Seventy-three students "died" on Thursday, October 19, 1989 at C.H.S. This was part of a program that Student Assistance Counselor Angelo Pierri and fellow alumna Candace Pierria initiated to inform students that drug and alcohol use is not a joke.

Everyday, within the six hours that are spent in school, about seventy-five students nationwide are killed from drug related accidents. In fact, a death occurs every five minutes.

Therefore, Pierri had seventy-three students, consisting of the Drug Free

Youth Club and Peer Development participate. Every five minutes a student would get their face painted white to indicate their death; in addition they were given a sign to wear around their neck stating how they "died" by drugs or alcohol.


Pierri wanted to get the whole school involved in drug awareness. "The program was aimed at scaring people," Mr. Pierri said. "Listen to your heart, not your head, not your friend sitting next to you - your heart."

#### CHS Gets Fired Up





### English







Some department members have noticed a conservative attitude among students. One noted how the students have become more concerned with academics and grades. They are concerned with maintaining their present standard of living or bettering it.








### Industrial Arts

Members of the Special Services staff are always available and willing to listen to a student, no matter what the concern may be.





## Business Department



### Guidance Department

Guidance counselors coordinate spring testing, and, during the eighties, the career development programs.

Besides their practical knowledge of high school courses, colleges, and employment opportunities, guidance counselors have information on each student's progress throughout the school year. They often set up conferences for parents and students, especially after mid-marking period progress reports.

Perhaps the most vital skill a student learns from his or her guidance counselor is that of decision-making, an essential element in everyone's life.


