A good night for the incumbents MacDonald joins council members in election win

Belleville held its council election Tuesday night and the voters sent a strong message that change was not what they wanted this time.

All three incumbents that ran this year won decisively in their wards while P.J. MacDonald, who received strong support from the incumbents throughout, claimed the open seat.

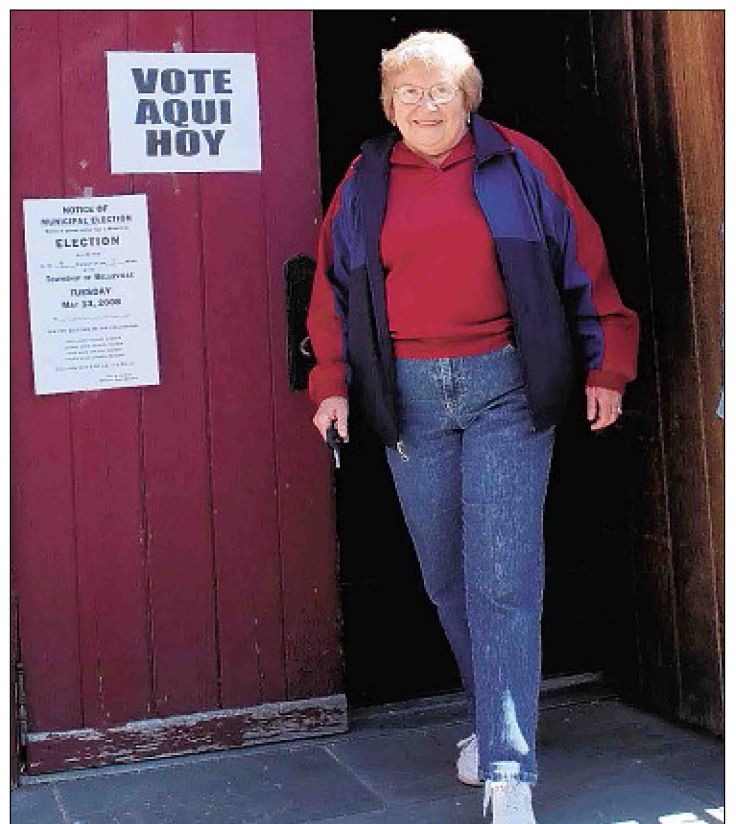
Councilwoman Marie Strumolo Burke reclaimed her position in the First Ward by defeating Peter Zangari by just under 400 votes, tallying 612 to Zungari's 237. Deputy Mayor John Notari also cruised to victory in the Fourth Ward by defeating Thomas Salzano 625 votes to 211, according to a report given to the Belleville Times by the town clerks office Tuesday night. "As my slogan said, actions speak louder than words and my actions have spoken to the people in this town and they have come out and supported me and I plan to continue to support and work for them," said Burke. "In the district where I live I got 207 of a possible 235 votes. That shows you what I do for my people and how much they support me."

The Second Ward was much more closely contested than the other two, but once again the incumbent won as Steven Rovell retained his seat by defeating for-

mer Belleville Mayor Mario Drozdz 710 to 447. Rovell's ward had the highest turnout in total numbers and Rovell also garnered the most votes of any candidate. "The people did not want change, it seems. I suppose they are content with what they have. The bottom line here is that they won and that is the decision we will abide by," said Drozdz. "Of course it is disappointing but it is what it is."

The open seat in the Third Ward, which is being vacated by Councilman George Ritacco, was the closest race of the evening as MacDonald barely edged out Elvin Pereira by a total of 485 votes to 415 votes. Vincent Frantantoni also ran for the open seat and recorded 95 votes. "This is a major statement by the public about the direction they want this town to go in. Notari and Burke won their wards by a margin of almost 3-1 and all our incumbents remained in office. People are happy with what is going on around town and historically this is a huge step for Belleville. In past elections we have had a sort of revolving door on the council where members are replaced every two years. Now that we have been given a chance to stay together I think we can really accomplish some great things," said Belleville Township Manager Victor Canning. "The voters have given us this opportunity and now it is our turn to make it work."

