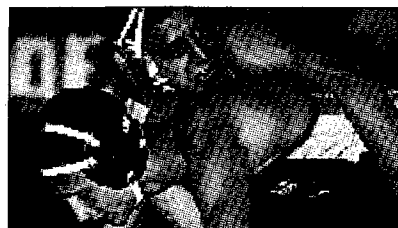

Parent charges 'Jolene's Law' not being followed

Mother of accident victim says Sayreville schools are not responding

Maureen Devlin claims that school buses are in violation of Jolene's Law. The law was written last year in response to the death of Devlin's daughter.

According to Devlin, district buses are not dropping off students on the same side of the street.

Devlin said this has been going on since before Christmas.

Devlin's only child, 15-year-old Jolene, was killed on the morning of April 13, after a car struck her as she walked to the Main Street school bus stop.

She died three days later as a result of injuries sustained.

As a result of the incident, borough and district officials coordinated efforts to pass what is now known as Jolene's Law.

Under Jolene's Law, school buses must stop on both sides of Main Street between MacArthur Avenue and the Main Street Extension.

In addition, pick-up and discharge of students must be on the same side of the street as their residences between those designated streets.

"If her death can save another child, I can somehow say that her

death has not been in vain," Devlin said.

Devlin said she first became aware of the matter about three weeks ago when her fiancé's 13-year-old son was not dropped off on the correct side of Main Street.

"I just hate to see this happen again to another child," Devlin said.

Devlin said she has contacted Superintendent of Schools Dennis Fyffe as well as several other borough and district officials about the matter.

She said that Fyffe told her about two and a half weeks ago that the school board would be monitoring the buses about the case.

Fyffe could not be reached for comment by deadline.

Debbie Shedlock, transportation coordinator for the district, would not comment on the matter.

Devlin said she has given the district ample opportunity to look into the matter, but has not received any information.

"To me this is an extremely important issue," Devlin said.

Devlin said she will continue her efforts to make sure that Jolene's Law is abided by for the sake of other children.

"It's almost like they feel it's been a year, and everyone has forgotten about it," Devlin said.

Devlin said the law is always open for addendum.

"All the parents in Sayreville, they have to start being aware of what's going on," Devlin said. "More streets can be added to the law."

Mayor: O. B. succeeding on many fronts

In State of the Township Address predicts rosy future for residents

Mayor Barbara Cannon promised to continue making Old Bridge a great place to live during her State of the Township address, that was scheduled for Tuesday.

The speech was to be broadcast over Old Bridge's local cable Channel 70 Tuesday night and will be rebroadcast this morning at 9 a.m. and again on Thursday at 7 p.m.

A copy of the speech was obtained by the *Suburban*.

The mayor said the township's strong financial position

enables Old Bridge to provide programs to senior citizens and to help those less fortunate through the food bank and an associated clothing facility.

With the use of special legislative grants, \$170,000 was allocated to upgrade and improve the Laurence Harbor Senior Center. The senior center will undergo structural improvements and a fully equipped computer lab will be installed.

The township has the highest bond rating it has ever had, and its debt is now lower than in 1999, Cannon said.

According to the mayor, Old Bridge has the ninth lowest municipal tax rate out of the 24 towns in Middlesex County. When she took office 10 years ago, the township had the second highest tax rate in the county.

The mayor criticized the

Township Council for financial decisions it has made over the last two years.

"The council, in its zeal to cut the tax rate — which is commendable — has taken a path that can lead to real problems now and in the future," she said.

The mayor disagrees with the council's decision made late last year to reduce the surplus in the 2001 fiscal budget.

According to council members, the reduction was made in an effort to provide tax relief to residents.

"There has never been any real attempt to cut the operating budget to achieve this goal," Cannon said in her address.

After viewing the mayor's speech on Channel 70 last night, Township Council President Dennis Maher commented

Library to start new educational CD-ROM collection

Old Bridge to get funds from Toys R Us antitrust settlement

OLD BRIDGE — Meeting the educational needs of the township's growing student population is a tough assignment for librarians.

However, with the help of a \$2,349 grant, the Youth Services Department of the Old Bridge Public Library has been given a reprieve.

The money comes from a \$392,000 antitrust settlement involving Toys R Us, said John H. Livingston, of the New Jersey State Library, Trenton.

"The money will be used to purchase educational books, including biographical and non-fiction books, and for CD-ROMs for our multi-media center," said Shirley Zuk, of the Old Bridge Library's youth services department.

"Our hope is to start a circulating CD-ROM collection," Zuk said.

The extra books will come in handy, especially when students receive assignments on the same topic, Zuk said.

Zuk said for at least the last 16 years, Old Bridge teachers have assigned their students to do a report about their country of origin.

"Old Bridge has a lot of students from Irish, Polish and Mexican descent, and I just don't have enough books to go around — it's too expensive, with some books costing \$35 each," Zuk said. "With the grant money, I hope to purchase more books in these areas."

"There is a high demand for children's programs at the library," said Barbara Ketterer, assistant director at the main branch of the library. "We were delighted to receive the grant because it is important for our children to become early readers."

Youth programs at the library include story time for pre-school children ages 2 to 3 years, and a book discussion group for middle school children. There is also a multitude of weekly programs for children, Ketterer noted.

Two years ago, the library received a \$25,000 grant from the state library for the purchase of six new computers, which are used for computer training courses and public use at the library.

In its audit of Old Bridge, the Local Government Budget Review commended the library for "identifying an appropriate service for which outside funding is available" in its use of state library grants.

The youth services department also received an acknowledgment from the audit for how well it manages its children's programs and for participating in the regional network's book review programs.

The main branch of the public library is located in the Municipal Complex, off Route 516 and Cottrell Road.

Its operating hours are Monday through Thursday from 9:30 a.m. to 9 p.m., Friday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Saturday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., and Sunday from 12:30 p.m. to 5 p.m. The library is closed Sundays during July and August.

The Laurence Harbor branch of the library is located on Shoreland Circle in the Laurence Harbor section of Old Bridge and is open Monday through Saturday from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. and until 8 p.m. on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

Efforts continue to aid India quake victims

E. Brunswick, Sayreville and Old Bridge residents work to send help

Area residents continue their campaign to aid those injured in the recent earthquake in India.

Approximately \$25,000 was raised on Saturday in a fund-raiser held at Temple D'warkadhish, Washington Road, Sayreville.

The funds raised will aid victims of the 7.9 magnitude earthquake which occurred on Jan. 26 in the western state of Gujarat, India.

Officials from the temple had hoped to reach the \$25,000 goal when they kicked off the event; however, they now plan to raise even more.

"They hope to reach \$50,000, which would be used to rebuild one of the towns devastated by the earthquake," said Himanshu Shah, Old Bridge's chief financial officer.

The Association of Sayreville Indian Americans (ASIA) will be sending 1,000 tents to earthquake victims, and plans to continue fund raising as well, Shah said.

The borough of Sayreville, along with

residents of nearby Old Bridge, has a large population originally from Gujarat.

Kalpna Kothari, president of the India Association of East Brunswick, said that between 25,000 to 30,000 tents are needed

in order to set up camps for the homeless.

She spoke at Monday's East Brunswick Township Council meeting, announcing that the group is now accepting donations to aid victims.

"One dollar can provide 45 rupees, which is sufficient to feed one person for one day," Kothari said.

However, Kothari said, the need is so

great that millions of people who have been left homeless from the earthquake are in need of food, shelter and clothing.

Contributions will go toward rebuilding bridges, buildings and hospitals that have all been damaged in the earthquake, Kothari added.

"We are left fortunate and can only provide to others in their time of need because we cannot imagine what we would do in the same situation," Kothari said.

Donations are still being taken for the earthquake victims. For further information about donating at the D'warkadhish temple, call (732) 254-0061.

in a telephone interview.

"I feel Mayor Cannon's speech demonstrated a dangerous inclination toward political posturing with combative and decisive remarks with respect to the Township Council," he said.

