

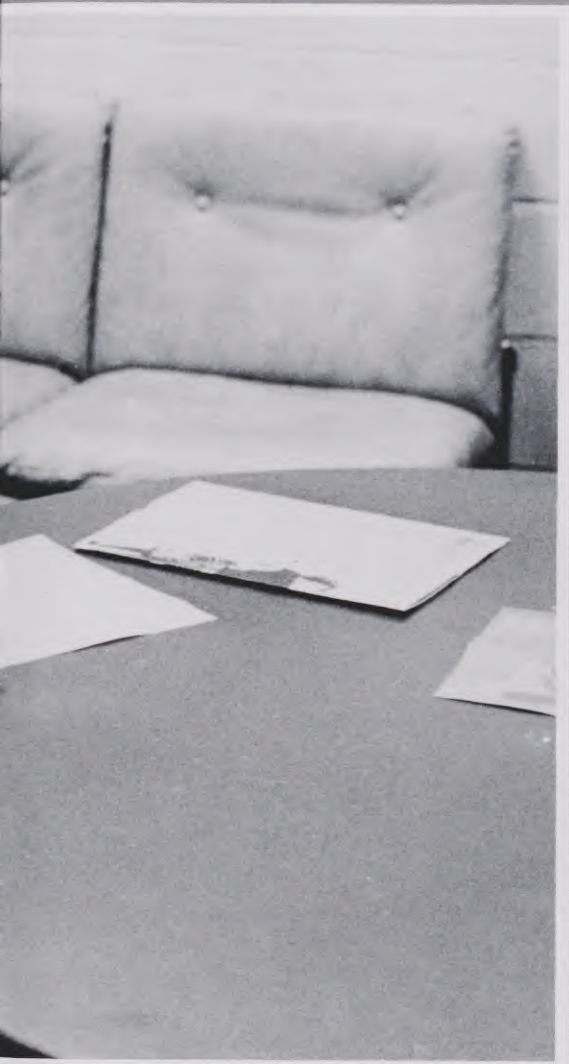

The guidance department made available for student's use a computer which could give them a list of colleges they may be interested in and information on each.

