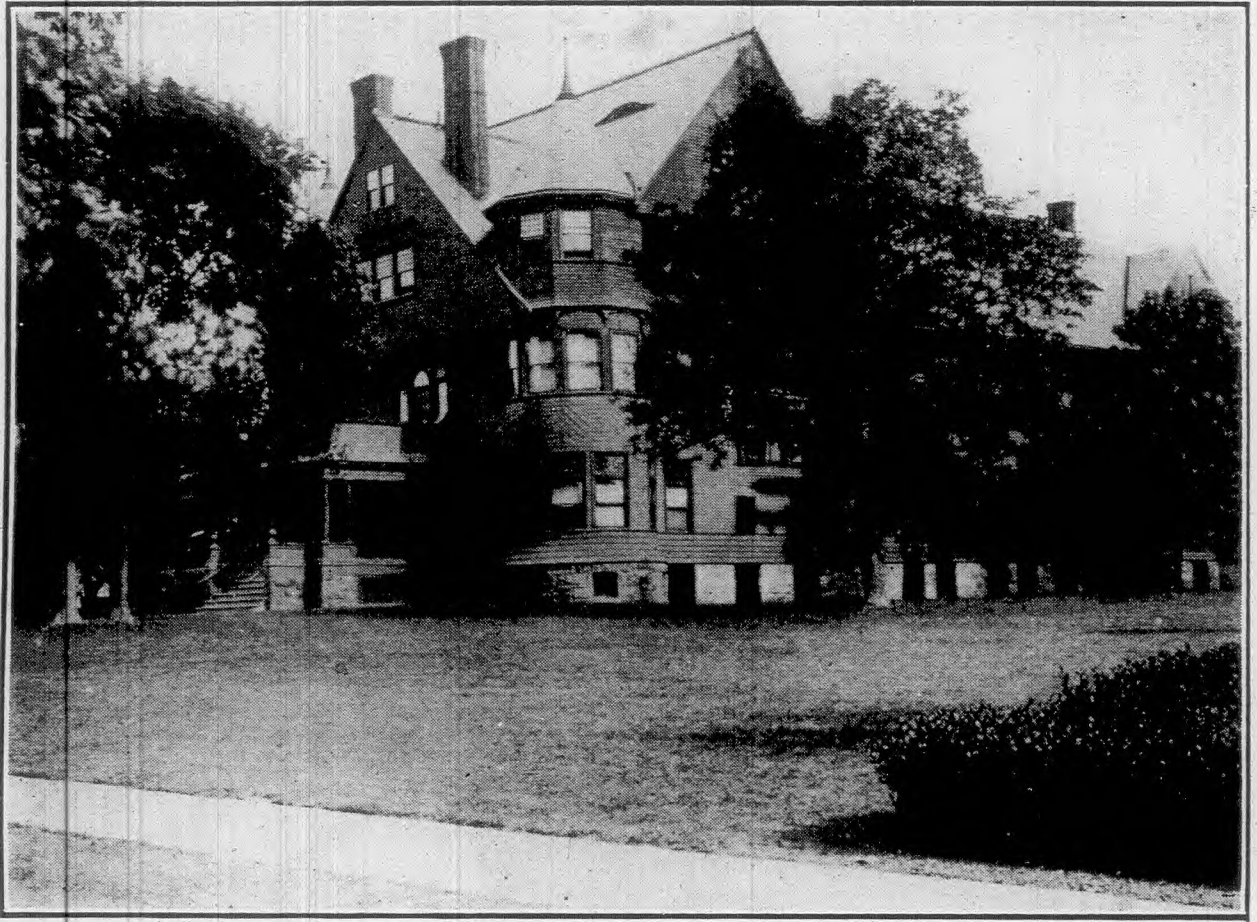

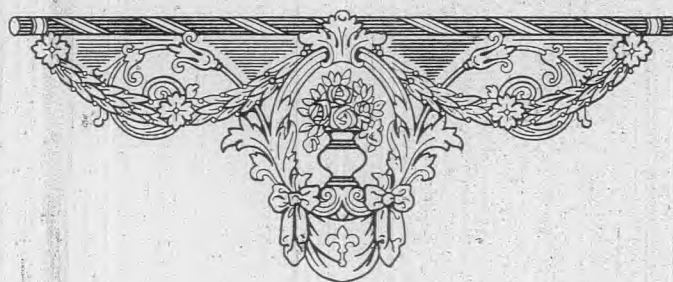

Prefatory

THE very difficulties which we have encountered in compiling the first edition of this Annual—and they have been considerable—afford the best proof of the real local need for such a work. In advance advertising matter, we hazarded the statement that “the Town of Montclair probably has more organizations than any town of its size in the world,” and we might add now, with far richer experience to justify an expression of opinion, that some, indeed many, of these societies are thoroughly and efficiently organized, while others are loosely coherent, even their officers appearing only slightly cognizant of their aims, organization, or such facts about them as would seem to be their reasons for existence, and as in Nast’s famous cartoon of the Tweed ring, the so-called officers form a circle, each officer pointing to the next for “full information.”

For a volume of its size, the Montclair Annual represents an amount of labor in compilation and preparation which is probably unique. In securing data of not several but of many of our organizations, for instance, we have had to secure history, names of officers, lists of members, and cuts from as many different officials or sources, and including the card indices handled and the painstakingly prepared if not wholly complete “Who’s Who in Montclair” feature, we have forwarded to our printer well over 6,000 separate pieces of copy, and probably nearly 10,000.

We have neither boasts nor apologies to offer for this book, the completed product of our task. Certainly there will be found errors and omissions, for they are inevitable in such a work even in one of long standing, let alone a first edition like this. The Annual is now, however, despite some of the cheerful forebodings of our friends to the contrary, an established fact and institution and it will appear year after year hereafter with what we fondly hope will prove unfailing regularity. The 1916 Edition appears several weeks after the time originally announced because so many societies organize for the year during the month of January and they were naturally anxious to have their data as published complete and up-to-date. Accordingly, for the 1917 Edition, the last forms will be held open until January 31, 1917, which will enable us to distribute that edition by the middle of February or soon afterward.

The preparation of the current edition has elicited some interesting historical data, much of which has not been published hitherto so far as we know. Requesting the charitable, or at least friendly, consideration of our readers for the matter now placed before them, we invite their cordial co-operation and assistance in the preparation of succeeding editions. Constructive criticism will be welcomed, new ideas or suggestions will be carefully considered, and above all, we earnestly advise and request that the Boards of all town organizations see to it that their records are gotten into first-class condition and kept so,—in preparing this book, we found it to be the exception rather than the rule for organizations to have

even a printed list of their members. Others invited us to run off their stencils at our own expense! The lists after each name in "Who's Who in Montclair" of course include figures representing only such organizations as have furnished their membership lists in time for the formidable tasks of cross-checking and preparation for printing involved. We shall be only too happy to have hereafter the full lists of members of all societies and if furnished in time, they will be cross-checked with the "Who's Who list" and the roster of the local activities of our adult citizens who share in the town's affairs will be published fully and accurately, so that "he who runs may read."

We wish now to thank our friends the advertisers for their patronage and also those who have subscribed to the book, without whose trust we could not have offered the business men a *guaranteed* circulation. So far as we have been able to ascertain, The Montclair Annual is the only Montclair publication which has ever offered its advertisers a circulation backed up by a guarantee to the effect that if such circulation should not be given as promised, a pro rata cash rebate will be distributed. The bulk of the circulation of this Edition has already been contracted for, a few copies remaining for "Missourians," but we should advise them to get their copies promptly and we really cannot encourage our advertisers to expect a rebate, as the present probabilities are that the edition of 5,000 copies will not satisfy the demand for the book.

We wish also to thank the many different officers and others connected with the societies and clubs of Montclair for their friendly and cordial co-operation and to register also our appreciation of the hard work which the staff and office force of this office have contributed toward making the Annual a success. It is exceedingly difficult to get the public to "visualize" the first issue of a new publication, in advance of its actual appearance. But with the Annual now a fact rather than a "future," we hope for increased co-operation for the next and succeeding issues and we would respectfully call attention to the members of those societies who do not publish year books or other literature of their own that this periodical offers them virtually the same thing—if they will seize the opportunity—at trifling individual expense and without any expense to their organizations as such.

We hope and believe that this little work will be found of benefit to the town we all love and that it will be truly a useful handbook for the organizations and their members, some of which have unconsciously and unintentionally trodden on each others' toes through lack of clear understanding as to what it was all about. The Montclair Civic Association, to which this Edition is dedicated, has done much to co-ordinate the work of our societies. Strength to its elbows to continue this most useful of its activities! And the Annual Publications Company promises untiring effort to improve this Annual and in time to perfect it so that it may be unquestionably the best periodical in the best town in the best country of them all.

A Biography Rather Than a History

They are a part of some greater community. They are the resting place, yes the nesting place of the eagles who go forth to work in the world of the uncounted millions of human slave hands—I mean the world of steam, electricity, gasoline and science.

The older people of Montclair like to think of the old days: the days when the Dutch traders went out with their Indian guides from New Amsterdam and Bergen and looked over the land of the meadows and the later named Orange Mountains. They tell of the days when Charles II, drove the Dutch from New Amsterdam in 1664 and made a new lair for the British Lion on Manhattan Island. The historian reflects upon the significance of the capture of the Hudson Valley by the British and the downfall of the Dutch West Indian Empire. The representatives of the Old Families of Montclair justly take much pride in repeating the stories of how the Cranes, the Van Giesons, the Baldwins, the Harrisons, the Van Vlecks and others from New England took advantage of the transfer of New Amsterdam to the British sovereign, and sought new homes and more freedom in the new colony of New Jersey. In the early days of our colonial history the rich land and the many resources of Northern Jersey developed thriving farming and trading communities.

The war of the Revolution revealed the fact that the history of northern and central New Jersey is determined almost entirely by its location between New York and Philadelphia. If you will look at the map you will see that Montclair is a look-out station, a little to one side of the road between these great cities. When Washington's defeat at Long Island and New York, made his rapid retreat cross New Jersey imperative; Eagle Rock was a signal station from which Washington's scouts watched for the signal gun that should tell when Washington's division of cavalry had passed Crane's Gap. Several times during the War, Washington stopped in Montclair. All this seems like a story of the old time but the location of Montclair on the road, or just to one side of the road between New York and Philadelphia, is worth studying.

In the days of the Revolution, Montclair, or rather the land on which Montclair is built, was a safe distance from New York. Today, however, the situation is different. Montclair is the back door to New York. Few people seem to realize that Eagle Rock is the natural fortress from which the rear of New York must be defended in case of a modern war. If you will climb to Eagle Rock on a clear afternoon and look out over Newark, New York and New York Bay, you will realize that very heavy artillery planted on this ridge of rock could send shells booming into any part of New York.

Is this the History of Montclair? This is the part of the present and future history that ought to be studied. It is the part that will be scoffed at by the flippant ignoramus who wants to show his wit. But the fact is that cities are made and unmade by the same forces that make nations. Cities are only depots on the great trade routes of the world. Montclair is an outgrowth of the commercial forces that have wrought so many miracles in the Western World. Manhattan, once sold for twenty-four dollars, is now the holder of more wealth than all of our great and powerful American States, located west of The Mississippi.

Montclair is a residential town for successful New Yorkers. The great forces of human life that are unfolding in New York will determine the history of Montclair.

In this great work the Montclair schools lead the way. Listening to the voice of the commercial world, speaking through the millions of voices who say give us a chance and give us tools with which to work: the schools of Montclair are progressing rapidly. Years ago the foundations were laid. For long years the schools of Montclair have been copied and envied. Nevertheless, the people of Montclair are only now realizing that school systems must change to meet new conditions. Of all institutions none are so likely to become covered with moss, both on the exterior and the interior, as schools and churches.

With our schools, our churches and our town we must look more to the future. We must be less satisfied with the past. Peaceful contentment in the contemplation of our own virtues is the sure path to stagnation.

In writing our history we should pay more attention to our faults than to our virtues. We are so egotistical that we can not forget our virtues. Whenever a new preacher comes to Montclair he must preach his first sermon on the chosen few—not of Israel—but of our Mountain Town. If a stranger mentions Caldwell, Glen Ridge or Hoboken he is greeted with as much applause as if he had said "damn" on the stage or had told a questionable story to the minister. With all of our outlook on the outside world in business and commercial affairs, we are very provincial in town affairs. We have a right to be proud of our town, its beautiful homes, its trees, wide lawns, fine schools, churches and clubs. But we must be careful not to let luxury conquer us.

Of all tests that the people in such a town as ours must meet—the supreme test is—can we stand up against prosperity and luxury? Montclair can boast of so many great families; so many strong men and women, so much talent and so many people of national reputation that I do not dare to mention any for fear of leaving out many who have even a greater claim to distinction. We have railroad builders and mining engineers. We have great scientists and inventors. We live near great architects and painters. At the club we meet great authors and actors. In the schools we see the second and third generations of great families in nearly every line of human service and human endeavor. The old families are those who have been here more than ten years. Nearly every week we meet a newcomer of distinction. New York is constantly drawing unto herself the talent and the brains of the world. As a direct result these hawks and eagles find nesting places in Montclair, Glen Ridge, The Oranges, and other residential towns. Without these newcomers with their brains and their money we soon would take on the aspect of a New England country village.

Montclair, like the rest of America, has enough conservatism to last her for generations. We need men and women who insist that we have all of the improvements that we can find money to pay for. We must preach the gospel of hard work and enthusiasm. With all that she may well boast of, Montclair must realize that more rapid progress must be made in the future. Many of our streets are so poor that our taxpayers wonder if our streets will ever be built. One railroad station in Montclair is so poor and so out of date that a stranger would think that he had come to the deadest—not to the most progressive town of the East. So many of our streets seem to shy off so far to one side at meeting another street that we wonder if an earthquake has shaken our town out of shape. The vacant houses and undeveloped lots prompt the single taxpayer to sermons on our throttled industry. In short there is work to be done in Montclair and we must enlist the services of the strongest if we are to keep up with modern progress.

