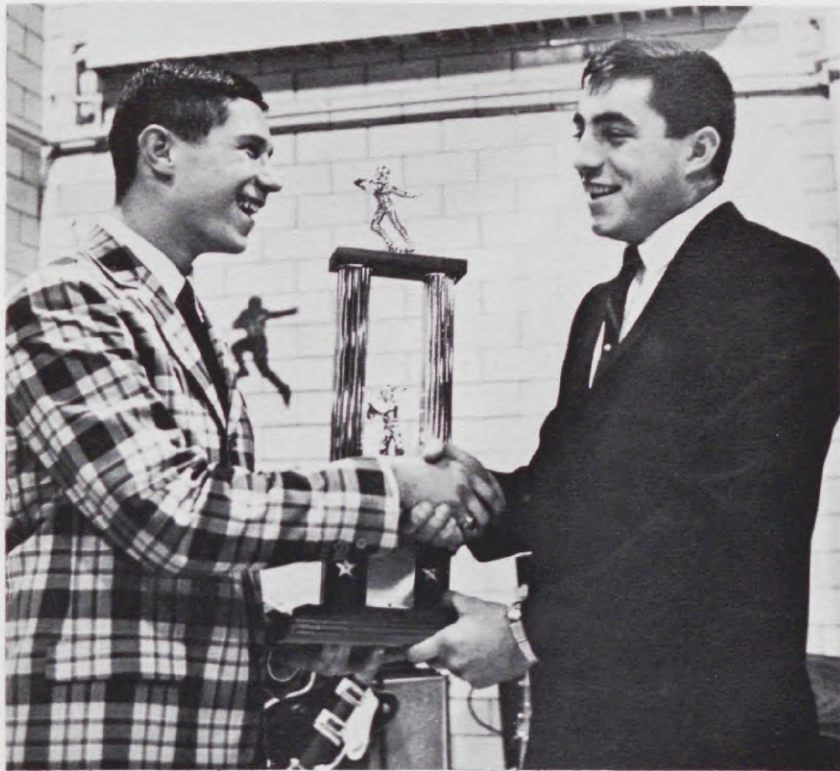

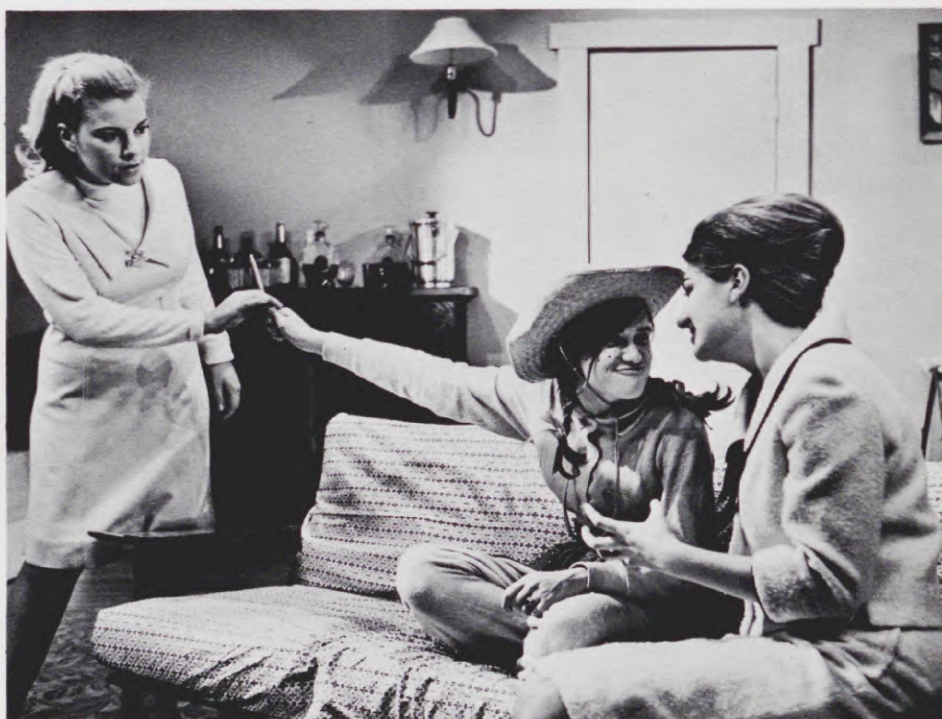

CHOIR

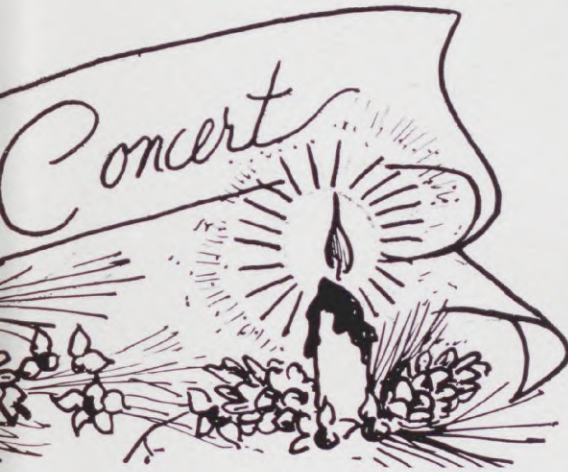

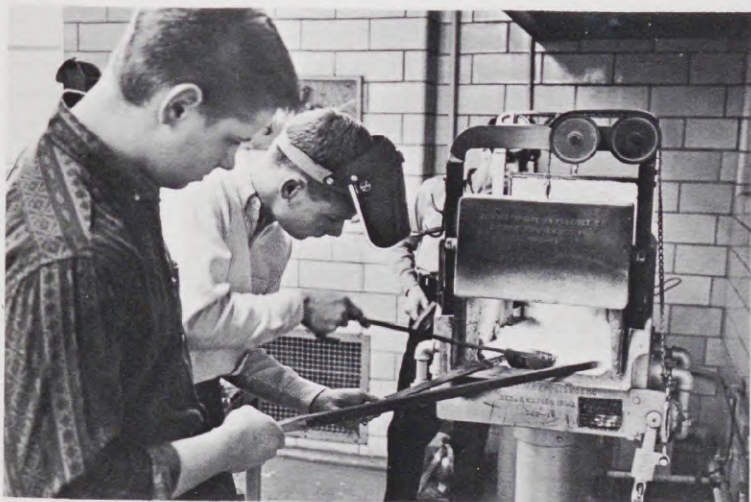

Student Faculty Game

