June, 1940

The first lap of the voyage over, we've put into port for a well earned rest.

September, 1940

The crew aboard, and all accounted for, with Leonard Ronco at the wheel, we've lifted anchor.

April, 1941

Our second year of the voyage was celebrated with a Hop. The celebration was a success and the crew again ready for action.

June, 1941

In port with the crew on a two month leave.

September, 1941

George Fero has taken command, as we start on the third lap of our journey.

May, 1942

All hands on deck for inspection. The crew in "whites" set off for a Prom that rocked the waves all night.

June, 1942

Gangplank up, engines roaring, full speed ahead, as Bill Armstrong starts us off on the last lap of a very successful trip.

March, 1943

While the crew combed make-up out of their hair, we gripped their hands and congratulated them on magnificent performances in their colorful presentation of "You Can't Take It With You."

June, 1943

Anchor dropped, all aboard, as we bid farewell to a vessel that's been HOME for four years. So we raise our hands in a final salute to our friends and shipmates.

Another victory was attained by the defeat of a strong Irvington team with Bill Henderson, Vinnie O'Connell and Gene Melody contributing to our success.

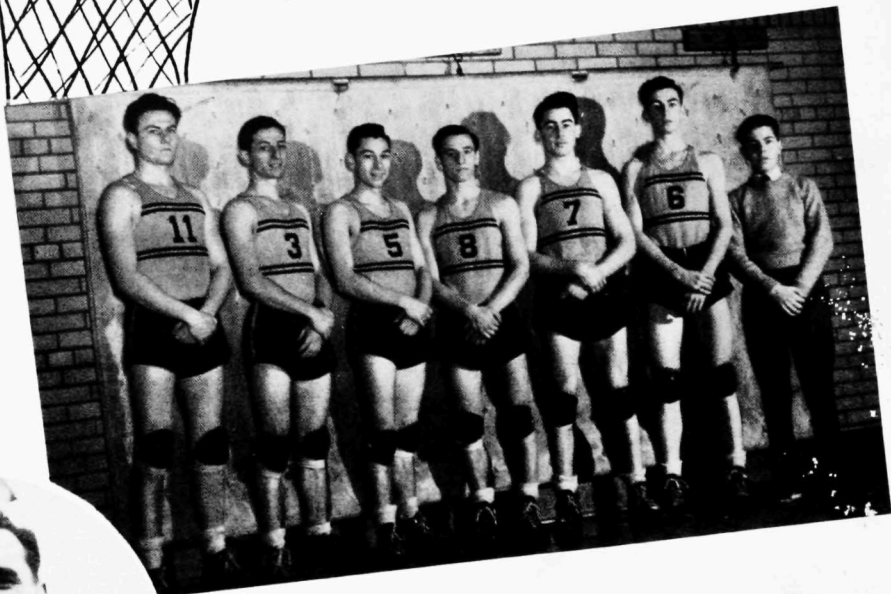

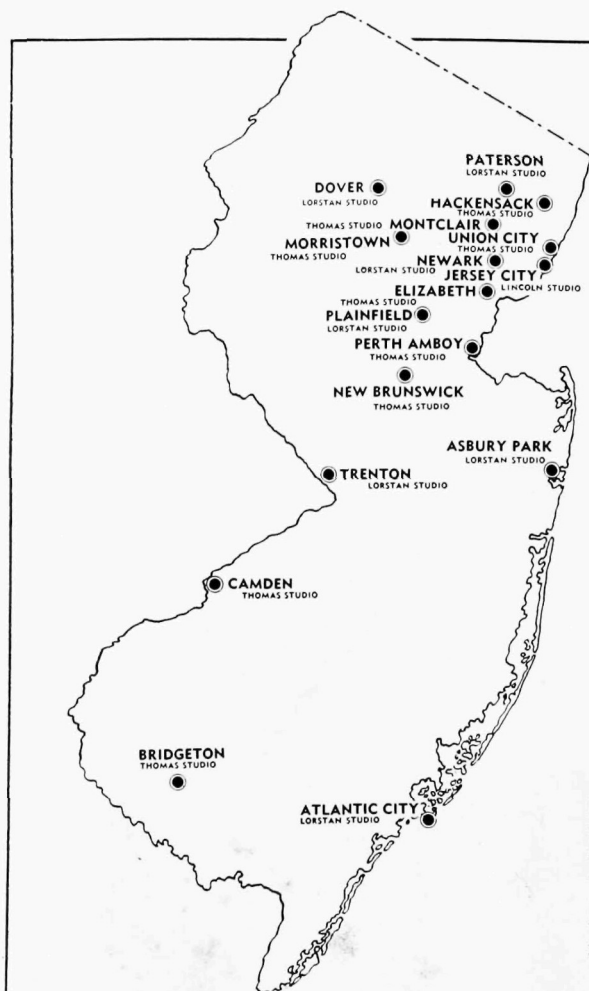
