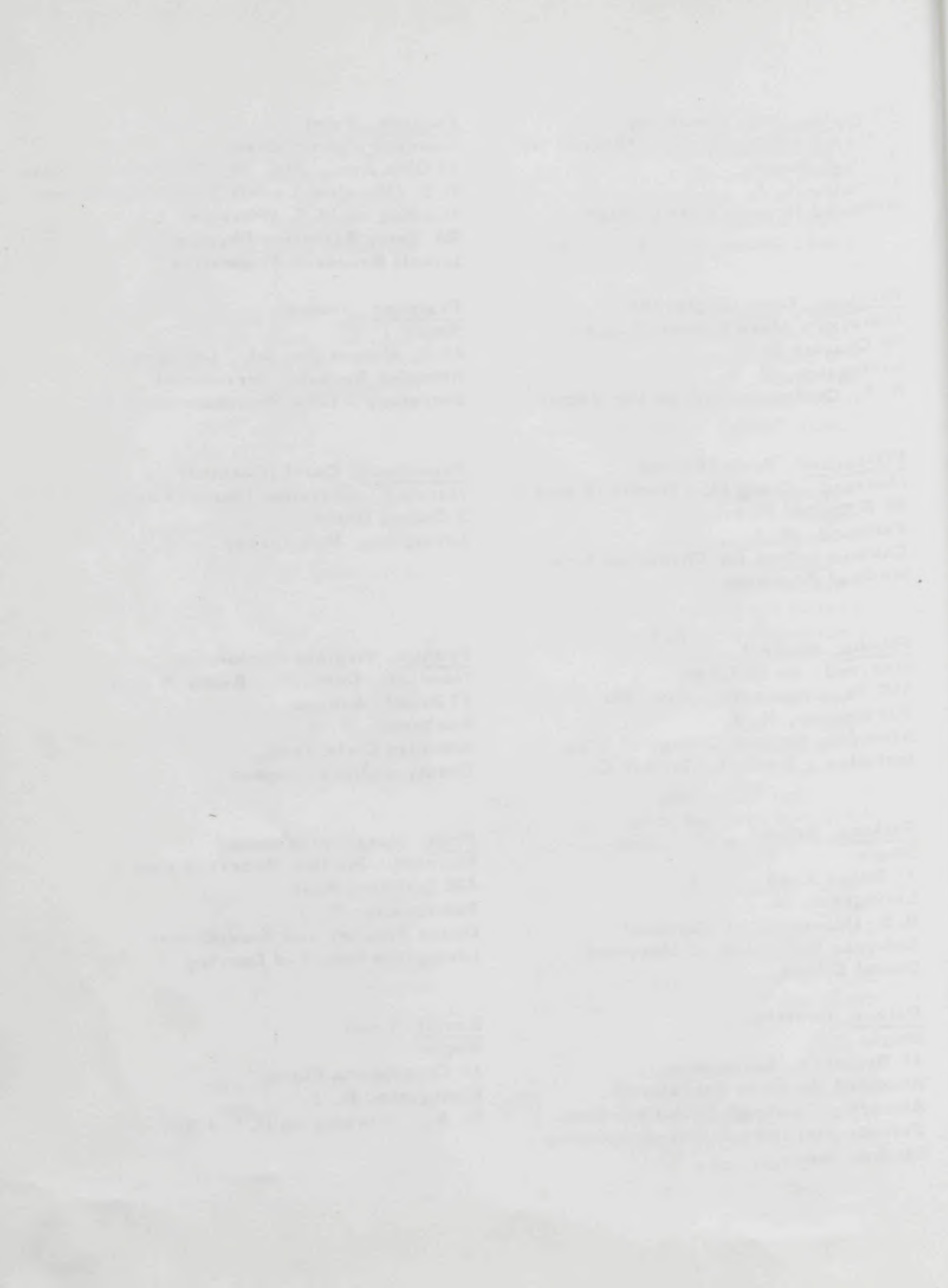

Foreword

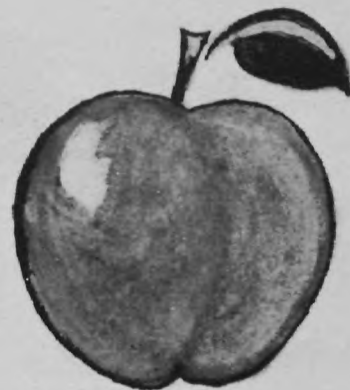

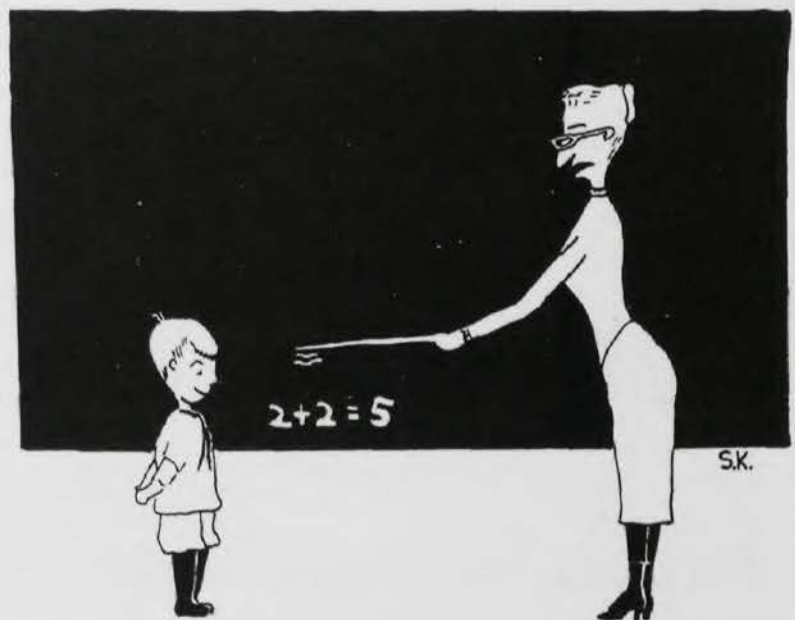

The unevenness of our road to learning presented us with many problems. You were always there when we needed you the most. We found you waiting, ever anxious to help.

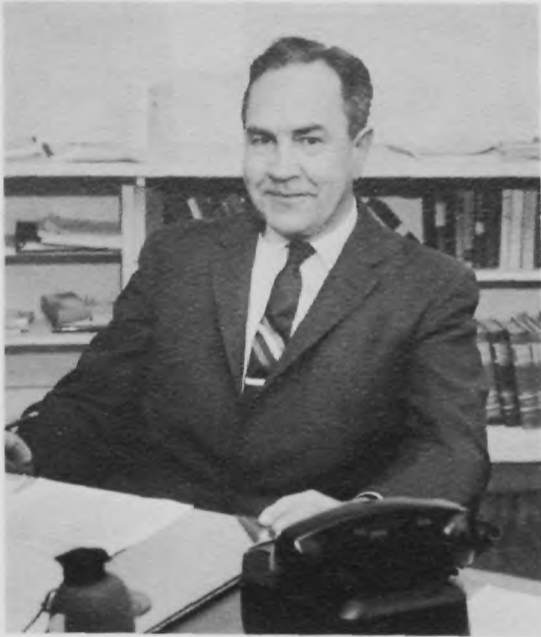

Livingston High's football team lived up to pre-seasonal predictions of being one of the state's top Group III teams. The Lancers finished with a 7-1-1 record, taking the Jersey Hills Conference Title for the first time.

In the first game Livingston was held by a surprisingly stubborn Millburn team to a 7-7 tie. The Millers tied it up in the final seconds of the game. The next game was the first home game of the season, initiating Conference play for the Lancers. It was also the first victory as Livingston rolled over Roxbury, 39-6. The following Saturday, the only setback of the season was suffered at the hands of a strong Verona team, 26-7. In the fourth game the Lancers rebounded by dumping Morristown, 26-6, as Don McKay scored all of Livingston's points. This was the second Conference victory. Livingston then avenged last year's tough loss to Caldwell, topping them by a score of 19-7. The following Saturday, Livingston returned to Conference play by meeting Parsippany. After trailing 12-6 in the second quarter, the Lancers rallied and defeated the Indians, 34-12. The next week the Lancers traveled to Hanover Park and pushed through the mud for their fifth victory by the score of 39-20. This was the fourth Conference win without a defeat. Livingston's next victim was Clifford Scott, as they fell 26-14. The Lancers clinched the Conference Title and ended their most successful season on Thanksgiving Day. They easily defeated Morris Hills,

37-0, on brilliant runs by Bob Matten and Don McKay.

