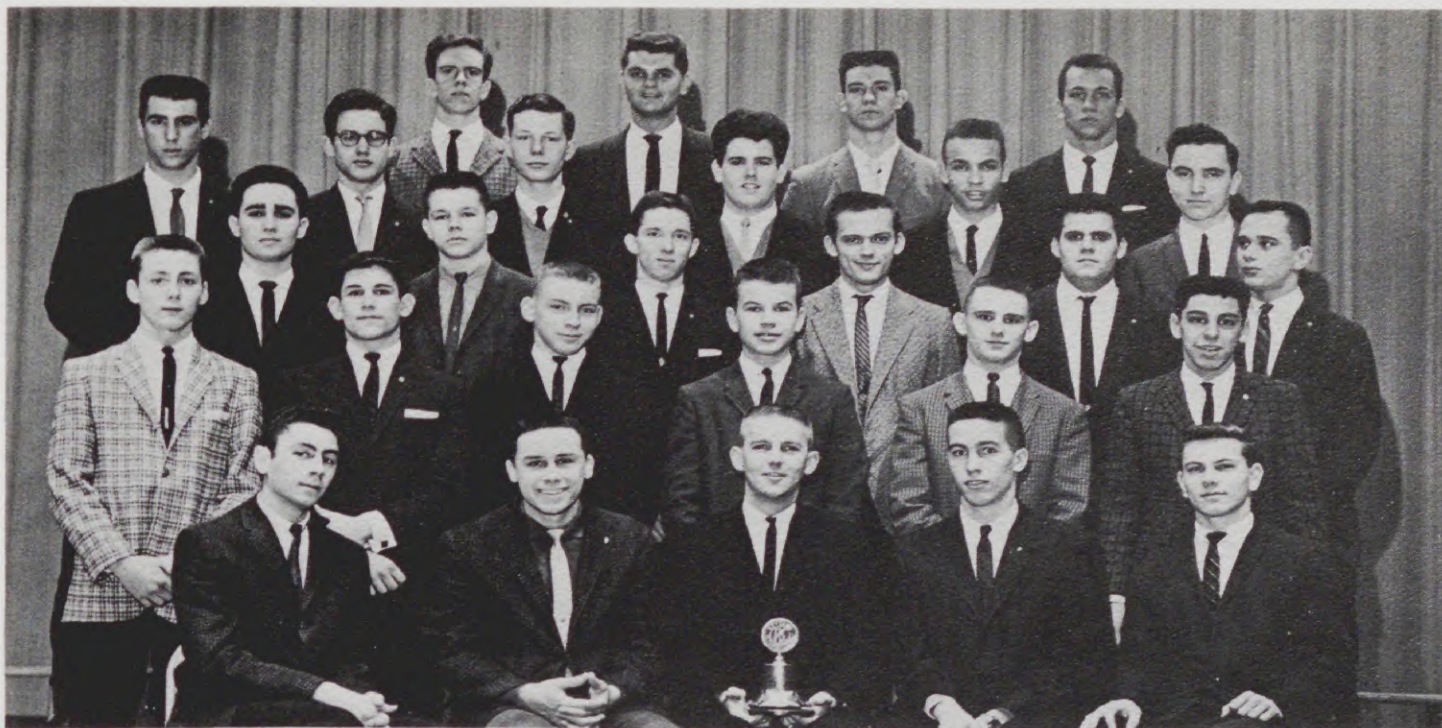

Members of the Library Council serve as assistants to Miss Rhodes in the library. This year they have initiated a service of library aides for the teachers.



