And as a final tribute, to the future Seniors, we leave the greatest dream of all, graduation, and our very best wishes for a happy and most prosperous future.

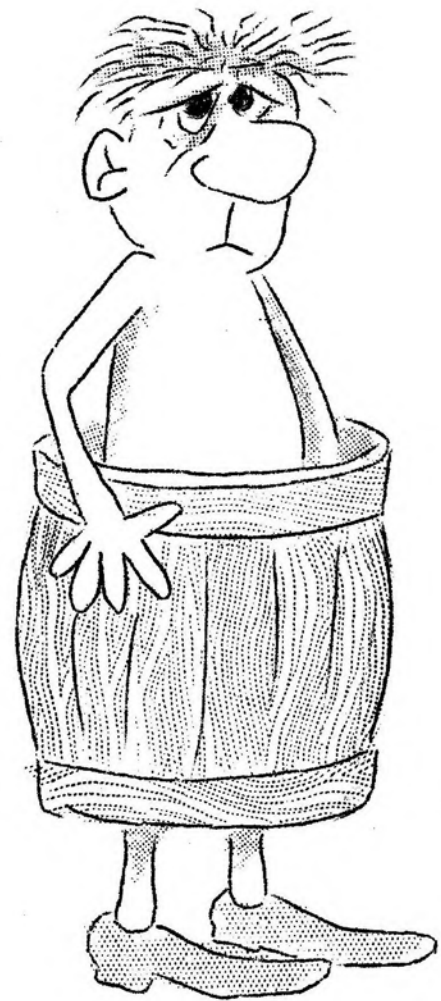
We bequeath to the entire student body all the hopes, ambitions, and high ideals which we, as Seniors, have possessed.

Language

It is the task of the foreign language department to produce skilled technicians trained to serve our country and the cause of international peace and friendship. Drill in the language laboratory, extensive reading, correspondence with pen-pals, and prepared and extemporaneous discussion and conversation are but a few of the activities engaged in to achieve this goal.

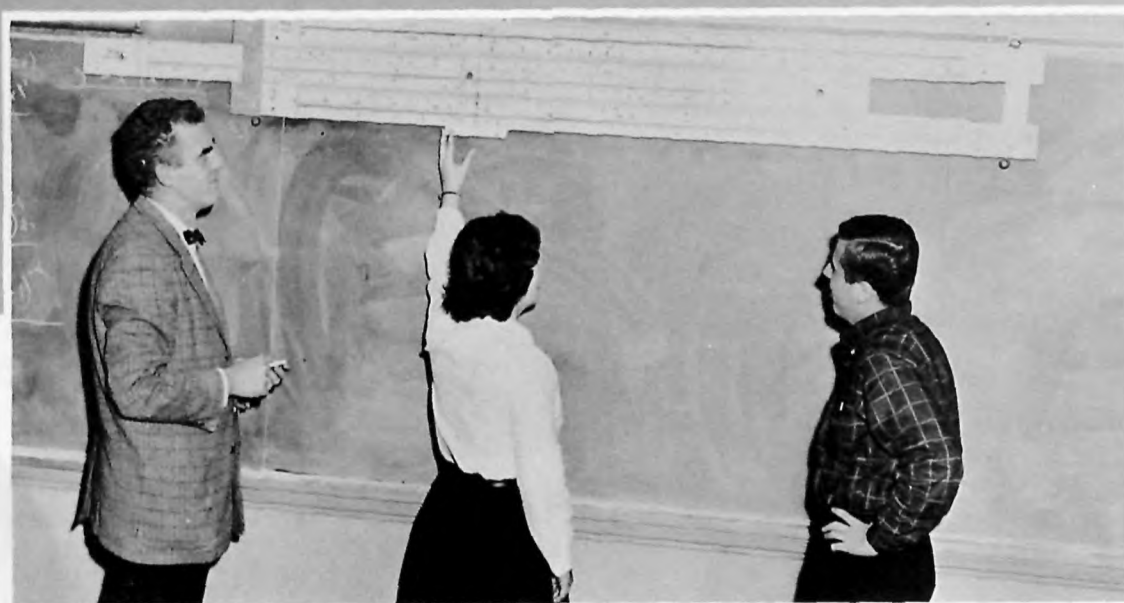
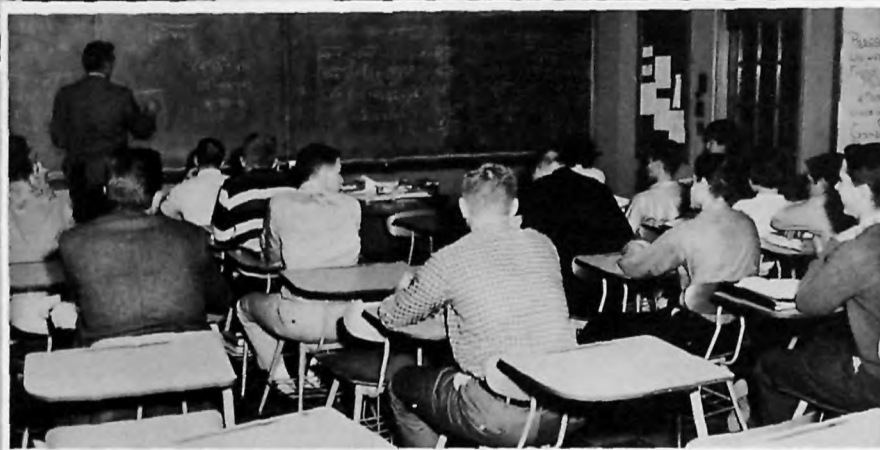
Science