Livingston's coaching staff was made up of head coach Allen Jacobson and his assistants, Charles Paul, Anthony Hope, Charles Berry, and William Graham.

Tailback Don McKay, who was named to the All-Group III, All-County, and All-Conference teams, sparked the Lancers' offense. Aside from these honors, he also led the state in scoring, rolling up 168 points. He was ably assisted by wingback Bob Matten, whose reverses and pass receptions dazzled the crowds. Jeff Allen, the Lancers' blocking back, was the man responsible for opening up the holes in the line. Usually seen busting up the middle for valuable yards was fullback Pete Marinaro.

The Lancers' powerful line, led by Co-Captains Harry Hansen and Sal Anicito, was one of the main reasons for the team's successful season. Interior linemen John Dowd, Jim Kraeutler, Mark Golden, Bennett Paul, John Durish, and Jack Washko were seen throwing key blocks throughout the season. The line was flanked by three fine ends, Ted Bertsch, Ed Danckwerth, and Mike Thaw. Anicito was a third-team All-County selection, while Thaw was named on the third team for Group III schools in the state.

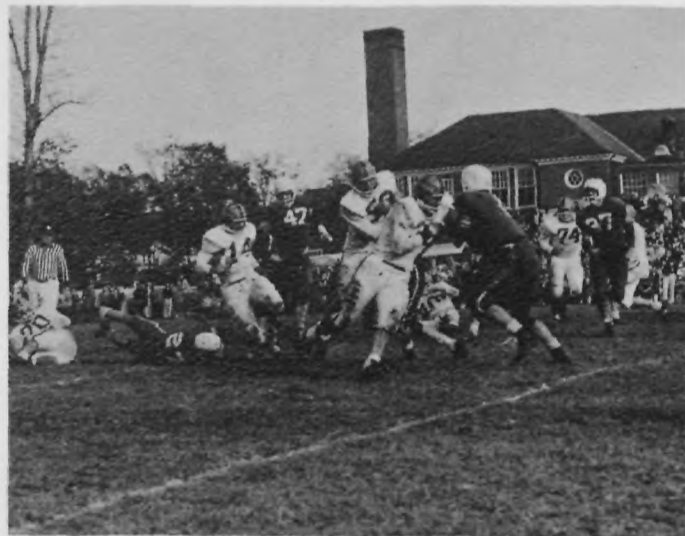

Conference Champs

Livingston High's Varsity Basketball team successfully defended its Jersey Hills Conference Championship. The Lancers compiled an 8-2 record in conference play and an overall mark of 15-5. The Lancers were faced with much stiffer competition than in previous years. Much of the strong competition came from the strong Morristown team. In the first Livingston-Morristown meeting, the Lancers were beaten 84-74 in a hard-fought game. 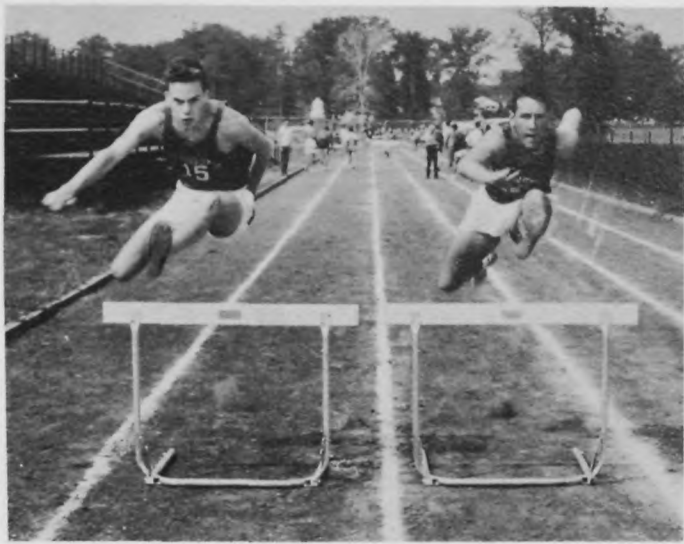
TRACK