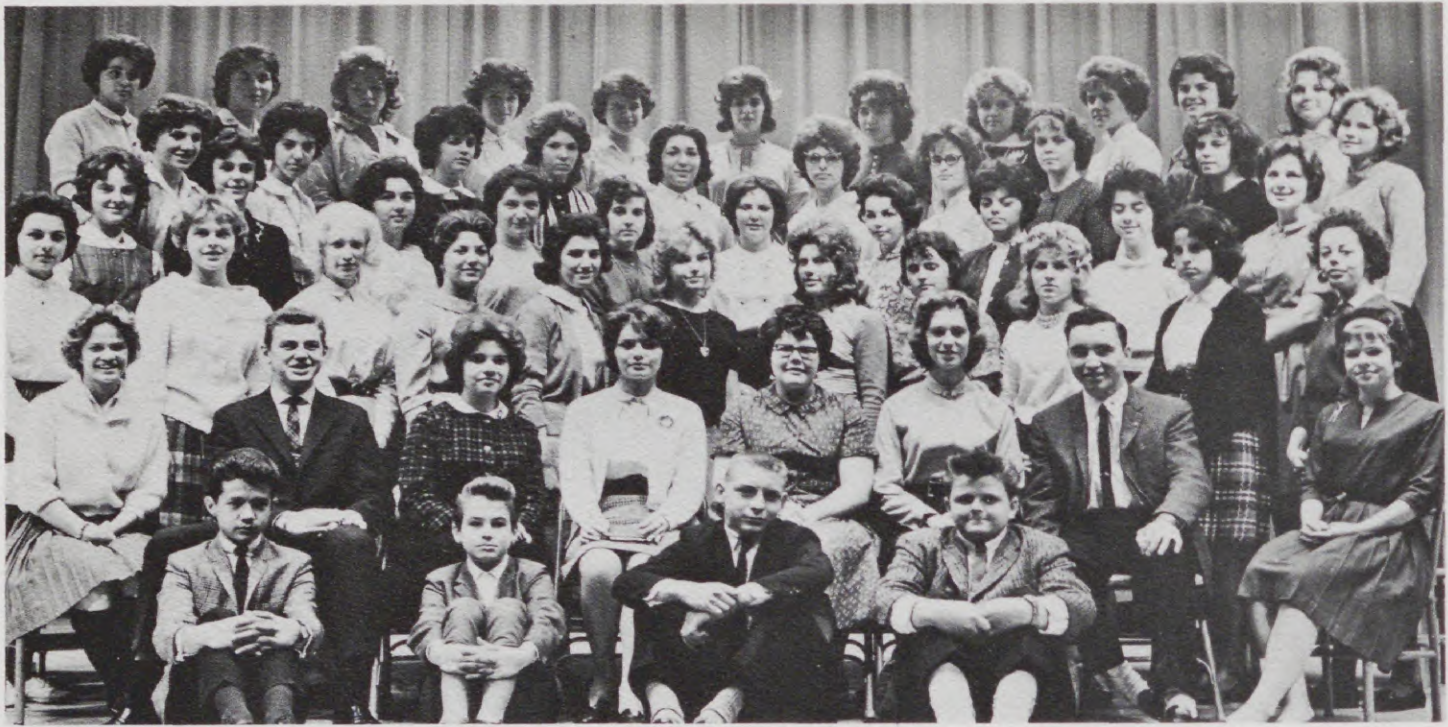

Turmoil broke loose on the Assembly floor as Cuba rushed to the rostrum and assailed the United States. Demonstrators carrying signs broke into the World Assembly and shouted down the delegate from the Union of South Africa. Matters became so heated that lunch had to be postponed.

These startling events occurred at the model U. N. General Assembly presented for the first time as a combined effort of our three sister schools on February 7. The preparation and execution of the event was left entirely to the two hundred students who participated, with the teachers setting only the

ground rules in the first few weeks of work.

Early in the school year the students from all three schools were grouped in blocs — Asian-African, Soviet, Latin American, and Western (ALJ represented the Western bloc). By doing a great deal of research and listening to lectures, the students imitated each delegate's mannerisms, arguments and actions. In almost all respects, the mock session resembled the real thing and was a worthwhile experience for all who debated on the question of admitting Communist China to the U.N.

