



The History Of Linden

Did you ever wonder how Linden was born? The Township of Linden was actually created from Elizabeth and Rahway on March 4, 1861. Our town adopted its name from the many beautiful Linden trees in the area. The government of the Township of Linden was made up of a Township Committee. The members of this committee were elected to represent various districts. A chairman, equivalent to the present position of mayor, was elected by this committee.

At this time, Linden's main occupations included farming, cattle raising, and small industries such as manufacturing, grist mills, saw mills, tanneries, and breweries. About the year 1900, oil and chemical plants were built in the Tremley area.

The center of cummunity life in the 1800's was in an old school house. Club meetings and parties were held here. Among the participating organizations were the Chimes, Bachelor's Club, Musical Society, and Ladies Aids.

From 1865 to the end of the Century, Linden was overcome by a spirit of expansion which led to rapid community growth. Several new families came to Linden, most of whom had business pursuits in downtown New York.

This commuting fraction of the Township formed a Borough on March 8, 1882. The cause of the withdrawal was the difference in the nature of the community. The Borough was strictly residential. These people wanted such improvements as sidewalks, roads, and streetlights. However on January 1, 1925, the Townships of Linden were consolidated to form the City Of Linden. The Mayor-Council type of government was adopted as the form of management of the city, Modern Linden developed from 1925 on. It has become an industrial suburban community.

It was in September, 1910, that Linden began its four-year high school. Approval by the New Jersey Department of Education came later in February, 1911. The first graduation class had just three members.

Our first building was a temporary one and included an elementary school as well as the high school. The elementary school and the high school then moved to the Number 1 school building. It was in September, 1925, that the high school moved to its present building and the first class to graduate from there was the Class of 1926. The enrollment of the high school increased so rapidly that the classes were on part-time during 1931-1932, and two wings had to be added to the building.

Linden High School was one of the first high schools in New Jersey to become a member of the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools. It has been approved by that accrediting agency ever since.

We the 75th graduating class of Linden High are proud of our school and its history.

When he took the position of superintendent in 1972, he was well equipped with the experience needed for the position. In his years in office he established employment orientation for handicapped students, the placement of computers in schools, and an all-day kindergarten. His major goal however, was to diversify the school curriculum, and in doing so he created a vocational program that emphasized on the basics, while giving a student a saleable skill. Mr. Taranto has placed his pride in his accomplishments, and he feels he has created the best school system in the county. We are also proud of him and his achievements, and we give him our thanks for his years of dedication.




BOYS CROSS COUNTRY


The club meets weekly during the morning homeroom period to discuss fundraisers, social activities and competitive events.