Only a few years ago land was cheap and we had plenty of opportunity to shake off our lethargy and to provide athletic fields and playgrounds for our children and students. We accepted the medieval idea that physical development was a matter of accident and that the only work of the schools was to teach an out-worn curriculum. Today we see the result. We have many fine and strong students in Montclair. Nevertheless you may see in all our schools hundreds of students whose lives have been blighted by lack of physical development. We see narrow-chested and pale-faced boys and girls who are sent to school when they might better be sent to the woods. We fill them with drugs and send them to bed when we could cure nearly all of their ills and develop them into good specimens if we would have brains enough to adopt efficient methods. The time is rapidly coming when every success-

ful nation must realize the fact that it is even more necessary to have scientific physical education than to give each citizen a mental education.

Modern medicine and modern science may keep the breath of life in weak babies and even prolong the life of poorly-developed adults but our American towns must learn that the old days of back yards and necessary work for children about the home has passed. In the old days the necessity of work looked after the physical development of the children. But today we pamper the children instead of educating them. This is especially true of the people who have had their money only a short time. Many of our weakest boys and girls are the children of people who fought for and won their own success but have been so completely conquered by luxury that they kill their children with kindness.

The human being is an animal and he must have work and exercise if he is to be strong. In a town like Montclair, physical education in the open air should begin with the kindergarten and continue as long as the student is in school. Good health can be cultivated and is the strongest bulwark against disease. In Montclair some of the richest children are to be pitied the most. Some of the hot house plants can not even stand sunlight. This is not the fault of the children. It is our fault. We take them to school in automobiles. We send the car to bring them home for lunch. We feed them on delicate foods. We have them tutored in order to save their strength. We forbid them to play foot ball because they are naturally frail. We even send them to private schools because the public schools are too severe and unsympathetic. We let them go to eight dances in one vacation in order to have something to talk about at the next meeting of the bridge club.

All this kindness is well meant but it has little place in the world's work. Our first duty in a residential town is to develop strong young people. They are the greatest resource of the nation. At the best, one generation does not last long. The older people will soon pass on. It is our duty in Montclair to take an account of stock and to discard the things that are evil and to develop more that is good. Today the world is progressing as never before. Today it is not sufficient to develop. We must develop rapidly and be prepared to meet strong competition. In many ways central Western towns have gone far ahead of us in building for the future. The future is the part of our history that most concerns us.

We have the opportunity of an American Athens, but we must avoid the mistakes of Athens. We must not let our art, our schools, our memorials, our temples point to the past. The past is dead. It has often been said that America has no art of her own; that all our art is borrowed from Athens or some other classical city. In one way this is unfortunate for towns like Montclair. In another way it is extremely fortunate. We have not yet worked out our ideal. In fact an ideal should never be worked out. We must be ever working. Let the old people talk about the ancient art and the old days. Let those who have done their work. But let the young study the art and the arts that point to the future.

To look back again to the old days; we find that before Montclair and New York were connected by railroads, local business men occupied a much higher position in the town than at present. At one time the local merchants, business men and others who did their work in Montclair were counted as leaders. Recently, however, the commuter has so completely taken possession of the place that many of our people hardly know that any business is done in Montclair. I have often heard young fellows who are earning enough to

buy their commutation to New York speak of Montclair's best business men as though any one who worked in Montclair could not claim cast with any one who was sweeping offices in New York. This example may be unimportant but it points to one serious weakness of Americans.

We often find fault with conditions without knowing what we are talking about. We often hear people say that they can not afford to buy goods in Montclair. This may be true of some articles; but as citizens of Montclair we must remember that we have the power to change local conditions. If we get acquainted with the business people of Montclair and spend a part of our money here, we can help ourselves and help the growth of our town.

Montclair—Fair Montclair—you have outgrown the colonial days and the days of the horse car and the stage coach. You have some of the scars and marks of the old days. You have covered your brooks that once furnished water power for industry. You have filled in many a skating pond and mosquito heaven. You have built some fine new residences and homes. You have retained some of the houses of the old time. You have introduced new things and new ways. Your streets are lighted with electricity. Your voice is sent out over the wires of the outside world. You have a local history, but it is now closely connected with that of other communities and in fact with the commercial world.

You must remove some of your old buildings and markings of the past. You must change some of your out-worn ways of thinking and stretch forward for a race with those who would gladly tear you down. You must spend less time talking about the dog ordinance and the time when chickens may be allowed to crow in the morning. Let them crow a little earlier; for necessity will drive your brother from his bed while you are dreaming of the latest dance. Luxury is fine, but it must not be your sole profession. Your sons and daughters must learn how to enjoy something besides vacations. Their vacations should come after they have done their serious work.

You have money, you have brains, you have good air and green lawns. Montclair has an outlook that can inspire her people to do even better in the future than in the past. We shall climb again to the look-out station at Eagle Rock. We shall look north to the Passaic line. We shall look east to Greater New York. We shall think of our little town nearby and the striving millions of the outside world. We shall look into the homes of our mountain town and see sleeping in the minds of our people forces of brain power that will yet shake the world. We shall see the young people just beginning to show the brain power that has been developing through generations of ability. We shall see the mingling of the best blood of the world brought in here by the successful people of nearly all of the nations under the sun.

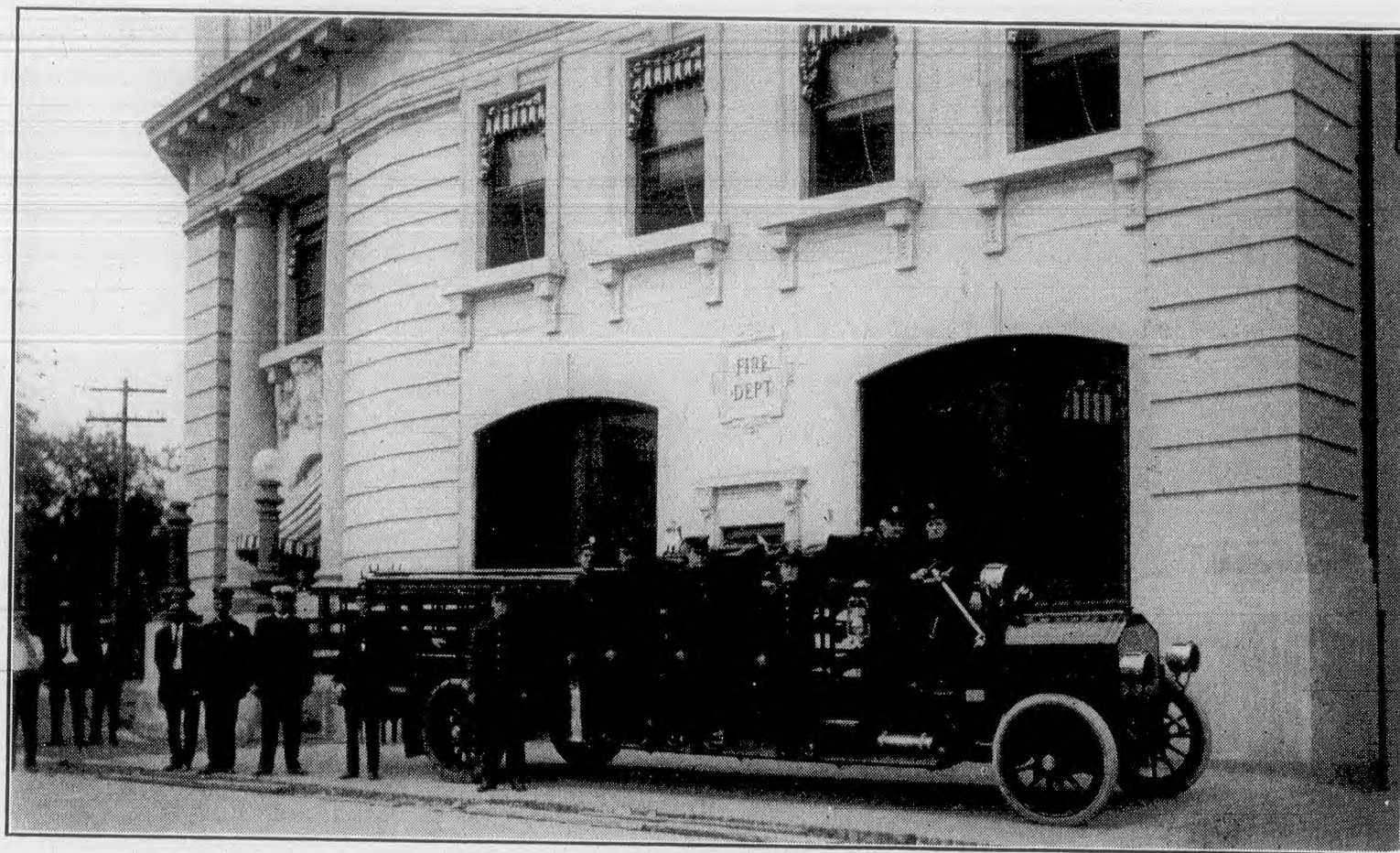

THE MONTCLAIR BOARD OF HEALTH

The Montclair Board of Health was created by the Town Council in 1894 by virtue of a Legislative Act which empowered the Town Council to create a board of health consisting of not more than seven members and whose terms of office should not exceed four years. The Board consisted of five members until the summer of 1915 when the Council, by ordinance, increased the membership to seven (all three-year terms).

During the last two years the amount appropriated for the use of the Board has been \$11,500.00 per annum and the receipts of the Board have amounted to about \$1,700.00 per annum, so that the sum available for the use of the Board is practically 50 cents per capita per annum.

A County Hospital is available, without cost to the patient, for cases of scarlet fever, diphtheria and tuberculosis, and the Board furnishes supplies for communicable diseases whenever necessary. The free services of the Board in the prevention of communicable disease may be summarized as follows:

DIPHTHERIA—Antitoxin in unlimited quantities to indigent cases, and at cost to all who cannot afford to pay the regular price. Cultures examined free.

TYPHOID FEVER—Immunizing serum upon request. Blood examinations free.

SMALLPOX—Vaccine and vaccination upon request.

TUBERCULOSIS—Sputum cups and any other supplies that, in the opinion of the Board, are necessary. Hospital treatment whenever necessary. Sputum examinations free.

RABIES—Pasteur treatment for indigent persons.

VENEREAL DISEASE—Diagnostic examination of specimens from any person and serum treatment for indigents.

Diagnostic examinations are also made of specimens from suspected cases of malaria. Application for diagnostic examinations or for treatment for diseases not enumerated may be made to the Board.

Whatever disinfection is considered necessary by the Board is performed free of charge.

Both the case rate and the death rate for communicable diseases in Montclair is exceptionally low, and the number of cases of typhoid fever during the past two or three years has averaged only about 1 for every 3,000 inhabitants per year, which is abundant proof of the safety of the Montclair water and milk supplies.

The death rate of the town during 1915 was 9.8 per 1,000 inhabitants, which, while a remarkably low rate, is but slightly below the five-year average for the town. The birth rate during 1915 was 20.8 per 1,000 inhabitants which is a relatively low rate. The marriage rate during 1915 was 7.8 per 1,000 inhabitants, which is also a comparatively low rate.

For years the Board has maintained a rigid supervision of its milk and cream supply and it now has rigid requirements for the ice cream and meat supplies of the town. Other lines of food control are frequent inspections of the food stores to see that all articles are properly protected from contamination, inspection of bakeries and of other food manufacturing plants.

The chief features from a health standpoint which make Montclair a desirable place in which to live may be summarized as follows:

1. A remarkably low death rate.
2. Comparative freedom from communicable diseases.
3. A perfectly safe water supply.
4. A pure milk supply.
5. Clean markets, inspected food supplies and medical examination of food manufacturers.
6. Medical inspection of the Parochial school as well as of the public schools.

MONTCLAIR PUBLIC SCHOOLS

Probably no town in the United States varies more widely than Montclair in the character of its school population. Provision must be made for the education of untaught immigrants at one end of the scale, and at the other for children who are surrounded at home with every refinement of cultivation. This means a wide variation in equipment, teaching force, and schemes to meet the need, and requires an expenditure which, in the nature of things, must go beyond that of towns in which one type of instruction is suited to most of the children.

The one thing above all others which has given Montclair her leading position in school matters and which draws hundreds of visitors every year is her recognition of the variety of the needs and her ability and willingness to meet them. It is the policy of "looking ahead" which puts a man at the front in any profession: it is this same policy of "looking ahead" which has always obtained in the Montclair school system. To take one instance among many: a few years ago the state passed a law that children three years or more below grade in their school work must be brought together in classes numbering not more than fifteen in membership, each class to be in charge of a specially qualified teacher able, beyond the usual requirements of a grade teacher, to meet those set forth by the state for the peculiar type of psychology and manual training demanded in this work. Already before the enactment of the law, two such classes were in operation in

Montclair. As more teachers have been assigned to such work to meet the growing need, it has been possible to secure their state certification, without examination, on the ground that they have already completed, through pedagogical courses of recognized standing, the necessary training for dealing with mentally defective children. This means that both the supervisory department and the teachers have used foresight. Since the town's reception of its share of the state appropriation depends on meeting the state requirements, it is a matter of business as well as of pedagogy.

"Look ahead" is the thought underlying plans for building accommodations, playgrounds, and type of instruction, but mere "looking ahead" may easily degenerate into a matter of fads and visionary ideals. The other principle in use by the department safeguards this one: "Base the plans for the future not on opinions, however wise they seem but on the facts of the past and the present as shown by the scientific investigation of each case under consideration."