Maher stands firmly behind the council's decision to use an additional \$600,000 in surplus funds to help stabilize taxes in the 2001 municipal budget. "For the past three years, the council has increased the amount of surplus utilized in the budget, and the mayor predicted Armageddon would come to the township. Well, it has yet to come," he said.

For the mayor, increasing commercial ratables is a continuing goal for the township. Presently under development on Route 9 are Wal-Mart, Lowe's Home Improvement Center, Home Depot and Ruby Tuesday's, which the mayor hopes will bring in millions of dollars in ratables.

On the recommendation of the Planning Board and Economic Development Corp., 500 acres of township-owned land off Route 18 has been designated as a redevelopment area. The administration envisions a business park or mixed use of the property emphasizing research and development.

Developing a Town Centre is still a viable concept for the township. The center would consist of a mixture of commercial, residential and recreational facilities, "mixing modern convenience with old world charm," constructed on 300 acres surrounding the municipal complex.

"The center will serve as the hub of the community, allowing the town to reduce suburban sprawl in the more rural areas of town," Cannon said.

Also slated for future development is 500 acres of undeveloped township-owned land and 100 acres of privately owned land across the east side of Garden State Parkway exit 121. The mayor hopes that a variety of research and development corporations will relocate to the area, particularly since GlobeSpan, a communications company, will be constructing its world headquarters at the site.

In her speech, the mayor highlighted numerous road improvements, improvements to recreational facilities and the importance of acquiring open space.

In conclusion, the mayor said she will be holding two outreach meetings next month.

The first one is scheduled for March 8 at 7:30 p.m. at Salk Middle School, and the second one is March 15 at 7:30 p.m. at Sandburg Middle School.

Members of the mayor's staff will be on hand as well.

The outreach meetings were created to give residents the opportunity to talk with the mayor and her staff and present them with questions and concerns.

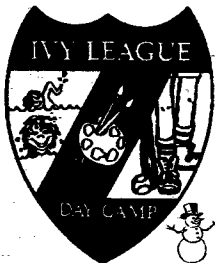

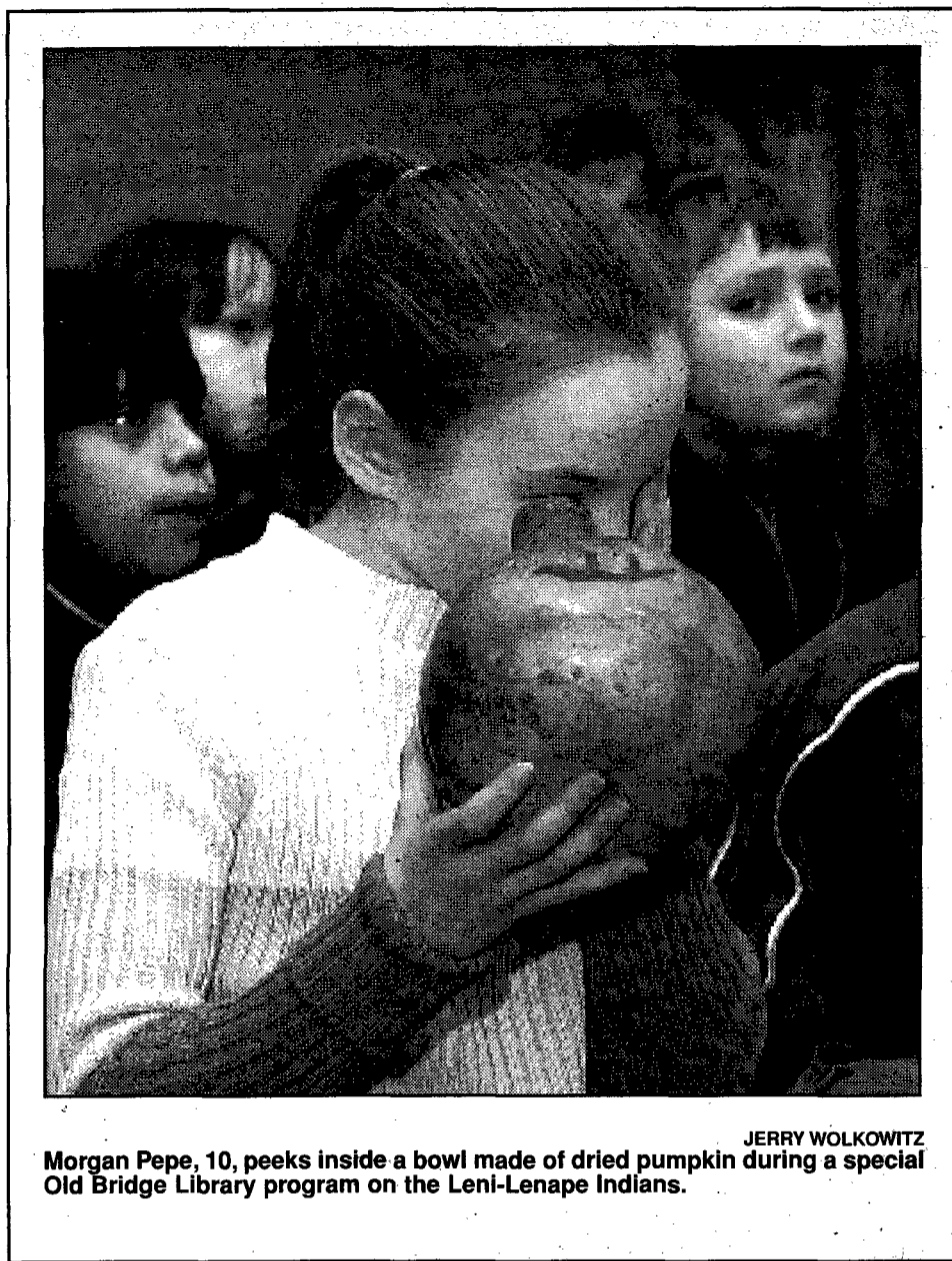

Price tag for snowstorms increasing in Old Bridge

Twp. may have to adopt emergency appropriation to pay costs

OLD BRIDGE — Cleaning up after Monday's snowstorm could cost taxpayers more money next year.

"It looks like we might need to appropriate funds to cover the cost of the cleanup," said Himanshu Shah, chief financial officer for Old Bridge. "The storm turned out to be bigger than we expected."

Estimates for snow removal costs have not yet been determined, but according to Rocco Donatelli, director of Public Works, that number is not expected to be too high.

"We got hit with about 4 inches of wet and heavy snow," Donatelli said, "but it was a short snowstorm."

Donatelli said he used 600 tons of salt and 14 trucks late Monday afternoon clearing township roads. Except for a skeleton crew, everyone was sent home around midnight, he said.

Cleanup costs for the Dec. 30 snowstorm cost the township approximately \$180,000, and it cost \$40,000 to clean up after a recent ice storm, Shah said.

The 2001 fiscal year budget allocated approximately \$150,000 for snow removal.

Historically, the town has had enough surplus funds to cover additional costs

associated with snow removal, according to Mayor Barbara Cannon.

"In 1996, we had enough surplus funds in our budget to pay for snow removal," Cannon said. "My concern is that since the surplus has been reduced again, we might have to make emergency appropriations to cover costs."

To date, the Township Council has had to appropriate \$360,000 to cover capital improvements and snow removal costs, and that number could increase before the year is up, Shah said.

Emergency appropriation funds are borrowed from the upcoming year's budget. That money eventually needs to be replaced in the new budget, Shah said.

During budget negotiations late last year, the mayor warned the council that their tax cuts will come back and haunt them, adding that the council's tax cuts would only provide short-term tax relief to residents.

The mayor's budget contained approximately \$7.8 million in surplus funds. Of that amount, approximately \$6.2 million was allocated for use in the budget, leaving the township with a \$1.66 million surplus.

During workshop meetings, the council decided to dip into the surplus and use \$600,000 to reduce taxes, leaving \$1 million in surplus funds.