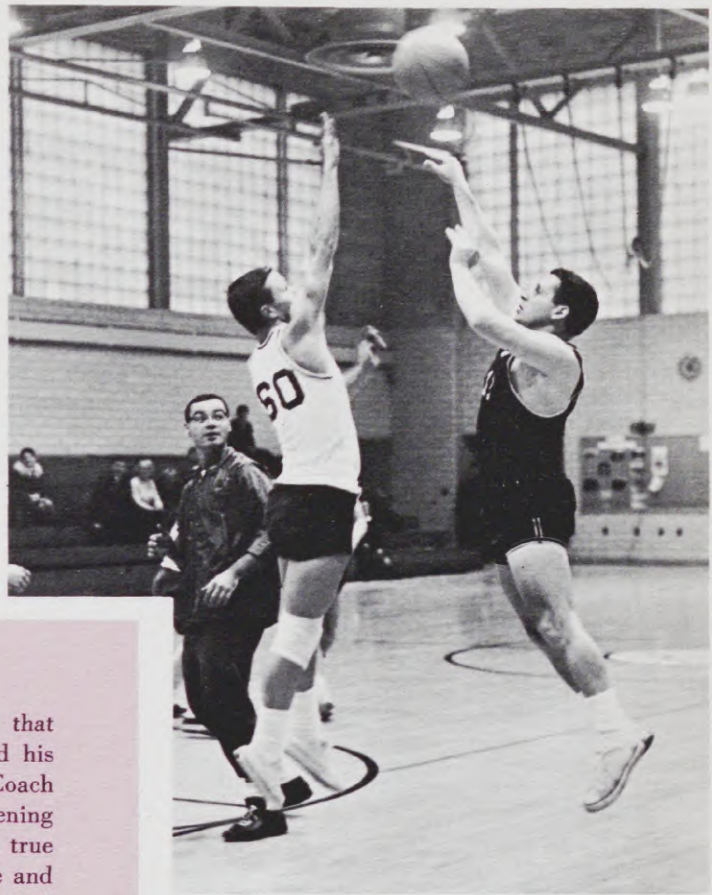

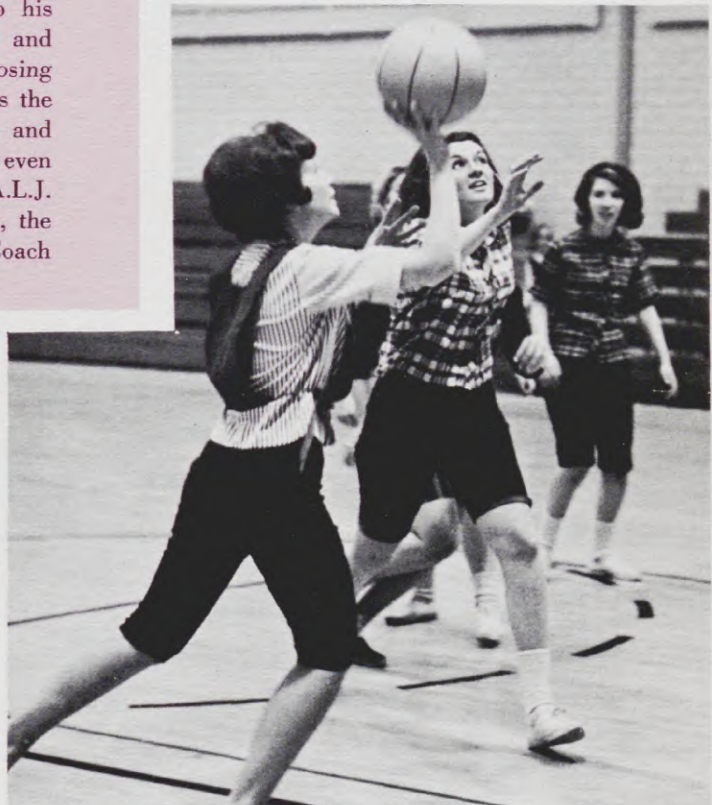
Mr. Fulton

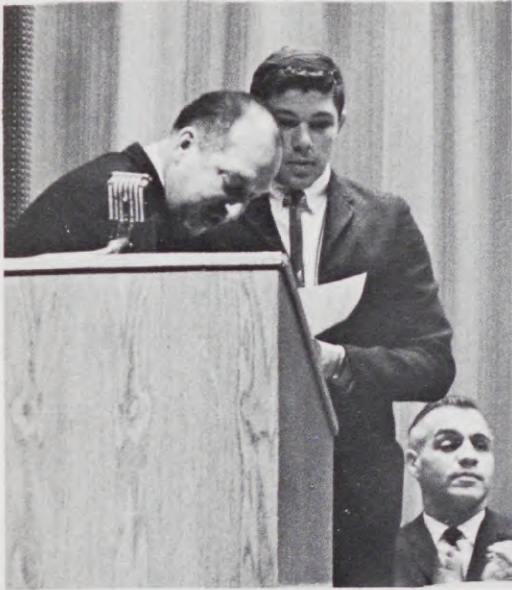

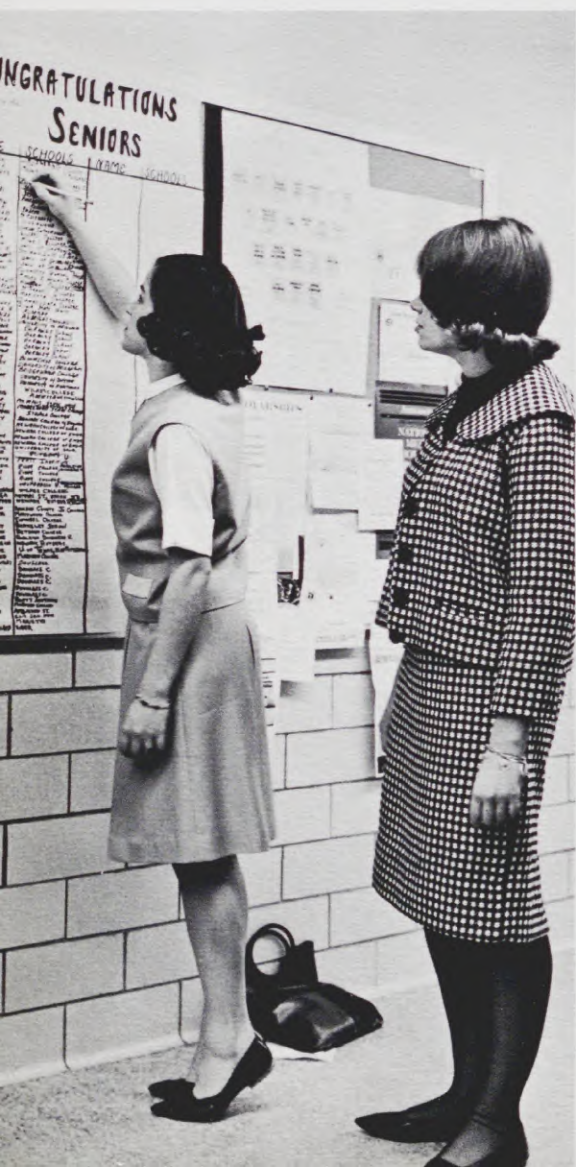

Acting as the backbone of the Regional system, the Board of Education formulates all of the policies and activities of the three schools. The members work diligently to create a healthier atmosphere for learning.