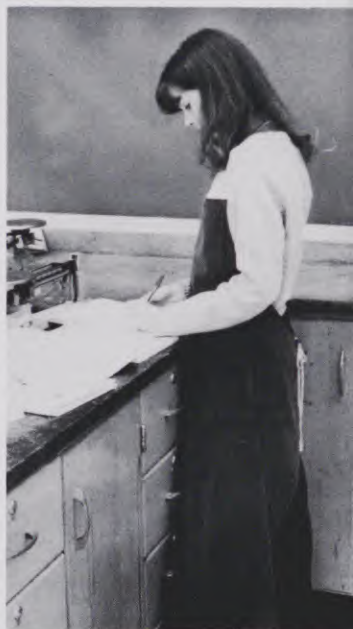

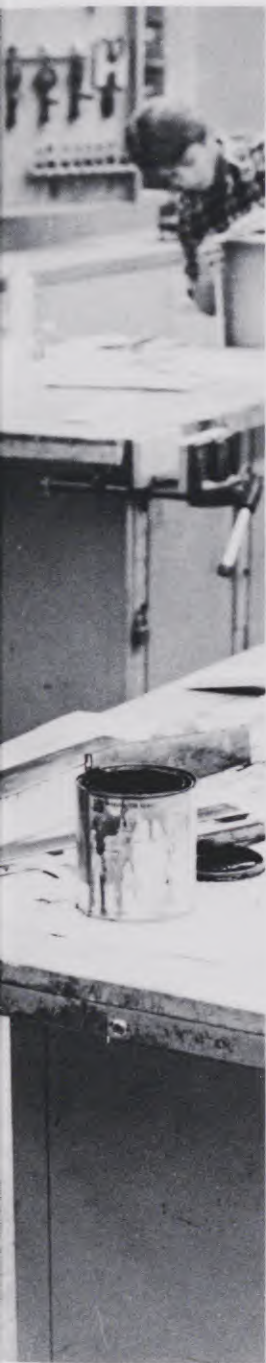

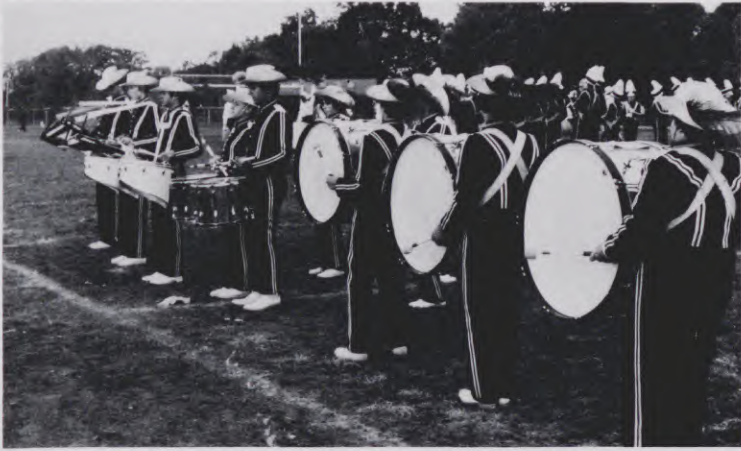

Although faced with stiff competition, the girls showed great sportsmanship and dedication throughout the entire season.

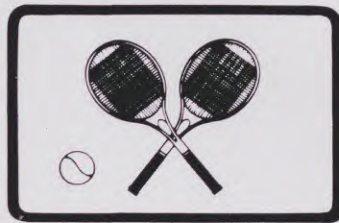

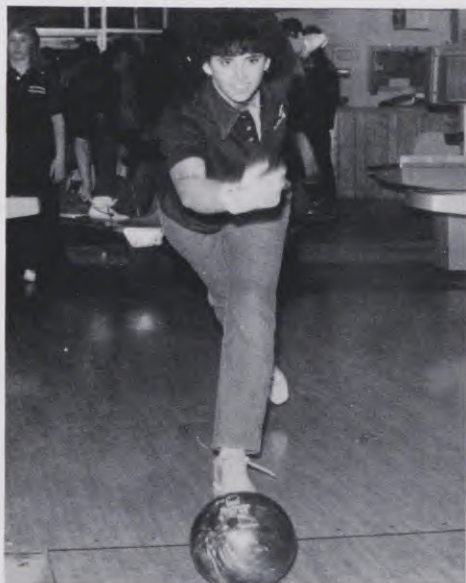

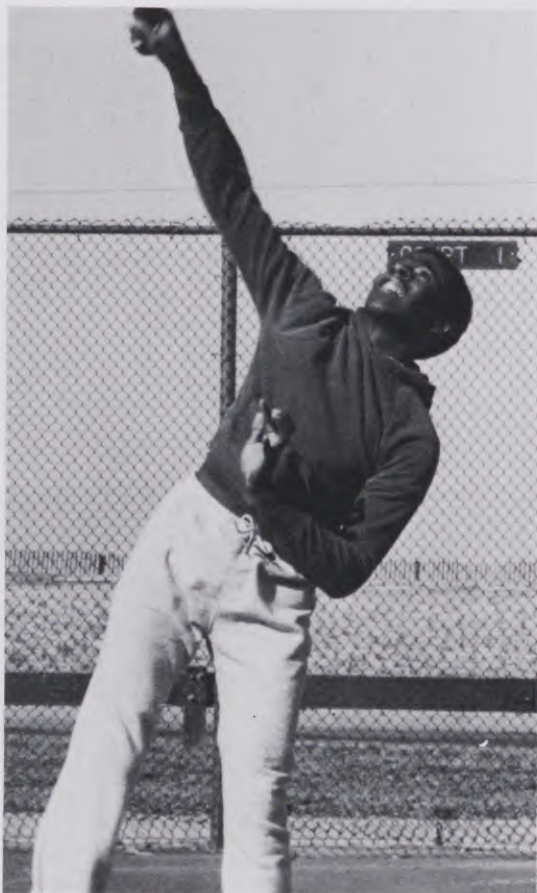

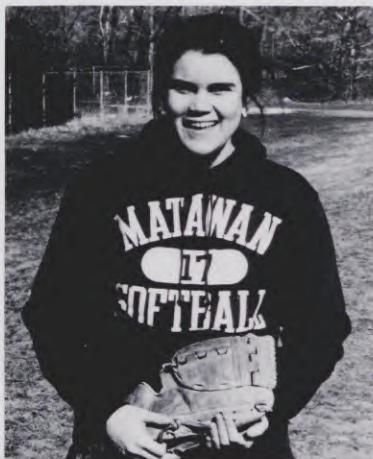