Often much pressure is brought to bear to induce the adoption of one or another measure excellent in itself but impossible to carry out without destroying the relative balance of the elements of the school system. The principle governing the administration of the schools is exactly that underlying the management of any large business. There every suggestion for improvement is welcomed but the possibility of its actual "use in the business" must be determined by the specially trained expert at the head, who knows the details of his own industry and is in close touch with similar concerns all over the country. No town which failed to grasp this principle ever obtained for its schools the reputation for excellence which Montclair has so long held.

The Montclair Free Public library was first opened at 16 Church street, January 1, 1894. It had been organized on May 1, 1893, through the efforts of Mr. and Mrs. Israel Crane. At the end of the first year of its existence it had 2,865 volumes. In June, 1899, the institution moved to the building now occupied by the Teachers' Club in Valley road and in 1904 the building which is now its home was made possible through financial assistance from the Carnegie Foundation and money acquired from local sources.

This building, at Valley road and Church street, was completed April 14, 1904, and is now equipped with 39,617 volumes, according to a report made at New Years.

Meetings of the board are held on the first Wednesday of each month in one of the library rooms.

In January, 1899, the Bellevue avenue, Upper Montclair, branch was installed in a vacant store, where it remained until the new completion of the present structure, also partly paid for by contribution from the Carnegie foundation. More recently a South Side branch has been established, on Orange road near Cedar avenue, as shown in data below:

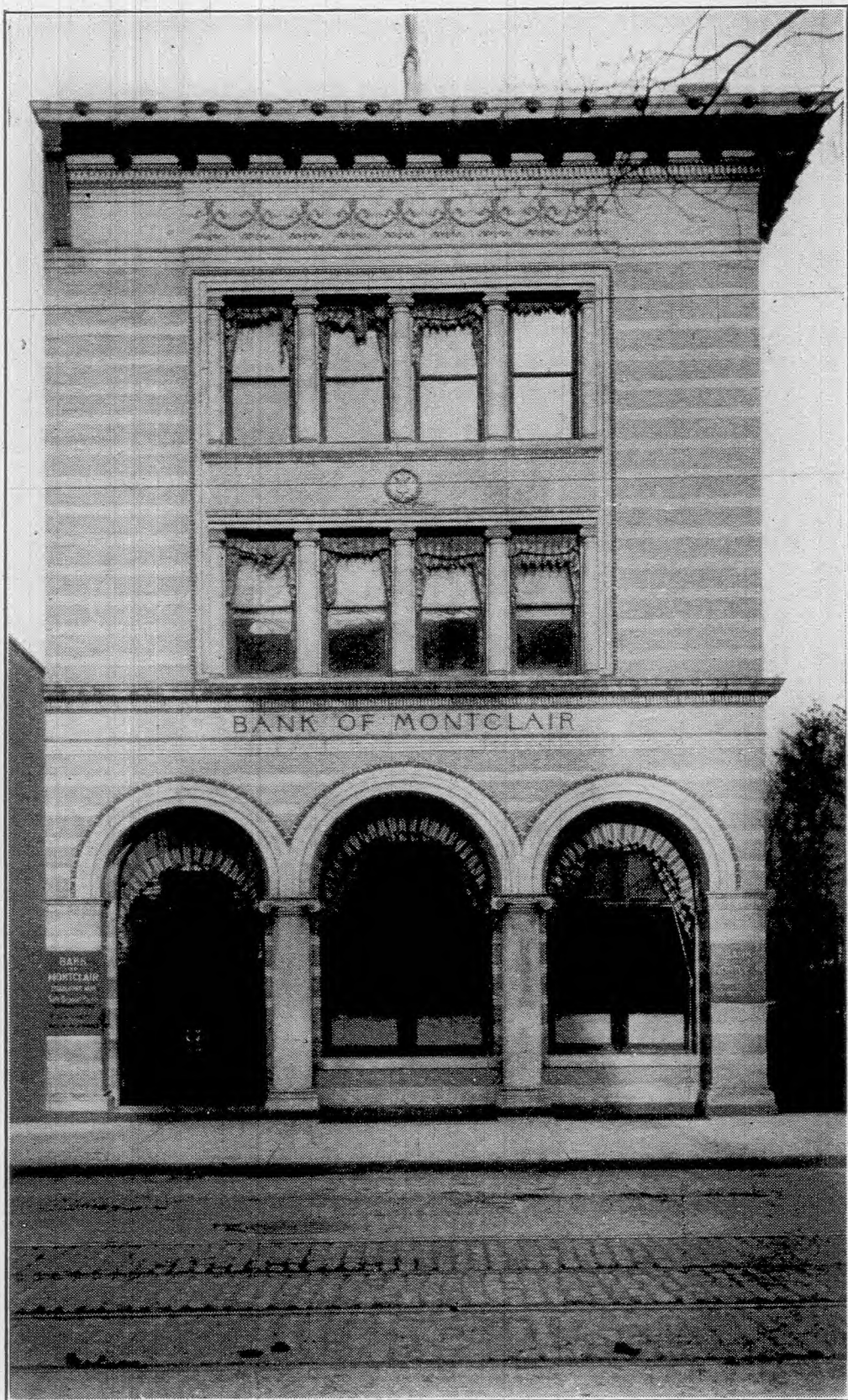

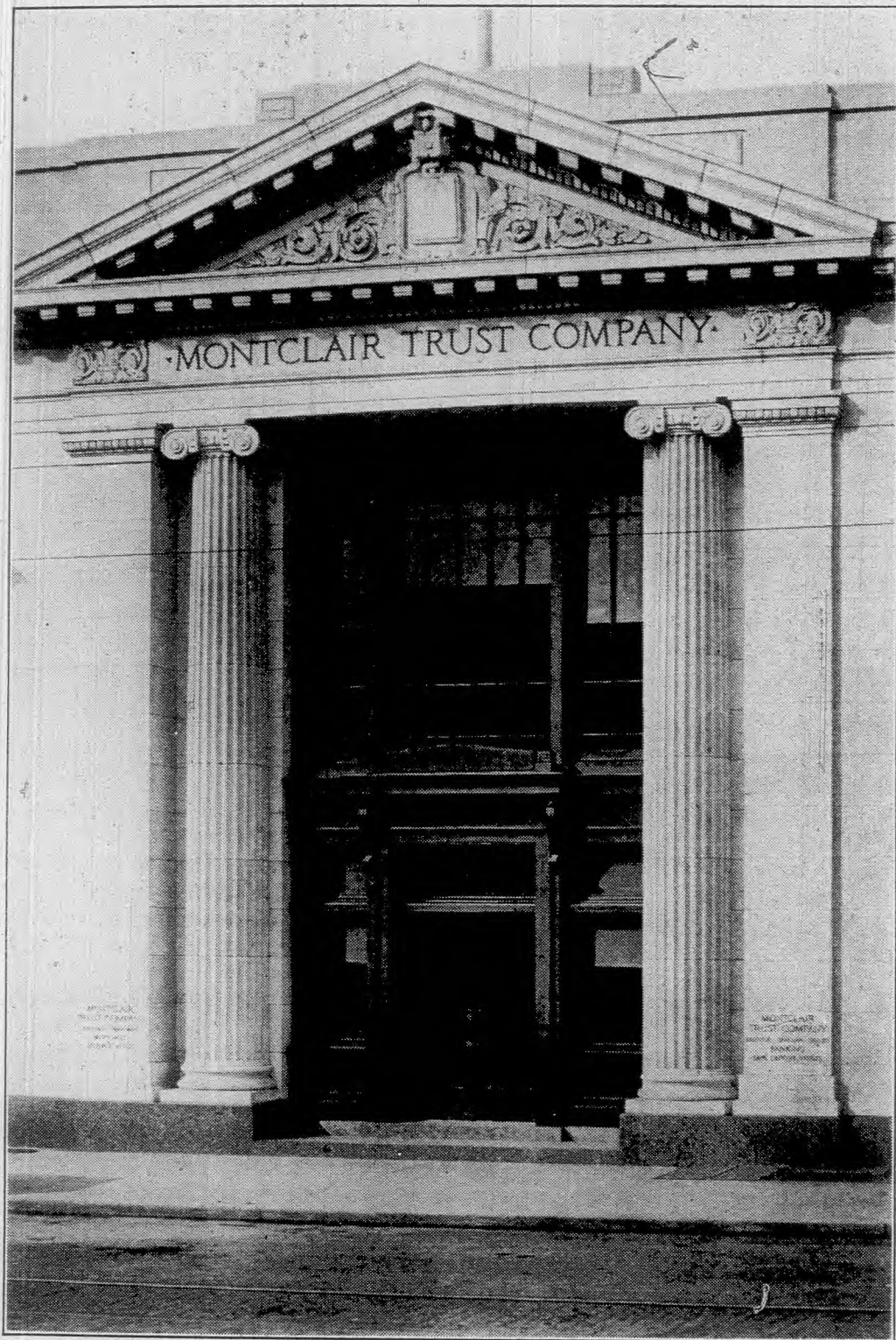

Graduate Nurses Club

39 South Willow Street

The club was organized in 1899, as "The Nurses' Home," 36 Fulton Street, Montclair. The membership grew until in the fall of 1896 the headquarters were moved to 95 Grove Street. In the year 1910 it was deemed wiser to dissolve the "Nurses' Home" and to form an incorporated body under the name of "The Graduate Nurses' Club." In the fall of 1912 it was once more necessary to obtain larger accommodations and this time the club moved to its present location, 39 South Willow Street.

In 1899 the organization was effected through Miss Margaret Stamford, who was a patient in the Mountainside Hospital for more than a year and wished to do something toward establishing a home for the nurses who had taken care of her. Miss Stamford gave some furnishings and Miss Clausen rented the house at 36 Fulton Street, which with the help of Miss Stamford formed the nucleus of the Graduate Nurses' Club.

The purposes of the body are as follows:

1. To promote the usefulness, honor and interests of the nursing profession; to encourage unity of action and advance friendly intercourse among nurses.
2. The furtherance of the efficient care of the sick and to establish a means of providing competent and reliable nurses to the medical profession and public generally.
3. To establish, maintain and to operate a clubhouse or place of residence and

congregation for graduate nurses, who may be either temporarily or permanently in Montclair.

4. To procure and maintain, by purchase, lease, or otherwise, any building or rooms, or other accommodations for the special purpose of a Nurses' Club or home for the use of its members at all times.

Meetings take place in the club house; The annual meeting on the first Saturday in March, The Board of Governors hold a meeting every three months and The House Committee every month.

THE ALTRUIST SOCIETY

213 Glen Ridge Avenue

The Altruist Society of today, well known as the Charity Organization of Montclair, evolved from the Home Society which was established in April, 1887. In an unpretentious little periodical, called "The Altruist," containing literary contributions and monthly reports from November, 1887, through June, 1888, information concerning the virgin purposes and work of this new factor in Montclair development was given to the public.

In the initial number the aims of the Home Society were thus defined:
"What is the Home Society?"

"An Association non-sectarian, non-partisan, representative of no class, united on the common ground of educational and philanthropic work for the town; and broad enough to help alike its workers and those for whom they work, by compelling a wider intelligence and truer sympathy; by teaching the dignity of labor, and by presenting the higher ideals of life.

"The young women of Montclair, in the hope of satisfying certain needs untouched by existing organizations, and awake to the fact that the worth of a community is in proportion to the work of its individual homes, have united in an organized effort to promote those interests which elevate the home.

"The name, 'Home Society' had been chosen as the one best adapted to include and indicate the various lines of work the organization has assumed. Its main lines of work are represented by five departments namely Educational, Industrial, Temperance, Relief, and Entertainment."

In soliciting funds for the society early in its career a confusion was found to exist in the minds of the public as to the similar names, "The Home Society" and the "Children's Home." The latter is also a new institution. The Home Society, therefore, adopted the name of the little paper that had been advocating its work and the "Altruist Society" entered upon its second stage of evolution. It was incorporated under that name in 1906.

During the nearly thirty years of its existence the work, and the character of its departments have changed from time to time to meet the existing needs; covering industrial, educational, flower mission, summer picnics for the work worn, wood yard and relief bodies.

The Society at present does an extensive preventive and constructive work.

The major portion of the work is centralized in the Altruist House at 213 Glen Ridge avenue under the supervision of Superintendent Mrs. Nettie Patterson and an assistant.

ALLIANCE FRANÇAISE DE MONTCLAIR

The world-wide society known as the Alliance Française has for its object "the propagation of the French language and the diffusion of an acquaintance with French literature, institutions and genius throughout the different countries of the world." This vast society, which includes among its members the most noted men in letters, science and art, is constantly extending its work by the formation of local groups, scattered over the whole surface of the globe.

Such groups have been established in a large number of centers in the United States, combined in a great federation under the name of the Fédération de l'Alliance Française aux Etats-Unis.

This federation on the 29th of March, 1915, included 145 groups with a total membership of over fifty thousand.

The "Cercles Français" of many universities and schools are affiliated with the Federation, including those of Harvard, Radcliffe, Yale, Princeton, the University of Pennsylvania, the College of the City of New York and that of the Montclair High School.

The regular meetings of the Alliance are held in Unity Church, on the fourth Tuesday of each month at 8:15 p. m. They consist of lectures and social evenings and plays. Afternoon meetings are held in The Montclair High School Building every second Friday of each month at 3 p. m. They also consist of lectures, games and French conversation.

French classes, Berlitz System, are also held every Tuesday at the High School building.

The Alliance Française of Montclair presents each year a medal to the pupil of the Montclair High School whose work in French proves the most meritorious.

The Alliance will aid in the formation of any classes for special study, for which there appears to be sufficient demand.

ARMENIAN ORPHANS' HOME

Office, 24 Church Street

The Armenian Orphans' Home was founded in December, 1915, by Dikran Bedikian, proprietor of the Oriental Art Home. Its purpose is to provide a refuge for Armenian orphans made fatherless by the Turkish massacres. Mr. Bedikian gave the work its initial impulse by donating six acres of land on his farm on Dundee Lake, N. J. and by announcing his intention to make his will in favor of the project.