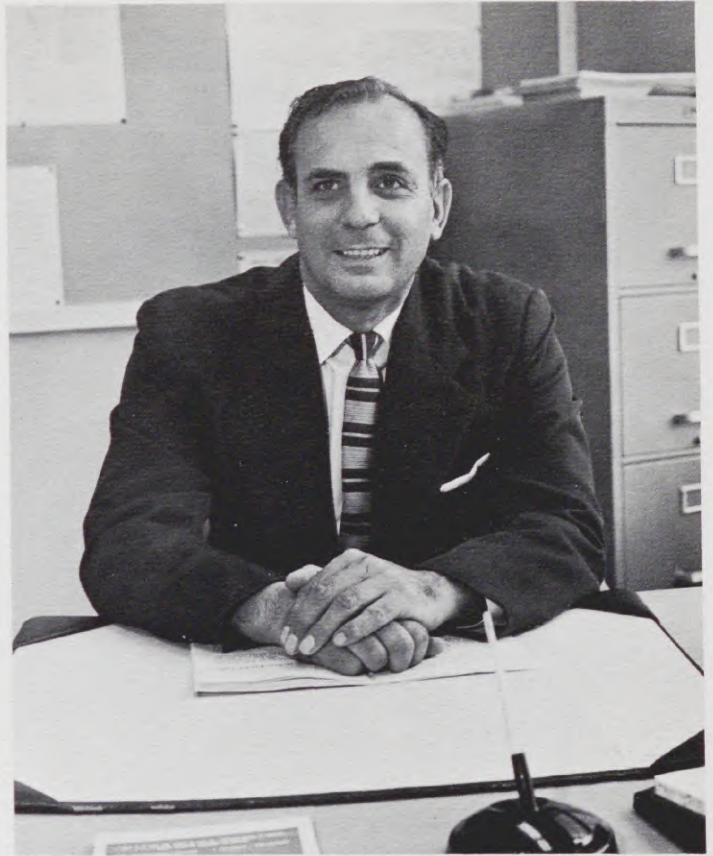

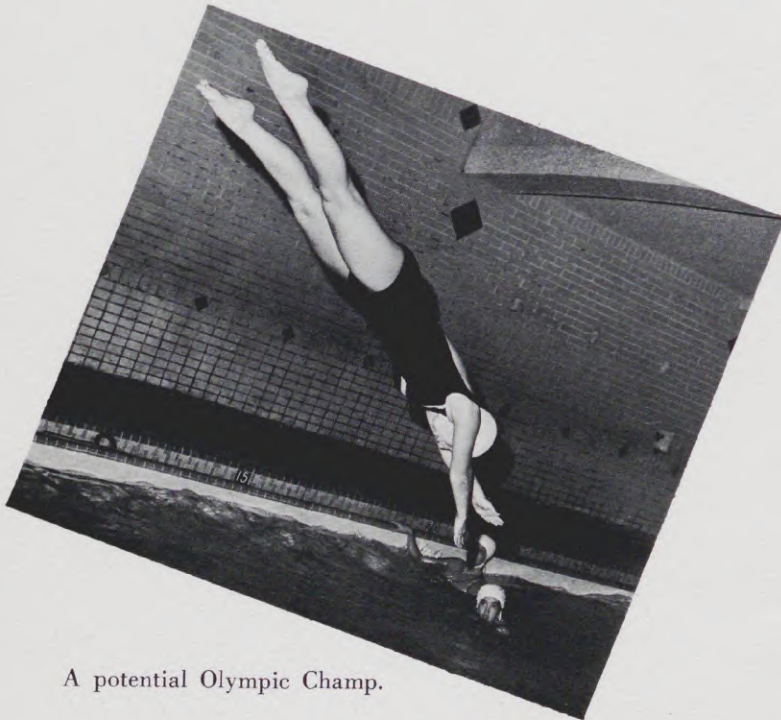

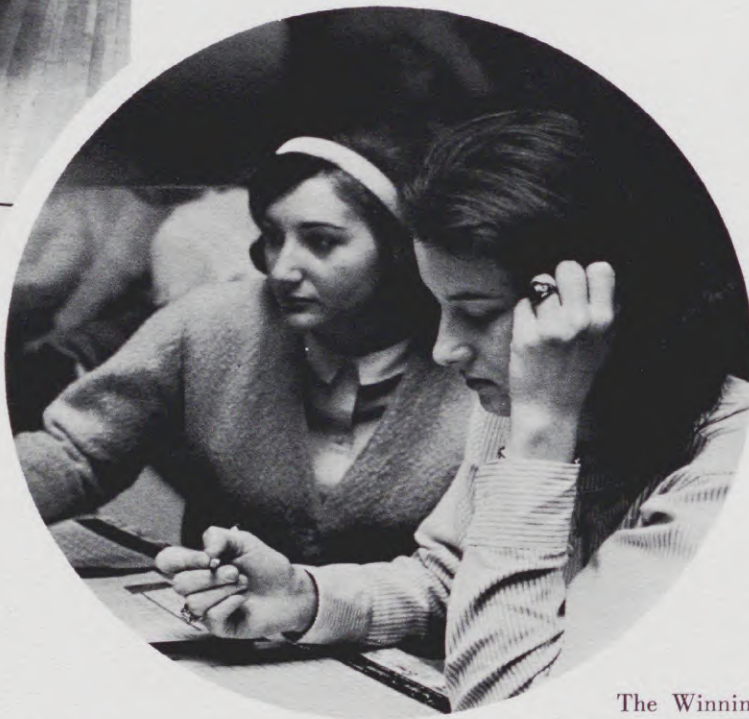

