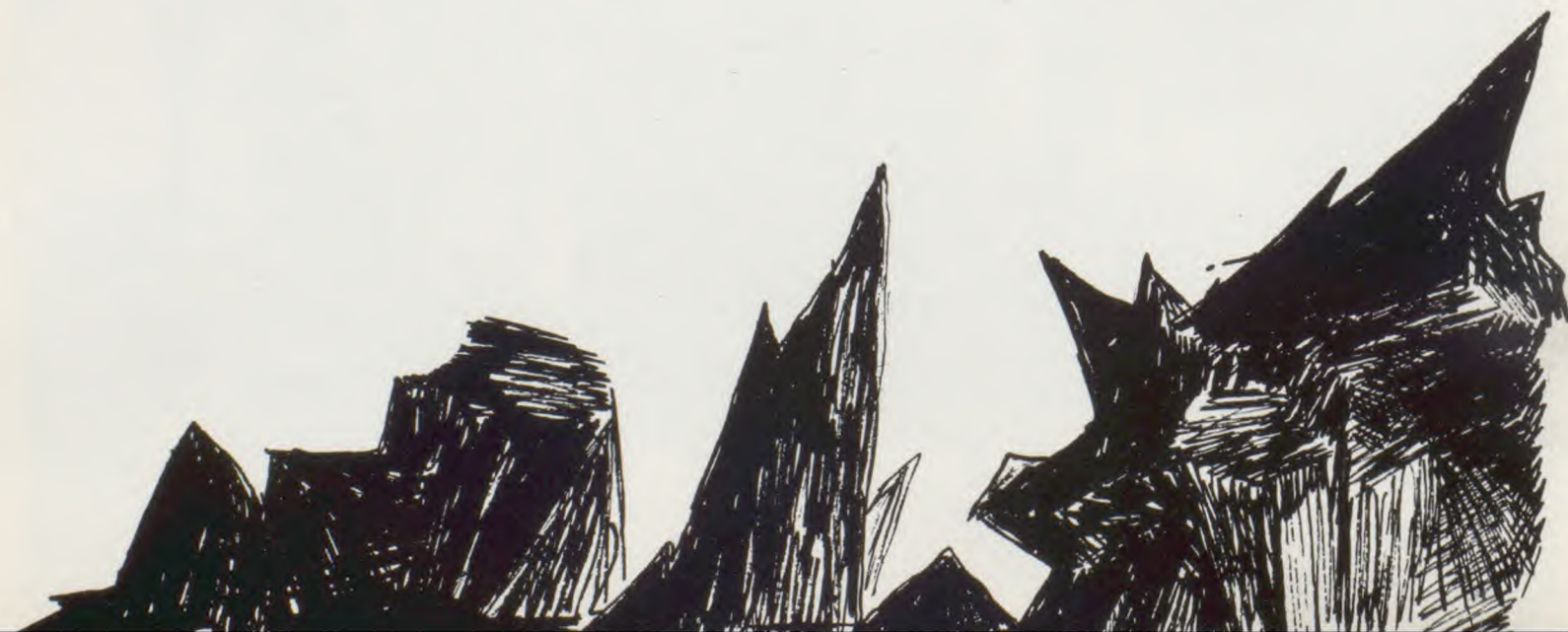

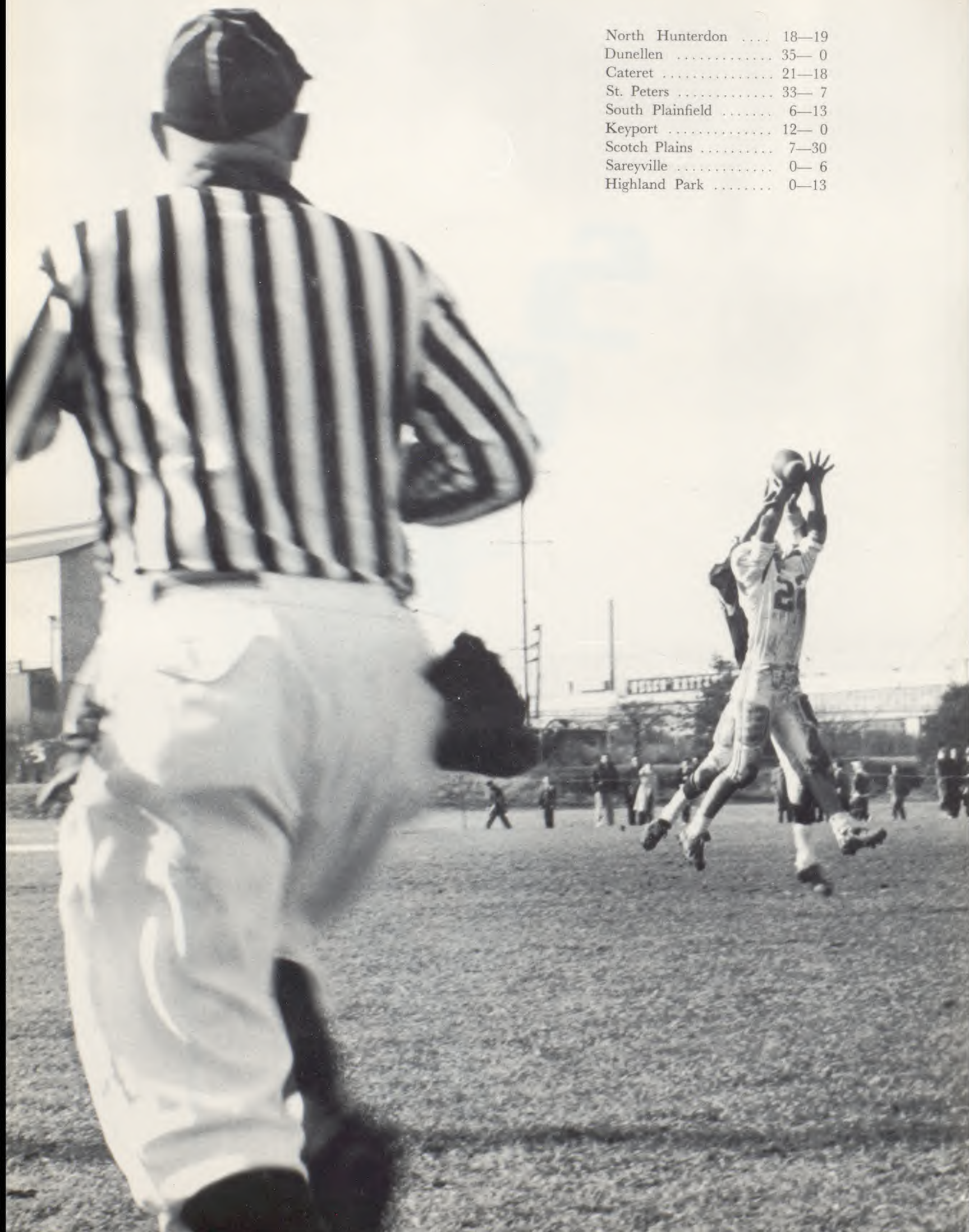

When Joe Zarinsky attempted the extra point kick with Metuchen behind 19—18 in the last quarter of the opening North Hunterdon game, the ball arched straight and hit the crossbar, where it paused momentarily — undecided on which side to fall — then dropped on the short side. This was the ominous harbinger of the Bulldog fortunes during the gridiron season that followed.

In the next few weeks came the Bulldog's brightest days. A formidable line, headed by Bob Danremond, Jim Disario and Charles Prickett, trounced Dunellen and went on to face Last year's state champions, Carteret. For three periods the Metuchen backs pounded the Ramblers without scoring, while the opponents gathered in three touchdowns. Then Joe Zarinsky, junior quarterback, engineered a last quarter blitz that saw the Metuchen squad eke out 21 points to win in the last minute.