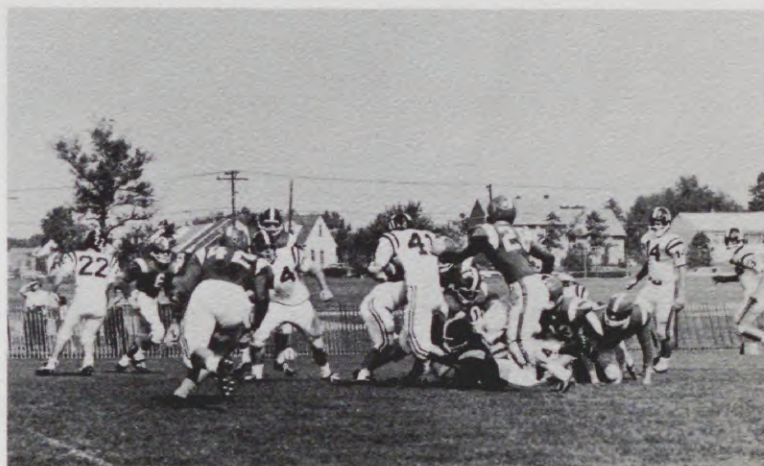

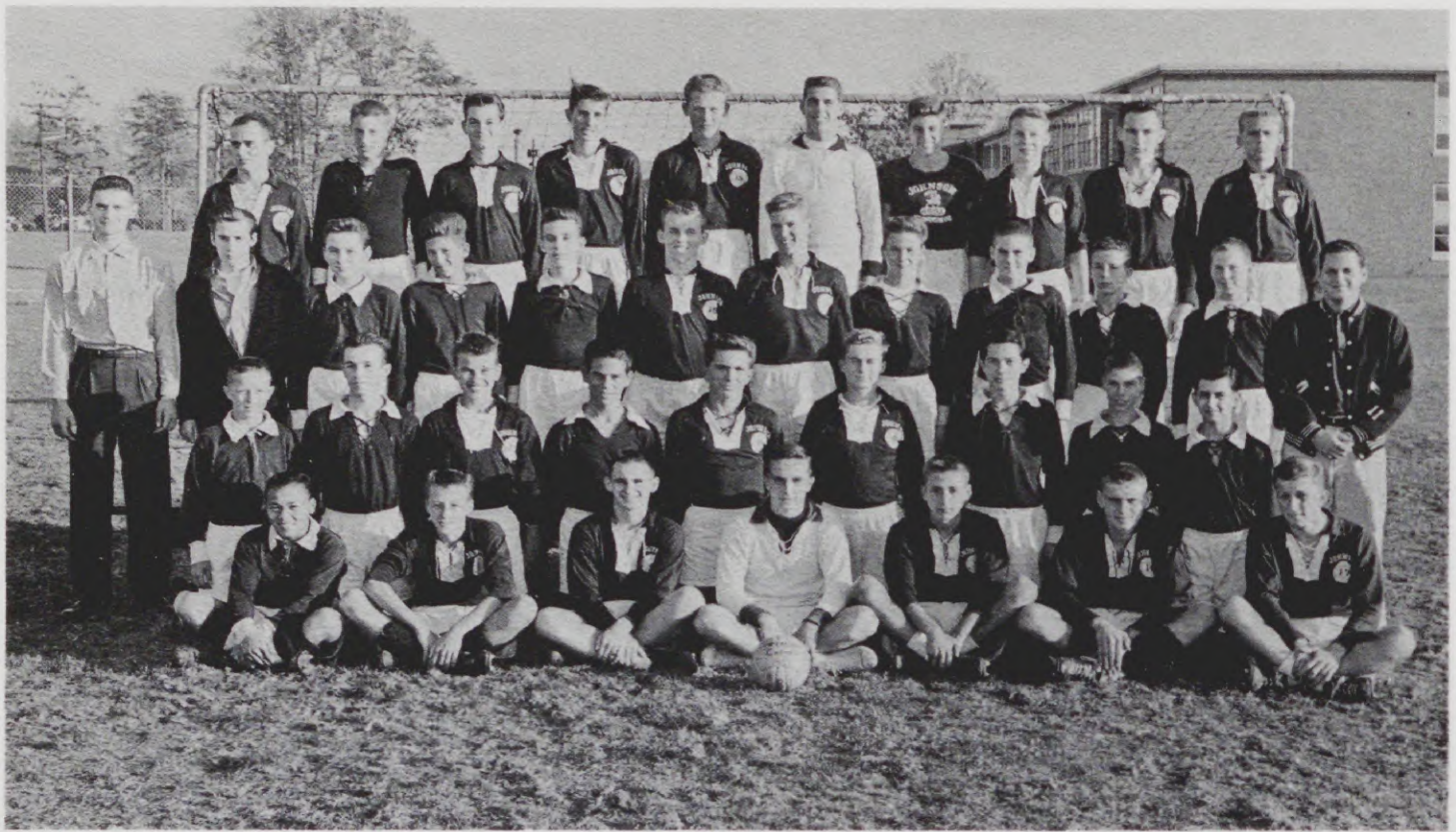

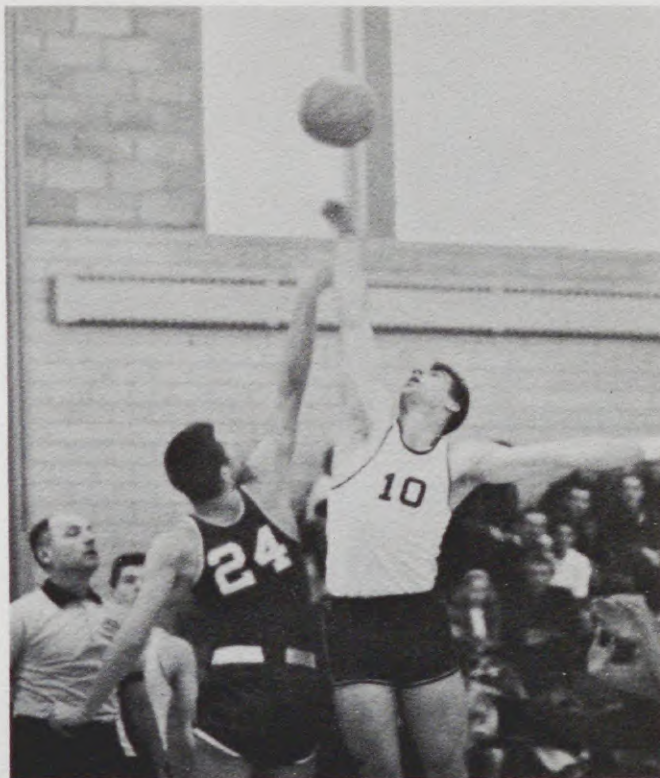