While many were excited about



the results, some voters were frustrated. "This was a big chance for this town to get some fresh faces in there and they did not seize that opportunity. I'm sure the same voters came out and voted the exact same way on the same promises and now we have two more years at least of this," said Jennifer Mendoza, a Belleville res-

ident and strong supporter of Pereira. "I don't know how people can appreciate the direction this town is going in. We have rising taxes, housing problems, abandoned homes, I mean I just don't get it. I really had faith that the people were going to voice that change was needed but as always it seems I stand corrected."

Real democracy and Roland Straten

Rep. Bill Pascrell, the former Paterson mayor who has been representing Belleville and the rest of the 8th District for the last 12 years, is, in at least one important respect, a typical member of Congress: if voting patterns are any guide, he has a job in the House for as long as he wants it. Congressional races are so un-competitive in this nation that it's rare for the national Democrat or Republican parties to pony up the cash required to unseat an incumbent rival in a particular district. Incumbents have always had an advantage, but that advantage has grown in recent years; in some states, more than 90 percent of incumbents get their jobs back in elections.

Money has a lot to do with it, especially in metropoli-

tan New Jersey, one of the costliest media markets in the country. Without significant cash it's difficult for a candidate to get a significant number of voters to learn his or her name, much less what he or she stands for.

So here's a name for you: Roland Straten, an engineer and executive with a Paterson fire protection company. Straten, a Republican, is Pascrell's main challenger for the 8th District seat in the November election. The Montclair resident is against a quick withdrawal in Iraq – more troops should be deployed, he feels – opposed to amnesty for illegal immigrants and supports health care reform in which people pay into a coverage plan throughout their working lives.

Are those good ideas? Maybe, maybe not – the point is that the constituents of the 8th should think about them sometime in the next several months leading up to the election. None of this is to suggest that Pascrell isn't in fact the best person for the job – many voters undoubtedly feel he is.

But voters need to weigh both these candidates – as well as any third-party candidates appearing on the ballot – before they pull the lever for anybody. Merely going into the booth and pulling the lever for the person whose name you recognize is not a triumph of democracy, it's a triumph of incumbency. And that's hardly the same thing.

Be vigilant against dog thefts

TO THE EDITOR:

Members of the Domestic Companion Animal Council have seen an alarming rise in dog thefts in recent months and warn pet owners to be vigilant.

In the first three months of 2008, the American Kennel Club (AKC) has tracked more than 30 thefts from news and customer reports, versus only ten for all of 2007. Media reports from around the country have shown an escalation in the number of dogs being stolen. In New Jersey this past March, there were two incidents of show dogs being stolen from vehicles.

The Domestic Companion Animal Council offers these tips to protect your dog from being stolen:

Never leave your dog unat-

tended in a parked car or tied outside a store while you run inside, even if it's just for a minute. It takes only seconds for a thief to steal your dog.

Never leave your dog alone outside – even in a fenced yard.

Keep your dog on a leash when you go for a walk. When your dog strays from your protection, he becomes an easy target for thieves.

Make sure your dog wears a collar and identification tag at all times.

Add extra protection by having your dog microchipped or tattooed which will provide permanent, non-removable identification.

If you suspect your dog has been stolen:

Immediately call the police and animal control in the area where your dog was last seen.

Have identifying information, such as photos and an accurate written description, ready to use to give to the authorities and for fliers.

We urge you to remain alert to protect your dogs from theft. Remember – the safest place for your pets is with you.

Preschool available through public schools

The Belleville Public Schools will be providing an Integrated Preschool Program for applicants who qualify for the program. This regular education inclusive program will provide an early childhood curriculum that promotes positive developmental experiences and independence, while encouraging the uniqueness of each child. The five-day program will consist of 2 hours each afternoon, Monday through Friday, and will service the needs of both classified and non-classified students. The program meets federal and state mandates for least restrictive environment by offering a full continuum of services.

Regular education enrollment in the program is limited and will be determined by lottery. To be eligible for the lottery, the child must be

either three or four years old on or before October 1, 2008. Four-year-old applicants are considered first for program admission. If there are not enough four-year-old applicants, then three-year-old applicants are considered. A birth certificate and proof of Belleville residency will be required.

Applications may be obtained at the Department of Special Services, 100 Passaic Ave Belleville between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Completed applications are due at the Department of Special Services Office no later than 4:00 p.m. on Wednesday May 28.

The lottery will be held on Monday June 2 at the Department of Special services. Applicants will be notified of their child's status by mail. For additional information, please call 973-450-3500 x3494.