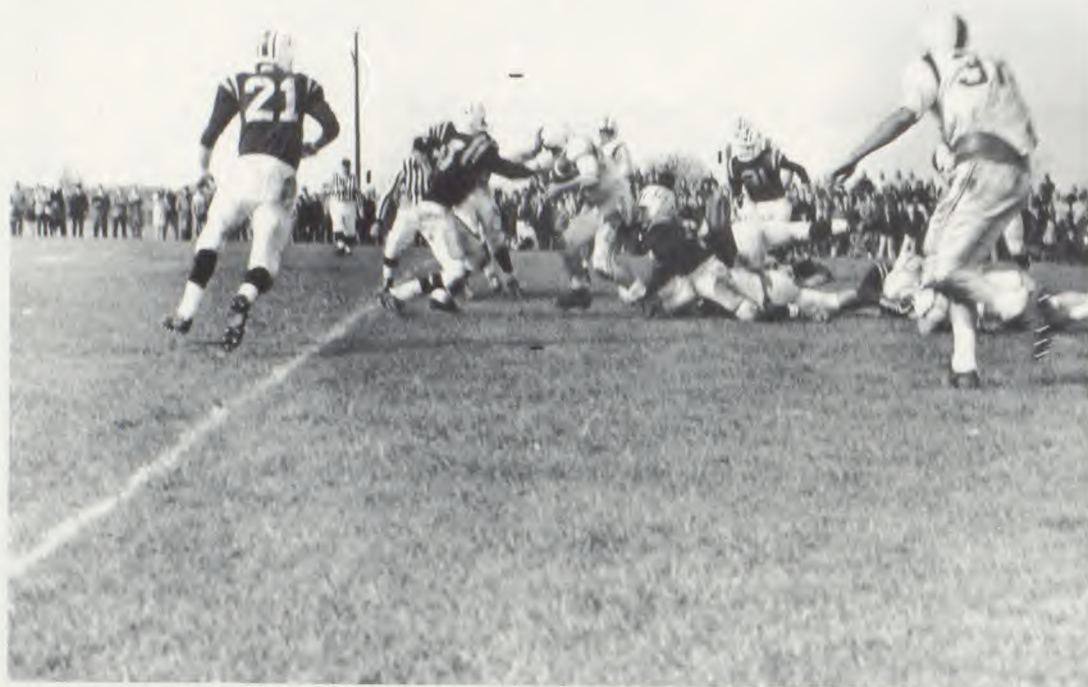
When the Blue and White downed St. Peters, Metuchen's one-two punch on the ground had come to be respected as

one of the best backfields in the area. Bob O'Conner was one of the fastest backs and Joe Snyder was certainly the most spirited and hard hitting. After the sobering disappointment of South Plainfield's upset, O'Conner gained 210 yards in rushing to lead the Varsity to victory over the Keyport Raiders.

With a 4—2 record, the home team was invaded by Scotch Plains. Unable to dent the Plainsmen's daunted air attack, the Bulldogs suffered a 30—7 loss. The Sareyville game opened with a Metuchen touchdown which was called back, and closed with a Sareyville score which wasn't called back. In between the two teams had battled to a scoreless duel.

The Varsity failed to salvage a winning season against Thanksgiving day rival, Highland Park. Playing a better game than the 13—0 score indicates, the Bulldogs' inchers Dangremond, Morehead, Zelesnick, Shimrack, Sanders, Smithson, Riles and Parchois — held the owls to short yardage.

Injuries and illness caused the untimely absence of senior stalwarts Bill Dineen, Phil Daro and Tom Sakmyster, leaving the burden on John Fullmer, Fred Ratliff and John Chamberlain. With a dearth of senior runners, the underclassmen came to the fore. Tom Muenger and Andy Modla improved rapidly to bolster the weakened varsity squad. John Fullmer, voted most valuable to the team, cap-

tained the squad. Sophomore Bob Peterson and freshman Gerry Konopka gained valuable varsity experience, besides contributing to the efforts of the J.V. and Freshman teams.

This year's freshman team went undefeated and posted several shutout victories against some of the finest teams in the state. Under the skillful direction of Coach John Cassell, these boys may well initiate a new era in Metuchen's Cross Country program and install the team as the state power it has been in the past.

Undoubtedly, the high point of this year's Indoor Track season was Bob O'Connor's invitation to run in the 60 yard dash in the nationals at Madison Square Garden in New York. Although greatly hampered in their attempts to get in shape, as a result of the year's two snow storms, and by the fact that only three other experienced upperclassmen, John Fullmer, Joe Snyder and Bruce Stead were on the squad, our boys nevertheless, struggling to overcome these handicaps, went on to give an enviable accounting of themselves. Sprint teams composed of Turner, Piren, Wagner, and Muenger and of O'Connor, Stead, Piren, and Wagner, at the Seton Hall Relays, placed second in their heat in the novice and fourth in their event in the opens respectively. Bob O'Connor placed third in the county in the 60 yard dash at the Middlesex County Relays at Lawrenceville. Beam, a freshman, clocked a :57 in the quarter mile in a dual meet with Lawrenceville's JV's, an odd accomplishment for a freshman.

