- 3/2/96 (" " " ") E. C. Winckler bought from Mrs. Johnson, a 4-acre tract, 500 ft. on Union Ave. and the entire length of Washgtn Pl. Will clear and build 2 houses.
- 3/30/96 (" " " ") Set of recent maps shows Judge F. E. C. Winckler owns farm which will be divided in 68 lots next year, 32 lots on Johnson Ave., 8 lots on Elm St., 10 lots on South Ave., 52 on Willow St., 25 on Spofford Ave., 10 on Washgtn St., 7 on Union Ave., 5 on Lincoln Ave., & 3 on Casino Ave., All his lots are 50x150 or larger.
- 4/20/96 (" " " ") Break fire on South Ave. side of tracks. Winckler's home saved by back fire as there were no hydrants.
- 2/6/19 - Herbert Winckler, son of Mr. & Mrs. F. E. C. Winckler married a French girl, Henrietta Mannier, on 1/7/19, in France.

- 23/18/20 - Herbert Winckler, Jr., new Vice-Commander of new Newell Rodney Fiske Post, V.F.W.
- 3/24/27 - H. Winckler, Secy. Cfd. Republican Club, q.v.
- 9/13/28 - Fred Winckler, 607 Willow St., died 9/11. Came to Cfd. in 1889 and entered real estate business. Built about 35 homes here, some between Spgfld. & Orchard St., west of Hampton. Leaves his widow, Elise, daughter Marguerite, & son Herbert.
- 12/18/30 - H.R. Winckler named as Township Treasurer.
- 1/28/32 - Winckler attends dinner honoring Aldrich (See ^{Cfd} TwtnshpComm.)
- 9/22/32 - Herbert Winckler - 116 Benjamin St.
- 10/13/32 - Marguerite Winckler, daughter of late Fred & Mrs. Winckler, & Fred Cattanaoh of Union Ave. married 10/8/32.
- 11/27/41 - H.R. Winckler member of exec. comm. of Defense Council (See Defense Council card.)

- 1/22/96 - E.C. Winckler to erect another house on Roosevelt Manor, on site 2 lots away from one he is now building.
- 1/29/96 - Winckler's house on South Ave. to cost \$3425.
- " - E.C. Winckler of South Ave., has purchased the Sengstak propty. on Spgfld & Willow Aves., of 19 acres, including 75 building sites. The tract will be called Fairview Manor. It starts at Spgfld & West End Pl., & extends west to the Winckler farm. Southern boundary is the farms of Williams & Torbusch. Beside Willow St., 2 other streets, Lafayette Pl., & Wshgtn Pl., have been laid out in the area.
- 2/5/96 - Winckler has contractor John Waterson building 2000 ft. of board walk on Willow St., Fairview manor.
- 2/12/96 - E.C. Winckler to erect 3 houses in Fairview Manor in early spring.
- 2/19/96 - New Winckler house cost \$4150.
- 3/4/96 - E.C. Winckler bought a 4-acre tract from Mrs. Johnson. It has a 500-ft. front on (S,) Union Ave. and the entire length of Wshgtn Pl. He will immediately start 2 houses on Wshgtn Pl.

- 3/11/96 - Fred'k E.C. Winckler (Cit.) elected Justice of the Peace on 3/10, over S.J. Cox, Jr., (Rep.) & Harry Wilbur (Rep.) (See Cfd. Twnshp. Comm. card.)
- 3/18/96 - Fred'k E.C. Winckler 1st of 4 elected to School Bd., 3/17. (See Cfd. School Bd. card.)
- 3/25/96 - Fred Winckler, newly elected member Bd of Ed., attended re-organization mtg.
- 4/1/96 - Set of recent maps show how extensive are real estate holdings of Judge Fred E.C. Winckler. In addition to farm to be divided into 68 lots next spring, he has 32 lots on Johnson Ave., 8 on Elise St., 10 on South Ave., 52 on Willow St., 26 on Spgflsd Ave., 10 on Hamilton St. 7 on Union Ave., 5 on Lincoln, & 3 on Casino Ave. None are less than 50x100 & Many are larger. (See Chronicle)
- 4/15/96 - Real estate transfers: J. Walter Thompson to Fred Winckler, a lot on Casino Ave. (See Thompson card.)
- 4/22/96 - The woods just beyond the Winckler houses on South Ave., discovered burning. on Sat. As no hydrant was near, the started backfires thus saving the houses.

1/16/47 - Mrs. Elsie Winckler, widow of Frederick E.C. Winckler of 721 Willow St. died 1/12. She was born in Dresden, Germany, the daughter of Rudolph E. and Theresa Schilling Stadler. She came to the USA in 1886 and ;to Cranford in 1890. She was the organizer of the Visiting Nurses Assoc. a member of the Rose Villa Music Club and leaves a daughter, Mrs. Marguerite Elise Cattanick with whom she lived, and a Son Herbert R. Winckler of Bradentown Fl., former Township Treasurer.
