


Sophomore Year







Football

The 1959 Bulldogs compensated for their inexperience and lack of depth with aggressiveness and determination by chalking up a record of five wins and four defeats. Two of the defeats were by top Central Jersey teams, Carteret and Highland Park.

Jim Miller, co-captain with Ted "Bucko" Grushewsky, was mentioned on several all-country teams, and is rated as one of the top defensive men to ever play for MHS. His value to the team was recognized by his opponents as well as his teammates, and he should go on to win recognition in college circles. Grushewsky, handicapped by lack of experience in the difficult role of quarterback, came on fast as the season progressed and did an exceptional job as team leader. O'Connor and Quagliariello were consistent ground-gainers.

The line which functioned well as a unit had no individuals who could be particularly pointed out.

The 38 points scored in the second half of the St. Peters game stands as a school record of one half's scoring.

Because this year's squad was made up largely of juniors, next year's team should be a strong one.

Corky, Snyder, and O'Connor will form a fine nucleus for the backfield; Dangremond, Zelesnick, Disario, Prickett and Sanders are returning first-stringers in the line.

The coaches must be commended again for attaining top performances from their hard-working squad. This team never came out second in the department of fair and hard play.



Basketball

As far as Bulldog rooters are concerned, the basketball season should have begun at 8 P.M. on the night of February 16, 1960, and ended two hours later with the magnificent defeat of Highland Park, 58-56. This win was a high point in MHS athletic history, not only because we outplayed, outhustled, outfought and even outhooted the Owls, but also because the conquest came after fifteen straight losses. Fifteen times Coach Jim Kelly and his boys had walked from gym floors with downcast expressions and heads hung low, but that one victory compensated for many heartaches after hard fought losses. Few, who witnessed the February 16 victory, will forget it.

Mike Sergeant, Rett Rich, Dick Hyldahl, Corky Quagliariello, Gary Brand, Bob Dangremond and Horst Ruckert were the mainstays of this year's team which fought difficult circumstances and injuries as well as worthy opponents. Rich, Hyldahl and Sergeant each scored more than 200 points for the season. Incidentally, we routed North Plainfield, 75-55.

The JV's, posting a nine and ten record, played better as the season progressed. Jon Sanders, Bunny Zarinsky, Bill Dineen, Jim Hantke, Milt Karten and Maurice Morehead should aid next year's varsity.