At time of publication plans are under consideration to incorporate the Home with a Board of Trustees made up of prominent Montclair and New York men. The Council of Philanthropy has given its approval of Mr. Bedikian's idea.

Not only will the Home be a place of dwelling for the orphans but it is also the intention to bring the Armenian children up as American citizens educated in public schools. A number of the children will be trained especially for missionary and social welfare work in Armenia after the war is over, in order that the disorganization and suffering caused by the present conflict may be repaired and ameliorated. It has been pointed out that during the missionary work undertaken in Armenia by American missionaries, one Armenian teacher could do more effective work when properly directed than ten Americans, as the latter were but little versed comparatively, in the ways, customs and thought-habits of the country.

Prior to publication, Mr. Bedikian received from all over the country assurances of aid in his task. As an eminent Oriental scholar, as an interpreter of manners and customs of Eastern peoples, he has a wide acquaintanceship with those who sympathize with his purpose.

Born and brought up in the Orient, and thoroughly educated in all that pertains to his line and people, he has written prolifically in an instructive and interesting manner about Oriental life. He is one of the best-known living authorities on rugs. He lived with the rug-makers, listened day by day to their stories told as they worked, and studied for years the great master-pieces of the weavers, ancient and modern; solving the mysteries of rugs. Mr. Bedikian recently spoke at the Montclair Art Museum during an exhibit there of Oriental rugs.

A campaign is now under way to raise an endowment of \$100,000 with which to equip the Armenian Orphans' Home. In April, a well-known aviator will contribute to the fund by giving an aviation meet on the grounds of the Upper Montclair Country Club. Contributions are rapidly coming in at time of writing, and promises come from many places each week.

BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA

The first local Boy Scout troop was organized in 1909 by the present Scout Commissioner, Frank F. Gray. That troop is now the Sir Robert Baden-Powell Troop, the only one in the world named after Sir Baden-Powell, originator of the Boy Scout movement.

The Council was organized in January, 1911, with H. C. Jackson as president, J. A. Hall as financial secretary and Henry Wheaton as treasurer. Mr. Gray was elected commissioner on January 8, 1913 and he entered the service of the Council in September of the same year. The present Headquarters, a large room on the second floor of the Madison Building, was opened March 1, 1914. A summer camp is maintained at Midvale, N. J., and is open to all boys.

At present the fourteen troops in Glen Ridge and Montclair include about 300 members, a larger number for each 1,000 of population than nearly any other place in the United States.

THE COLLEGE WOMAN'S CLUB OF MONTCLAIR

The College Woman's Club of Montclair was organized in the spring of 1911. Following a suggestion of Mrs. Walter Lloyd, an organization meeting was held at the home of Miss Emily B. Shultz, Miss Elsie M. Dwyer, presided.

The first president of the club was Mrs. Thomas S. Gladding of Ohio Wesleyan University, and there was an initial enrollment of over 100 members. This has since increased constantly. At the present time the club has a membership of 275, representing graduates and former students of over forty different women's colleges.

Although organized primarily for social purposes, the club early avowed the more serious purpose of serving general educational interests in the community, and of furthering the higher education of women. With these ends in view, five stated meetings are held yearly.

One of these in April is the annual business meeting at which written reports are submitted by all chairmen of standing committees, and election of officers takes place. In mid-winter is the annual breakfast to which members bring guests, and which has a formal program, including addresses by well-known educators. The other meetings are purely social. Then various college groups entertain the whole club, fostering the spirit of camaraderie of undergraduate days and giving expression to much invention and dramatic genius in the club.

The work for which the club is best known, however, is the now established custom of giving each year to Montclair a play of quality and literary standard such as would not ordinarily be attempted by amateur dramatic societies. Through the proceeds of these plays a \$500 scholarship has been created, awarded annually to a girl-graduate of the High School.

From the time of the first annual play, these performances have been features in town life. The first production was Milton's "Comus," in which Mrs. E. D. Farmer took the title role. This, and the two succeeding plays were given out of doors in June, on the Estate of Mr. and Mrs. Edmund B. Osborne, Mrs. Osborne being a member of the club.

The second play was Alfred Noyes' "Sherwood," with Mrs. Harold A. Brown as Robin Hood, and the third, "Jeanne d'Arc," by Percy Mackaye, in which Mrs. J. Alfred Chard played the part of Jeanne. Last year the club presented in the Montclair Theatre the difficult Moliere comedy "La Malade Imaginaire," in which Mrs. J. A. Jackson and Mrs. W. S. Brayton took important parts.

THIRTY-FOURTH ANNUAL REPORT

In presenting this thirty-fourth annual report of the Children's Home, the Board of Managers expresses its most grateful appreciation of the generosity of the friends of this work. In spite of the depression of business and the unusual calls upon the charitably disposed, there has been very little falling off of the subscriptions and donations.

Twenty-two children have been admitted during the past year, of whom ten were from Montclair, five from Bloomfield, four from Newark, two from Caldwell and one from Verona.

Ten of the children were here for a period of one or two months, while the mothers were obliged to go to hospitals, for operations or treatment. These have all been returned to their families.

Of the twelve that have become permanent inmates of the Home, one has a brutal step-father, by whom her life and morals were endangered, two have deserted mothers and a feeble minded father; four lost their fathers by tuberculosis; the mother, a cook in the institution, keeps a fifth child with her while waiting for a "widow's pension," when she hopes to make a home for all her children. Two others have a deserting father, another, a drunken one, whose presence in the home was a menace to the children, and the remaining two have an insane mother; the father is out of work and could not care for his six children. These facts from the report of the chairman of the admission committee, give a good idea of the kind of children we are helping.

Through the untiring efforts of the supervision committee, the boys are placed on farms, when they reach a suitable age, or those who show better ability are sent to other institutions, where they can be trained for some trade or useful occupation. Homes are found for the girls and some are also sent to institutions, such as the Good Will School at Hinckley, Me., Home for Girls, under Miss Smythe's care in New York City, or the Andrew's Institute at Willoughby, Ohio, where they are trained in domestic science, dressmaking, millinery, etc., that they may become self-supporting.

The committee in charge of the clothing for the Home are grateful to the several needlework guilds which have generously sent in good donations of clothing, stockings and underwear, and to the ladies of the different churches, who made the children waists and dresses. Perhaps some families, where good coats and hats, shoes, as well as dresses and suits, are outgrown, would like to think the clothing of their own boys and girls were keeping warm and neat the little bodies of these less fortunate children. If so, the Wardrobe Committee can make use of all that is sent.

The Home has been the grateful recipient of two legacies this past year. One from Mrs. Samuel Wilde, of ten thousand dollars, and one from Mr. J. C. Williams, of one thousand dollars—the interest of these to be used for current expenses. This has enabled the Board to make some long needed repairs, the expense of which has been also shared by our good auxiliary—always ready to help in time of need.

The Home is inspected each week by the house committee, and any criticism in the management or care of the house or grounds will be kindly received and suggestions carried out.

The garden is a good source of supply to our Home, providing summer vegetables and many for winter use as well. Its appearance has been greatly improved by a fine wire fence, the generous gift of T. H. Taylor. The material for setting the fence was kindly donated by Osborne & Marsellis.

The children are taught practical sewing on Mondays, and a member of the Board is at the Home on each visiting day. Our matron ably manages the household and is second mother to the children, and as such is glad to report there have been no contagious diseases this winter, nor was it necessary to call in a physician since last summer.

Just the same, we are glad to feel that Drs. Brown, Halsey, Noble and Mount are ready and willing to attend the children and that eyes and teeth have the good care of Drs. Broughton and Opdyke, and Drs. Crane, Areson, Chitterling, Rabus,

DEUTSCHER VEREIN von MONTCLAIR

An invitation was extended in 1911 by the German Kraenzchen of Montclair, which consisted of Mrs. William M. Brown, Mrs. Charles F. Droste, Miss Louise C. Hinck, Mrs. Henry Lang, Miss Edith Brautigam, and Mrs. G. Menhinick, to a number of Montclairians of German descent to organize a club. The Deutscher Verein von Montclair was the outcome.

The first meeting was held in Unity Church, where seventy members were enrolled. Its object is to furnish entertainment and promote social intercourse in a German atmosphere. Meetings are held on the first Friday of each month, either at Unity Church or Montclair Club Hall. FIFTH WARD IMPROVEMENT ASSOCIATION

In a town covering the widely extended area of Montclair, it is impossible for a small group of town officers, no matter how conscientious, to be conversant with every street and light and local condition. They themselves admit this and are always glad to get friendly suggestions. It is equally impossible to give each section exactly the same consideration as the other.

Back in the summer of 1910 the immediate residents around Rand Park became greatly exercised over a project of the Board of Education, to place another school building on Chestnut Street. There was already one public school on this street only a short distance away, and the residents thought that such a congestion of schools would be undesirable. Hence was formed the Rand Park Neighborhood Association, to protect the community interests.

Meanwhile the citizens of the lower part of this Ward—on Montclair Avenue, Christopher Street, Grove Street and adjacent streets—felt that something must be done to provide better school facilities in their own section. Their cause

naturally linked itself with that of Rand Park, although from different points of view. Out of the common need the Fifth Ward Improvement Association was formed. Some lively meetings were held. The Board of Education was respectfully but strenuously petitioned—and the cause of the Ward was won.

This is chronicled in no unkindness to the Board, which throughout was most considerate; and to-day the relations of the organization with it, as with other branches of the town government, are open and cordial.

The visible result is the imposing stone structure on Grove Street, an ornament to the whole Ward and a strong advertisement of Montclair to every passenger entering the town on the Erie Railroad. The next result was the still more beautiful structure, but for High School purposes, upon the natural crest of Park Street.

The Association, however, from the outset has been active in many other channels besides the foregoing. In fact, no phase of wholesome activity for the Fifth Ward has been neglected.

The committees meet in executive session at frequent intervals; and during the year there are open meetings of the association for the transaction of business and interchange of ideas. It has, for example, had prominent speakers on mosquito extermination, wider use of the schools, disposal of sewage, and other timely matters; and, for one other example out of many, it worked quietly for many months on the railroad problem in Montclair.

HOMEOPATHIC SOCIETY of Montclair and Vicinity

About 25 years ago the homeopaths of Montclair made their first effort to obtain public recognition for their school, and a place in which the followers of it could receive, when necessary, treatment in accordance with its principles.—Although this attempt was unsuccessful, the wish has never ceased to exist that the hope of these early pioneers should some day be attained.

The present society was organized in 1904 and for a time co-operation with the Homeopathic Hospital of Essex County, Littleton Avenue, Newark, seemed possible—but owing to the inconvenient accessibility of that institution the idea was abandoned. In January, 1907, by the act of incorporation under the name of

Homeopathic Society of Montclair and Vicinity the work became localized and as the result of a series of entertainments a building fund was started which has steadily increased since then through donations, interest on investments, etc.

While of recent years the society has not been prominently before the public, the Board of Managers has given much time and consideration to the best way to attain the object, and that of upholding the principles for which the body stands and which have been steadily advocated from the start—that the sick, regardless of his means, should receive whatever treatment he desires and that provision should be made to that end.

Acting upon this belief the present Board has decided that the time is at hand when it is possible to establish a place on such a basis, and to the accomplishment of this they will bend their energies throughout the coming year.

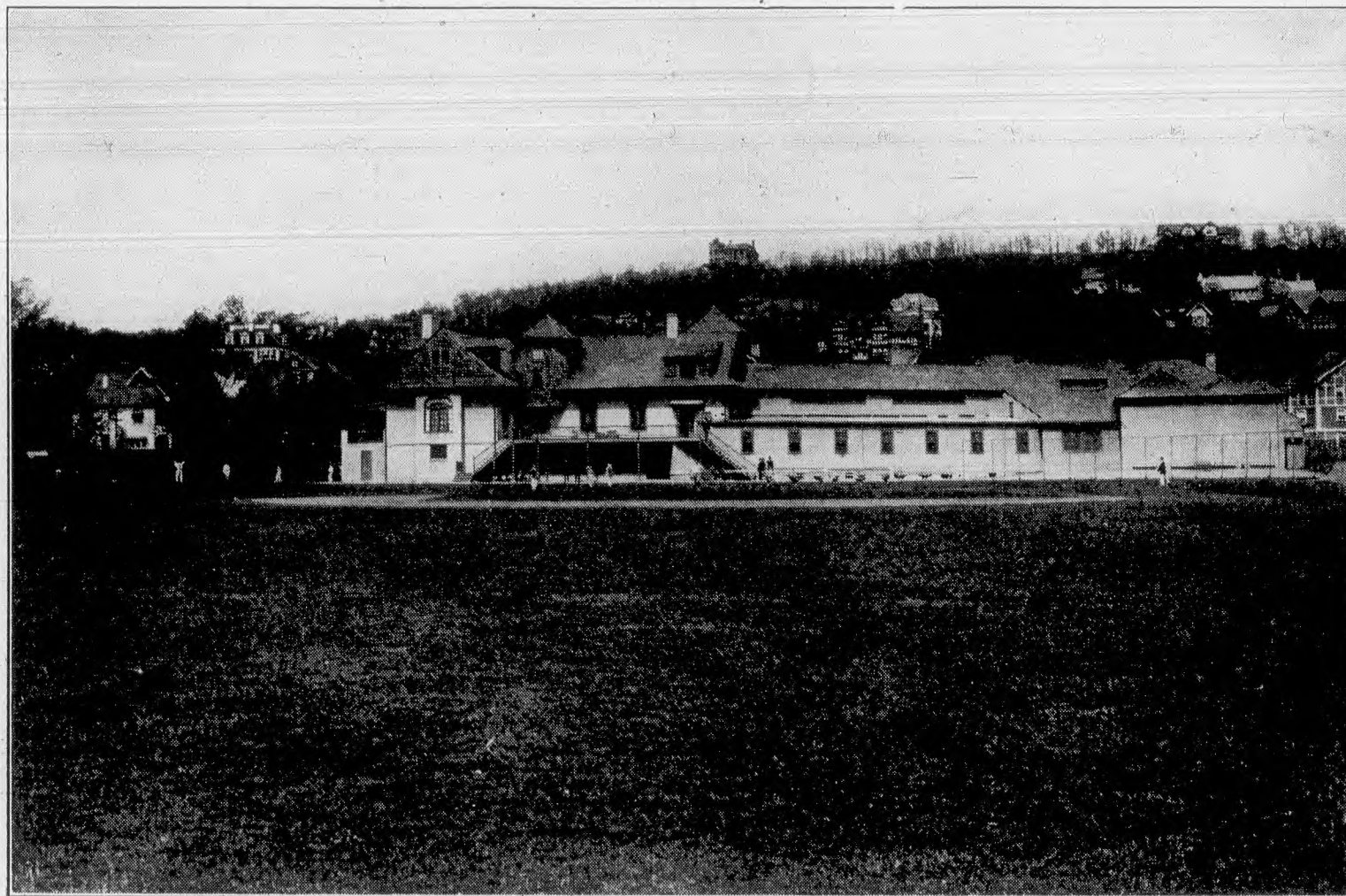
The association has done much to start scholarships for ten upper classes and has encouraged lower classes by offering prizes. There are about 200 active members.

