing the Peace Corps. With the enactment of this legislation, an avenue was provided by which Americans could serve their country in the cause of world peace and understanding and, simultaneously, assist other nations towards their legitimate goals and freedom and opportunity.

The concept of the Peace Corps was entirely new. It was subjected to a great deal of criticism at the beginning. If it had not been carried forward with such great care and in a sense of living, it could have defeated a great purpose and could have set back the whole cause of public service for a good many years.

Now, more than two years after its founding, the country can be proud of the success of the Peace Corps. President Kennedy, as founder of the Peace Corps, has taken a great personal interest in the information, operation, and functioning of the Peace Corps. He has made this venture an integral part of his total concern as President.

The President has said of Peace Corps service, "Government service should be in these days when so much depends upon the United States the most prideful of all careers. To serve in the United States Government, to be a public employee, to be a bureaucrat in the critical sense, that should be the greatest source of satisfaction to any American.

"I hope that when the time is ripe and when we have moved on to other work inevitably that the sense of having worked for the government during important days will be the greatest source of pride to all of us . . .

"To be able to make a maximum effort to serve peace in a time of maximum danger I would consider the most satisfactory of human experiences . . .

"What we want here in the National Government and what we need are some new faces with new thoughts . . .

"I can assure you that the next ten or twenty years are going to be among the most critical and sensitive for the United States of any in our history. I cannot believe that there is any private career that will offer you half the rewards in the sense of doing a job that is important, that government service will do. . . . It is the most rewarding, and not in the material sense, but in a real sense, and the place to be in the 1960's I believe, is in the service of our country . . ."

If success is measured solely by the number of



The *Spotlight* began as the C.H.S. newspaper forty-two years ago. It began as a magazine with more essays and poems than news, and twenty years ago took the newspaper form it has today.

For many years the *Spotlight* was the yearbook as well as the newspaper. The 1929 issue had sixty-eight pages, and had pictures of the forty seniors and twenty-six faculty members.

In the 1930's the *Spotlight* was a thirty-two page magazine containing essays, stories, and poems by the students. Besides the literary material headed "manuscript," the issue contained editorials which informed, entertained, and advertised. However, this news was dull and incomplete.

The class of 1941 changed its publications to newspaper form. The excellent essays written by the students never left the English department, because the *Spotlight* was devoted to news.

Since 1940, the *Spotlight* has improved almost every year. The brilliant writing present in the 1930's is gone, but news coverage has become more complete and the style of the paper has advanced.

In the 1950's outsiders such as government officials and heads of local industry wrote guest editorials for the *Spotlight*, thus lightening student editor's work.

Recent years have produced *Spotlights* much like the present one with sports, Sadie and Emma, and traditional features carrying over from one year to the next. Something new is added each year.

## RED CROSS



## REVIEW OF FOOTBALL SEASON

Mr. Grayson, who has been teaching physical education and coaching football at Cranford High since 1946, had a celebrated athletic career of his own. He was on the Temple University track team and football team. He also participated in intramural wrestling and basketball in college. He had the privilege to play in three All-Star games and a Sugar Bowl game. Because of his skill he was selected for the All-East team and won honorable mention to the All-American Team.

After playing football he taught for three years in southern New Jersey and served in the armed forces. In 1946 he came to Cranford High and began coaching our football teams. Under his coaching Cranford has won forty-five games while only losing thirty-two. In 1952 and 1957 he coached teams to state championships.

It was an off year for Coach Stan Grayson and the 1962 Cranford High football team as the Cougars terminated the season with a sad 2-7 record. However, behind the aggressive ball playing of juniors Frank O'Brien and Booney Mazzella, and seniors John Krip and Steve Dmytriw, the Blue and Gold never gave up hope and fought gallantly throughout every contest. The varsity squad dropped some good, hard-fought games to powerful Linden, 19-7; Westfield 26-0; Clark, 13-7; Hillside, 7-0; and Scotch Plains, 18-0. They were defeated decisively by newly scheduled Springfield Regional, 29-7, despite controlling most of the play, and by arch rival Thomas Jefferson on Thanksgiving Day, 41-7. Their two victories, both achieved at Memorial Field, saw the Cougars down Rahway, 18-12 and maul Roselle 41-0, in a game marred by high winds, heavy rains, snow, and icy temperatures. Mazzella scored six touchdowns for the Cougars, three in the Rahway game, to lead the scoring for this year's squad. Hard fighting Frank O'Brien received the highest praise by local newspapers for a Cranford player by being named to the second team All-Watching Conference. He also, along with John Krip, Mazzella, and Steve Dmytriw, gained honorable mention honors for the All Union County Team. Despite their record, the locals had mostly juniors, with only eight seniors on the team. The Cougars, therefore, should look forward to a bright season in 1963.

