### The Story

On September 1, 1961, the first day of football practice, the outlook for the upcoming season was gloomy. Only eight lettermen, all of whom were seniors, were returning from the last year's team. To make the situation less favorable, only co-captains Roger Eosso and Joe Zarinsky had more than limited experience on offense.

had more than limited experience on offense.

The practice field on that first day, and the next few weeks which followed, at times resembled a first aid station. Only minutes after the first practice session had begun, Harvey Meyers, one of Coach Conti's main offensive hopes, had suffered a possible broken nose. Soon after, Zarinsky reinjured a shoulder and was out for the season. Other injuries to key performers, and a 90 degree heat wave plagued the squad even worse. The Bulldogs were down, but far from out.

Eosso and Pete Smithson, who became co-captain in Zarinsky's absense, instilled into this group of young men a spirit that will be hard to equal in future years of football at Metuchen. The coaching staff instilled in their young men a tremendous desire to win. The young men themselves had the desire to play together, as a team, rather than as individuals out to seek personal glory. Coach Conti promised this team that if they worked hard they would pull a lot of surprises. They did.

#### North Hunterdon Game

The first surprise was the North Hunterdon game. The Farmers, as they are commonly known in Metuchen High School, had made a habit of plowing over the Bulldogs on opening day. Most people, including the local newspaper which predicted the Blue and White to lose by "at least" two touchdowns, thought that 1961 would be no different, considering the inexperience of this team. North Hunterdon drew the first blood in the game, taking a 6-0 lead at the end of the first quarter. In the second quarter Smithson scored for Metuchen and Ken Johnson, running out a fake-kick formation, scored the extra point. The half ended with the Bulldogs in front, 7-6. As the third quarter progressed, the Bulldogs began to warm up (the temperature of the day was in the vicinity of 90°). In the third quarter, junior quarterback Jim Cooper hit Smithson with a screen pass and the latter scampered 43 yards for the second Bulldog score. Johnson again ran for the extra point as the bewildered Farmers stood waiting for him to kick. North Hunterdon scored in the last quarter to make the score 14-13, but Eosso insured our victory with a 31 yard touchdown run. The Bulldogs of Metuchen High School were off and running in the right direction, much to the surprise of many people.

#### Dunellen Game

Our second, consecutive victory came at the hands of Dunellen in our first home game. We won by a convincing score of 33-0. Ken Johnson got off one of the longest touchdown runs in central Jersey—91 yards. Harvey Meyers scored on a 62 yard run, and sophomore Jack Williams ran a total of 58 yards for two touchdowns. Cooper scored the remaining touchdown on a 12 yard run.

#### Carteret Game

Carteret became the third Bulldog victim, second in a row on Edgar Field. Smithson scored both Metuchen touchdowns; Meyers picked up 106 yards rushing. The latter, with a desperation shoe-string tackle, prevented Carteret from scoring. The Bulldog defensive line, headed by seniors Dick Newcomb, Al Young, Ollie Parchois, Roger Kubiak, and Roger Eosso produced its second straight shutout.



In the closing seconds of the game, Meyers went in as quarterback for one play. He rolled out as if to run, as the opposition expected, and then unleashed a 60 yard touchdown pass into the waiting hands of sophomore end Chris Kaliontgis. The Bulldogs won. It was another solid team effort, but without a doubt, one senior, Harvey Meyers, has to be singled out for his sterling performance.

#### The Seniors Made the Team . . .

The coaching staff must be praised for the work they have done. Mr. Conti, assisted by coaches Faeth, Hartland, and Blindow, molded a "bunch of gol-dinged idiots" into a successful football team. The coaches did more than build

a team; they built character. The Characters : Roger Eosso, nicknamed "Eskimo", played for four years and won three varsity letters. Playing blocking back he didn't make the headlines often, but the amount of work he did on offense, defense, and as co-captain, make him one of the chief reasons for the Bulldogs' success. He was chosen "Most Valuable Player" by his teammates and was named to

the All-County Team. He wore number 8.

Affectionately called "Trippy", John Holt played four years and was first string left guard on the 1961 team. He was a real workhorse at practice and in the games. He didn't play much defense because he couldn't see well enough. He

wore number 60. If John was late to practice, it was because he was fighting with one of his girl friends.

Kenneth Johnson, known as "Zebra", played two years of varsity football as end and halfback. He scored 27 points this year and 402 yards rushing - an average of 6.9 yards per carry. In the Dunellen game he electrified the crowd with a 91 yard touchdown. His most spectacular run was against Highland Park, in which he shook off six would-be tacklers en route to a score, Zebra could usually be found "chirpin"

some tunes, Gem". He wore number 5. Steve Kiraly, known as "Cheeko", played only as a freshman and as a senior. During his senior year he was first string, right end. His glue fingered hands hauled in many a high or wobbly pass. If Steve was late to practice, everyone knew he was at a Literary Club meeting with Miss Haitsch.

He wore number 81.

Deno Kolias, known as "the Greek", didn't play football until his senior year, when he was in a starting position as defensive halfback. His interception in the Berkeley Heights game will be long remembered. He ran just once on offense, and claims that his slide rule measured his gain as 12.12963 yards. Actually, it was recorded as 6 yards. Deno wore number 2.