Profusion of safety titles at schools a 'necessary evil'

When the Board of Education held its reorganization meeting recently, there were a bunch of resolutions that might have seemed strange to a typical resident. What the various environmentally focused rules were are an example of state regulations run amok, according to the schools' business administrator.

Resolutions with names like Asbestos Management Officer, Indoor Quality Officer and Integrated Pest Management Coordinator may sound confusing and might alarm taxpayers with the idea that lots of money is necessary to pay for these added personnel. Not so, according to Edward Appleton, school business administrator.

istrator.

First of all, the titles all go to the same person, Vincent Fucella, the district's supervisor of buildings and grounds, so there are no new positions involved. Second, the training he is being sent for quite often these days is at least funded by the state, so local tax money is not necessary.

"We have Vinny going for all kinds of seminars and training," Appleton said. "It's all in the name of compliance with new state environmental regulations."

Some would call them onerous and unnecessary regulations covering areas that most districts already are complying with voluntarily, but Appleton said the state puts such rules in place to compel districts that might otherwise be lax in dealing with environmental

health issues.

Now, most people would agree that finding and removing harmful asbestos, ensuring that indoor air quality is up to safe standards and pests infestations are avoided is important, but spelling it all out adds more red tape to what is already a mountain of paperwork, Appleton said.

Still, where students' and staffs'

health and well-being is at stake, Appleton said, "It's a necessary evil."

The timing of all of the designations is simple as well, he said.

"The time of the reorganization [of the board of education, which recently occurred following the election] is the ideal time to do all of this," Appleton said, since a lot of paperwork is already involved.

So the next time a parent or student feels like there is something not quite right about the air in a school building, or they see an unidentifiable insect crawling or flying around, remember, there is someone specifically trained to handle such problems.

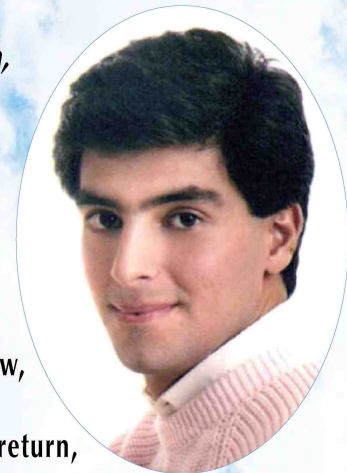

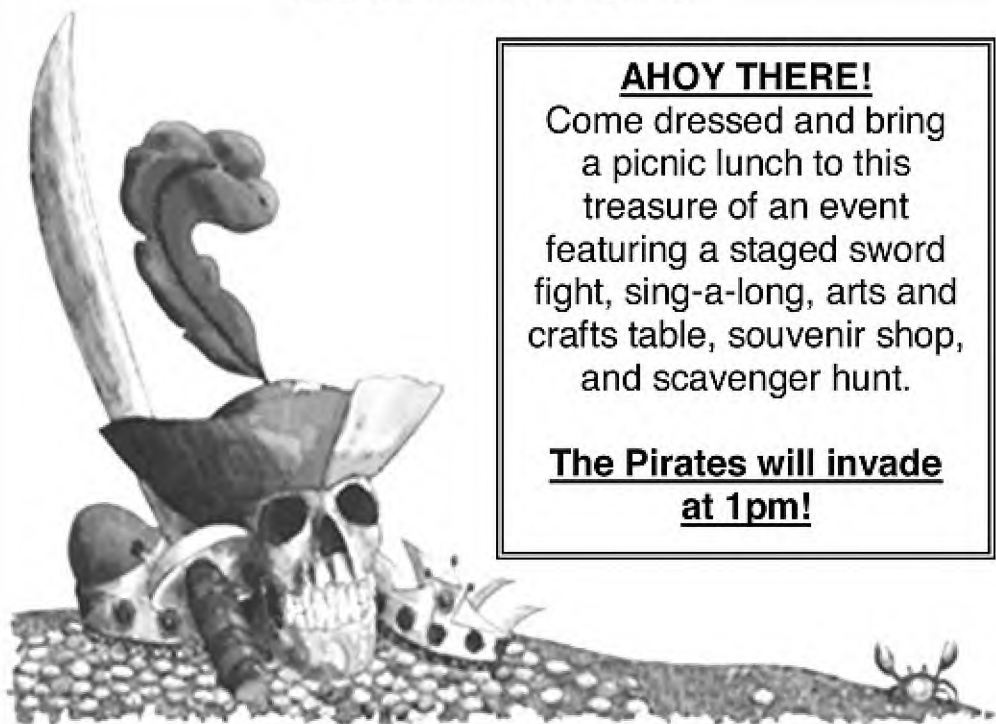

Winners, losers spent equally in BOE election campaign

With most of the final campaign spending numbers in for the recent school board election, figures show that the money spent was virtually even on both sides. The winning side sent out three times the number of mailings, while the other side spent more on lawn signs.