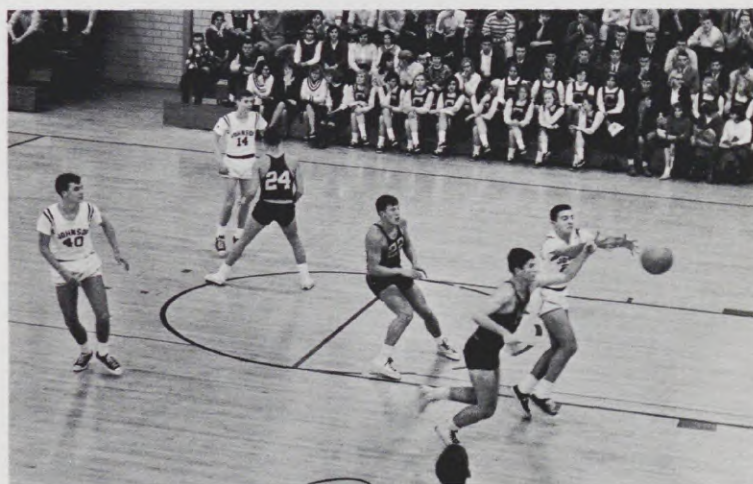

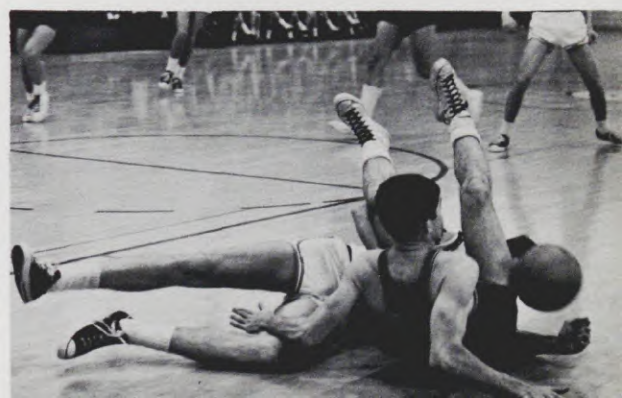

