The celebration was a success and the crew again ready for action. June, 1949 In port with the crew on a two month leave. September, 1941 George Ferrs has taken command, as we start on the third laps our journey. May, 1942 all hands on deck for inspection. The crew in whites set off for a Prom that rocked the waves all night. June, 1942 Jangplank up, engines rowing, full speldahead, as Bill armstrong starts us off on the last lap of a very successful trip. March, 1943 While the crew combed make-up out of their hair, we prepped their hands and congratulated them on magnificent performances in their colorful presentation of "you land Take It with you." June, 1943 anchor dropped, all aboard, as we sid farewell to a vessel that's been HOME for four years. So we raise our hands in a final salute to our friends and shipmates.