"We've already had three major snowstorms this year," Cannon said. "Hopefully we have enough funds to cover snow removal costs, and that depends on how many more storms we might get this year."

E. B. temple closes doors against discrimination

Resolution bars local Boy Scout troops from using temple's facilities

EAST BRUNSWICK — Temple B'nai Shalom has decided it will no longer hold out its hand to organizations that practice discrimination.

Last week, the temple's board of trustees adopted a resolution prohibiting discrimination on the basis of gender and

sexual orientation.

Consequently, outside groups currently using the facility — including Boy Scout Troop 252 and Cub Scout Pack 250 — will be required to abide by these anti-discriminatory measures if they want to continue using the building.

While Temple B'nai Shalom claims to have always had a nondiscriminatory mindset, a written statement recently issued by temple parent organizations Union of American Hebrew Congregations (UAHC) and Central Conference of American Rabbis (CCAR) prompted the board of trustees' recent action.

Cited in the UAHC/CCAR statement was the U.S. Supreme Court case of Boy Scouts of America vs. James Dale, in which the court ruled that the Boy Scouts were allowed to bar homosexuals from serving as troop leaders.

The 5-4 decision, issued on June 28, was based on the rationale that "forcing the Scouts to accept gay troop leaders would violate the organization's rights of free expression and free association under the Constitution's First Amendment." While such a ruling did not specifically give the Boy Scouts permission to bar homosexual boys from membership, its language left room for that interpretation.

James Dale, a former Eagle Scout and assistant scoutmaster of a Matawan troop, was 19 in 1990 when he was identified in a newspaper article as co-president of a campus gay and lesbian group at Rutgers University, New Brunswick.

Shortly afterwards the Boy Scouts' Monmouth Council revoked Dale's registration as an adult Scout leader.

"As Reform Jews, and as responsible members of the East Brunswick community, we will not condone prejudice in any form," said temple President Miriam Eichler. "Unfortunately, the exclusionary practices of the Boy Scouts are in direct conflict with our most fundamental values of human rights and dignity for all."

Eichler also added that a number of the temple's members have come forward to express their discontent over the issue.

"Keeping both the people and parent organizations' feelings in mind, it became obvious to us that we needed to create a formal resolution," said Eichler.

The resolution dictates that "the temple shall not tolerate discrimination on the basis of gender and sexual orientation," and that "any organization or group which is primarily secular in nature and desires to be sponsored by the temple and/or use space within the temple is expected to honor and abide by the policy."

A copy of the resolution appears in the January/February issue of the Temple B'nai Shalom newsletter.

Both the scoutmaster of Troop 252 and leader of Pack 250 have been sent a letter signed by Eichler which includes a copy of the resolution asking whether or not they are able and willing to abide by it.

Although he has not yet seen a copy of the temple's resolution, Ron Green, chief executive officer for the Central New Jersey Council of Boy Scouts, is still troubled.

"I can tell you this ... that throughout

Sending the right message

In this week's paper, we have a story about the decision of an East Brunswick temple to close its doors to discrimination. One byproduct of this decision is the likely removal of two Boy Scout troops that use the facilities of Temple B'nai Shalom.

As you may recall, the U.S. Supreme Court last year upheld the Boy Scouts of America's right to bar homosexuals from its organization.

The decision stemmed from a lawsuit filed by former Monmouth County troop leader James Dale. The Scouts removed him following news accounts of his being a leader in the gay community at Rutgers University.

We certainly agree with the temple's decision to bar groups that advocate or practice discrimination. However, we find it painful that the Boy Scouts find themselves in this position.

The organization has been an important part of our community for almost a century. Many of us have benefited from participation in the group.

Scouting is a great place to

learn and experience about teamwork, the wilderness and travel.

We find the comments from Ron Green, chief executive officer for the Central New Jersey Council of Boy Scouts, telling, "Nothing in this program teaches discrimination," he said. "As a matter of fact, it's just the opposite. The Boy Scouts teach respect for all people and is one of the most inclusive organizations in the country."

We don't disagree with the Supreme Court's ruling. Private organizations have the right to make decisions about membership. However, the Boy Scouts made the wrong decision. The non-compromising position has done far more damage to the organization than allowing anyone who is a good scoutmaster to keep his job.

Everyone can benefit from scouting. The Scouts have never been a place for sex education. Since the organization is supposed to be teaching tolerance and inclusion, it should practice what it preaches.

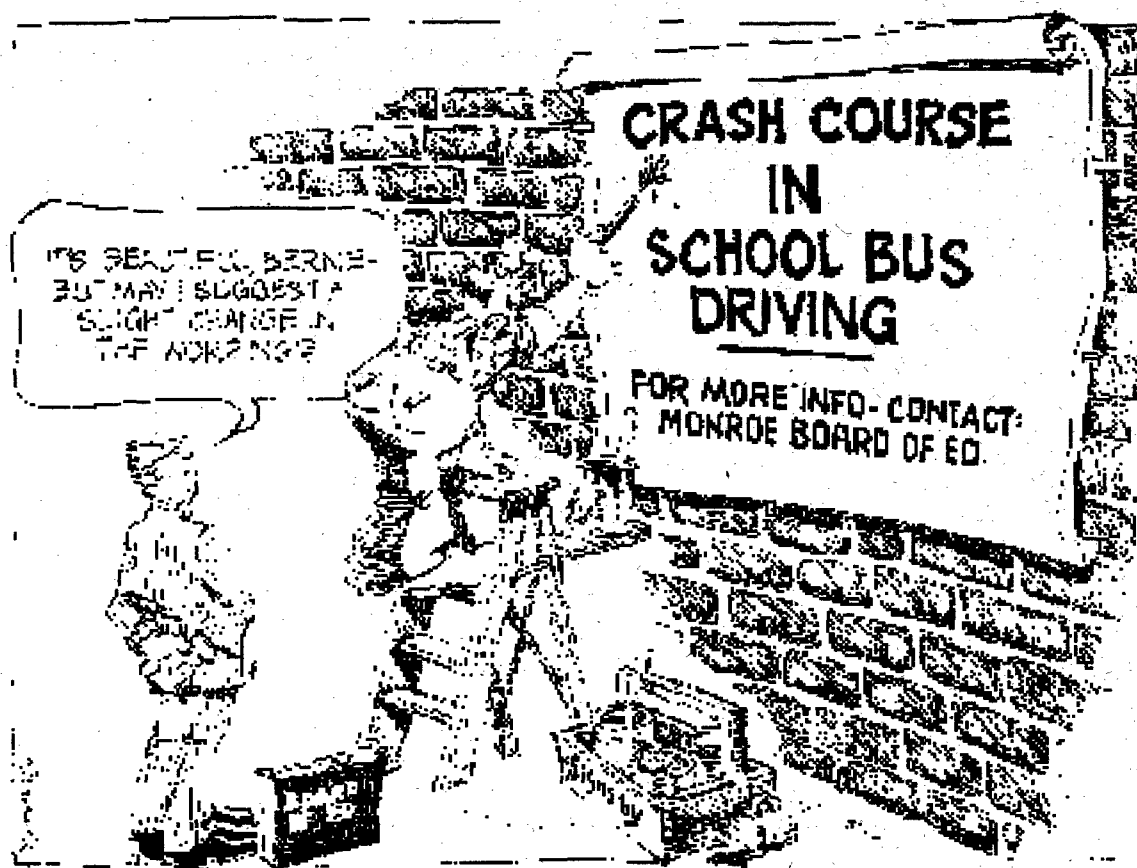

Once again, a community has come together to help those who are in need; but this time the generosity has spread to others in our county.