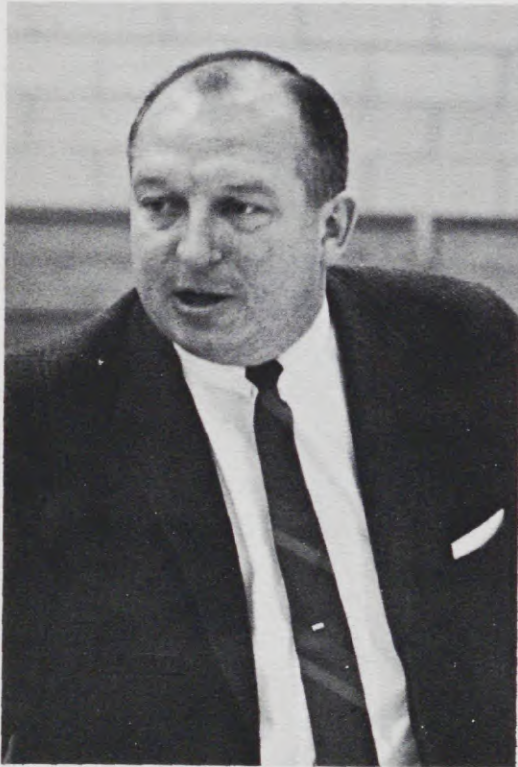

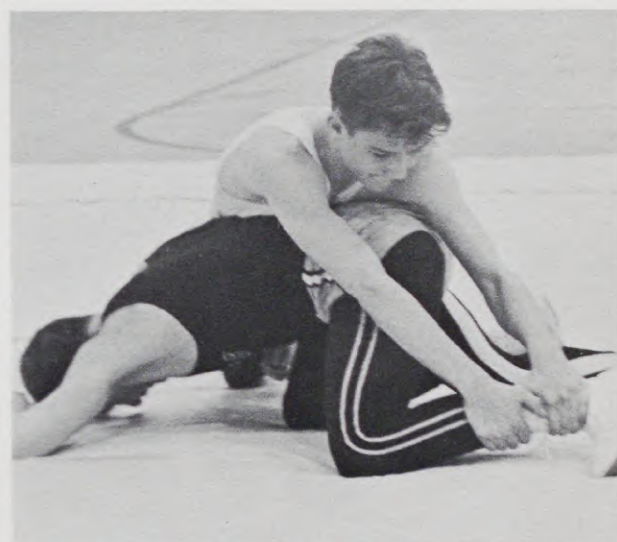

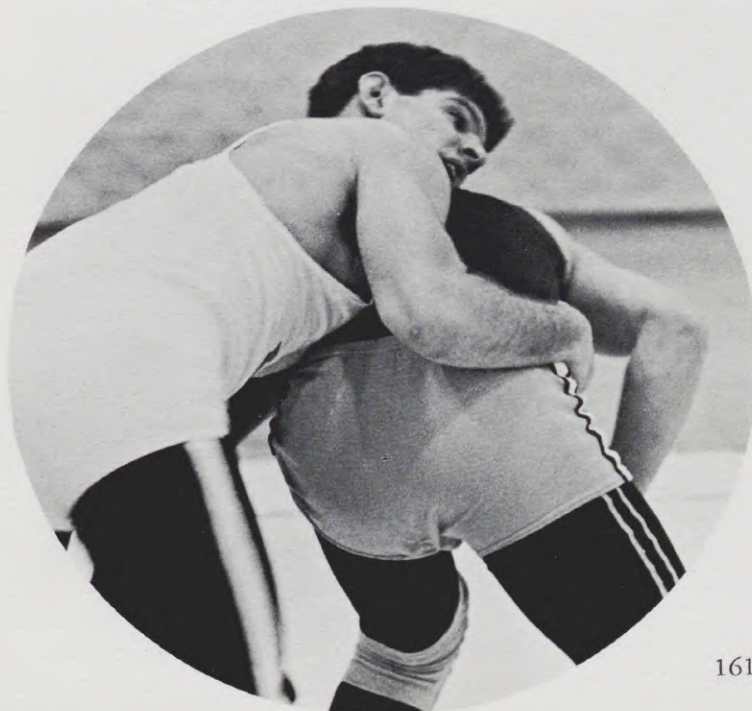