MONTCLAIR ATHLETIC CLUB

Valley Road at Club Street

The Montclair Athletic Club, now the largest organization in Montclair, was founded in 1889, and duly incorporated under the name of the Montclair Club Athletic Association, May 15th, 1890. This name was changed in December, 1891, to Montclair Athletic Club. The first officers of the club were George Inness, Jr., President; E. G. Burgess, Vice-President; Bayard Whitehorne, Secretary, and Louis Bangert, Treasurer. Others interested in the management of the club in its earliest days were F. W. Gwinn, R. L. Keen, H. B. Keen, James D. Freeman, Horace Stone, C. R. Truex, William Elder Marcus and W. J. Pinckney.

Up to 1904 the membership of the club never rose above three hundred, and was at times considerably below this figure. Its main interests in its earlier years were baseball, track athletics and tobogganing on a wooden slide. Accessions to the membership followed each forward move and especially with the growth in popularity of lawn tennis. In 1904, two squash courts were built; in 1905, four bowling alleys; in 1909, when the membership was about four hundred and fifty, a large wing was added on the south side of the club house, containing a swimming pool and new club rooms. The membership then increased two hundred and fifty in a year.

The membership now comprises one hundred life members, and over nine hundred active members, besides a number of non-residents. Privileges to the women of members' families and minor sons are given without charge. The limit of membership is one hundred for life members, and one thousand for active members.

As already indicated, the Club has a swimming pool, fifty by twenty feet, with a capacity of forty thousand gallons and filled with crystal-clear well water. Adjoining the pool on the north is a locker room for active members and on the south side a complete locker room and showers for ladies. Over these rooms on the second floor are two large club rooms and an entrance hall. The newer of the club rooms is a handsome room, sixty feet by thirty, and contains four billiard and pocket billiard tables. In the third floor are committee rooms, a lounging room for ladies, and employees' rooms. To the north of the main house is an extension containing four squash courts, four bowling alleys, and an exercising room. This part of the building contains two locker rooms, one for home teams and one for visiting teams, use of high school teams, which have used the Club grounds for years. Handball is played in the squash courts.

The grounds were substantially enlarged last summer by an addition, five hundred by one hundred and eighty feet on the north, a purchase made possible by the sale of fifty life memberships last winter, and which represents one of the longest forward steps in the club's history. On this addition were built four tennis courts, making a total of eighteen courts.

Beside this is laid in the new field a baseball diamond for junior members. While the principal use of the main field is for baseball in summer, it is used in the winter for football, soccer football by the club team and American football by High School team. Nine of the tennis courts are flooded in winter for skating. The sports of the club, therefore, include baseball, football, tennis, skating, bowling, squash, gymnasium work, handball, billiards and swimming.

In the absence of a field for the High School, the Club has always given its facilities to high school teams, for practice and contests, in swimming, football, etc., and track athletics. One of the new locker rooms added to the north wing was designed especially for high school teams and the club throughout has been prompted by a spirit of co-operation with the education authorities.

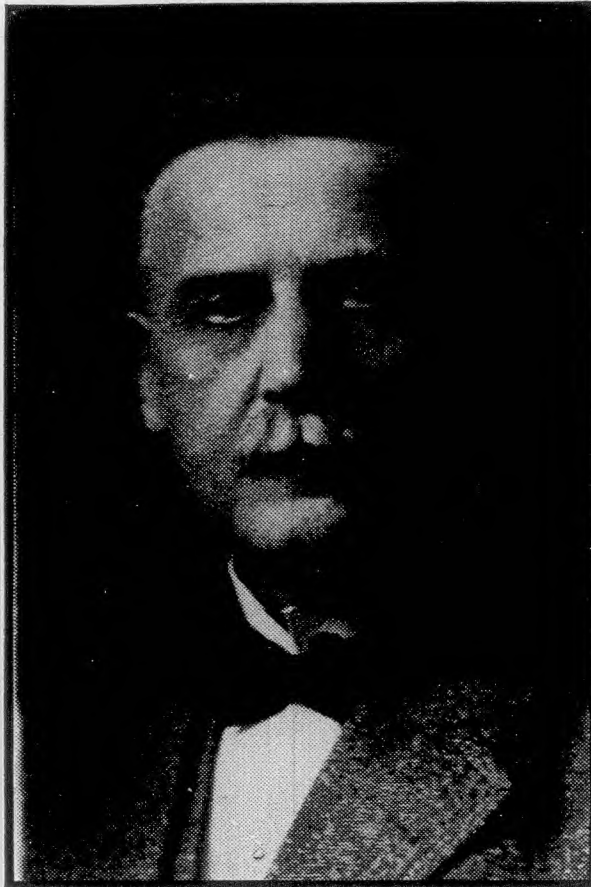

MONTCLAIR CIVIC ASSOCIATION

Montclair Club Hall

The Montclair Civic Association has accomplished much for Montclair by resisting and preventing that which would have been objectionable and also by creating and maintaining a civic pride among the townspeople to zealously guard the good name of the town and induce all proper care and improvement of its streets, trees, parks, sewers, sidewalks, water supply and railroad facilities.

It has done a splendid work in a quiet way in relieving the dumb beast from cruel treatment and children from improper surroundings. It has done unusual work among the penal institutions, gathering much information which is of great value in the study of psychological conditions. It has looked after the sanitary condition of the town under the direction of one of the ablest engineers in the country.

The safeguarding of the interests of the public schools has been one of its prime objects. It stands for clean politics without regard to party and for a fair and equitable consideration of the liquor question. The association has stood by the Board of Health in all its efforts to protect the community from disease and encouraged betterment of housing conditions among the poor.

It recognizes the people of all classes and from all parts of the town as citizens, all of whom can contribute to the welfare of the community. It recognizes the spirit of patriotism and provided for the proper celebration of the Fourth of July until the local Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution took over that important function. One of its most important services was, perhaps, the foundation work in preparing for the double-tracking of the Lackawanna railroad from Bloomfield to Montclair and improved terminal conditions in Montclair.

The Association appointed the Charter Revision Commission, as authorized by the citizens of Montclair, at a Public Dinner held in March, 1908; and this Commission made its report to the citizens of Montclair at a public meeting, held under the auspices of the Civic Association, in March, of 1910. A bill, providing for the future form of government in Montclair, was drafted by this Commission, and submitted to the people at a public meeting. It was endorsed by the citizens, and presented to the Legislature then in session. The bill passed the Senate without a dissenting vote, but was introduced in the House of Representatives too late for action by that body.

The Municipal Art Commission was also appointed by the Civic Association under the authority conferred upon it by the citizens at the public meeting in March, 1908. This commission made its report to the citizens of Montclair in the form of a printed and illustrated book, prepared, published and distributed at its own expense. It also drafted, and introduced at the Legislature of 1910, the bill which made it possible for the town to appoint an official commission to carry out the wishes of the citizens in regard to the report.

As the first fruits of this movement William T. Evans presented to Montclair a collection of more than fifty representative paintings, by American artists. These paintings now hang in the Montclair Art Museum, where they are on exhibition.

The Montclair Civic Association was incorporated May 12, 1906, assuming at that time the charter of the Town Improvement Association with whose membership it united, thus continuing the organization of the older association. The Town Improvement Association was incorporated July 19, 1894, and consisted entirely of public-spirited women who carried on the work of the Association very successfully for twelve years. Thus, in a certain sense, the Civic Association dates back to the Town Improvement Association in 1894, and is, therefore, over twenty years old at this time.

The Civic Association grew out of the "Get-together Dinner" which was held under the auspices of the Altruist Society in the winter of 1905-6. As a result of this dinner a renewed general interest was manifested in local municipal affairs, and a Committee of Twenty was appointed by the Rev. A. H. Bradford, D.D., Chairman of the Dinner, in conformity with a resolution adopted at that meeting.

This committee met and organized by electing Decatur M. Sawyer, Chairman, and appointed various sub-committees which carried on a useful work for several months. The general committee met once a month and held occasional special meetings as well.

MONTCLAIR ANNUAL, 1916

The work of the Town Improvement Association being along lines similar to those followed by the Committee of Twenty, it appeared expedient to unite the two bodies, and this was successfully effected at the annual meeting of the Town Improvement Association held April 20, 1906. The combined organization took the name of The Montclair Civic Association and elected a new Board of Directors.

On April 28 of the same year, the first meeting of the Board of Directors of the Civic Association was held; and on May 8, the organization was perfected.

A Montclair Dinner under the auspices of the Civic Association was held in March, 1908, at which time reports were made of the work of the different charitable and public organizations of the Town. At this dinner the appointment of two commissions was authorized, one to consider the future form of government for Montclair and the other to be a Municipal Art Commission. These two commissions were duly appointed by the Board of Directors of the Civic Association and announced at a meeting held April 12, 1908, at the Montclair Club Hall. Since that time committees have been appointed from time to time which have successfully conducted important negotiations on various public questions and have rendered notable service to the town.

Since the dinner given in honor of Rev. Henry E. Jackson, on his retirement from the presidency of the organization there has been renewed activity among the members. During Mr. Jackson's administration much time and effort were given to school matters. He worked zealously to harmonize the Town Council and Board of Education who differed greatly regarding vital questions.

James H. Kennedy who succeeded Mr. Jackson, has revitalized the committee work and instilled new vigor in the sub-executives. Some of the things attained in his administration are:

Concrete proposal for improvement of Town Government.

Revision of snow-removal ordinance.

Establishment of safety zones along trolley lines.

Appointment of special committee to present Town Government recommendations to Town Council—including suggestion for re-organization of Town Council itself.

Study by special committee of Commission Government and City Manager Plan along lines suggested by public opinion.

Constructive consideration of educational problems.

Formation of committee to study water problem.

Formation of committee to study playground and recreation center needs.

Steady, consistent work toward better trolley service.

The Humane committee of the association, of which Mrs. James A. Ryan is chairman, prevailed upon the Town Council, with the assistance of public sentiment, to create the office of animal warden and appoint a warden. It is expected to bring about the appointment of the warden, William B. Williams, to be an agent of the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals.

MONTCLAIR CLUB

22 Church Street

One of the social centers of the town, the Montclair Club, is a strictly temperance organization. It is visible and unmistakable evidence that a large club can be successfully conducted along temperance lines.

Through the ceaseless efforts of its officers and the co-operation of its membership it has become the centre of social activity of the neighborhood. Enlarging its scope as opportunity presented, it has developed gradually a system of entertainment in which every member of the family can find wholesome enjoyment. The substantial appreciation of this has been shown in a constantly increasing membership which at the present time is nearly 600. But notwithstanding the excellence of past endeavors, the club proposes, beginning with the present season, to enlarge its scope and bring a class of entertainment to Montclair that hitherto has been enjoyed only in the cosmopolitan centres at great expense.

This is possible through influential friends by virtue of its recognized standing in the community. It might be interesting to note the gradual growth of the club up to the present time.

Organized in 1882, it purchased the Dr. Love property in Church street, and soon realized the necessity for larger accommodations. Accordingly the present club house was erected in 1886, the old club house being moved to Valley Road near Bloomfield Avenue, where it now stands.

The organization prospered until, due to the opposition from no-license advocates, a license to sell liquors having been secured, the club had to close in 1899 because of lack of support. Public sentiment later crystallized and a new corporation was formed with the financial support of a few substantial citizens to conduct a "no liquor" club. Then it became a permanent and successful factor in the social life of the community.

It has had its "ups and downs" as to membership, but is now in the "heyday" of its prosperity, and looks forward to great achievements. It is closely allied in a general way with all movements that have for their object the social and moral uplift of the community.

The club invites all good citizens to co-operate by becoming members and enjoying its manifold advantages.

THE MONTCLAIR DAY NURSERY

Grove Street and Glenridge Avenue

The Montclair Day Nursery was founded in March, 1905, by a number of earnest women, working under the leadership of Mrs. William J. Dykes. Its first home was at 117 Bloomfield avenue and during the first year 2,090 children were cared for.

The work having outgrown these quarters, a house in Hartley street was purchased which in turn became too small for the steadily increasing number of children who came each day to the nursery.

Through the kindness of friends, the managers bought in 1910, the present home at Grove street and Glenridge avenue, where a comfortable house and ample grounds make an ideal place for the little ones.

The work increased until the number of children cared for last year numbered 6,928.

Besides the daily care of children whose parents are at work, dinner and supper are provided for school children.

