Art

The Art Department has been steadily improving and expanding during the past three years. Courses in Fine Art and General Art offer the student a chance to work in such varied media as silk-screening, clay sculpture, oils, and pen-and-ink. Marking period electives in Crafts have become a popular way to relax and create during the hectic school day. One of the newer innovations is the course in Fashions, taught by Miss Casterlin. The staff also aids students in the preparation of their portfolios for admission to art schools and colleges; the number of these students is increasing yearly. Thanks to a dedicated teaching staff the Art Department is turning out more talented artists than ever.

History

The History Department offers a wide variety of courses. United States History I and II, the two required history courses, are both taught by the team teaching method. The course of study in the second year of American history is divided into four sections - economics, politics, social America and a survey of events since Reconstruction. Each of these sections is further divided into mini-courses taught by various teachers. Activities such as political campaign work are acceptable for credit as are formal papers. Among the other courses offered by the department are Economics, Sociology, Government and Psychology. These courses, some of the most popular electives in the high school, deal each in a different way with man's social behavior. Other offerings of the department which concentrate in specific areas of history are Modern European History, Far Eastern Survey and Cultural Geography. For those students who wish to pursue history more intensely there is Advanced Placement United States History I and II and an Independent Study Program.

Political candidates Fred Bohen and Millicent Fenwick spoke at the high school and answered students' questions during the campaign for the Congressional seat in the fifth district this year. Other speakers for the history classes this year were Messrs. Welch, Cooper, Schultzberg, Crincoli, Coburn, and Mrs. Beck, all of whom spoke in connection with local campaign issues.

Foreign Language

The Foreign Language department has undergone some major changes during the past three years. 



Home Economics

Other popular courses are Foods, which is crowded with boys as well as girls, Clothing and Advanced Clothing, and Senior Seminar, which is designed for seniors with little or no homemaking background.

In these days of recession and inflation, the department teaches students various ways to cut back on costs. A great deal of time is devoted to exploring money saving methods of shopping and economical meal planning.

One of the nicest things about Home Economics is that students are involved with people. Their subject matter directs them towards doing things that are designed to help or to please others.





Business

The Business Department is not just concerned with teaching secretarial skills; it offers a variety of courses which appeal to students with diverse interests. Accounting, Salesmanship, Business Math and Bookkeeping are just some of the classes available to interested students. One of the most amazing things about the Business Department is that after completing the four-year programs many students are so well trained that they are either able to obtain jobs immediately, or are quite well prepared to continue their studies in business school. For the college-bound, courses in personal typing and notehand often prove extremely useful. Students also have the opportunity to learn by doing; in Data Processing, students learn how to operate various key punch machines and are also able to take advantage of the work-study program. Cooperative Education

The Cooperative Education program, operating under the guidance of a Board of Education appointed advisory board, is especially designed for juniors and seniors who plan to seek employment immediately after graduation. Along with required classes, each student elects another course dealing with his intended occupation. Co-op Ed. students leave school in the afternoon and work half a day so that they are able to benefit from on-the-job training.

There are three different types of Co-op Ed. programs.

Office Education, organized by Mrs. Gompf, instructs students in secretarial and clerical skills. Industrial Education, directed by Mr. Gray, trains students to become skilled craftsmen in the electrical and mechanical fields. Distributive Education, guided by Mr. Lovi, prepares students for jobs in the areas of marketing, retailing, wholesaling, and promotions.

The Cooperative Ed. programs have been an overwhelming success with both students and employers. The participants in Cooperative Education and the Livingston business community as a whole have certainly benefited from it.





Physical Education

The Physical Education department enables students to have some recreational activity during the day in such sports as volleyball, basketball, gymnastics, tennis or soccer. In addition to recreational activities, in each of the three cycles, all students must take a three week classroom course. Sophomores are required to take Health, juniors must take Driver Education and seniors study Family Living. During the fourth marking period all students choose three electives from the numerous offerings. Both the traditional spring courses such as golf, tennis and softball are offered as well as many innovative electives such as weight training, fencing, bicycling, speedball, lacrosse, and dance. The wide selection ensures an enjoyable time for everyone.






Sophomore Council




Football Team Upsets West Essex







Girls' Field Hockey Has Disappointing Season






Cagers Take Jersey Hills Conference!!








Grapplers Take 2nd In J.H.C.








Skaters Qualify for Gordon Cup Playoffs







Lancer Swimmers Capture County Meet




This year's varsity swim team, under the guidance of coaches Neil Rothstein and Sid Friedenberg, had another excellent season as they recaptured their position of Essex County Champions and looked very strong against their difficult dual meet schedule. 
Track Men Look Forward to a Victorious Season








J.H.C. Co-Champs Anticipate Victorious Season






Lancers Have Ability to Become J.H.C. Champions


Golfers Plan to Be Strong Contenders in J.H.C.






Inner Voices



Ecology Club







Center for the Performing Arts






Ski Club