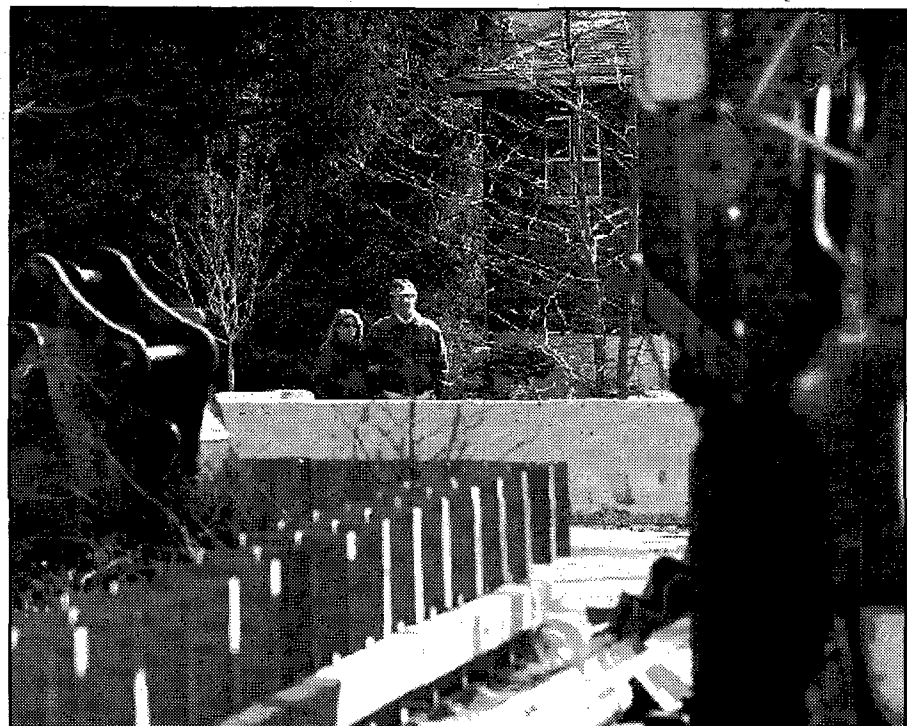
This year, the South River Elementary School Adopt-A-Family program was able to help 33 families with a total of 115 children. Not only individuals in

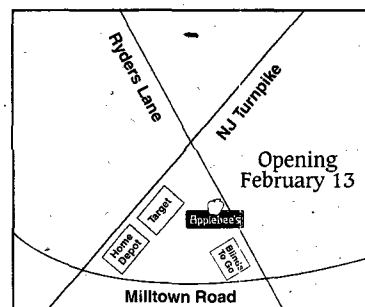

Clearwater residents want better ventilation

Heavy snows have caused heating systems to fail in adult community

SPOTSWOOD — The borough wants to make sure every resident of Clearwater Village — a mobile home adult community — has a properly vented heating system.

Following the Dec. 30 snowstorm, 43 residents had to be evacuated because they had no heat. Janine V. Balazs, director of the Spotswood Office on Aging, said heavy snow blocked roof ventilators, causing the homes' heaters to shut down.

The Spotswood Office on Aging has been approved for a Mobile Home Rehabilitation Grant to be used toward roof modifications at Clearwater Village.

The \$31,250 grant will make it possible for "income eligible" mobile home owners to receive reimbursement of up to \$125 if and when they decide to replace their roof-jack extension.

The roof jack, which leads to a propane gas heater within the home, serves both to expel exhaust and circulate fresh air.

If the top of this pipe were to become blocked, the heater's pilot light would eventually go out — causing a loss of heat and possibly a gas leak, such as the one that fire inspectors believe may have

caused an unoccupied unit to explode on Jan. 1.

Fire Inspector John Kosik is leading the investigation, which he said is still inconclusive.

Fire officials, however, did confirm that the fire did not appear to be suspicious.

"Whatever the cause, explosions like this one are extremely rare," said Business Administrator Wayne Hamilton, who is also acting Office of Emergency Management coordinator.

"There is a special mechanism within these heaters that will automatically cut off the gas supply if the pilot light has been extinguished," Hamilton added.

"This incident was an isolated one and most likely the result of one faulty mechanism."

Hamilton also stressed that Clearwater residents had nothing to be afraid of.

In order to expedite the roof-jack replacement process, Balazs has taken it upon herself to obtain quotes from two different companies that provide and install the specific model of exterior roof-jack extension recommended for Clearwater units.

They are Hague's Heating and Cooling and MSI Manufactured Home Service, both in the Spotswood area.

Hague's has supplied the cheaper of the two bids at \$125. MSI assessed the work at \$162.75.

OLD BRIDGE — Third-, fourth- and fifth-graders at Cheesquake Elementary School were part of a live radio broadcast with DJs "Scotty B" and "Greg T" from WHTZ-FM, New York's Z100 "Morning Zoo" show.

A contest promoting the importance of reading was celebrated with the help of the radio crew on Jan. 30. The crew set up their equipment in the all-purpose room of the school for an early morning broadcast. The "Z-Morning Zoo" crew was joined by 150 students and 40 parents. All participants enjoyed a continental breakfast, provided by the Old Bridge Human Relations Commission and the Friends of Seniors.

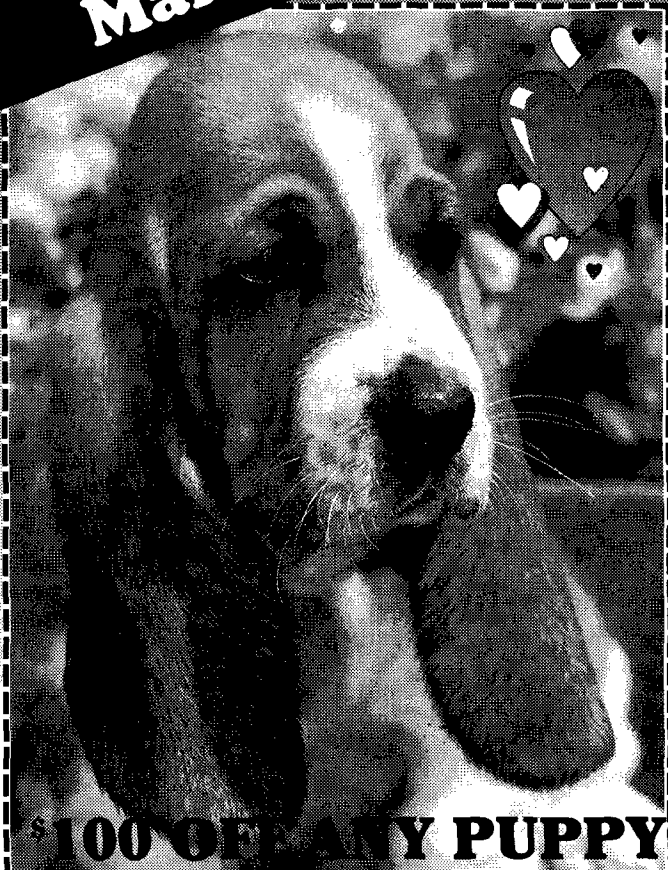

"Residents of Clearwater Village will not be forced to make these improvements," said Balazs, "nor will they be forced to use the companies we've suggested."

"However, we strongly recommend they get the work done if they can afford it, as the reimbursement check should arrive within three or four weeks after that."

The roof-jack extension would add approximately 14 inches of height to the existing pipes, which would prevent them from becoming obstructed during most normal-to-heavy snowfalls.

The economic breakdown to qualify

for the \$125 reimbursement is as follows:

- one-person family - \$30,600 total gross income;
- two-person family - \$35,000 total gross income; and
- three-person family - \$39,300 total gross income.

"These are really modest numbers," said Balazs, "which we estimate that about 250 [out of 367] homeowners will be able to take advantage of."

The remaining 117 homeowners either have already had the work done or are financially able to assume this expense.

Applications for aid must be filled out in person at the Office on Aging between 9:30 a.m. and 4 p.m. weekdays.

Applicants must bring proof of income, or a 1999 tax return or rebate form.

"Janine [Balazs] is very tenacious and extremely dedicated to these seniors," said Mayor Barry Zagnit. "Like us, she only wants what is best for them."

Again, while residents of Clearwater Village will in no way be forced to make these repairs, they are being urged to seriously consider the idea.