MONTCLAIR DRAMATIC CLUB

Montclair Club Hall

On April 17, 1889 a meeting was held at the home of W. L. Guillaudeu to organize this club. The idea grew out of the presentation of two farces on the stage of the old Montclair Hall. The entertainment was given for the benefit of the Children's Home and was managed by Mrs. Guillaudeu. Because their casts formed the nucleus of the Montclair Dramatic Club, the names of participants and the parts they played are of especial interest. They were as follows:

At the first meeting were present, W. W. Guillaudeu, C. D. DuBois, R. M. Boyd, Jr., Starr J. Murphy, A. D. Noyes, A. T. Reichelt, Mrs. W. L. Guillaudeu, Mrs. C. D. DuBois, Mrs. C. E. Van Vleck, Miss Mary M. Clark, Miss Lily Clarke, Miss Charlotte T. Weeks and Mrs. S. J. Murphy. The club was formed with the membership of those in attendance, to whom were added by vote, William A. Pratt, Miss Minnie Benedict, Miss Lucy R. Bouden, Miss Marion H. Cunningham, Miss Horatia B. Cunningham, Mrs. D. D. Duncan and Miss Bessie K. Francis.

Under the chairmanship of W. L. Guillaudeu, the organization of the club was effected by the preliminary choice of a board of nine directors. The choice for the club's first official board was then made as follows: R. M. Boyd, Jr., C. D. DuBois, W. L. Guillaudeu, S. J. Murphy, A. D. Noyes, A. T. Reichelt, Mrs. C. D. DuBois, Mrs. D. D. Duncan and Mrs. W. L. Guillaudeu.

In a meeting held May 10, 1889, the immediate management of the club's season was placed in the hands of a play committee, originally consisting of three members and the president, ex-officio. The first of these committees, which was responsible for the initial appearance of the club before the public, consisted of W. L. Guillaudeu, Starr J. Murphy, A. T. Reichelt and Mrs. W. L. Guillaudeu. Mr. Guillaudeu was first president of the club.

By a fortunate coincidence the Montclair Dramatic Club was organized simultaneously with the completion of the new house of the Montclair Club. It was thought by both clubs to be appropriate that the distinction of opening the hall of the new clubhouse should be granted to the new dramatic club. This was accordingly done on November 11, 1889, when W. S. Gilbert's comedy, "Randall's Thumb" was performed before a large and appreciative audience. The piece was elaborately presented, as befitted the occasion. Goatcher & Young, one of the best-known firms of scene painters in New York City, prepared a series of garden exteriors, rock effects and sea-side views. Lander's orchestra furnished the music.

This initial play, like the second of the club's series, was prepared and presented under the management of Mrs. Guillaudeu. It was not, in fact, until the ninth subscription performance of the Dramatic Club, on December 9, 1893, that professional coaches were employed to prepare the cast for the performance. Prior to that date Mrs. Guillaudeu, Miss Josephine F. Rand, Mrs. Lawrence C. Earle, Mrs. William Pinkham, Robert M. Boyd, Jr., and Miss Stella M. Bogue, successively directed the production of the plays. The initial director was Fred Williams, of New York, who served the club for several years. Since then the club has had such directors as George F. Christie, Walter O. Wilkinson, Max Figman, Robert O. Jenkins, Walker M. Dennett, Alfred Young, Fred C. Patterson, Deane Pratt, Frank Lee Short, Jr., and Will Hutchins.

In return for the courtesy of the use of the Club Hall on its opening night, the Dramatic Club on December 27, 1889, tendered a benefit performance to the Montclair Club, in which "The Matchmaker," a comedy in three acts, by Charles Smith Cheltnam, and "Slasher and Crasher," a one-act farce, by J. Madison Morton, were presented. These performances netted more than \$200 for the Montclair Club and are the only extra plays that have ever been given by the Dramatic Club. During the next season, on December 6, 1890, "A Scrap of Paper" was repeated for the benefit of the Children's Home, and on May 26, 1898, a repetition of "The Mikado" was given to defray the expenses of the subscription performance. However, it was the feeling of the club's directors from the first that permitting the general public to obtain single tickets to a play for which subscribers of the club had been required to purchase four tickets was not fair to the subscribers. In the end official action was taken against such repetition.

The associate membership was for many years limited to 125, with eight dollars annual subscription, for which each member received four tickets to each performance. This made 500 tickets and, as very few were unused and a certain number were given to the members of the cast in each play, it resulted in overcrowding the Montclair Club Hall. The first authorities became a little uneasy over the matter, so that it was thought advisable to cut down the associate membership. Therefore, at the annual meeting held in 1907, a resolution was passed providing that the associate membership was to be allowed to drop, from resignation or other cause, to 115, and the subscription raised to ten dollars. This slightly increased the club's revenue and overcame the objectionable condition.

The by-laws provide that if the dues for associate members are not paid by October 1, the membership may be declared void by the treasurer and the vacancy filled. The managers of the club have felt that the unbroken success and good credit of the club have resulted largely from this arrangement, which places the club always in funds for the approaching season and gives the Committees confidence in making their plans. As far as is known, the club has never had a deficit at the end of any year, and as for many years there has always been a waiting list for its associate membership, this fact has acted as an incentive to prompt payment of dues. Many of the present associate members have continued their membership in the club continuously since its organization.

In 1900 practically the entire executive work of the club was in the hands of the Plays Committee, this being the only officially recognized committee in existence. It not only selected the plays and cast them, but was responsible for the setting, the management of the club hall, the selection of ushers, the preparation of programs and many other details. This not only gave the committee an enormous amount of work, but so centralized the authority as to make the balance of the directors little more than mere figure-heads. Recognizing this fact, other committees were gradually established, although the action was not expressly sanctioned by the by-laws, until in 1905 the standing committees consisted of the plays, properties, floor and membership, performing the duties indicated by their names. With changing conditions the original by-laws, carried along without alteration until 1913, were found to be inadequate. Therefore with the election of new officers and directors at the annual meeting of the active members in 1912, a committee was appointed to draft a new set of by-laws which were adopted in February, 1913.

Since its organization the club has given two plays each year. Thus at the conclusion of the season of 1913-1914, which marked the end of its first quarter of a century, the club had presented fifty different plays. The selection of plays suitable to a Montclair audience has not been easy and has been rendered more difficult by the limitations of the stage in Montclair Club Hall, where the performances have always been given. The time may come when greater stage

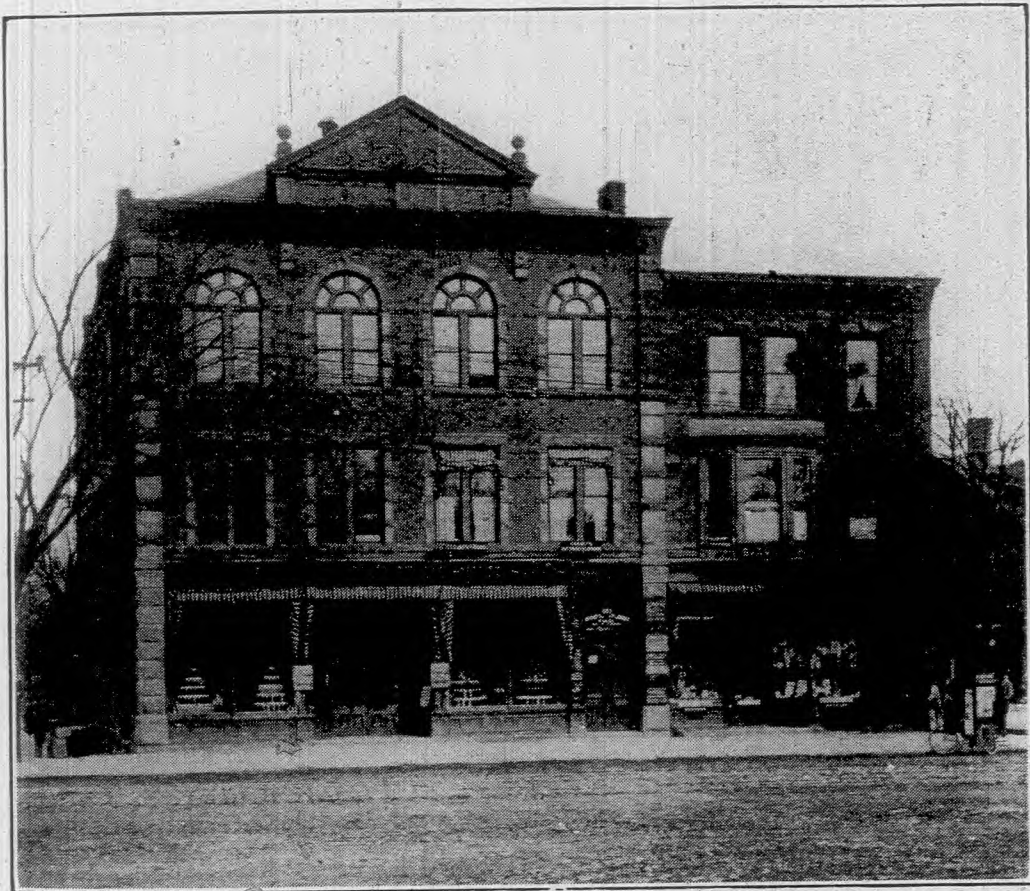

The Montclair Women's Club, Inc., was organized April 15, 1915, as the outcome of a mass meeting called by Mrs. William Durbrow, Chairman of Organization of the Montclair Federation of Women's Organizations, in response to numerous requests for such an organization. Several meetings were held to perfect the formation of the Club, at all of which Mrs. Robert Lynn Cox presided until the adoption of the Constitution and By-Laws. The election of officers was held April 30, 1915. Articles of incorporation were applied for by Robert L. Cox and the charter granted May 7, 1915.

The Club was admitted to the New Jersey State Federation of Women's Clubs and January 27th 1916, joined the Montclair Federation of Women's Organizations. It has five Departments, Reform and Social Services, Science and Economics, Literature and Fine Arts, Education and Junior. It is co-operating with other organizations in all civic movements, having speakers from state societies; and takes an interest in the study of town, county and state government, the history of New Jersey, housing problem, and in all branches of our local government. At Christmas the Club undertook the Community work in the Maple Avenue and Baldwin Street schools and sent donations of groceries and other things to the Children's Home. Miss Minnie Lucy, of The Day Nursery and the Altruist Society, with a membership of 375 is looking forward to a year of steady progress and service in the community.

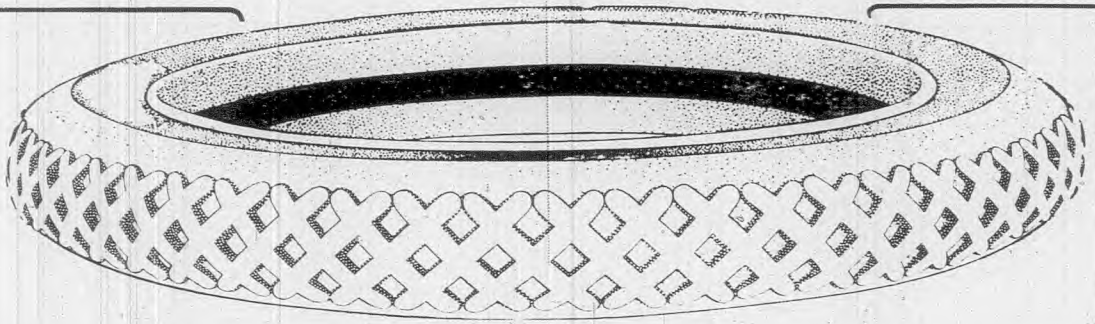

The Board of Directors is formed of the above officers, chairmen of committees with one representative from each member-organization of the Federation who is not an officer or chairman in the Federation.

The Board transacts all business between meetings of the Federation. The Annual Meeting of the Federation is held in Montclair in April. All other meetings are called by the Board.

Each Committee works under its chairman, reporting the work accomplished at the Board Meetings.

Any woman's organization of Montclair and vicinity in sympathy with the aims and objects of the Federation and ready to co-operate in its work may become a member upon the approval by the Board of Directors of its application.

The objects of the Federation are the improvement of the social, civic and moral conditions of the community for which purposes departments may be organized by the Board of Directors.

The People's Concerts in the Hillside Grammar School, the Home Department in the Baldwin Street School of which Miss Minnie Lucy has charge and many improvements in Montclair are largely due to the efforts and activities of the Federation.

MONTCLAIR ART ASSOCIATION

Art Museum

Bloomfield and Mountain Avenues

In the year 1909, William T. Evans, President of the Municipal Art Commission of New York, and a citizen deeply interested in the development of Montclair, wrote a letter to the Commission, offering to present to the town a collection of paintings by American artists of established reputation.

This was to serve as a nucleus for a Montclair Art Gallery, provided arrangements could be made for suitably housing the collection.

This generous offer was followed by another from Mrs. Henry Lang, of \$50,000, toward the erection of an Art Gallery and Museum.

The gifts, and the interest and desire of public-spirited citizens to promote the appreciation of art in the community, led to the organization, Dec. 8, 1910, of the Montclair Art Association, with Mr. William T. Evans, as first President, and with an enrollment of several hundred members, and to the building of the Montclair Art Museum. Through benefactions of some of the members, the Association acquired the land for the Museum on the south side of Bloomfield avenue, between South Mountain avenue and St. Luke's place.

The formal opening of the Museum took place on January 18, 1910.

Installed in the Museum are the permanent collections, art objects comprising a large number of paintings, presented by Mr. Evans, works of sculpture in marble and bronze, and a large collection of curios and handiwork, illustrating the artistic development of the American Indian.

To these will be added from time to time, other works of art, selected to harmonize with the excellence of present possessions.

One work of the Association is to give special loan exhibitions each month, and to cover so far as possible the whole field of the fine arts. A Summer Exhibit of craft work of the Public Schools has also been shown, and co-operation invited.