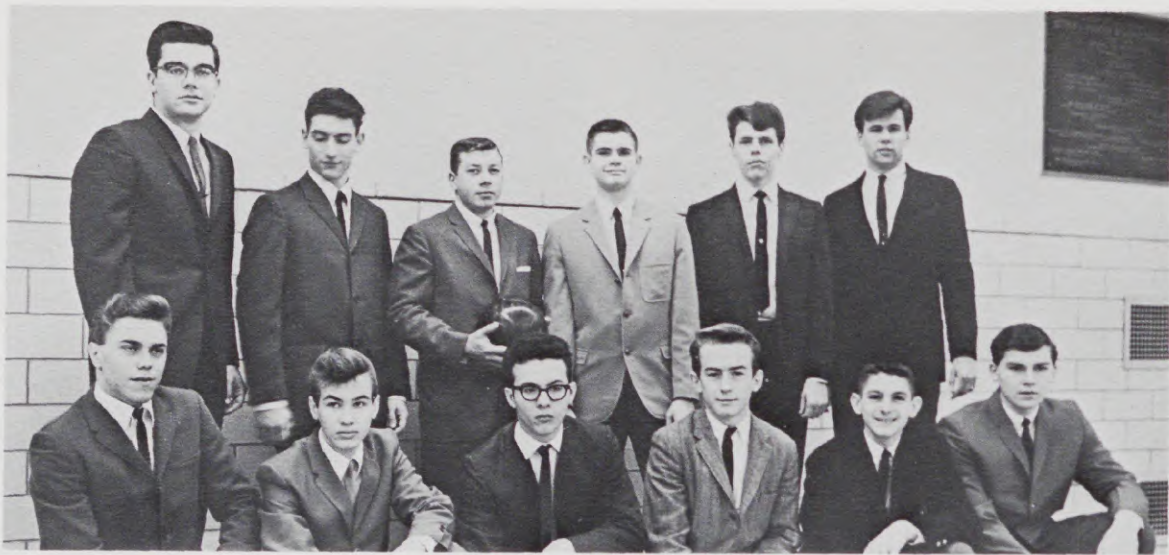

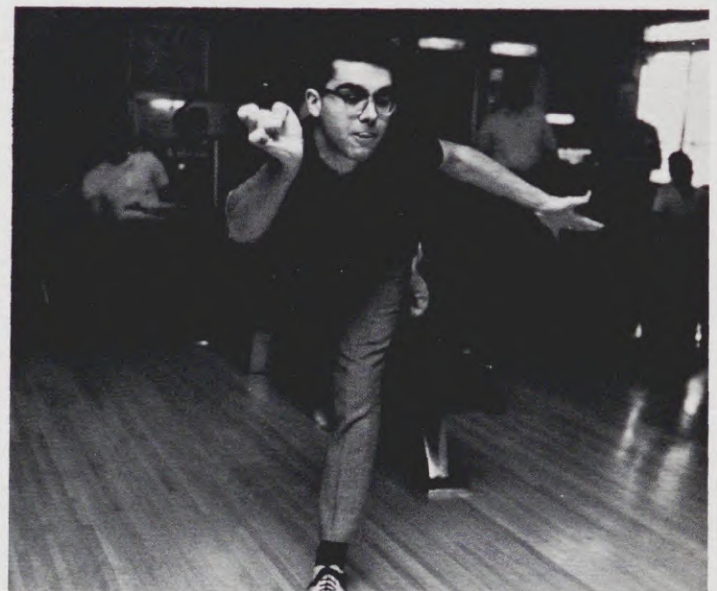

