
DEDICATION








The announcement in February of our beautiful Campus Queen, Nancy Freeman, was second in suspense only to that of the Miss America Pageant.

It has been rare occasions throughout high school when Whitey has not been guarded by two and sometimes three defenders. Yet he still managed a 34 point average and a multitude of assists. He can dribble with the best of them, and has often been called upon to bring the ball up-court in tight situations. There is no doubt that he will make a first rate college guard. The unending number of college scouts, including Bob Cousy, who have come to see him play can attest to that.

Our sincere congratulations to the Lancer basketball team on their very outstanding performance in '66 and best wishes to the team of '67.





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


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FAREWELL