"I will negotiate on an individual basis for those in dire need of more [financial] assistance," Balazs said. "And I will find a way to circumvent the application process for those in need."

She concluded, "Regardless of what Clearwater residents decide to do, I would like to see every one of them conduct a regular maintenance check of their home's heating system. This is an excellent way to prevent accidents."

Emergency crews will also begin carrying specially shaped brooms with them on snow emergency calls, which will allow snow to be cleared from the lower roof jacks without actually climbing onto the roof.

East Brunswick mayor reports much progress

Township Address focuses on Open Space, Public Safety, Recreation

EAST BRUNSWICK — Approximately \$13 million worth of land was preserved, 412 arrests (the highest in the state) for drunken driving were made and 192 homeowners received compensation for sidewalk and curb repairs last year.

And that isn't all.

During Monday night's Township Council meeting, Mayor Bill Neary delivered his fifth annual State of the Township address — which he began by highlighting some of last year's accomplishments.

Achievements both large and small were noted, as Neary spoke of the 13,876 summonses issued by the East Brunswick Police Department to aggressive drivers, the transition of Channel 8 to EBT Channel 3 — resulting in the live broadcast of council meetings — and the 5 miles of municipal roads that underwent reconstruction, as well as the \$250,000 grant for construction of a bikeway along the Ryder Lane corridor.

"Despite all of the continuing projects, the Planning and Engineering Department has plans for an even more aggressive agenda in 2001," Neary said.

Two hundred and forty-one trees were planted in East Brunswick this year as part of the township's first-ever Shade Tree Master Plan.

"For the first time in many years we are adding more trees than we are losing," Neary said.

On the scholastic front, Irwin School was added as an additional site for the Township's School Aged Child Care program.

In addition, financial assistance was given to three more PTAs to use for improving the neighborhood's school playgrounds.

The Public Works Department successfully distributed over 55,000 free leaf bags

to residents wishing to participate in the voluntary leaf bagging program, started by the Neary administration in 1999.

The township's programs for seniors experienced an increase in intergenerational activities, the hiring of a new director for the Department of Aging and other staff changes that have brought fresh ideas and a new energy to the senior center.

Also last year, the center underwent numerous renovations with the installation of automatic doors, a new roof and a more efficient heating and air-conditioning system.

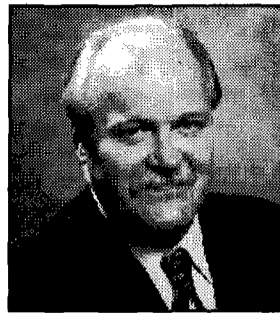
"The senior center is another shining star in our municipal services," Neary said. "No wonder attendance [at the center] has increased from 31,700 to 33,555 in 2000."

The mayor also spoke about the excellent state of the township recreation department, pointing to what he considers to be last year's most significant improvement — the increase in the duration of the all day summer camp program from six to seven weeks.

"For those of you that feel our recreation department is the thread that holds our community together, you should be pleased to know that we will never unravel it," Neary said.

In addition to the summer camp programs, the department has been responsible for providing dozens of additional programs for children of all ages, adults and families.

The East Brunswick Arts Commission, for example, presented adult activities such as the Coffee House Series, Wonderful Wednesdays, and trips to New

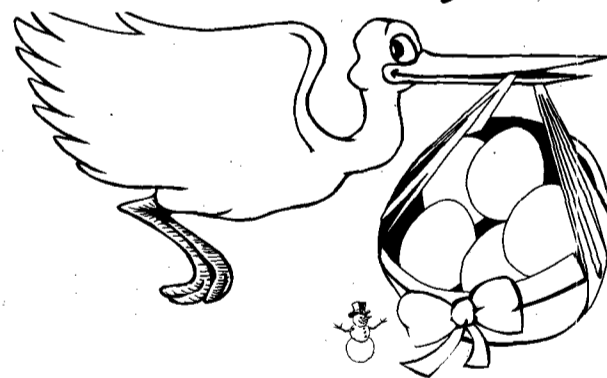

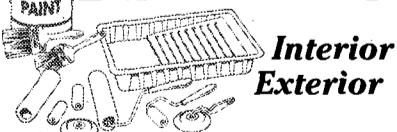

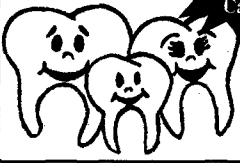

The truth about George

First president a guest
at county historical
association gathering

MIDDLETOWN — George Washington held a press conference last week.

It was the highlight of the Monmouth County Historical Association's Jan. 30 102nd annual meeting.

After getting lost on the way to the Taylor-Butler House and trying to find the right place to park his horse, Nelson, after he threw a shoe, the white-haired, sword-bearing first president of the United States made his grand entrance, descending the staircase at the historic home nestled on Kings Highway.

He was in pretty good form for a 269-year-old. He spoke eloquently, interjecting just the right amount of humor into his monologue as an overflowing room full of Monmouth County Historical Association members sat transfixed.

Washington, aka William Sommerfield of the American Historical Theater, joked that his wife was the only one who didn't vote for him, as he explained how and why the Electoral College was created.

As the country's first president, he enlightened the crowd on how the Electoral College was designed to protect the small states from being overrun by the larger states, which have many more votes to cast, in an election.

Sommerfield has played George Washington for 10 years and is the only person authorized to portray the first president at Mount Vernon, the Washingtons' family home in Virginia.

He held a newspaper in his hand as he expressed his angst over the publicity craze that now surrounds the sought-after office of the most powerful man in the world.

"Balderdash!" exclaimed the first president as he shook a mock newspaper and read excerpts from it. He talked about what a dismal job the presidency is nowadays, since "they write about you in the newspapers."

Sommerfield's Washington talked about being "cash poor and mind rich" as he explained how he had to borrow \$500 to get to his own inauguration, which was then held on April 21 instead of January, as it is today.

When it came to formulate a title for the new office, Washington said he suggested "Mr. President," calling other

choices too formal and monarch-sounding.

Correlating the discord of the past with the turmoil surrounding November's election, he talked about how he appointed the diametrically, politically opposed Alexander Hamilton and Thomas Jefferson to his cabinet, each having his own area of expertise. Hamilton became secretary of the treasury and Jefferson, secretary of state.

"They were stubborn as mules for that first term in office, but they pulled together and worked just fine," he said.

After espousing his own thoughts on the French Revolution and a few other snippets of history, the man posing as president conducted a press conference, fielding questions from members of "the press," aka the audience.

He set the record straight on a few things. For instance, when asked if his teeth were in the Smithsonian Institution, the president replied, "No, I think they're in my mouth."

And speaking of teeth, the president made it clear that he does not have wooden teeth.

"They're made of hippo tusks. When I made my second inaugural speech, people said I never laughed nor made any small talk. It was because my teeth were bad. So I had teeth crafted out of hippopotamus tusks. There was considerable criticism of me as the president of the United States," he said.

Some of the tougher questions were those that concerned Washington's treatment of General Lee and other historical criticisms. But Sommerfield didn't flinch as he answered them.

"I remember you, sir," he replied to a man who asked about his treatment of Lee. "You and I had brandy wine and you fell off your horse. Yes, I had a problem with General Lee. You see, he couldn't make up his mind. He thought he was British and he thought he was American."

He even told of his favorite dish that Martha Washington made for him, without wavering or speculating for a second. "Each morning Martha made me hot cakes with sugar, honey, and two cups of tea. She was a wonderful cook, besides being the richest woman in Virginia," he sniped with a gentlemanly chuckle.

As for the famous cherry tree story, it's not true. "I never cut down a cherry tree," he said. "A man wrote about that and made it up. It was a myth."

After answering a few more questions on his theories about international lending and borrowing, and the Battle of Trenton turning the tide of the Revolutionary War

York City shows, Neary said.

"The recreation department is also to thank for the Fourth of July fireworks extravaganza, last year's Millennium Party, our Memorial and Veterans Day observances and much more," the mayor added.

Last year, the department serviced more than 38,000 people in a wide variety of programs.