The Museum is open to the public every day, without charge, the week-day hours being from 10 to 12 o'clock and 2 to 5 o'clock (4:30 in winter) and on Sundays, 2 to 5 o'clock (4:30 in winter).

The only income of the Corporation is provided by the dues paid by the Sustaining Members. There are six classes of membership.

MONTCLAIR HEIGHTS COMMUNITY CLUB

Parish House, Montclair Heights

Dutch Reformed Church, Mt. Hebron and Valley Roads

Aimed to work for the civic and social welfare of the northern end of Upper Montclair, and the community generally, the Montclair Heights Community Club was formed May 23, 1913. Since then much has been done to improve the section and the services it depends on. A list is issued by the club of changes secured through the civic club:

CONCRETE SIDEWALK: East Side of Valley Road, from County Line North.

ELECTRIC LIGHTS AND SHADE TREES: On Normal Avenue.

PARK IMPROVEMENT: Newark City Water Dept. placed a 48-inch drain pipe underground to carry brook running through their right-of-way; graded plot, planted shrubbery and made a crushed stone driveway at an outlay of several thousand dollars.

VALLEY ROAD CAR LINE: Better service, more cars, cleaner cars, six minute headway during rush hours, evenings and afternoons, road bed repaired and publication of time table secured.

SUNSET PARKS Sidewalk laid around entire park.

ERIE RAILROAD: Stopped unloading of fertilizer cars in Montclair, secured additional express train prior to 8 a. m.; lessened weighing of a number of cars at Heights; installed telephone service at Heights Station.

CROSS-WALKS: Valley Road and Mt. Hebron Road; Valley Road and Macopin Avenue; Valley Road and Alexander Avenue; Valley and Elston Roads; Valley Road and Laurel Place.

In addition to the foregoing, a number of minor improvements have been secured—repairs to streets, oil on streets, two gas lamp-posts set back to line, weeds cut along sidewalks, Valley Road car to meet car of Bloomfield Avenue line.

The chief result of the club's efforts has been its success in arousing a vital interest in civic matters. The coming year's plans embrace a still wider field of action, co-operation with the Town Council being one of the definite lines of work deserving the community's cordial support.

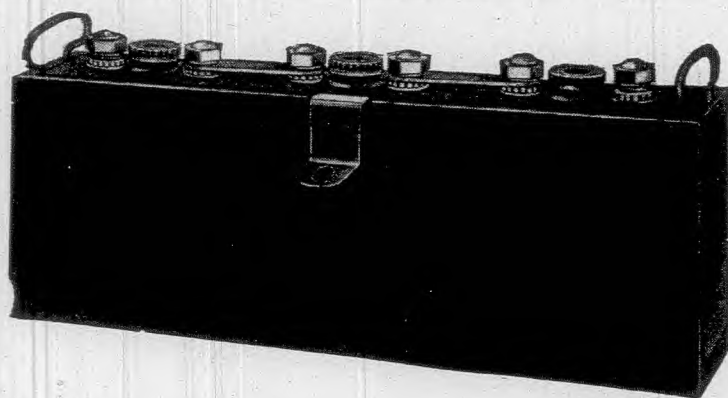

NO-LICENSE LEAGUE OF MONTCLAIR

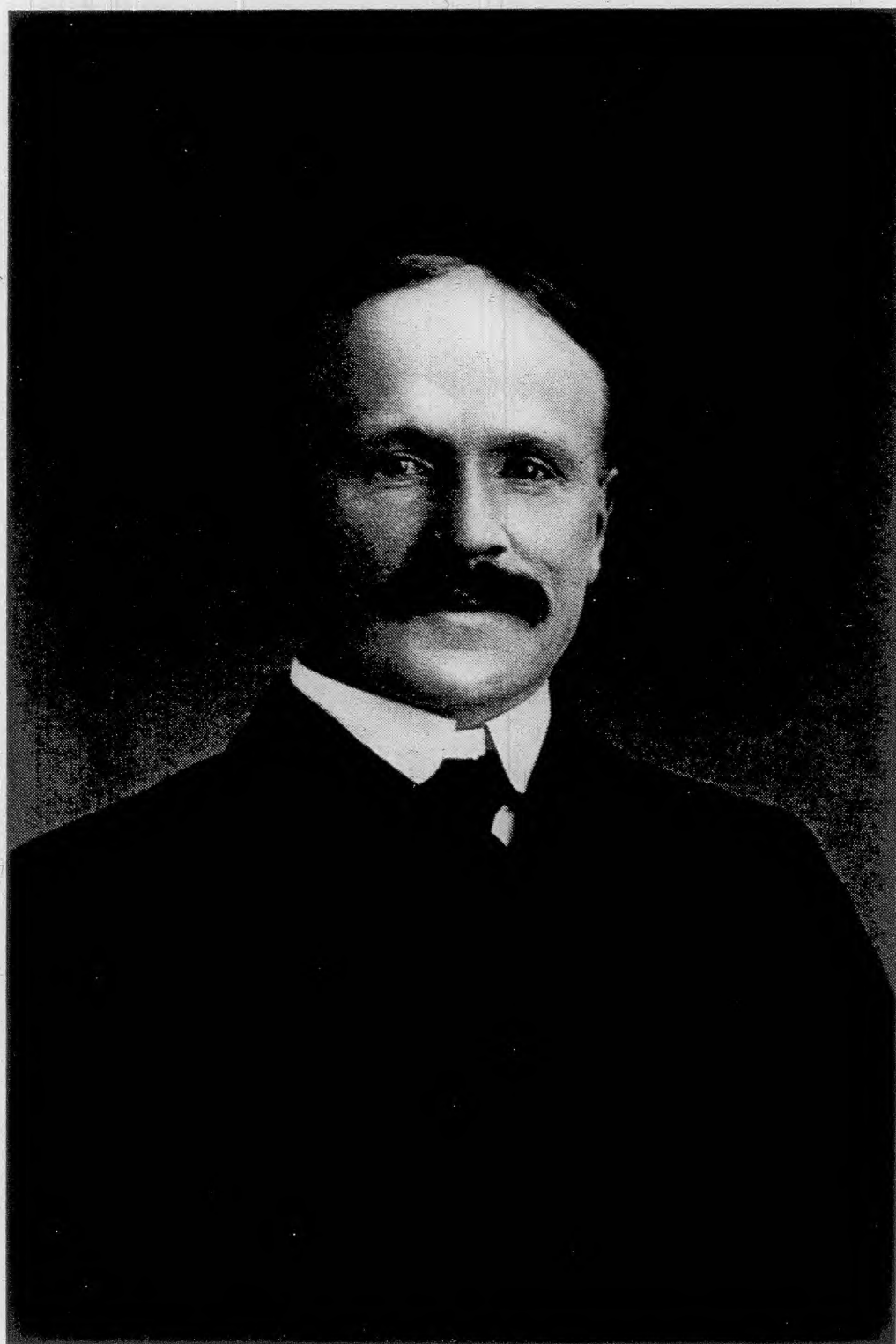
Madison Building

The No-License League of Montclair was organized shortly after the proposal to make Montclair a "dry" town was defeated, on November 2, 1915, by a majority of 169 votes, by the leaders of the Committee of 100 on Excise. Its purpose is to keep fighting for no license for saloons in Montclair. Harvey MacCauley is the executive secretary and has an office in the Madison Building where meets are held frequently to plan the work.

One of the aims of the organization is to enroll as many as possible of the men who voted on the side of no license, in the referendum conducted on Election Day, 1916, by the Committee of 100 on Excise.

The outbreak of the Great War in Europe in the summer of 1914, awakened the world from a stupor. Until that time many great men had taught that the last great war had been fought; that treaties, understandings, arbitration would settle all the great disputes between civilized nations.

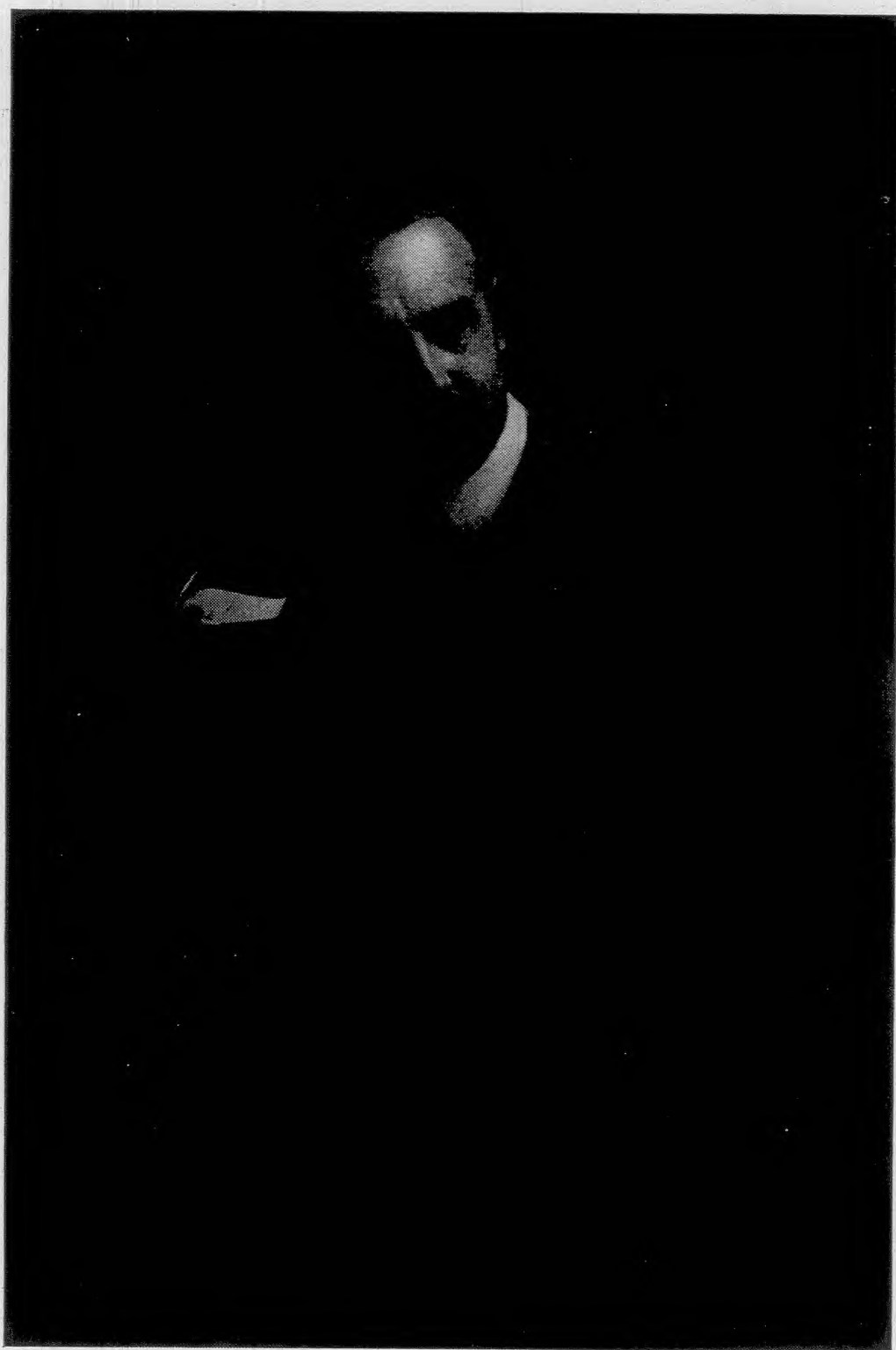

OUTLOOK CLUB

The object of the Outlook Club is to hear the discussion of things of current and vital interest by prominent thinkers in various fields, and especially to enlarge the views of its members by the wholesome process of hearing "the other side."

Like many other good things in Montclair life, it was suggested by Rev. Dr. Amory Howe Bradford, then pastor of the First Congregational Church. During several winters, from December, 1883, to the spring of 1887 there had been held in Montclair a fortnightly gathering of those interested in hearing papers on famous authors, and readings from their works. The writers and readers were drawn from the town at large and a general interest made the unpretentious evenings signally successful.

When, in 1887, the Montclair (Social) Club was organized, the efforts of many active workers centered in that, and the literary evenings were dropped. But when, in 1889, the new clubhouse was completed, Dr. Bradford thought the time propitious to begin again, and on a rather broader platform, the regular assembling of people together for purposes of general culture.

A meeting was called by a printed note of invitation, signed by Rev. Dr. Bradford, Rev. Dr. Wm. F. Junkin of the First Presbyterian Church, Rev. F. B. Carter, of St. Luke's Episcopal Church, and others; and on a raw, sleety, stormy evening, December 3, 1889, about seventy-five men and women came together, agreed to organize, and appointed committees—to prepare a brief Constitution, to nominate Officers and Executive Committee, and to plan a December public meeting.

The first public meeting was held in Montclair Hall December 30, with an audience of something over 150. John R. Howard was made chairman; Paul Wilcox, chairman of the committee on constitution, presented the draft prepared, which was adopted; an executive committee and officers were elected; the limit of the membership was fixed at 200; the literary topic for the evening was presented by the speakers,—and the Outlook Club was launched.

At first, the plan of the Nineteenth Century Club of New York was followed, members of the club discussing an address or paper presented by an invited speaker; but this soon lapsed into addresses, or more often discussions, by prominent outsiders. While, at times, members of the club for special reasons were appointed as the speakers, in general, the list of topics and those discussing them, shows an interesting number of notables (to quote the Constitution), "in literature, philosophy, politics, science, art, industry and religion."

