7/4/46 - Louise and Harry Dill, deeded to Dorothy and C. E. Trubenbach property at 112-114 South Ave. E.

9/6/45 Truenbach opposes the petition for a town ordinance which intends to stop raising of live stock in town. He says it is too severe, and infringes on the rights of residents who have raised lives stock for 25 years or more.

- 5/10/10 - Twnshp Att. Austin finds old deed which conveyed tiny corner of Walnut & South to Twnshp., claimed by August Tuber.
- 7/26/28 - Ordinance introduced to dedicate small triangle plot on N.E. corner of South & Walnut for street purposes. This was deeded to the town in 1894 by an Augustus Tuber & wife. (See Cfd. Twnshp. Comm.)
- 3/24/32 - According to Herodotus, 7/13/1875, Augustus Tuber, owner of Central Hotel which burned to the ground. (See Cfd. Fire Dept.)