"We must continue to provide these popular programs and keep the fees affordable," Neary said.

"The \$632,000 generated for fee-based activities continues to keep our programs self-funded, and minimizes tax dollars," he

said.

Technology has also come a long way over the past year, according to Neary.

He stressed the Township Council's staunch commitment to providing technological equipment that would effectively service residents.

"In four short years," he said, "every department throughout the township has been equipped with new computers."

He also made mention of the township's newly developed, comprehensive Web site, which attracts approximately 266 hits per day.

"In the near future, residents will be able to directly interact with many of our departments," Neary said.

"In fact, many of them are already taking advantage of our e-mail system to communicate with us, at their convenience, on a whole host of topics," the mayor added.

The mayor finished his speech by acknowledging predictions of a national slowing of the economy in 2001, which could possibly have a ripple effect that would hit close to home.

"So as we begin the task of setting our goals and objectives for this year, including budget preparations, this climate of change will be on all of our minds," Neary said.

"This will no doubt present many challenges for us to overcome as we strive to achieve our stable municipal tax rate, allocate resources to continue to improve our roads and infrastructure, and plan for future needs," he added.

"But I am confident that with your support and the continued support of this council, we can face these challenges with success," he said.

The challenges, he said, will most likely include increasing school enrollment, municipal parks and ball fields filled to capacity, the award-winning library stretching the demands of an educated population and extensive use of East Brunswick's public buildings by township and community groups.

"We [on the East Brunswick governing body] cannot sit back, cannot get complacent," Neary said. "We must use our past accomplishments as the standard for our future."

"We must work together to meet the needs that have yet to be met and focus on our needs for the future, if we are to preserve our quality of life and ensure that East Brunswick continues to be the best it can be," he said.

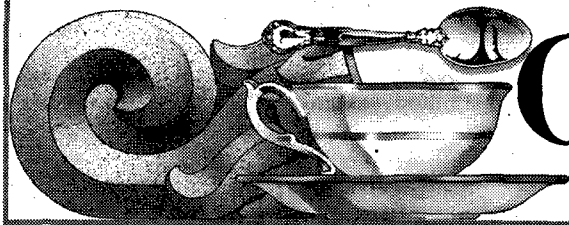

Guide to Good Eating

For a top-notch barbecue joint, try The South RiBber

Eric Pintinics and Joseph D'Esposito, while vacationing in South Carolina, sampled local barbecue sauces and decided that they can do better. Upon creating their own sauces, it became apparent for these childhood friends that it would be great to open up their own ribs, chicken and seafood restaurant in the town in which they were both born and raised.

The South RiBber is the latest culinary sensation that is resurrecting the dining scene in downtown South River. This homey, quaint take-out/eat-in establishment, which seats 20 comfortably, has five TVs, three huge refrigerated cases filled with beverages, and pictures of downtown South River taken in the late 1800s and early 1900s, is located on Main Street, across the street from the South River police station.

Opened on Sept. 23, The South RiBber opened its doors to a well-received public.

"Our specialty and top seller is the barbecue baby back ribs," said D'Esposito, who later mentioned that they sell beef short ribs as well. The ribs are available as a full or half rack and come with a choice of all-natural sauces including Joe's Sissy Sauce, Smokin' Joe's Hot BBQ, Eric's Sweet and Tangy, and Eric's Inferno.

Included in my sample of several menu items were baby back ribs with Eric's Sweet and Tangy sauce. There was no fat on the ribs and the medium sauce was delicious. I had the pleasure of sampling the BBQ shredded pork, which contained no fat or filler, and possessed that delicious sauce that I requested on the ribs. An order of shredded pork, which is normally sold as a sandwich for \$5.25, contains 1/2 pound of pork and is served with french fries.

The RiBber's barbecue menu extends to items such as a whole or half chicken, available with the same selection of sauces, as well as the widely known Cluck U Chicken Wingers, for which The RiBber is a branded dealer. Cluck U sauces consist of Mild, Atomic, Nuclear and Thermo Nuclear. The chicken, which is also served as a sandwich, is juicy and the wings are meaty and do not appear to be deep-fried. D'Esposito said that they are deep-fried, but the high quality frying oil that they use prevents the food from becoming heavy and greasy. The side order of sweet potato fries, fried skin and all, also showed no sign of grease. The mozzarella sticks and onion rings that I had for appetizers were lightly battered, not breaded. The sticks were filled with the real thing, and the rings contained whole onions. Other appetizers that are offered include soup, salad, and jalapeno poppers with your pick of cheddar or cream cheese filling.

The fresh fish, which is delivered

every Monday and Thursday, is served in platters of your choice of fried or broiled flounder, haddock, catfish, scallops or shrimp. Fried platters include fries, cole slaw, tartar and lemon. Broiled platters include baked potato, cole slaw and lemon. I selected broiled flounder and requested a baked sweet potato, which I thoroughly enjoyed. The fish was definitely fresh and perfectly seasoned with parsley and paprika. The flounder, haddock and catfish are also available as sandwiches. The fish platters range from \$8.25 for the fried flounder or catfish to \$11.95 for the broiled scallops. The sandwiches are \$6.50 each. Previously unmentioned sides include cheese fries, warm cinnamon apples, baked beans, macaroni salad, potato salad and corn on the cob (when available).

The selection of pies caught my eye as I tasted my companion's rhubarb pie. They also have strawberry, apple, blueberry and peach. All pies are fresh and naturally sweet. The carrot cake that I sampled was very good, and they also have cheesecake.

D'Esposito and Pintinics, who both have enjoyed cooking since childhood and who each have previous cooking experience, Pintinics at area restaurants and D'Esposito in the U.S. Navy, are surprised at how quickly word has spread about The South RiBber. The facts that all of the food is served fresh and prepared to the customer's specifi-

cation, that they have South River roots and are familiar with the clientele, and that the area was in need of a good rib joint all contribute to the appeal and success of the establishment.

The front page of the menu states, "Come on in and have a seat. You're better off here than across the street." They jokingly say this because of their location across from the police station, but the saying would hold true if they were across the street from any of the franchise restaurants to which we've all gotten accustomed.

The South RiBber, located at 56 Main St. in South River, is open 11 a.m. to 9 p.m. seven days a week, with a lunch menu available from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. daily. Free delivery is available with a \$10 minimum order. Areas of delivery extend into Sayreville and to the fairgrounds in East Brunswick. The phone number is (732) 238-RIBB (7422) and their Web address is www.njweb.com/ribs/. The South RiBber is also on the Web with N.J. Cyber Coupons. 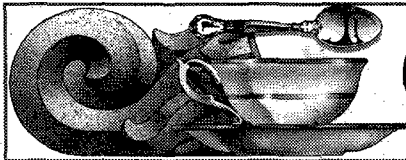

Enjoy cuisine from all over the world at Percalla

Those in the mood for delicious Mediterranean food will be delighted with Percalla Mediterranean Grill, 7 South St. in Freehold. The restaurant is a culinary tour of 14 countries — Turkey, Egypt, Morocco, Greece, Tunisia, Israel, Lebanon, Armenia, Spain, Percalla, France, Syria, Algeria and Italy.

From the outside, the restaurant seems a bit small-scale. Once you step inside, however, you realize the outward appearance is quite deceiving. Only Percalla's main dining room is visible from the street entrance, but there are also intimate booths farther back, and rather large dining room at the rear of the establishment — all together allowing seating for more than 100 guests. Colorful original artwork (which can be purchased) complements the lively décor. The atmosphere is festive. Owners Sandra and Richard Callamaras (Richard is also the chef) think food is for more than sustenance — it should be a celebration.

"I love great food and the hustle and bustle of cooking, serving, and enjoying good conversation. That should be what eating out is all about," says Richard, who with wife Sandra have at least half the countries represented on the menu somewhere in their collective bloodlines.