The winners, recently elected school board president Joseph Longo and vice president Bill Freda, raised \$9,550 and spent \$9,367 running as a ticket. Ralph Vellon spent \$5,130.68, and owes about \$250, while Barbara Lozaw, his running mate, states on her most

recent report that she raised \$4,075 and spent \$3,776.53, according to figures provided by the Election Law Enforcement Commission, a state agency. Lozaw could not be reached for comment on whether those are the final numbers for her campaign, but the other three all confirmed their final numbers. Longo and Freda won by about 400 votes each in an election where slightly more than 11 percent of registered voters participated.

Longo said the effect of money on the campaigns "was not overwhelming, especially since we heard all through the campaign that the other side had so many more lawn signs than we did. That

turned out to not be a sign of their strength. Bill and I spent for two, not one, so we were able to combine a lot of things. It really comes down to the fact that they got our message out, and made sure we got our voters out."

Vellon said that certainly having fewer mailers "had an impact, especially the quality of the literature. My little bit of experience has taught me that voters react more to tax issues, which is not directly related to the issues of the children's education. They have concerns about tax spending, and some utilize that fact to their advantage, which can be misleading."

Still, Vellon, who plans to run

again next year, said he has no real regrets.

"I'm not sure I'd do anything different," he said. "I would try and communicate more directly with community, and would like to be in a position to generate a little more revenue next time."

Freda said his competitors' decision to under spend on mailings was a key issue.

"I would say, yeah, you have to spend some money, but there can be a problem with sending out too little information or conversely, with flooding residents with too much information, where people wind up getting too many mailings," Freda said.

While the list of contributors was not available as of press time, Vellon said he received a \$1,000 contribution from Democratic state Assemblyman and county Freeholder candidate Ralph Caputo, and believes Lozaw received a similar amount.

Longo and Freda ran with the assistance of a group of Republicans that included former local GOP chair Richard Yanuzzi. The two are candidates for county committee slots as the Yanuzzi group battles current GOP Chairwoman Antoinette "Toni" Marone for control of Belleville's Republican party.

Technology, safety on board agenda

Monday night's Board of Education meeting featured brief reports on a locker search at the high school, the new quality assurance system being used by officials to measure standardized testing, new advances in school technology, and the need to improve school buildings and grounds.

Superintendent of Schools Dr. Edward Kliszus reported that on April 16 a complete sweep was done of all high school lockers, featuring the county sheriff's canine unit. The search turned up no illegal drugs, which he said made officials happy, and the entire exercise was part of a drug resistance awareness program done throughout the school year. It was the first such locker search at BHS, but such exercises have been conducted at surrounding districts, including Nutley, Kliszus said.

Kliszus said the new Quality Single Accountability Report system used by county and state officials to gauge the progress of the district has run into a snag.

"There is a discrepancy between the test scores given to the county and the state," he said. "When that is settled, I will be able to give a more detailed report about the process."

The new system analyzes the district over several years, a different approach from the former Quality Assurance Report that had been used before the last school year.

With the school board having just reshuffled its committees, leaders of two of the major committees discussed the first meetings of the newly-constituted groups, offering more general comments than specifics about changes.

School board member William Villano said the technology committee had its first meeting with his new colleagues, including newly-elected Bill Freda, the school board vice president, whose professional background is in technology services.

"I think Mr. Freda got some good insight into what we're trying to do," Villano said. "We talked about the new computers (in the high school and middle school as well as for special education)."

Villano said the latest long-term technology plan is now four years old, an eternity in the fast-evolving world of computers.

"We need to revisit our technology plan," he said. "It's four years

Zanfini to be honored on Friday at stadium

Around Belleville High, he was the ultimate "one letter" man.

