7/28/10- So-called "Daylight Saving" has been found to work well at American Bank Note Co. in Ottawa. St. Paul has agreed to try it at 89 manufacturing concerns employing 6,000 people.

Dayton St.

10/12/00 - Centennial Ave., did not cross the RR. People wanted ~~Dayton~~ Dayton St., put in to connect South Ave. near Centennial to North Ave., near Trinity Church. At this point, the tracks are high enough to tunnel under.

- 12/11/41 - More than 1000 have signed up in Cfd. for defense council units. Defense Chrnm Herbert Winckler. (See World War II card for division chairmen.)
- 12/25/41 - Air raid wardens named for 10 districts with Louis R. Allison as chief. (See World War II card for chairmen)
- 2/5/42 - Capt. Chas. Christian of reserves & Defense Council called for active duty. Replacement is Edgar Miller, 4 Pittsfield.
- 2/12/42 - Local Defense Council needs volunteers for blood typing. (See Red Cross)
- Two Casualty stations set up in event of air raids. One, at Cfd. Hall with Dr. Frank L. Foster in charge, staffed by Dr. Alb. Lewis, Dr. Fletch Gilpin, Dr. Sidney Carsley, & Dr. Carl Hansen,. Second at H.S. under Dr. Rowland Blythe, with Dr. Newbury, Dr. Canright, Dr. Zingales, & Dr. Terrell.
- 3/5/42 - Newspaper collection 3/15. Proceeds to help defray Defense Council expenses.
- 3/19/42 - Almost 75,000 lbs. of paper collected give \$523.14 to the Defense Council.

Defense Council

- 6/19/41 - Local Defense Council calls for at least 700 volunteers in case of emergency. (Also see World War II card.)
- 6/20/40 - (From Amer. Legion card.) Organization of an emergency mobilization squad to re-inforce local police in a crisis approved by Amer. Legion at a Casino mtg. (See Amer. Legion card.)
- 6/26/41 - 2500 Home Defense Volunteers to register 7/8, in Cfd. Present plans call for training pf police & fire units, 1st-aid squad, motor vehicle corps, a minimum of 696 workers. Also needed are 1300 for air raid wardens, 250 for feeding units & 250 for debris, rescue & clerical work.
- 8/21/41 - Local Defense Council forms 10 First-Aid Units.
- 10/16/41 - Defense volunteers divided into 12 units, will undergo 10-week course of instructions. Each unit has 10 to 12 members.
- 11/27/41 - Local Defense Council organized with exec. comm. consisting of H.R.Winckler, C.K.Sellers, Clarence Victor Mrs. G. Crosby & Louis Allison.
- 2/6/41 - Cooper heads Defense Council.

- 9/17/42 - Dr. Carl Hanson appointed member of local Defense Council to succeed Dr. Castaldo who was called into service.  
- To conduct survey for housing evacuees, if necessary.
- 10/1/42 - Medical unit of Defense Council re-organized under direction of Dr. Hanson, by order of state Defense Council. Ordered to be set up & ready for use immediately.
- 11/26/42 - Motor Corps of Cfd. Defense Council, organized, and is all set for any emergency.  
- Hebert Winckler resigns as Civilian Defense head due to time necessary to be used. Sellers will be acting head until there is a new appointment.
- 12/10/42 - Sellers named new chairman of the Defense Committee.  
- Civilian Defense organization resumes.
- 12/24/42 - Rotary donates \$400 for an inhalator & resuscitator to the twndshp. emergency facilities.
- 12/31/42 - Amer. Red Cross Fund for a mobile kitchen at \$1946.
- 4/15/43 - New Mobile Kitchen presented to Red Cross (See R.C.)  
- Last Fri. (4/9), blackout of 43 min/ was successful.  
House lights reported on at 2 homes, lights on in cellar of Christian Science Church & at 500 S. Union Av also street lights in 7 spots. On hand were 21 Defense Council members in central area, Rescue Squad 15 (over)

4/15/43 (Cont.) Motor Corps 4, Regular Police 18, auxiliary police 16, auxiliary firemen 35 & air raid wardens about 600. At the English Village casualty station were 2 doctors, 3 messengers, 1 nurse, 1 aide, 1 ambulance, 2 motor corps workers & 2 quartermasters. At Lincoln station were 3 doctors, 4 nurses, 2 aides, 1 motor corps worker, 1 feeding unit member, 2 communications members and 1 ambulance.

4/29/43 - Black-out test in surprise. 49-min. test. May buy 2 more sirens so they will be more audible.

5/13/43 - 20 tons of metal collected 5/9/43.

- Morning Air Raid Test was very successful.

6/3/43 - Late air raid test 5/28 - 10:09 to 10:59 all clear. Nets 8 violations of lights left on. 1st alert just as HS graduates were leaving school.

6/10/43 - No violations reported during test blackout of over 1 hour on 6/8/43.

6/17/43 - Twnshp. Engr. McLaughlin appointed to Defense Council to succeed Comm. Herbert Winckler who resigned last Nov.

6/24/43 - C&C 50th Anniversary Issue, events:

Home Guard of 1917.

8/26/43 - Cfd Civilian Defense Council has completed new control center in accordance with State Civil Defense requirements.

- Test blackout on 8/23 went smoothly. Blue signal 9:25, red signal, 9:35, all clear at 9:55 P.M.

10/28/43 - Information Center of the Defense Council has moved from 29 N. Union to 104 No. Union Ave.

11/4/43 - Dimout ends & neon store signs are turned on again. Headlights must be unmasked.

11/11/43 - Stan MacClary says town collections of tin cans will be discontinued on a house-to-house basis. Hereafter residents are to place cans in containers which will be placed in front of food stores.

- 38 tons of paper collected on 11/7/43.

12/9/43 - Black out on 12/2, termed a success.

1/27/44 - Paper Drive, Sunday 1/30/44.

2/3/44 - Picture of truck & workers in paper drive, 1/30. There were 62 tons picked up.

4/13/44 - Clarence Victor, active in Civil Defense Council, transferred to new Mass. plant, after 17 yrs. (See Victor).

9/14/44 - Carroll Sellers (head of Defense Council) advocates expression of joy at anticipated D-Day.

11/9/44 - 50 tons of paper collected 11/5/44.
