





The tests sample student achievement at four grade levels in word recognition, com-prehension and study skills on the reading

test, and computation, number concepts, measurement and geometry, problem solving and applications in math.

Of 126 third-graders, 100 percent met standards in reading; 98.4 percent in math. In the sixth grade, of 147 students tested, 89.1

percent met standards in reading; 85.5 percent met standards in math.

ninth-graders met standards in reading and 92.3 percent succeeded in math, while 93.7

percent of 190 11th-graders met standards in reading and 91.5 percent did so in math. In addition, a significantly greater per-

At the secondary level, 89.1 percent of 183

Analysis of group scores will be done to assist the district in planning program improvement. The individual student roster is used to identify students who have scored below statewide standards and may be deficient in basic skill areas.

It is the district's responsibility to verify

that students' performance on this test ac-curately reflects their competencies. Other standardized test scores as well as classroom performance are reviewed to help select students who are in need of remediation.

Scores for all students will be shared in the fall with parents, together with results of the local testing program.

Backyard Gardener

Tomato is the favorite

by Patrick Denton

The tomato is the most popular garden vegetable in North America. No other vegetable crop produces as great a dollar value per square foot of garden space.

A single, robust hybrid vine will take up to six square feet of space and can produce 30

pounds of tomatoes.

With a few tricks, you can be harvesting

tomatoes before the season's peak, when tomatoes are still fetching high prices in the

First, choose early hybrid varieties. They will produce earlier, and given adequate moisture and a good mulch, will continue producing fruits until frost in cold season

Another tip is to transplant very small tomato seedlings into the garden. The plants should have no more than six leaves.

Set them in early, just after the average date of the last frost, but protect them with bottomless plastic jars. The little plants will begin establishing a large and efficient root

system while the weather is still cool.

Once the weather warms, they will quickly put forth sets of blossoms for early

In long-season areas, a later variety of tomato can be transplanted into the garden at the same time, for a second crop.

Another key element in getting maximum value from your tomato plants is finding ways to keep them producing as long as possible.

One trick is to lay a mulch around the plants once the soil is warm. The mulch will

help retain soil moisture and warmth to keep the tomatoes happier longer.

Look for ways to protect the plants from cool weather. Some home gardeners give their whole tomato patch a plastic blanket each night when the temperatures begin to drop. This works especially well if the tomatoes have been grown in cages. Each cage simply receives its plastic drapery late

With the threat of frost, bring remaining

tomatoes indoors to ripen.

He has served as a Rutgers University trustee and a member of the Board of Overseers of the Rutgers University Foundation.

The recipient of numerous awards, in cluding a special commemorative gold medal from UNESCO, he accepted the Nobel Peace Prize on behalf of the International Labour Organization in 1969