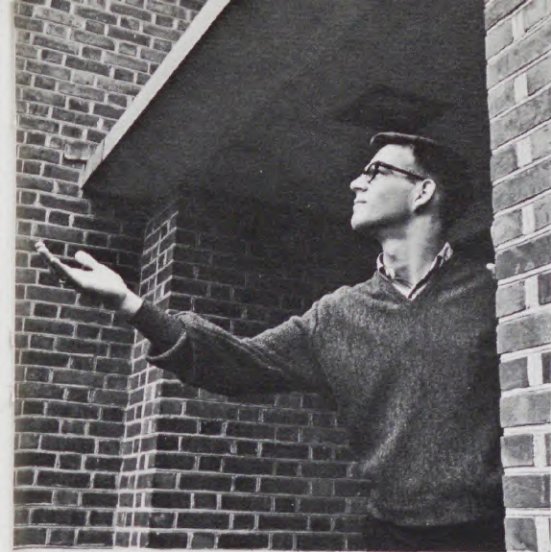

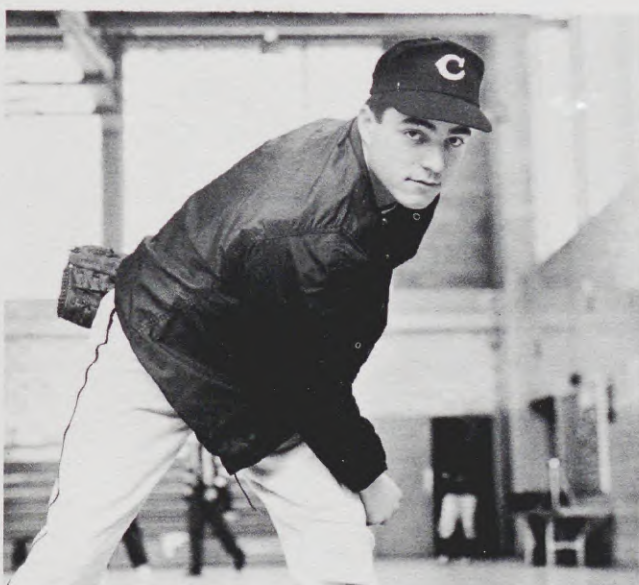

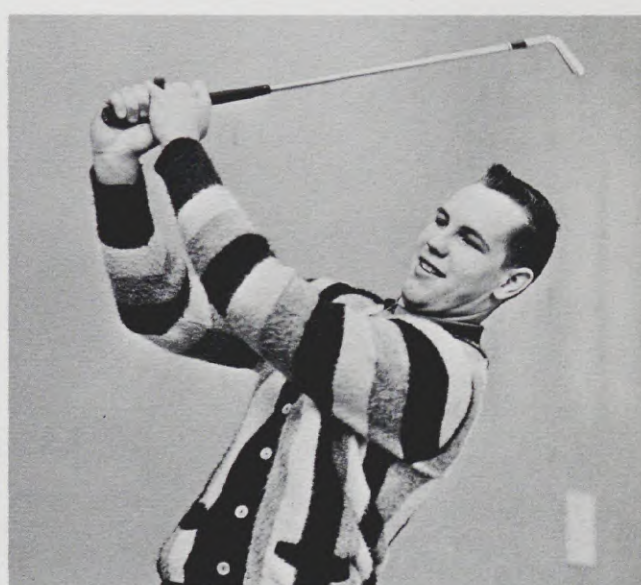