I've said many times that the highest compliment paid to a teacher by a student in the Belleville school system, at least when I went to school, was calling that teacher by one letter, usually emblematic of the first letter of that teacher's last name.

So when I say "Z", everyone around Belleville, and probably in the surrounding area as well, knows who I'm talking about. And tomorrow night, at Municipal Stadium, the baseball field will be renamed in his honor. It's only appropriate that the field, which has undergone a great deal of renovations, will be in pristine condition for the unveiling of a sign bearing George Zanfini's name that will forever be a part of the ballpark's heritage.

The ceremonies will begin at 6 p.m. in the high school library, with a small reception. It will then continue on the field at about 6:20 when the field is officially dedicated to Z. At 7 p.m., Belleville will host a varsity baseball game against Watchung Hills.

It will be indeed be a special night for Zanfini, a beloved history teacher at Belleville High for 41 years before retiring last spring, and an outstanding baseball coach there for 16 years. The coaching record speaks for itself; 156-59 as a varsity coach from 1975-1982 and again in 1987 and 62-17 as the freshman skipper from 1970-1974, for a combined 218-76.

"I guess that's pretty good," Zanfini said in a classic understatement last week when talking about his coaching mark. "But to me, it

was about those kids. They were just great. We had some incredible times when I coached and I'm so grateful to have had the opportunity. I remember how special it was every Tuesday to open The Star-Ledger and see where we were in the state rankings. We were a Top 20 team, a lot, during my years as varsity head coach (1975-1982 and again in 1987). That was a testimony to the players' hard work."

He never had a losing season in his 14 years as a head coach. He also worked for two seasons as an assistant in 1999 and 2000 when Alan Frank, a former player for Zanfini in the early 70s, was named the new head coach in '99. The first thing Frank did after being named coach was to call Z and try to talk him into returning to the diamond.

"Alan is about the only guy I would have done that for," Zanfini said of his return to coaching nine years ago. "He had just gotten the job, and he was teaching in the Lyndhurst school system. I know how tough it can be for a coach not to be in the building during the day, and I wanted to help him get off to a good start."

Obviously, there were some great teams, along with excellent players during Zanfini's tenure. But two teams stand out in particular, the 1976 team, which finished 24-4 and the 1981 squad, which won 22 games and captured Belleville's only Greater Newark Tournament title to date.

"We had an incredible run in '76," Zanfini said. "We actually lost our opener that year, then won our next 20 games and were ranked first in the state for a month. The excitement at the school that year was pretty special. That team could really hit, and we had excellent pitching, too. In 1981, of course, we won the Greater Newark Tournament and advanced to the sectional finals. I guess I'd have to say the '76 team might have been my best overall, but that shouldn't take

away from '81, either."

Rocco Balsamo played for Zanfini during that era in the mid 1970s and was graduated in 1977. He remembers the '77 team had gotten off to a good start before Zanfini was stricken with hepatitis.

"We were 11-3 at one point that year," Balsamo recalled the other day. "But then Z got sick and we weren't the same team after that. (Belleville finished 18-15 in 1977). I'll tell you what, I am so happy that the field is being renamed for Z. He's such a great guy. Growing up back then was something special and I'll always cherish the memories of playing baseball and football for him."

Oh yes, football. Zanfini's coaching career actually began on the gridiron, where he was a freshman football coach at Belleville, starting in the mid 1960s. He coached for many years with John Senesky, who now resides in California. Zanfini and Senesky were coaches and teachers at the junior high and later at the high school for three decades.

"I had the privilege of coaching freshman football with George at a time when there were 60 to 80 kids on the team and two coaches," Senesky said last week. "Not only has George been a good friend and coworker, but he has devoted himself totally and sacrificially to his sport and especially to the kids he has coached and influenced. And I could safely say that George has always put his players and his town above himself, never seeking honors and recognition for himself, but deflecting any that he may have received and directing it towards his players and fellow coaches. I know that as he is honored on Friday night, he will once again humbly thank everyone, and direct all of the accolades to those he has had the privilege to know and to coach. It is very fitting then that he receives this honor due him, and

Land purchase by town part of wide-ranging development

The past 18 months have been a time of development and change for Belleville and the upcoming months look poised to continue this pace.

Township Manager Victor Canning announced at the last Township Council meeting that Belleville recently purchased more property for the township to develop and has entered the final stages of talks with the Lowe's Home Improvement developers. "We bought another piece of property on Valley Street so that we can have all four gates and lots in that area. We expect to close on the property in June," said Canning.

