


In Many Different Ways






Not even the rain dampened the spirits of Homecoming activities on Thanksgiving day. Colorful floats and enghusiastic students paraded through town for all to see.



















We Remember . . .

Mr. Harold "Chip" Dolan was many things to the people at MRHS, a friend, a teacher and an administrator. Mr. Dolan's involvement with our school went back much further than many of us realized. It began when he, himself, entered MRHS as a student. During those four years, Mr. Dolan was an active participant in school sporting events, leadership programs and social activities. After his college graduation, he returned as a teacher and later became assistant principal. It was during this time that most of us had the opportunity to become acquainted with him.