With outdoor track practice having already started, the picture may be a little brighter for Coach John Cassell. With 35 boys aspiring for a berth on the team he will have one of his largest squads since the fire at the old High School. With appearance of a number of weight and field men the squad may change from primarily a running team to an overall threat as it was in bygone years. This year's schedule, which includes a number of dual meets, will give everyone an adequate chance to compete. The fact that the team is dominated by sophomores may give us a preview of Metuchen's hopes two years from now.

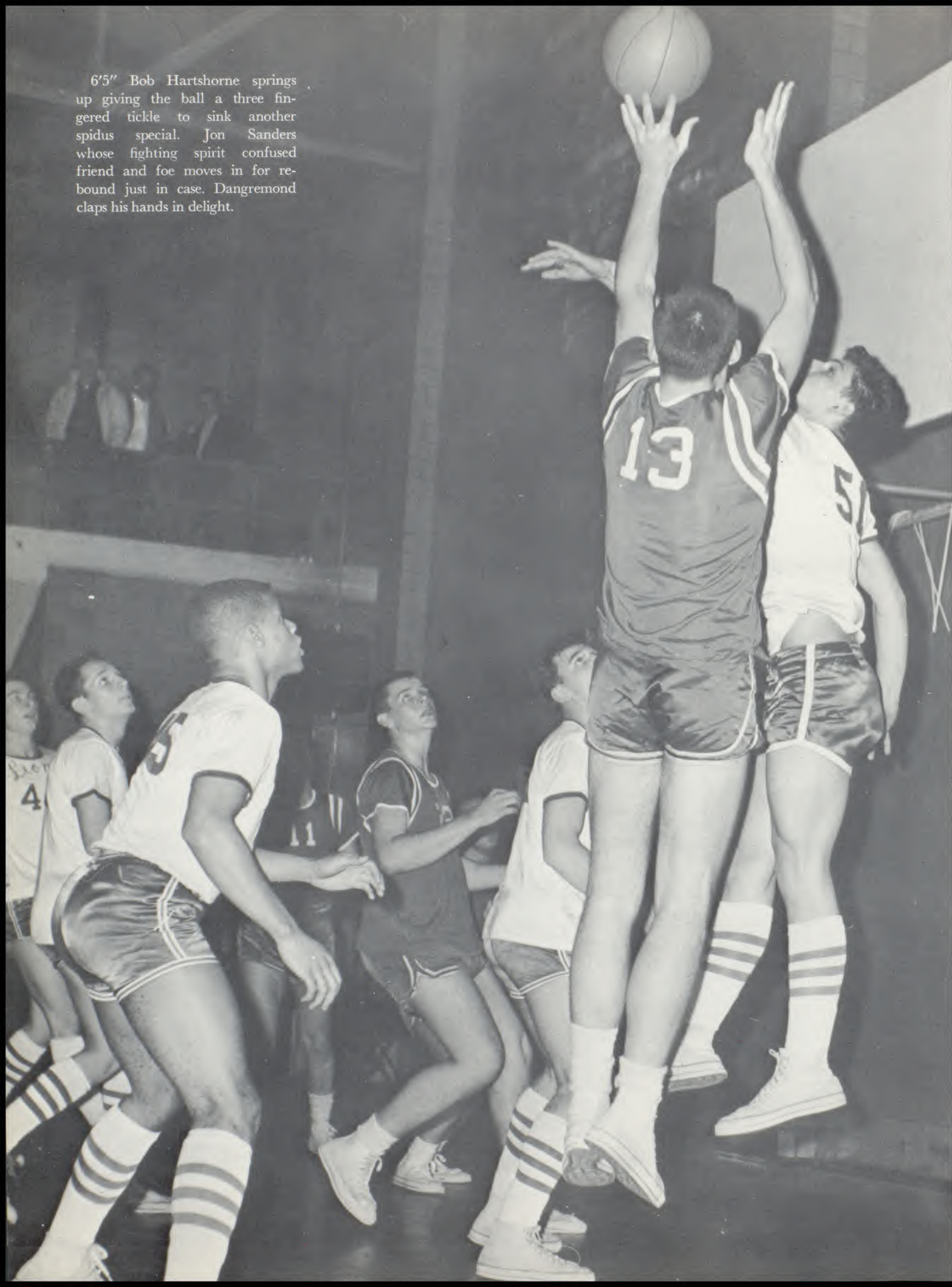

BASKETBALL

The 1960-61 season saw a number of new faces on the Metuchen basketball scene. In his first year as varsity mentor, Coach William Blindow was faced with the task of molding a playing unit from the group of players who had had no regular varsity experience. Despite this, injuries and loss of key players at mid season, the squad compiled a respectable record of 7-13.