Mathematics

The major goals of the Math Department are still deeply imbued with two unique features: the ability of mathematics to describe physical phenomena in our world and the fact that mathematical forms are truly ideal in extracting the simple from immense complexities. We seek to develop two basic abilities: (1) an ability to capture a real problem in a mathematical capsule; (2) a quality of reflective thought which can penetrate to the heart of the problem. These are two prized possessions towards which the mathematics department is continually striving.

We employ two basic techniques for discovering knowledge in mathematics, the deductive and inductive approaches. The first is a development that proceeds from preestablished

knowledge or assumptions and arrives at new facts; the second method is the experimental approach where students observe several trials until a pattern is discovered.

In every mathematical program there are differences in need and in speed of assimilation. Our program at Livingston provides avenues of acceleration, Advanced Placement in Calculus, enrichment in more recent mathematical topics, as well as a basic program featuring mathematics for everyday life. Our courses reflect the very latest secondary school recommendations.

Although mathematics is demanding in its precise forms, still we hope to convey a bit of its adventuresome spirit to our students and to share moments of discovery with humility.

Business

The Business Department of Livingston High School is divided into three major curriculum areas:

1. Our Skill subject offerings include Typewriting, Stenography, Office Practice, and Transcription which provide specialized training in a useful and marketable skill.
2. Our second area of Computational Skill Offerings includes Bookkeeping, Record Keeping, Business Mathematics, and Commercial Arithmetic. These subjects help to provide training for intelligent participation in business life.
3. Our Social Business Offerings include Introduction to Business, Salesmanship, Consumer Education, Business Law, and Economics. These subjects help to give students the necessary background in basic economic and sales education that is so desirable in our complex economic society.

In summary, the Business Department is a Department with DUAL responsibilities — responsibilities for training business students with the tools to get a business job, hold it after they get it, and advance in the job — and responsibilities to provide all college-bound students the opportunity to master new skills in learning to typewrite, and to take notes, since these are considered so necessary for success in college. The study of economics further provides for more competence on the part of the student in dealing with daily economic decisions and current economic issues of our times.

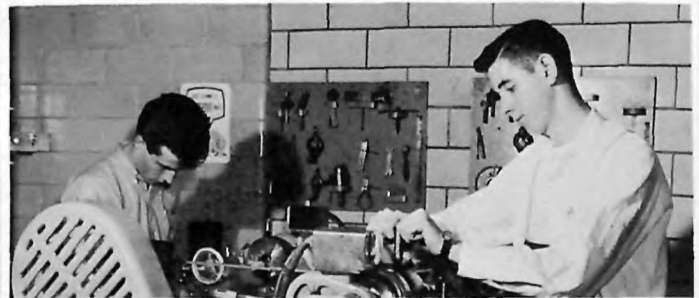
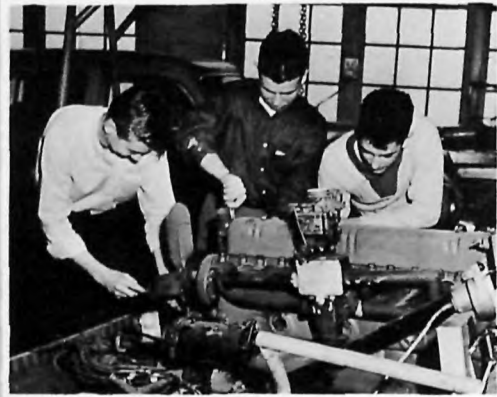
Industrial Arts