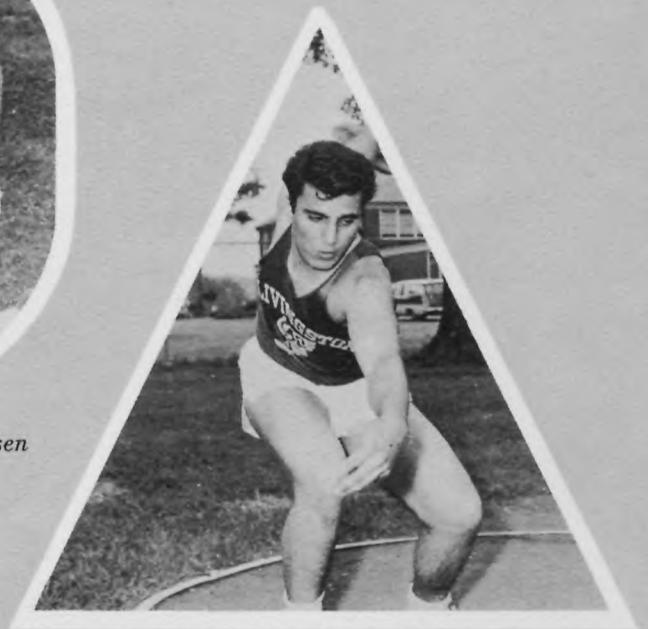

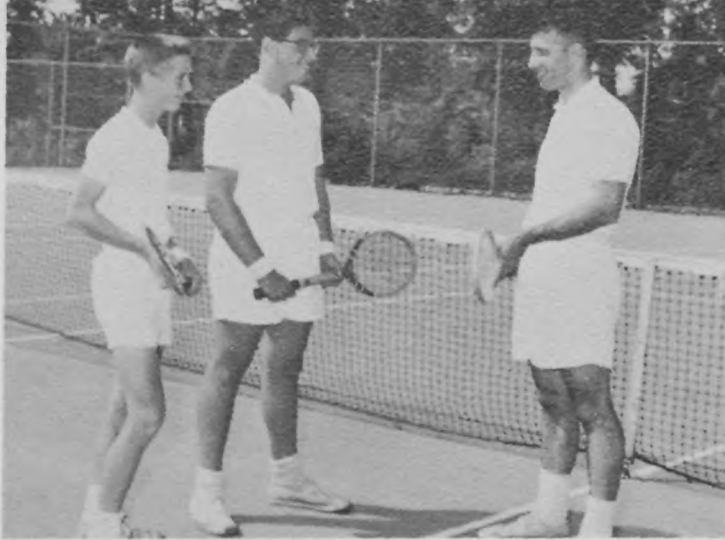

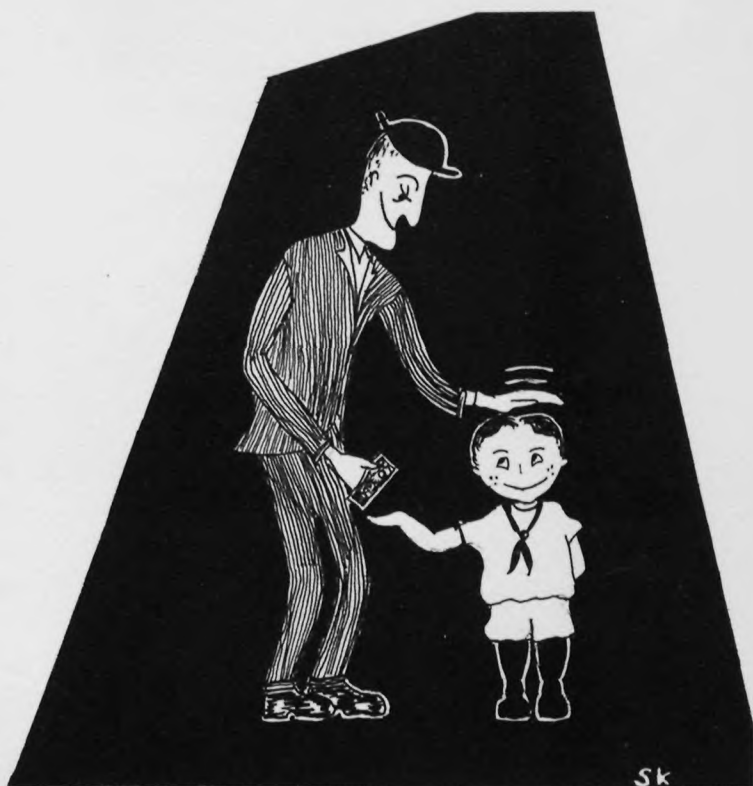
