On Sept. 9, 1887, he & his daughter were taking the 7:30 Somerville to N.Y. train. She got on the train but he stopped to talk to someone, then tried to get on the moving train. He fell & his feet went under the wheels, amputating them. He was about 63 & died 1 A.M., Sept. 10, 1887
- 10/22/31 - Cfd. Hist. Society moves into old Phillips house. Old cannon given by E.K. Adams on front porch. (See Cfd. Hist. Soc. card).

- 3/3/32 - According to Herodotus, 5/17/1872, Scudder farm bought by E.K. Adams. (Walnut Ave.)
- 3/17/32 - E.K. Adams gave the Revolutionary War cannon on porch of museum to the Historical Society. (See Hist. Soc. card.)
- According to Herodotus, 3/3/1874, Village alarmed by report half of village destroyed by fire. Full report not yet received but house of Adams occupied by Day, burned down.
- 3/24/32 - According to Herodotus, ~~Emmor~~ 4/20/1875, Emmor Adams elected to Twnshp. Comm. from 2nd Dist. (See Repub. Club card.)
- 3/31/32 - According to Herodotus, 5/2/1876, Wm. Bigelow & E.K. Adams delegates to Repub. State Convention.
- 9/8/32 - Newark Sunday Call has story of E.K. Adams (Feature writer, Robt. L. Moore). At age of 6 during Civil War, he wanted a drum. A lad next door went to war & brot back a pair of drum sticks. He still has 1 of them which started his collection of war relics. He sold his collection in 1931. He is V.P. of the Cfd. Historical Society. At 19, he was made e a deputy. Formed with others the Cfd. Detective ~~Force~~ Police. Since there was no jail

 9/8/32 (Cont.), they used box cars on the RR if, at night, until daylight when the prisoners were taken to Eliz. Sometimes the train would take off during the night. He was a volunteer fireman. As a boy he started a Cfd. newspaper, "The Times" which lasted 2 yrs. For last 37 yrs., has been agent for the Great American Insurance Co. of N.Y. In 1896 he married Lucy Miller. Has 2 daughters, Mrs. Oliver Richards & Miss Elizabeth Adams. He is 78. Collection sold included about 300 swords, 300 muskets, & several hundred pistols.

12/1/32 - E.K. Adams to give Indian Relics to Historical Society. Found on land by workmen of Sylvester Cahill, Jr., owner of land now occupied by Riverside. Land originally an Indian Village, according to tradition handed down to John D. Miller who died at 90 yrs. of age about 1880. Village was on homestead of Cahill, on bank of Rahway River, about 200 ft. NW of Prospect Ave. Sylvester Cahill, Jr., a nephew of Sr., who had a fine collection which was lost when Cahill mansion burned.

4/26/34 - ~~Emmor~~ K. Adams, Jr., 308 North Ave., 78, died 4/21. Came to Cfd. at 15 in Apr. 1870. (His father was 1st assessor and on the twnshp. comm. 1873-75). As a youth became interested in printing & took N.Y. job to learn the trade. At that time he founded "Cfd. Times" 1st issue May 1st, 1871. Gave up printing to enter father's real estate & insurance business. Organized Cfd. Thief Detecting Society & Cfd. Fire Dept. Was on Twnshp. Comm. for 1891-92, a freeholder 1896-1910, member Historical Society of which he was 1st VP at start in 1927 until his death. Leaves wife, 2 daughters, Mrs. Oliver Richards & Miss Eliz. Adams.