Compiles 4-7 Record

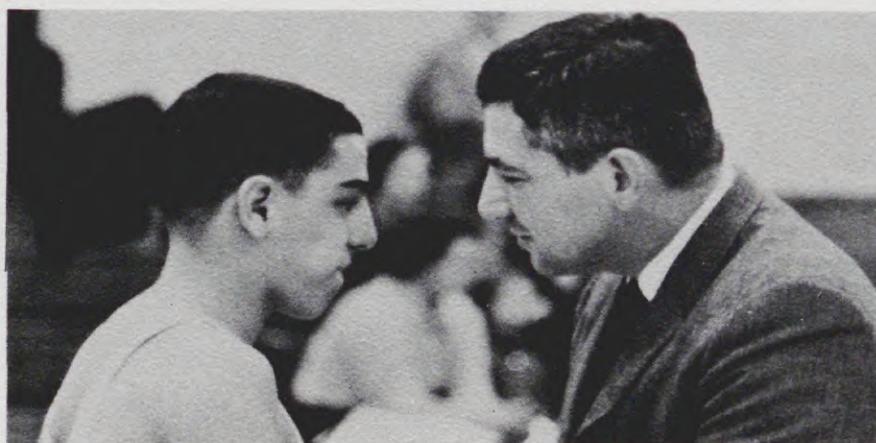

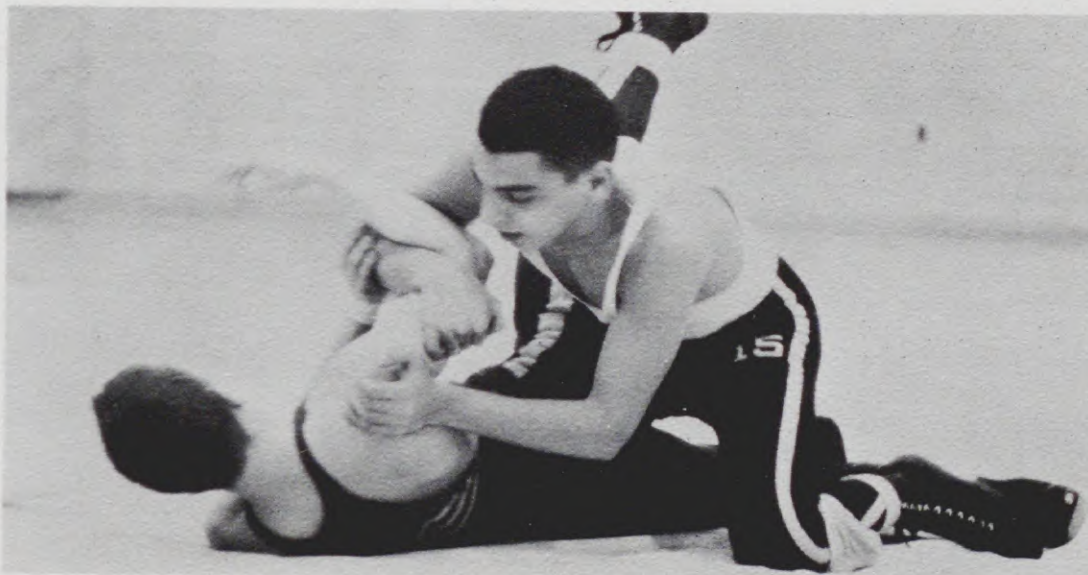

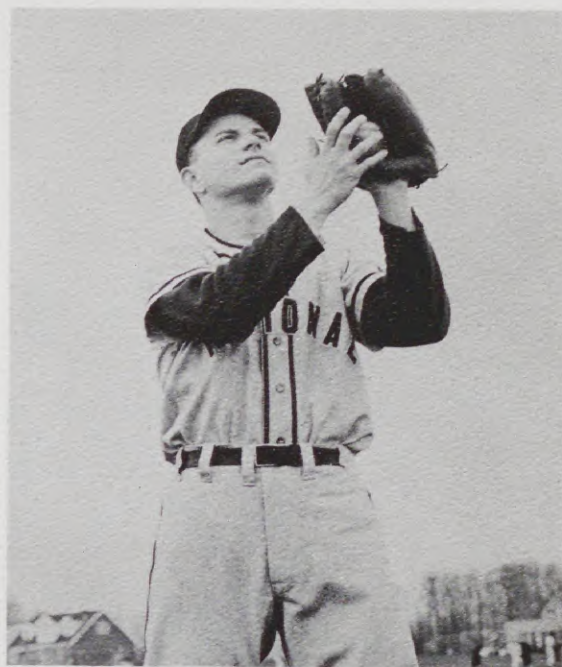