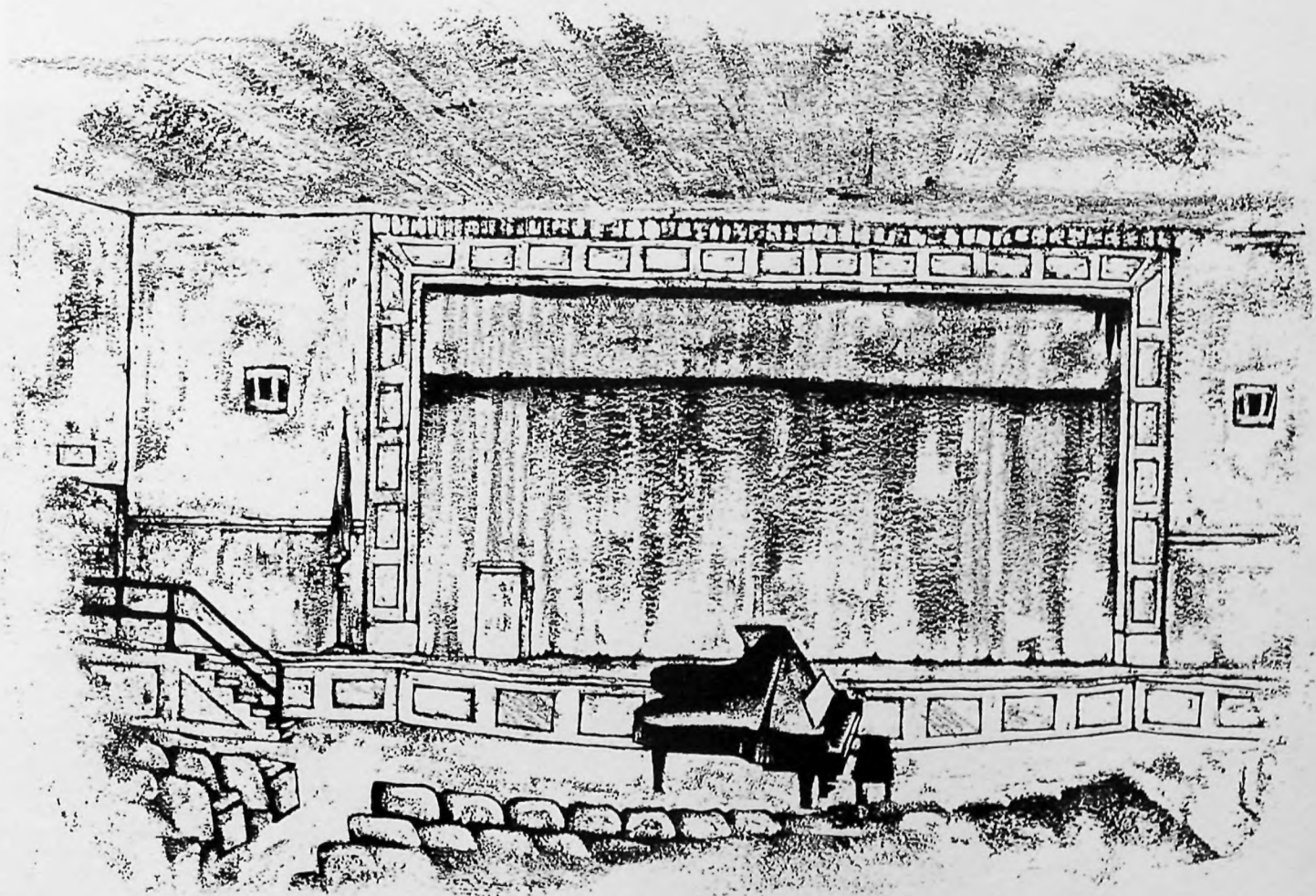

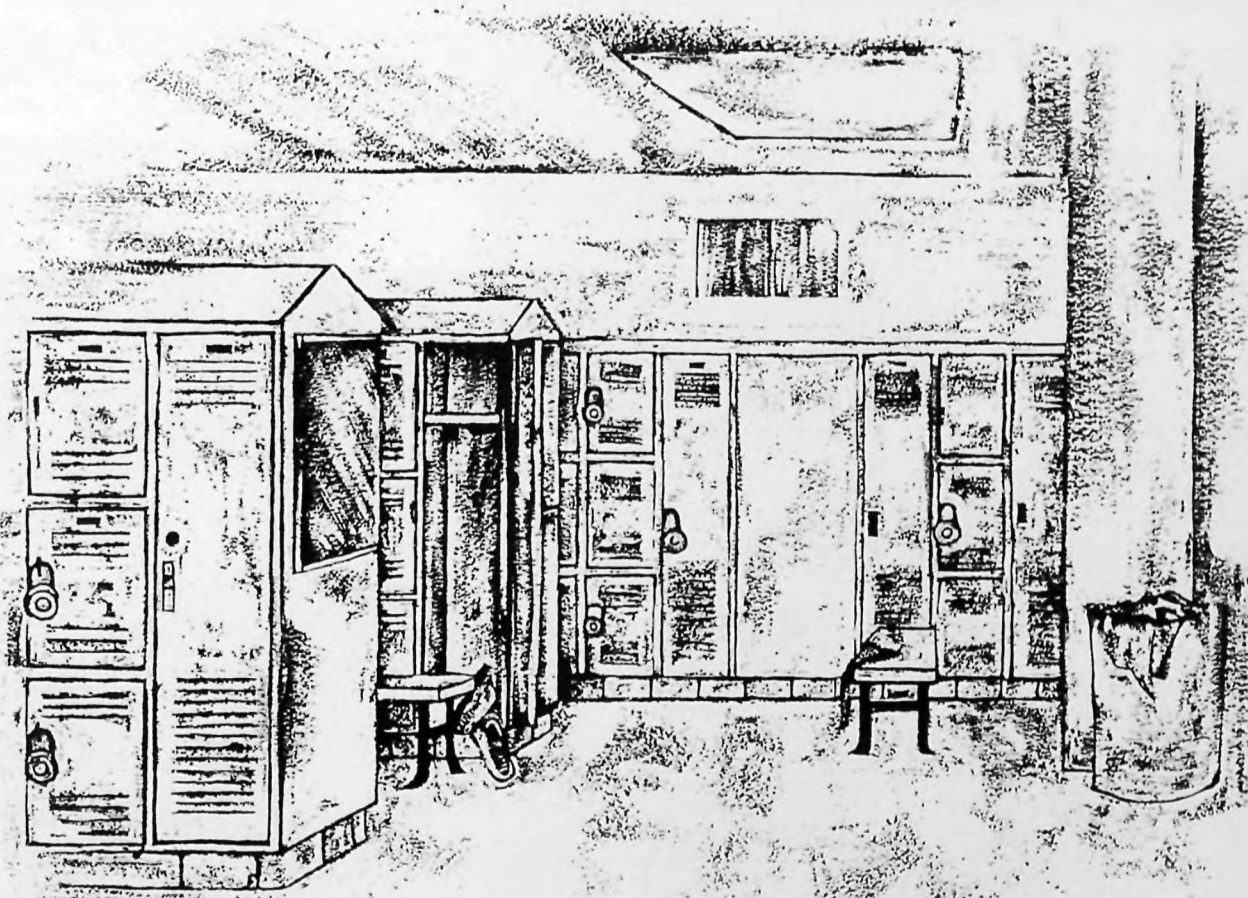

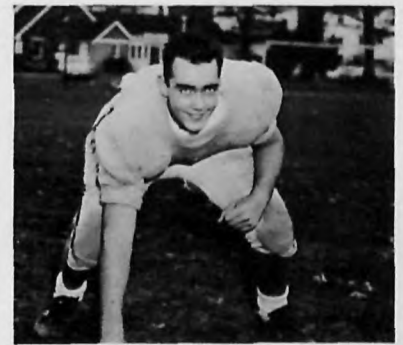
JOE WARD earned his letter at defensive end in his senior year. He played J. V. ball as a sophomore and Varsity as a junior. His efforts will be missed.

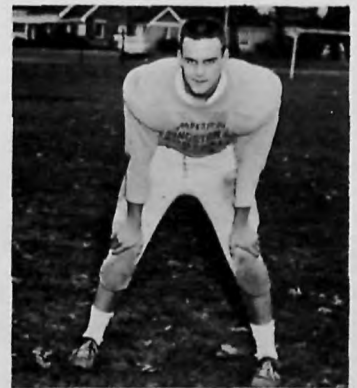
BOB MARSH played Varsity tackle for two years and always gave a fine defensive performance. The gap which Bob leaves will not easily be filled.

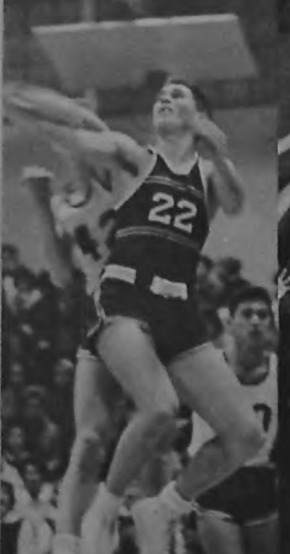