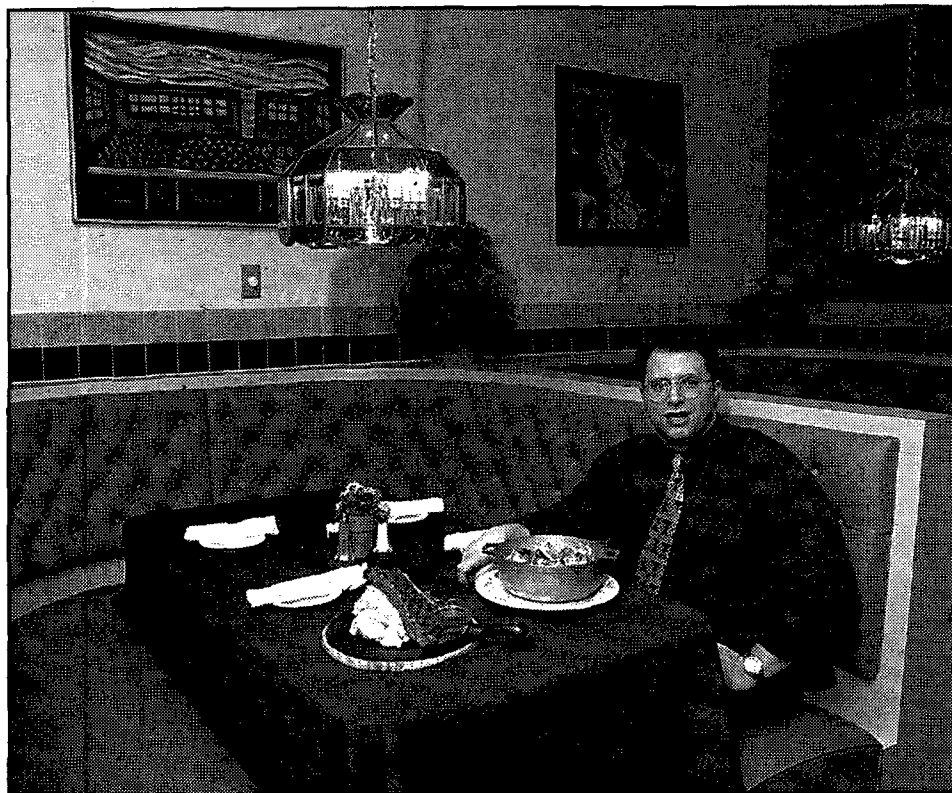
The menu is informative and clever,

with flags next to each dish showing the nation of origin. It is here the gastronomic tour of the Mediterranean begins.

To start your meal, try a cup of Syro-Palestinian clam chowder, a wonderfully spicy chowder similar to Manhattan-style, but extremely thick and loaded with vegetables. A lighter way to begin is with a salad. Kodar (Tunisia) consists of mixed baby greens, red onions, golden raisins, pine nuts, dried dates, and a tabil vinaigrette. Also noteworthy is the antipasto, generous enough for two to share, with delectable ingredients such as marinated lamb, smoked ham, brie, Asiago, grapefruit, mandarin orange, marinated olives, and grilled vegetables over fresh greens dressed with citrus vinaigrette.

The entrees are remarkable, skillfully prepared, and beautifully presented. The Hamam Muhammar — grilled, butterflied quail lightly brushed with Egyptian/Algerian marinade, served with toasted pita and saffron potatoes over a bed of spiced spinach, is scrumptious, as is the Souvlakia (Greece) — marinated leg of lamb skewered and served over mixed greens tossed with red onions, tomato, and orzo in a lemon and oregano dressing, served with a side of tzadziki.

As expected, the paella (Spain) is an excellent choice — saffron-infused rice cooked with clams, mussels, shrimp, scallops, calamari, chorizo and chicken, tossed with pimentos, olives, and peas — olé!

For something out of the ordinary (though most of the dishes served at Percalla are just that) try something with a Moroccan-Tunisian influence such as the Tabil veal chop — a pan-seared and oven-roasted 12-ounce chop seasoned Middle-Eastern style and served over baba ghanouj with a crown of toasted bread. Extraordinary.

The final leg of your Mediterranean eating tour is dessert, with tempting sweets such as rustic apple-berry bread pudding, baklava and biscotti (homemade and truly scrumptious), tiramisu, and oversized truffles in assorted flavors such as Chambord, Frangelico, Godiva — delectably decadent.

After-dinner coffees such as Amoro-

Turkish, cappuccino, espresso, café latte, cocoa, cocoa cappuccino, and cocoa latte are fabulous (all "cocoa" coffees are made with imported Dutch cocoa).

Service is excellent at Percalla, and Chef Richard frequently comes out to chat with guests about, you guessed it, the dishes served, the origins of dishes, and what new and exciting cuisine he is thinking of introducing and possibly adding to the already extensive list of countries represented on the menu.

If you are on a pilgrimage to find authentic Mediterranean food, your journey should begin and end at Percalla.

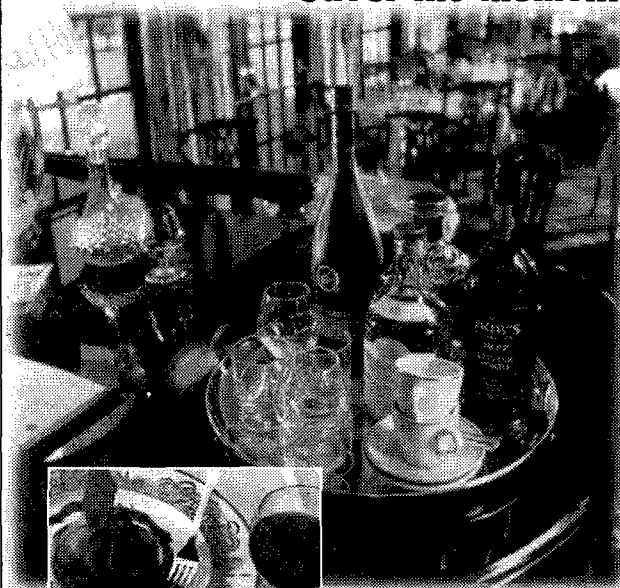

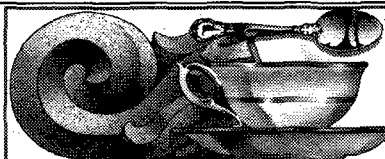

Confessions of a chocoholic: 'Give me more, give me more!'

No one is happier than I when February arrives. February has become my favorite month for one reason, and one reason alone — St. Valentine's Day.

It's not that I am an incurable romantic. Far from it. It is just that Valentine's Day allows me to go public with my biggest vice.

OK, I confess. I am a chocoholic. Go ahead, tell me that everyone loves chocolate, and it is not a vice. You are correct if you're talking about the run of the mill candy bar a day, two pieces out of a Whitman's Sampler kind of chocolate lover. Even the brownie eater who can stop after three sounds reasonable to me.

I, on the other hand, have gotten out of a warm bed in the middle of a snowy night to drive six miles to the nearest 7-Eleven store because there was no chocolate in the house.

Eating a pound of M&M peanuts barely satisfies my craving. I can remember, with longing, my introduction to Leonidas, a Belgian chocolatier, seven years ago.

It was a dark chocolate bonbon filled with real cream, delicately scented with hazelnut and shaped like a lily. The chocolate was impossibly smooth and nearly bitter. The thick, rich, cream filling begged for a spoon.

I savored the taste for nearly a minute before devouring another five pieces. Need I say more? The worst part of this confession is that I am not looking for a cure. The only 12-step program I want involves a game of "Candyland," and it had better be made of chocolate.

Valentine's Day gives me a chance to indulge my vice in public. So many people expect to overindulge in chocolate for the day that I blend in without

notice. The Valentine's Day gifts that please me most are neither jewelry nor flowers nor sonnets. Champagne might be nice, but only as an accompaniment to some strawberries dipped in dark chocolate. And please, no frilly red satin heart-shaped boxes. Save the money and use it to buy a bigger box of butter creams! As for the sentimental cards, buy one if you must, but please be sure it arrives on top of a container of dark chocolate almond bark.