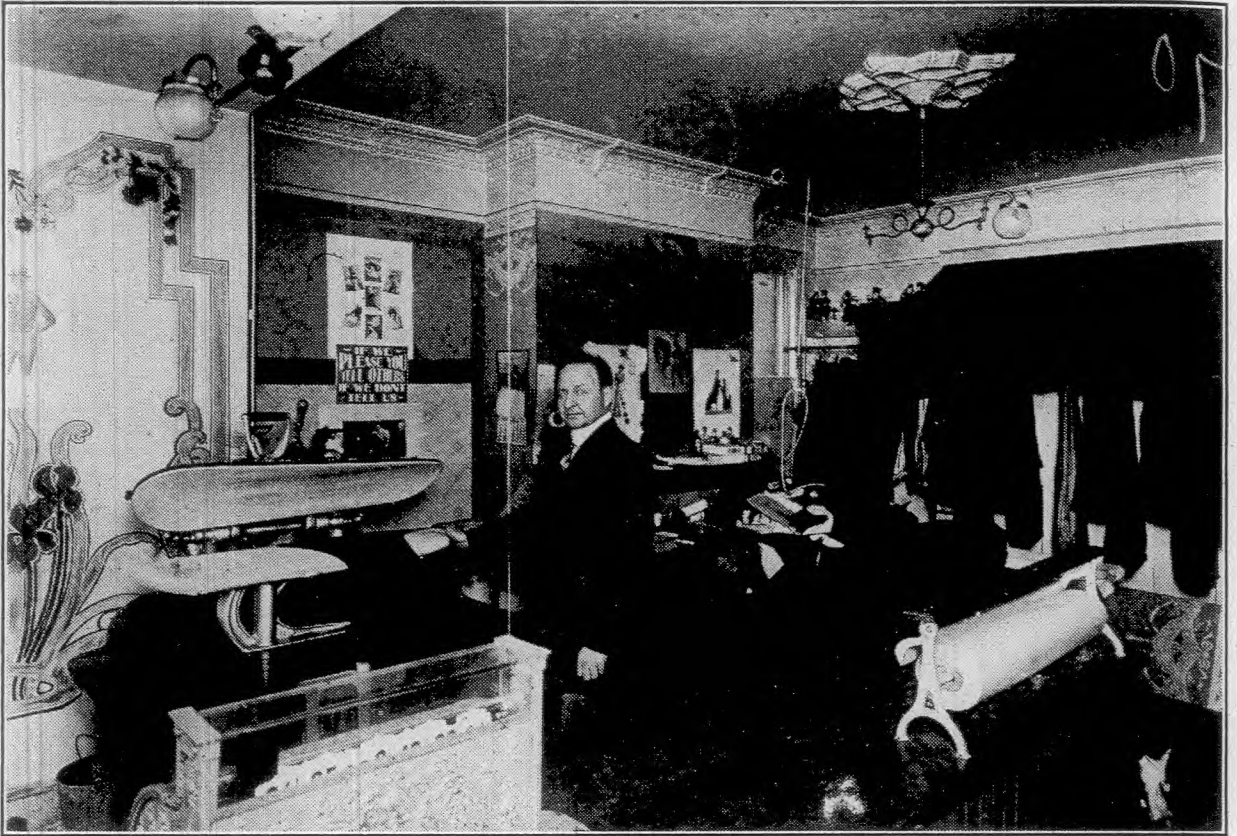
From the outset, the meetings were crowded, and full of interest. It became necessary to enlarge the membership to 250, then to 275, and finally to 300. This was then the largest possible limit, for the members received each two tickets to every public meeting, and the Montclair Club Hall, in which for twenty-four years all meetings after the first were held, seated but 500. There were rarely less than 400 present, and generally the hall was full.

In the autumn of 1913, the completion of the new Hillside Grammar School, with its fine auditorium seating 840, made it possible to hold Outlook Club meetings there, and the continuing interest induced the enlargement of the membership to 400, which was done at the meeting of February, 1915.

Montclair is a New Jersey suburb of New York, 50 minutes distant from the city, by the Lackawanna Railroad; ferries at the foot of Barclay, Christopher and Twenty-third streets, or Hudson tunnels to Hoboken; the club's membership, being composed chiefly of New York professional and business men and their families. Meetings occur on the fourth Friday evening of each month, from October to May. With observance of all the courtesies of the debate, varied and opposing views have been effectually presented with entire freedom; and the educational value of this is so highly appreciated, not only by the members, but by the community, that there has usually been a considerable "waiting list" of applicants for membership.

Since the founding of the Outlook Club the population of Montclair has grown from about 10,000 to more than 25,000; and the best evidence of the club's work is that, despite the activity of the great variety of special organizations for diverse purposes, the 25th year of "the Outlook" has shown an increase rather than a diminishing interest on the part of the Montclair public.

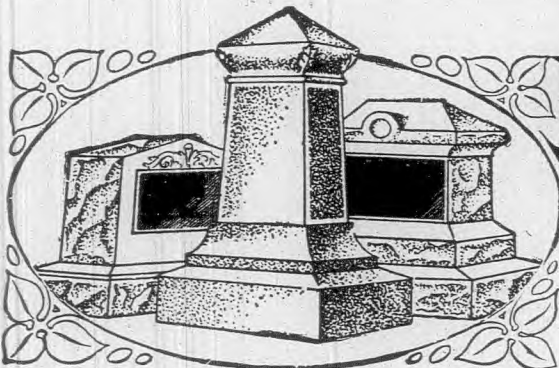

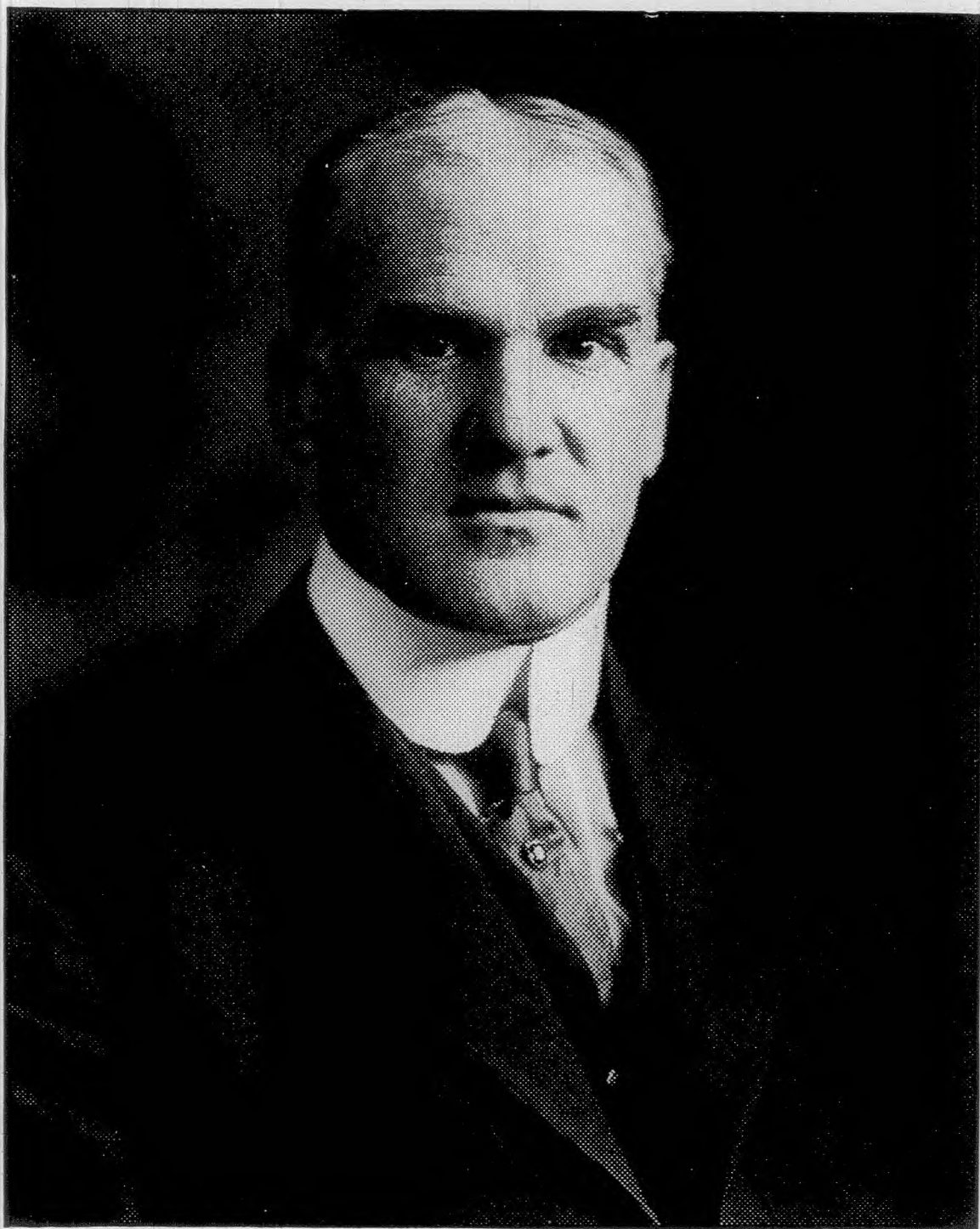

ST. VINCENT'S NURSERY AND BABIES' HOSPITAL

Elm Steet near Washington Street

(Under direction of Sisters of Charity, but Non-Sectarian)

"Saint Vincent's Nursery and Babies Hospital" owes its existence to the benevolence of Mother Mary Xavier, Superioress of the Sisters of Charity in the Diocese of Newark, who, recognizing the need of a shelter in which sick, abandoned and orphaned infants might receive the care suited to their tender age, purchased, in the spring of 1899, the old church property of the Immaculate Conception Parish, Montclair. Three members of the sisterhood were appointed to labor on the new foundation, and on the feast of the Guardian Angels of the same year the first infant was admitted. The little one received the name of Angela in baptism, and ere many weeks she had several companions in the Nursery.

The first babies' ward was located in the brick building on Elm Street, which had been erected for residential purposes. Before the large frame structure, formerly the parish church, was remodeled and ready for occupancy, there were babies in every available space in the improvised hospital.

It was a joyous day for the household when the Nursery proper was in readiness for the family of over thirty infants, who were transferred to their commodious quarters, and from that period until the present time, Saint Vincent's has continued the labor for which it had been founded.

From its foundation in August, 1899, to the close of 1914, 1,330 infants have been cared for in Saint Vincent's. Many of this number have grown up and have been received into childless homes which they now bless with the sunshine of their endearing presence and the warmth of filial affection with which their tender hearts overflow. Others, half orphans, on reaching their second year, have been taken by father or mother. The totally abandoned on reaching the transfer period, have been placed in diocesan institutions suited to their years, while not a few of the young charges have reached the "Home" to which we all aspire, where, we trust, they plead with the "Father of the Poor" for those who have befriended them and for the institution in which they were made children of God.

Our honored Bishop has taken upon himself the task of soliciting contributions from the Church Committees in his jurisdiction, and already a considerable sum has been subscribed for the much-needed new building which we hope at no distant day to have erected on the plot of ground held in reserve for that purpose.

To this goal the Sisters, whose lives are spent in caring for the babies, look forward to a spacious and well equipped nursery, and babies' hospital, from whose doors no deserving applicant may be turned away because of the present too-often repeated lament: lack of room.

The departed pastors in whose parish St. Vincent's is located always took an active interest in the well-being of the institution. The present incumbent, Rev. Joseph J. Gately, is no less interested in its welfare; the spiritual needs are kindly attended to by him and his assistants, and his counsel cheerfully given.

As the institution is not self-supporting, various means have been resorted to, to increase the income sufficiently to meet the outlay.

One of the deeds, which it is hoped, will become a permanent and continuous source of revenue, has been the foundation of a "Union of Masses, Prayers and Good Works for the Benefit of St. Vincent's Nursery and Babies' Hospital."

TEACHERS' CLUB OF MONTCLAIR

The Teachers' Club of Montclair was incorporated under the laws of the State of New Jersey in June, 1911, and has been successful since inception. The idea of forming such a club in Montclair originated with Miss Mary K. Waring of the Kimberley School and as a member of the schools committee of the Montclair Civic Association she, with Mrs. William H. Vernon and Charles Whiting Baker, gave the club its start.

The object of the club is two-fold: To bring the teachers together for social and intellectual intercourse and to develop closer relationship between the people of the town and the teaching profession.

Teachers of public, normal and private schools in Montclair and Upper Montclair, and teachers of music or other educational branches form the membership. Friends of the club are included, as associate or honorary members.

The home of the club is the old Habberton House at 19 Valley road. Artistic furnishings, open fireplaces and other features make this dwelling a centre for the teachers of Montclair. The organization has become a recognized factor in the life of the community.

The first president of the Teachers' Club was Miss Louise K. Greene of the Hillside School, who after two years was succeeded by Herbert W. Dutch, principal of the Montclair High School. Miss Helen Murphy of Hillside School is now president.

UPPER MONTCLAIR COUNTRY CLUB

The Upper Montclair Country Club was organized about seventeen years ago by a few golf enthusiasts in Upper Montclair, N. J., and has grown from a very primitive three-hole course to a first-class eighteen-hole course, covering about six thousand yards. The club has 300 resident and non-resident members, among whom are many prominent New Yorkers, and in addition there are many associate and junior members.

The first land used by the club was land upon which the taxes were paid in lieu of rent, but about five or six years ago the enterprising membership became dissatisfied with this make-shift proposition, and organized a new scheme whereby 90 acres of land were purchased by the club itself, and a handsome \$25,000 fire-proof clubhouse was erected.

To finance this scheme, \$70,000 worth of bonds were issued and sold, and the club occupies the somewhat unique position of owning its own club house and course. Also the club enjoys the distinction of being represented by Jerome D. Travers, the noted amateur golfer. Mr. Travers has won the amateur championship of the United States four times, twice for the Upper Montclair Country Club, and as a result of his golf prowess, the club now holds the open championship of the United States. On the club house wall, too, is the first METROPOLITAN CHAMPION TROPHY which was retired from competition by Mr. Travers and became the property of the club.
