SENIOR SERVICE PROGRAM

The Senior Service Program at our high school permits seniors to serve as volunteer assistants on a daily basis for a semester at local elementary schools. It was developed to provide educational experiences, to serve as a natural outlet for the social service inclinations of teenage students, and to introduce students to teaching or an allied professional career.

Students selected for the program attend high school classes for four or five periods each day and devote the rest of the day to assisting at the grade level and local school of their choice. As beginning aides in the classroom, the Senior Service students spend some time observing the classroom procedures and becoming acquainted with the students. Gradually, they become involved in tutoring small groups of students or individual students who require additional instruction or support and, at times, they may work with the entire class. Students in this program have proved to be of invaluable assistance in carrying out related teaching activities such as preparing tests, correcting papers, recording grades, operating audio-visual equipment and duplicating machines, preparing bulletin board displays, typing stencils.

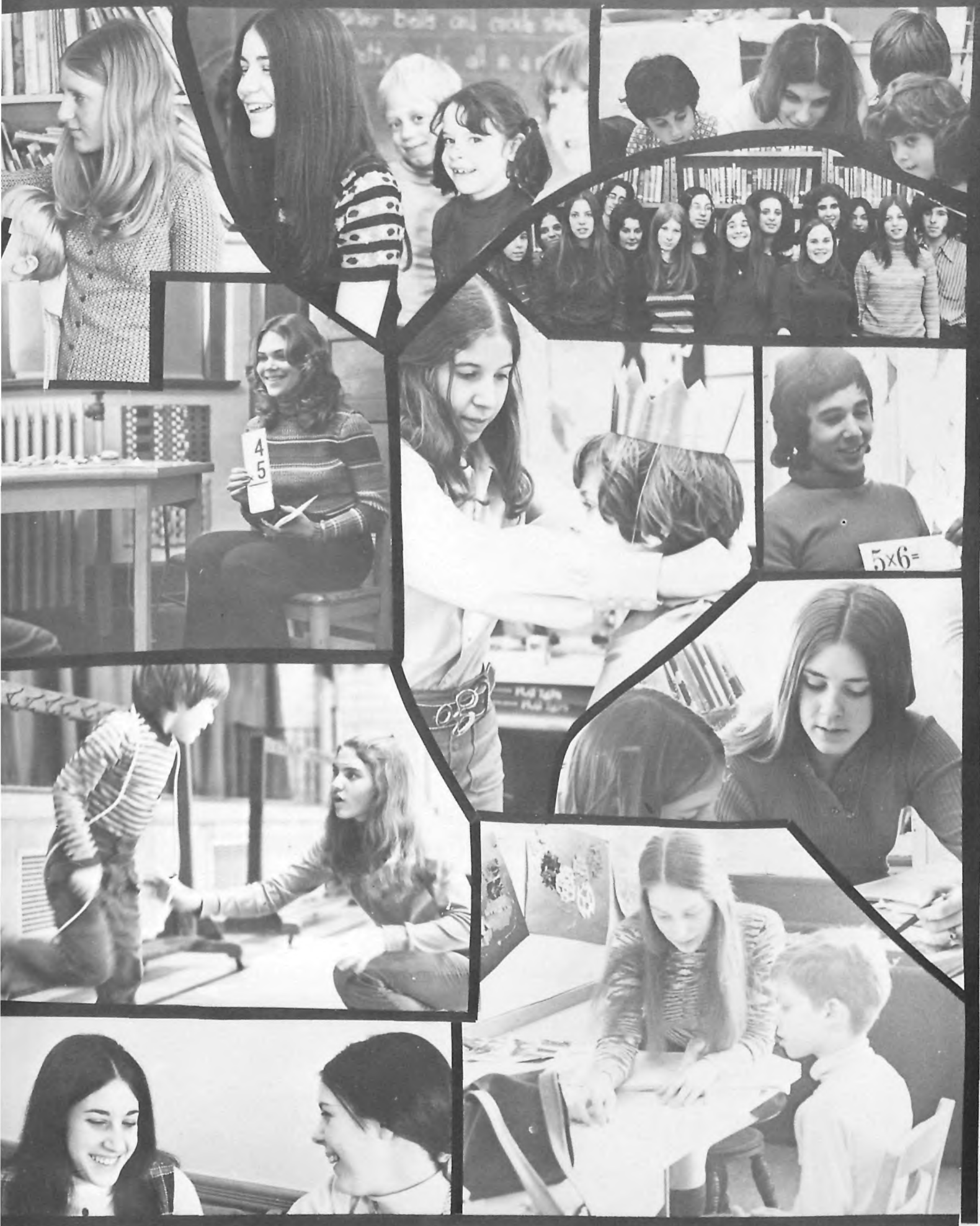
It is the consensus of everyone involved in the program that it is valuable in terms of the experiences gained by the seniors and the assistance obtained by teachers and students at the elementary schools. Of course, seniors are not admitted to the program unless academic requirements for graduation and college admission have been met.