The 1962 soccer team compiled the best record in C.H.S. history under first year mentor Angelo Preite, posting an outstanding 9-4-2 log. The team was the first Cranford team to be invited to participate in the state tourney, group IV, and went as far as the quarter finals before bowing to Freehold Regional, 1-0. The booters also had the distinction of placing six players on the 1962 Elizabeth Daily Journal All-County team, more than any other school in the area. Those boys were Bill Ray (1st team), Ken Thorn (2nd team), and Rich Rubenstein, Noris Berzinskis, Rusty Cree,

and Rich Duemmler (honorable mention).

During the season, the booters upset only once beaten Linden 1-0, and then repeated the fete in the opening round of the state tourney. They also downed a strong union team 2-0 with Noris Berzinskis, a junior, tallying both goals. The Cougars also won six consecutive contests at the end of the season before losing to Freehold.

The team's defense, led by Bill Ray, Ken Thorn, and Rusty Cree, was one of the county's best, for they permitted only 13 goals to be scored against them. Goalie Cree also was credited with six shutouts, and was chiefly responsible for the Cougars' second place finish to unbeaten Clark in the Watchung Conference.

Offensively, Berzinskis and Rich Rubenstein were the top scorers, with eight and six goals respectively. Rubenstein and Rich Duemmler, however, were responsible for the most scores, with eight assists and ten goals between them.

#### VARSITY BASKETBALL REVIEW

Although considered by many as a well below average ball club in the beginning of the year, Cranford High's 1963 varsity basketball team fought hard to compile a respectable 9-11 final season record. The Cougars, despite finishing below the .500 mark for only the second time in Coach Martin's 11 years at CHS, gave some of the area's best some good battles. The Blue and Gold, paced throughout the season by the steady point producing of senior star Ron Ritter, dropped two close contests at UCCT Champion Westfield, 66-57 and 52-50, the latter being an overtime heartbreaker at Westfield. The Cougars really put a scare into powerful arch rival St.

Mary's before bowing 55-54 in the opening game of the year and 54-45 in the County Tournament. In these specific games, Coach Martin's charges utilized strong shooting and determination to battle their heavily favored foes right down to the final buzzer. The Cougars also fought hard against Watchung Conference Champ Hillside, but they slowed down in the end and lost 44-36 at Hillside.

The Cougars were seeded eighth in the UCCT and reached the quarter-final round after trouncing St. Patrick's of Elizabeth 76-45. They then dropped their tight quarter-final verdict to St. Mary's at Upsala College. A fourth place Watchung Conference finish, with eight wins and six losses, cushioned the below par season. The varsity dealt a pair of losses to Watchung members Roselle, Clark, Springfield, and Rahway, with Ritter scoring 30 against Roselle. Ritter, who averaged 20.3 points per contest this year, with 406 points, tallied 20 or more markers 12 times during the season with his high of 30 being the high of his CHS career. The Cougar star's 20-point performances were highlighted by 30 and 28 points against Roselle; 25 and 24 against Springfield; 20 and 22 against Westfield; 26 and 21 versus Rahway; and 26 and 22 against Clark.

Senior Ron Rubenstein and junior Noris Berzinski were also consistent scorers for the cagers as they each dunked 128 points. Rubenstein scored 10 or more points seven times with his 16-point performance against Hillside being his high. Berzinski had six games over 10 points with his 17 point output versus Roselle topping the list. Junior Rusty Cree finally found himself after a slow start and finished with 107 points and more than 100 rebounds, second only to Ritter's 200 plus.

Senior Nelson Dittmar and juniors Robbie "Lefty" Thurston and Jim Downing also were outstanding during the season with Thurston doing quite a bit of scoring and Downing aggressive rebounding. Sophomores Wayne Huckel, John Dreyer, and Bill Marek, who led the J.V.'s to their second Union County Championship, also saw varsity action and performed excellently.

Coach Farrell also became the first high school wrestler to ever capture a National AAU title, in 1939.

Mr. Farrell entered the University of Indiana in 1941, but he did not graduate until 1948 because of a four-year term of service. At Indiana Mr. Farrell captained the varsity wrestling team in his senior year. After teaching for six years in Indianapolis, Mr. Farrell came to Cranford High School in 1955, and he has served as a physical education teacher and wrestling coach ever since.


### 1962-63 WRESTLING TEAM

The Wrestling Team's very successful season included an 8-2-1 dual meet log and the NJSIAA District VI team championship. The campaign was marked by several excitingly close meets, four of which were decided by two points or less. The Cougars defeated such powerhouses as Roselle Park and Columbia. But they lost the Watchung Conference championship when they were edged by Scotch Plains.

