

A member of the Internal Revenue Service Department's gestapo visited major merchants in the business areas of the home towns where the agents reside with their families. Exhibiting his credentials to a shoe merchant the U.S. Treasury's gum shoer begins the inquisition. "Have you sold any shoes to any Internal Revenue Agent or member of his family? How many pairs end-when? What did they cost? Thank you very much and please keep this confidential. Don't disclose anything about this visit."

Down the street parades the proud member of the U. S. Treasury Department's gestapo. His next stop is a ladies wear store. The same routine is followed: "I am from the U. S. Treasury Department. Here are my credentials. Do any Internal Revenue Agents or members of their families make any purchases from you? Oh, Mr. John Doe's wife does? What does she buy? How much does she spend? How often does she come in to make purchases? Thank you very much. Your cooperation is very much appreciated. Please don't tell Mr. or Mrs. Doe that I was inquiring about them. This is a confidential investigation."






