- 3/28/18 - Liberty Loan Parade 4/6/18. Flag Pole for which funds were raised will be erected in Mac Connell triangle. Marshall will be Robt. E. Crane who is in charge.

- 5/2/18 - Editorial on gossip all around concerning pro-Germans.
- 5/30/18 - Kenneth Culbert, 22, killed in France. Wife was former Miriam Towl.
- 26/13/18 - Home Guard collected up all Hearst papers on Sunday from homes & burned them. They gave another paper in place of it. 6 persons refused to give them up. About 300 copies were picked up.
- 6/13/18 - Letters from Wm. Sperry concerning his loyalty. Some high-ups started rumors when he refused to sign calling for exterminating all German men, women & children because they are German. He says such is unchristian, that Prussianism must be exterminated.

6/27/18 - Woman's Land Army, 18 yrs. old or over, to work on farms. Camp where they live is near Summit. Receive \$15 a month, room and lodging. Farmers where they work pay 25¢ an hour, and this covers pay, room and board expenses.

27/4/18 - List of Service Men.

7/4/18 - Parade to start from RR area and end at ball grounds on Orchard St. (Center of town to be roped off). Reviewing stand will be at rear of station. Service Flag with 217 stars to be presented to town. There will also be reviewing stand at baseball field.

7/11/18 - Guard detail of Cfd. Militia Reserve called out Mond. 7/8, to protect a plane from Signal Corps Co. at Little Silver. Engine trouble while flying over Cfd. forced landing at Osceola Farm cornfield. While trying to take off, pilot ran into a ditch and broke a propeller. As it had to stay overnight for repairs, Home Guard was called out. Repairs made by 2³⁰ PM the next day and took off after cornfield was mowed to give it room.

- 7/11/18 - Dr. E.C. Lavab, Kenilworth principal cleared of disloyalty charges and remained head of Knlwth Schools. Jr. O.U.A.M. of Cfd. has charged disloyalty because he said teachers did not have time to sell Thrift Stamps. Due to coal shortage, ~~xxx~~ schools closed part of time last winter and sessions had to be lengthened by $\frac{1}{2}$ hour daily to get school work done and all the time had to be used in academic subjects. Jr. Order agreed the charges were not proven.
- 7/11/18 - Schools to give working papers to children under 16. No child under 14 will be allowed to work in a factory. Mrs. Furman, 209 Union Ave. will issue working papers 8 to 9AM, weekdays.
- 7/18/18 - Third Gold Star, Wm. A. Hale, killed at Curtiss Field in Buffalo. He & Pilot Sharp had their engine quit too near the ground. Parents, Mr. & Mrs. E.W. Hale, 18 Cranford Ave. He leaves also a brother Frank & 2 sisters, Miss Alice Hale and Mrs. Button.
- 7/25/18 - Arthur Wesighan, 23, died at Camp Bowie, Ft. Worth, Tex., after a motorcycle accident. Leaves wife, parents from the Normandy Park area, 3 sisters, Mrs. Chas. Kaylor, Mrs. Minnie Galvin, & Miss Hannah Wesighan, & 3 bro., Chas, Wm. & Fred,

- 10/10/18 - Morgan Explosion 10/2. 94 killed. 165 refugees brought to Cfd.'s Cleveland School & Presby. Church. Started 10/4 and was at its worst on Sat. Grau, Shapiro & Apollo lost windows.