Six seniors were in the starting lineup, including co-captains Ralph Zobel, Bob Olson, and Tony Peters. Ralph Zobel (106 lb.) compiled a season record of 10-1. He also won in the pre-season Union Christmas Tournament and District Championships and placed second in the Region II tourney. Bob Olson (130 lb. and 136 lb.) was the only unbeaten Cougar during the dual meet season, as he racked up a 10-0-1 record. He also won championships in both the Union Tournament and the Districts. Stan Minch (141 lb.), whose record was 9-2, placed second at Union and in the Districts. Tony Peters (148 lb.) ran up a 9-2 record, placed second in the Union Tournament, and won the Districts. John Krip (157 lb.) placed second at Union and compiled a 3-3 log before injuring his arm. However, he returned at the end of the season to win the Districts and place second in the Regionals. Steve Dimitriev (178 lb.) was 9-2 during the year, won the Districts, and was runnerup in the Union Tournament and in the Regionals.

The other starters on the team were: Randy Nelson (98 lb.), 5-6; Pete Occi (115 lb.), 5-4-2; Roland Scheller (123 lb.), 6-5; Rick Nyce (136 lb.), 1-3; George Krip (168 lb.), 6-5; and Frank O'Brien (heavyweight), 9-2.

people volunteering to aid the project, the Peace Corps has been a success. President Kennedy supports this aspect of success by pointing to the fact that many thousands of Americans have volunteered to serve. This is a convincing demonstration that we have in this country an immense reservoir of dedicated men and women willing to express their actions and convictions. People from all races, creeds, and nations have volunteered. Although the average age of Peace Corps volunteers is thirty-five, there are many people over sixty years of age who have joined the ranks. Peace Corps workers have demonstrated their courage and fortitude by working in many areas where Americans have neither lived nor travelled. They have been enthusiastically received in these areas. This is best reflected by Colombian President Alberto Lleras Comargo's opinion of the Peace Corps: ". . . the finest way in which the United States could prove to the humble people of this and other lands that the primary purpose of its international aid program is to build a better life in all the free world's villages and neighborhoods."

## *The Peace Corps*

"Throughout the world the people of the newly developing nations are struggling for economic and social progress which reflects their deepest desires. Our own freedom, and the future of freedom around the world, depend, in a very real sense, on their ability to build growing and independent nations where men can live in dignity, liberated from the bonds of hunger, ignorance and poverty.

"One of the greatest obstacles to the achievement of this goal is the lack of trained men and women with the skill to teach the young and assist in the operation of development projects—men and women with the capacity to cope with the demands of swiftly evolving economies, and with the dedication to put that capacity to work in the villages, the mountains, the towns, and the factories of dozens of struggling nations.

"The vast task of economic development urgently requires skilled people to do the work of the society—to help teach in the schools, construct development projects, demonstrate modern methods of sanitation in the villages, and perform a hundred other tasks calling for training and advanced knowledge.

"To meet this urgent need for skilled manpower the Peace Corps has been established an organization which recruits and trains American volunteers, sending them abroad to work with the people of other nations.

"This organization differs from existing assistance programs in that its members will supple-

ment technical advisors by offering the specific skills needed by developing nations if they are to put technical advice to work. They help provide the skilled manpower necessary to carry out the development projects planned by the host governments, acting at a working level and serving at great personal sacrifice.

"Among the specific programs to which Peace Corps members contribute are: teaching in primary and secondary schools, especially as part of national English language teaching programs; participation in the worldwide program of malaria eradication; instruction and operation of public health and sanitation projects; aiding in village development through school construction and other programs; increasing rural agricultural productivity by assisting local farmers to use modern implements and techniques. The initial emphasis of these programs is on teaching. Thus the Peace Corps members are an effective means of implementing the development programs of the host countries—programs which our technical assistance operations have helped to formulate.

"The Peace Corps is not limited to the young, or to college graduates. All Americans who are qualified are welcome to join this effort. But the Corps is made up primarily of young people as they complete their formal education.

"Because one of the greatest resources of a free society is the strength and diversity of its private organizations and institutions, much of the Peace Corps program is carried out by these groups, financially assisted by the Federal Government.

"Peace Corps personnel is made available to developing nations in the following ways:

1. Through overseas programs of colleges and universities.
2. Through private voluntary agencies carrying on international assistance programs.
3. Through assistance programs of international agencies.
4. Through assistance programs of the United States Government.
5. Through new programs which the Peace Corps itself directly administers.

"The benefits of the Peace Corps are not limited to the countries in which it serves. Our own young men and women are enriched by the experience of living and working in foreign lands. They have acquired new skills and experience which will aid them in their future careers and add to our own country's supply of trained personnel and teachers. They return better able to assume the responsibilities of American citizenship and with greater understanding of our global responsibilities.

"Although this is an American Peace Corps, the problem of world development is not just an American problem. Let us hope that other nations will mobilize the spirit and energies and skill of their people in some form of Peace Corps—making our own effort only one step in a major international effort to increase the welfare of all men and improve understanding among nations." Statement by President Kennedy.