Led by the fine shooting of Phil Degnan, the team played the best ball of the season in the Christmas Tournament. After having upset rough Sareyville in a televised tilt, and defeating Perth Amboy in the semi-finals, Metuchen entered the finals as the "Cinderella" team of the tourney. Matched with strong St. Mary's of Perth Amboy, the team played determined ball in losing by only two goals.

The team staged a brief revival near the end of the season, after a long losing streak. Maurice Morehead, voted most improved by his fellow team-mates, sparked this late season resurgence in which Metuchen downed Dunellen, Carteret and Highland Park, and put a temporary scare into high-rated Roselle.

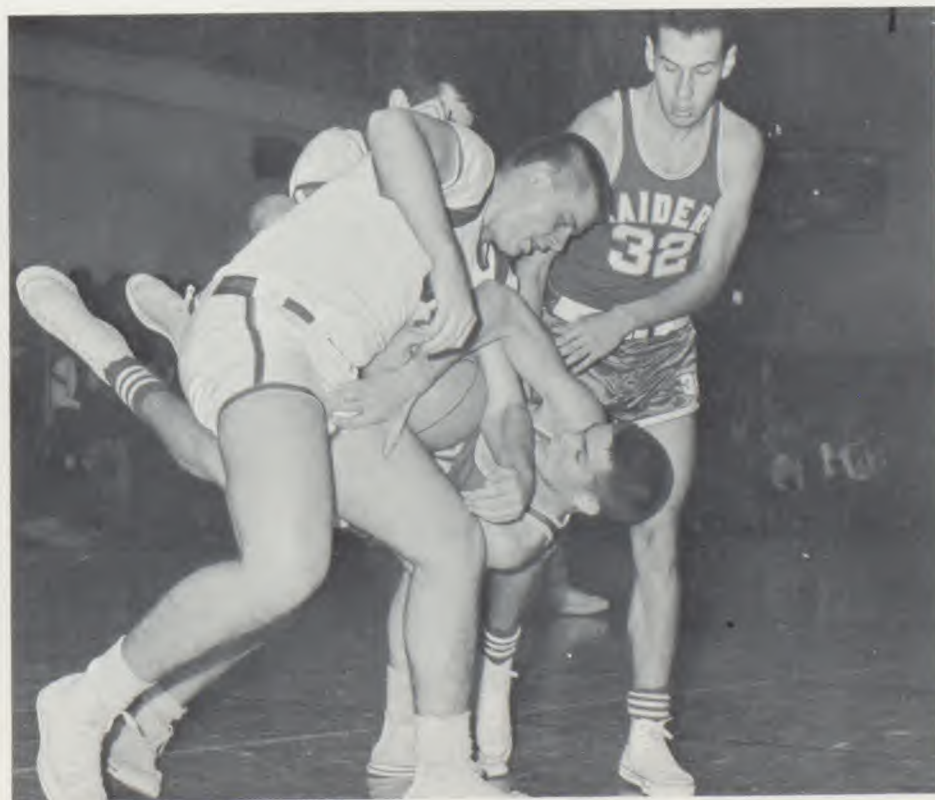

The squad, bolstered by seven returning lettermen, hopes to improve on last year's record of 7-8. The main problem confronting Coach Hartland is his pitching staff. Lacking any pitcher with varsity experience, the team will have to rely on the efforts of Milt Karten, Phil Degnan, Roger Kubiak, Bill Wright and senior Maurice Morehead. Hitting provides no problem for this year's team as sluggers Tom Sakmyster, Jon Sanders, Milt Karten and Jim Disario are back from last year's team.

The infield will require some juggling after loss of last year's first and third baseman. Either Jon Sanders, Gary Ratkin or Charlie Prickett, all seniors, will get the affirmative nod from Coach Hartland, for the first base position. Leading the candidates for second is last year's star, Fred Gernand, Tom Sakmyster, last year's short-stop, can also play second, as well as Joe Altovillo, a J.V. stalwart.