Roger Kubiak, nicknamed "Patches" or "Cube", played as a freshman and as a senior. Besides being a defensive specialist, he kicked 5 extra points. Patches usually went

hunting to relax before a game. He wore number 42. Harvey Meyers, called "Sol" or "the Prow", played football for two years, both on the varsity level. He was a pass-defense specialist in his junior year and as a senior he developed into one of the finest backs ever to play for Mr. Conti. He scored six touchdowns this year and threw a touchdown pass that won a game, but more important is the fact that he averaged 7.7 yards in 102 carries of the ball. He was named WCTC's "Back of the Week" for his performance against Berkeley Heights and was named to the first string All-County Team. He wore number 3.

Richard Newcomb, known as "Newk", played four years of football and won two varsity letters as a tackle. He played on offense and defense, and often led the team in tackles. Newk was the team's punter, and averaged about 40 yards a kick. He gained All-County recognition and was voted "Most Improved" by his teammates, He wore number 71.

Oliver Parchois, nicknamed "Gay Paree" and "the Frenchman", came to the United States in his sophomore year and lettered in varsity football as a junior and senior. He played both offense and defense, but was most valuable at the latter. He was noted for his "Mechanical Man" techniques and his "around-the-neck" tackles. He wore number 70.

Robert Sergent, known as "Sarge", played for three years, not coming out as a junior, and won his varsity letter in his senior year. The third of four brothers to wear the Blue and

White, Sarge played linebacker and wore number 16.
Peter Smithson, called "Wayne" or "Smitty", played for four years. Smitty was one of the hardest workers on the team. On defense, he was tough to get by; on offense, he was not easily stopped. He scored two touchdowns against both Carteret and North Hunterdon and a fifth against Sayreville. Smitty was a real team leader and an excellent co-captain. He wore number 4.

William Wright, known as "Bill" or "Willie", also played four years of football, despite numerous injuries. Bill played end and received a letter in his senior year. He could snag that pass and run with it when called upon. He was a dedicated football player and a hard worker. He wore

number 36.

Albert Young, sometimes called "Moo" or "Coach No. 17", played football for four years, getting a varsity letter in his last two years. He played center, end and guard on offense and was one of the best blockers on the team. He also played on defense and was another dedicated player.

Al wore number 29.

Joseph Zarinsky, who is also known as "Jumbo", "Box", and "Barrel", played four years of high school football. He won three varsity letters and was co-captain of the 1961 team. Although Joe was injured early in his senior year he was out on the field every day helping the boys and Mr. Conti. Joe's injury almost collapsed the morale of the team for he was to quarterback as he did the previous year. Joe, however, probably fulfilled the greatest ambition of his senior year in football, when he was able to get dressed with his buddies for the Highland Park game. That game was the first and last time he had journied to the middle of the grid iron with his other two co-captains "to call the coin". If you asked anyone on the football team who was the best liked and most helpful you would probably hear, "Jumbo". Also if you asked any senior whom he was playing for that first glorious game you would again hear, "Joe". Joe wore number 7.

The underclassmen who supported them so well, namely

Cooper, Piren, Heavens, Rubarski, Watson, Bocra, Cowen, Kaliontgis, and Williams, have a nucleus for another fine team

All who played on the team of 1961 can be proud of their coaches, proud of their record, and proud of themselves.

## BASKETBALL

Coach William Blindow

The basketball season this year was highlighted by the spirit of the team and the exceptional play of Phil Degnan. Between the two, the Bulldogs managed to win 7 out of 17 games. The wins came over South Brunswick (twice), Carteret, Sayreville (twice), Highland Park, and North Plainfield.

Team spirit stood out in two of the victories, and graced the team in at least two defeats. One of the spirited wins came at the hands of Sayreville, in which Degnan fouled out midway through the third quarter. The second spirited victory came over Highland Park, in which the Bulldogs held the high-flying Owls to a mere five points in the second half. Games in which tremendous team spirit eased the burden of defeat were with Dunellen and St. Mary's. The Dunellen game, which was a real thriller, provided a one point loss, 62-61, in overtime. In the St. Mary's game, the Bulldogs came from behind to tie at the end of regulation time. Again hard luck plagued the team in the overtime period. This resulted in another defeat.

The team had nine members throughout most of the season, seven seniors, one junior, and one sophomore. The seniors, besides Degnan, were Milt Karten, Deno Kolias, Ken Johnson, Pat Dineen, Rich Herold, and Bob Sergent. Jim Cooper, a junior, and sophomore Bob Nann, completed the team. Kolias, Cooper, and Johnson were unable to play in several games, suffering from a badly sprained ankle, mononucleosis, and

measles, respectively. The shining lights of the season were led by Phil Degnan, one of the finest all-around basketball players to ever represent Metuchen. Degnan picked up 364 points for a 21.4 average, second best in Middlesex County. Karten, Herold and Johnson were bulwarks on the boards. Dineen did a fine job replacing injured Kolias in a play-making role, Cooper also sparked the team as a play-maker and his varsity experience was a great help too. Sergent and Nann also played well when called upon.

The second meeting with Highland Park marked the most pleasing and most impressive victory. Trailing by seven points at half time, Coach Blindow changed the Bulldogs' plan of attack. In the second half, led by the shooting of Degnan and Johnson, the Bulldogs ran over, around, and between the stunned Owls.

With this victory the season could almost be called a success. The team easily could have had a winning season had it not been for the loss of several key players. It also may be noted that several defeats were by less than four points.

Coach Blindow must be commended for a fine job in building a team around Degnan. Degnan should also be commended for gaining All-County recognition as a junior and possible All-State honors as a senior. The rest of the players, Johnson, Herold, Dineen, Karten, Sergent, Kolias, Cooper and Nann gave the necessary support for an effective team.






