SOCCER

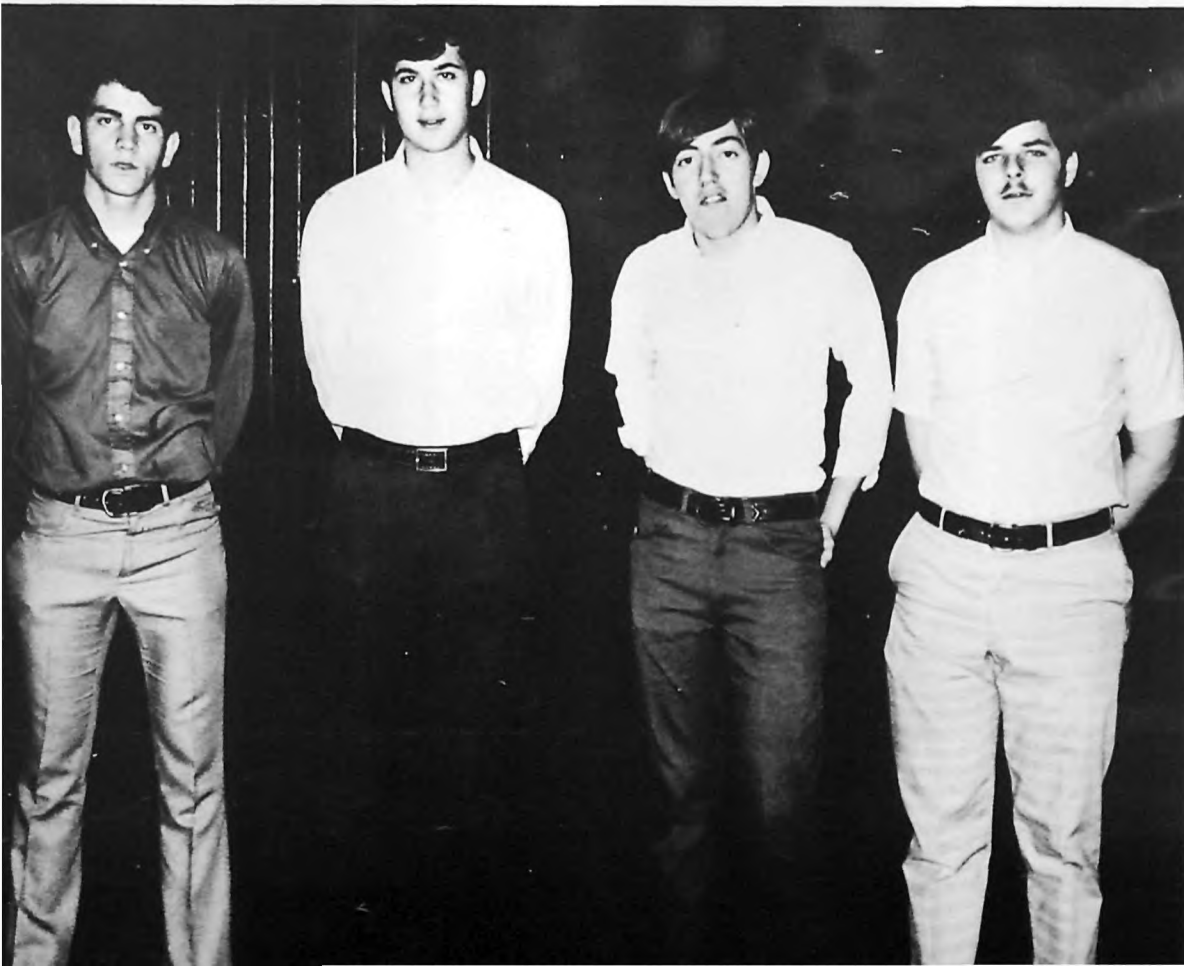

BASKETBALL

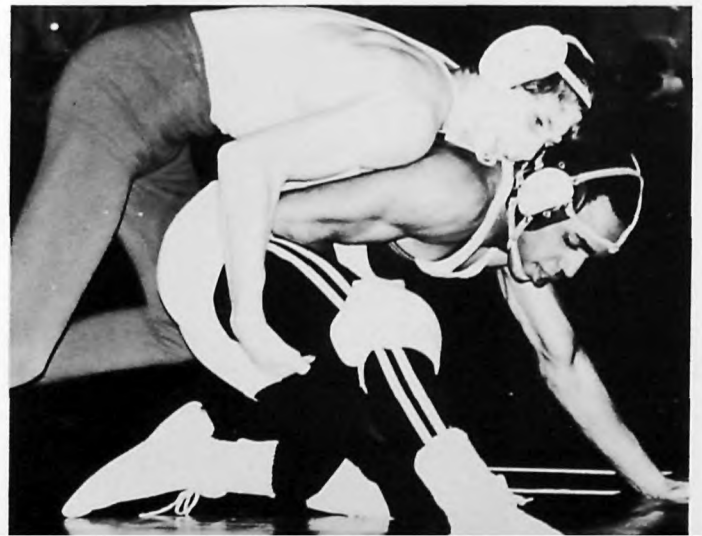