The plan is to knock down the existing buildings there, which are older homes that have been abandoned, and expand the parking lot below the railroad tracks. "This should provide us with anywhere from 50 to 70 parking spaces. We would have four extra lots with a dimension of about 150 by 100 feet. This will open more spaces not only for the residents coming to town hall but also for the residents coming to shop along Washington Avenue," said Canning. "I don't want to stop here either, we are always looking for more property to purchase and develop because we need it so desperately around here."

The main plan for Canning and

the council is to bring Washington Avenue back to where it was decades ago and revitalize the once energetic street. "We want to bring success, revenue and liveliness back to Washington Avenue. It has been a sore spot for years and it is an area that this council really wants to see improve," said Canning.

The town just recently applied for a \$50,000 grant from the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs to help with the redevelopment of Washington Avenue. The council will not know if the grant money will come through for the next four months but is already beginning to plan for its arrival should they get it. "This grant that we applied for will help us move our initiatives forward. We have targeted some older industrial sites that are privately owned and contaminated that we want to clean up. The areas that are in question mostly fall between Rutgers and Mill Street and between Washington Avenue and Main Street," said Canning.

The former Van Dyke property was also an area mentioned by Canning for improvement. "We have met with the owners of that property and they seem interested in the idea if we go in on the project with them. We have to start addressing these sites that have been deemed as contaminated or unusable and start turning them around and making them produc-

tive again," said Canning. "We cannot understand what we can do with them until we evaluate their condition and determine if they can be turned into residential or commercial zones."

Canning stated that his overall plan is to slowly convert the area back to residential and leave the commercial development for Washington Avenue. Bringing back residential areas around New Jersey is a featured part of the state master plan and is also a goal of the council.

Should the property be in a condition that would not allow residential development, Canning said the next best thing would be to turn it into pocket parks for recreational use. "The areas are just eyesores for our residents and they make the town look sloppy. Improving them at least aesthetically would give us a better appearance and would give those areas usage again," said Canning.

Residents seemed to agree with Canning's comments. "I have said before that this town needs to clean things up and I will say it again. This town must start to at least clean the image in order to bring back the business and the people," said Joseph Miller, Belleville resident. "We want to see changes and I am beginning to see them. This council has made a lot of promises and some of them are starting to come to fruition and that is exciting because for years

and years we have heard but not seen anything. The old ice factory is a mess, Washington Avenue has no parking and the roads need paving. All of these things and more I want to see fixed and Mr. Canning is targeting these areas. It is nice to know that the council's priorities seem to be lining up with mine."

Another resident who attended the last council meeting voiced similar support. "Every time I come to a meeting I hear about something new coming. It is exciting because we have had such a long time without anything so to finally start seeing some development really makes me happy," said Gregory Mindenson, who moved to Belleville just two years ago. "I came here because I heard that things would be changing. When I got here, the first few months I saw nothing happen but now I am starting to see the ball move in the right direction and that is very encouraging because so many places around here now are moving backwards."

Another project that has moved forward is the construction of a Lowe's Home Development superstore. "Lowe's recently got approval from the state for their storm water and sewer plan. If they wanted to start the infrastructure work tomorrow they could," said Canning. "This is another step that further shows the council, myself and the residents of this town that

this is not just a pipe dream. This is going to happen and it is going to happen soon."

The main hold-up on the project is that Lowe's developers are currently seeking suitors for two areas adjoining to the store for occupancy. "They want to find two more prospective retailers to come on board to round out the building. When they do and all this comes to town, it will be a fantastic thing for Belleville. This will bring more ratables, jobs and money to this town," said Canning.

While many residents spoke in support of the Washington Avenue developments, not all were in favor of the Lowe's development. "I think the general idea of a Lowe's store is great but we must get more parking and space before we do this. Driving around this town, up and down Washington Avenue and through the side streets is a nightmare already. If you add something like a Lowe's store this place is going to turn into another Clifton Commons and that would be miserable," said Patricia Mendez, Belleville resident. "Before we go adding new things I think we may want to first look into fixing what we have already. This will be great for the town, but it could potentially be a very large headache for a large handful of the residents."

The next scheduled Township Council meeting is set for May 27th.

Unique to this facility, each of the several examination rooms has a whirlpool foot bath to relax the patient and soften the tissues. Gait and pressure analysis is computerized digitally and sent to a

lab instantly, enabling custom-made orthotics to be available in less than a week. An array of stylish special shoes is displayed on the premises and for reasonable prices.

An MRI (magnetic resonance imaging) machine is on-site, which allows cross-sectional viewing of the foot and ankle. There is also fluoroscopic imaging for immediate bone imaging results — no waiting to develop an X-ray. Osteoporosis screening can be accomplished with a bone density testing machine. Diagnostic echography provides soft tissue scans for sprains and strains.

Stubborn warts that haven't responded to traditional treatments can be helped non-surgically with a flashlamp pulsed dye laser. The laser treatment blocks the blood supply that feeds the wart.

The number of diabetic patients has increased over the years, mostly due to the increase in the

obesity population. Some relief of numbness in the feet is available with use of anodyne therapy, which uses infrared photo energy to stimulate the body from the legs down. This treatment usually restores sensation for about six months.

Seat belt enforcement being stepped up

Law enforcement officers throughout New Jersey will be stepping up enforcement and education of the state's Primary Seat Belt Law. The enforcement and education campaign comes as part of the nationwide *Click It or Ticket* mobilization.

The goal of the program is to increase the statewide seat belt usage rate to 93%. Last year, the

seat belt usage rate in New Jersey rose for the 11th consecutive year, to 91.4%.

In 2007, there were 716 motor vehicle fatalities in New Jersey, a large percentage of which were not wearing a seat belt. Seat belt use saves lives and prevents injuries. Between 1975 and 2000, seat belts prevented 135,000 fatalities and 3.8 million injuries nationwide,

saving \$585 billion in medical and other costs.

Seat belt use is especially important for teens and young adults. Motor vehicle crashes are the leading cause of death for people age 15-34 in the United States.

During the mobilization period from May 19-June 1, local police agencies will conduct a zero tolerance seat belt enforcement cam-

aign. Motorists who are not buckled up will be issued a ticket. In addition, concerted efforts are going on locally and statewide to raise awareness about the importance and life-saving benefits of seat belts.

"High visibility enforcement saves lives," said Pamela Fisher, Director of the New Jersey Division of Highway Traffic Safety.

"Our goal is to make sure that all motor vehicle occupants are properly restrained, on every trip."

"We are committed to the Click It or Ticket strategy," added Tom Louizou, Regional Administrator of the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. "Tickets are a strong deterrent and the results are meaningful: Fewer deaths on our road."

Be ready for floods, town advises

New Jersey has experienced flooding due to severe storms, hurricanes and tropical depressions. The majority of the State's floods in the past five years have occurred during the spring and summer months.

Since 2000, New Jersey has experienced five federally declared disasters due to flooding.

Hurricane Ivan crashed ashore in July 2004 and quickly became a category five hurricane.

New Jersey residents were hit with intense rains, causing millions of dollars in damages to homes and businesses.

Most recently, the spring floods of April 2007 covered New Jersey in almost a foot of rain. Extensive flooding destroyed land and property, causing every county in New Jersey to be declared a federal disaster area.

New Jersey Flood Facts

(Source: National Flood Insurance Program)

Flooding costs New Jersey. In the past five years, (2003-2008), insured flood losses in New Jersey totaled approximately \$266 million. More New Jersey residents are now flood insured.

Since April 2007, flood insurance policies in New Jersey have increased by 4.6%, to more than 225,000 policies as of April 2008.

However, many New Jersey households remain at risk. There are more than 3 million households in New Jersey (2000 U.S. Census), but just 225,171 insurance policies in effect. Only seven percent of the state's households are covered.

BE FLOODSMART - REDUCE YOUR RISK

Learn your flood risk. Properties that are not located within high-risk areas can also flood. Find out your flood risk right now by enter-

ing your address at FloodSmart.gov's "One-Step Flood Risk Profile." Insurance agents can also help assess your risk.

Plan for evacuation. Plan and practice a flood evacuation route, ask someone out of state to be your "family contact" in an emergency and make sure everyone knows the contact's address and phone number.

Move important objects and papers to a safe place. Store your valuables where they can't get damaged.

Conduct a thorough home inventory. Thorough documentation of your belongings will help you file your flood insurance claim. For more information, visit www.knowyourstuff.org.