In case my family and friends are reluctant to supply my habit, I think I will make myself a batch of my favorite truffles. The recipe was given to me by one of my dearest friends and is laughably easy to make. The only difficult thing about it is trying not to eat all of the truffles as quickly as they are made.

Kelly's Truffles

- 16 ounce bag of semi-sweet chocolate chips
- 1 can ready to spread chocolate fudge icing
- 1/4 cup Kahlua
- cocoa, chopped nuts or coconut for rolling

Place chocolate chips in a microwave safe bowl. Melt in microwave on 50 percent power for two minutes. Stir and continue to microwave on 50 percent power until chips are melted. Stir in can of icing and Kahlua. Refrigerate for 20 minutes or until cool enough to handle. Roll mixture into one-inch balls, and roll each ball in cocoa or other topping. Allow truffles to firm on waxed paper. Store in refrigerator. Truffles will keep for three weeks.

Yield: 30 truffles

the history of the Boy Scouts, it has never been our practice, nor our policy, to ask leaders or Scouts about their sexual orientation or preference," Green said.

"On the same token, we do not allow the private lives or personal agendas of our leaders to detract from the program's core values," added Green.

Green went on to say that the Boy Scouts have been synonymous for setting the best educational values for over 90 years, which has proved effective through a variety of studies.

"If they follow what they're taught, this organization will have an extremely positive effect on children that will stay with them into adulthood," Green added.

"Nothing in this program teaches discrimination. As a matter of fact, it's just the opposite," he said.

"The Boy Scouts teach respect for all people and is one of the most inclusive organizations in the country," he said.

While Green maintained that the temple has a right to exclude the Boy Scouts, he also said that the two (Scout) parties involved have a right to not want to meet in a place that practices reverse discrimination.

"The point that people are missing here is that innocent children and good people [in Scouting] are being exploited by other individuals' own agendas," Green said.

"The bottom line is that the Boy Scouts

of America do not discriminate," he concluded. "And the fact that we have never responded forcefully to such allegations does not change that."

Eichler, however, stressed the point that this policy "is not aimed particularly at the Boy Scouts, but at anyone who would discriminate."

Rabbi Eric Milgrim, religious leader of Temple B'nai Shalom and a social action and civil rights leader in the community, said, "We have always dedicated ourselves

as a people to the improvement of the world. To us, as Reform Jews, this includes a commitment to social justice and the rights of the individual, as well as the principle of inclusion, not exclusion."

And the UAH/CCAR Joint Commission on Social Action had this to say, "While we main-

tain our hope that the Boy Scouts of America will abandon its discriminatory policies, its lack of response to the many expressions of disagreement and disappointment with the policies gives us little basis for optimism."

Temple B'nai Shalom's sponsorship of the Boy Scouts includes providing space as needed for meetings, distributing membership recruitment materials and publicizing events, as well as recognition at annual Shabbat services.

"I can assure you, we are not doing this to raise a conflict, but rather felt it important to publicly state how we feel," said Eichler.

"Nothing in this organization teaches discrimination. As a matter of fact, it's just the opposite."

Mayor: Toxic site payment is like 'a slap on the wrist'

MARLBORO — As the period for comment on the Imperial Oil-Burnt Fly Bog federal Superfund site consent decrees comes to an end, more information on the cost of the cleanup is coming to light.

As of Jan. 28, the period for receiving comments on the proposed consent decrees ended, leaving the matter to the U.S. Court for the District of New Jersey. The two sites in question are the 15-acre Imperial Oil-Champion Chemical site on Orchard Place near Tennent Road and Route 79, and the Burnt Fly Bog toxic waste site on Texas Road.

On Dec. 7, the two proposed consent decrees were lodged in the court, outlining payments from Imperial Oil, Champion Chemical, and Emil and June Stevens to the federal and state governments, reimbursing them for a portion of the cleanup that has already taken place on both the Imperial Oil and Burnt Fly Bog properties.

According to environmental documents listed in the Federal Register on Dec. 28, "The consent decrees resolve or partially resolve the liability of defendants Champion Chemical Co. Inc., Imperial Oil Co. Inc., Emil Stevens and June Stevens."

According to Joseph A. Gowers, project manager for the Southern New Jersey Remediation Section of the federal Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), "Through June 1998, EPA has incurred at least \$10.5 million in costs for the Imperial Oil site."

Section five of the consent decree covers the reimbursement of United States response costs and state response costs and sets out the amount for Imperial Oil and Champion Chemical to pay the EPA Hazardous Substance Superfund, \$1.375 million, citing "representations to the United States of their limited abilities to reimburse the United States."

"I am very disappointed that the government has not found a legal way for Imperial Oil to pay the full amount of the cleanup, even if it means having Imperial Oil paying out money over a period of years," said Tina Freedman of Marlboro, president of the Monmouth County Environmental Coalition (MCEC). "Maybe they should get the people at the IRS to show them how to do it."

Marlboro Mayor Matthew Scannapieco said, "It appears as if the amount is

rather insignificant toward the cleanup cost to date and in the future. It's a slap on the wrist. We wish it could have been more."

The attorney representing Imperial Oil, Kathy Caminiti, of the firm of Collier, Jacob and Mills, of Somerset, did not return messages seeking comment. To date, there has not been a public disclosure of the financial records of Imperial Oil supporting the firm's reported "limited ability to pay."

Part of the consent decree explains that the settling defendants "do not admit any liability to the United States or the state or the appropriateness of civil penalties arising out of the transactions or occurrences alleged in the complaints in the actions captioned above, or in the complaints and third-party complaints filed in the actions related to the Burnt Fly Bog site."

The proposed payment schedule for Imperial Oil and Champion Chemical is broken down in 96 payments of \$12,500, made in monthly installments totaling \$1.2 million; and \$175,000 would be paid within 30 days of entry of the consent decree.

Imperial Oil would also pay a percentage of future profits. Subsection C of Section 5 indicates that Imperial Oil would pay the difference between 15 percent of its gross profits for that calendar year and the total payments made to the U.S. government if the firm's gross profits are \$1 million or less. If the gross profits are more than \$1 million, the percentage is 18 percent and the difference between total payments in the year. For \$2 million in profits, it is 20 percent.

A total of 70 percent of insurance recoveries by the settling defendants would be reimbursed to the government. The federal government would then divide this reimbursement 75 percent toward the Imperial Oil site and 25 percent toward the Burnt Fly Bog site.

"It's the people's money being used to clean up contamination by private industry," Scannapieco said.

"If the government and the people let polluters off the hook, why would any industry comply with regulations and standards? It's far cheaper to pollute than to be environmentally conscious," Freedman added. "Maybe they don't realize that we are all connected in New Jersey. We all breathe the same air and drink from local aquifers."

According to the EPA's Web site, the Imperial Oil-Champion Chemical site

 consists of seven production, storage and maintenance buildings and 56 above-ground storage tanks. Imperial Oil blends oil on the site, which is leased from Champion Chemical. Several companies have operated at the site in the past. One, a reprocessor of waste oil, may have discharged wastes to a nearby stream, according to the EPA.

Another company which operated at the site produced arsenical pesticides. The site formerly contained a waste pile contaminated with polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs).

Reports from the EPA state that surrounding the site are many areas that could be critically affected by contaminants in the soil and water. A fire pond in

the northeastern corner of the property line is contaminated. A small stream from the pond eventually flows into Lake Lefferts in Matawan.

Samples collected from Lake Lefferts during the remedial investigation indicated that the lake is not significantly impacted by the contaminants found at the Imperial Oil site. Also located around the site are a wetlands area and a wooded area.

The ground water is contaminated with volatile organic compounds (VOCs), PCBs, metals, polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs), petroleum hydrocarbons, and phthalates, a plastics byproduct, according to the EPA.

The summary from the Web site added that off-site sediments contain numerous contaminants including arsenic, lead, phthalates and PCBs. The surface soil is contaminated with heavy metals including chromium, lead and arsenic, as well as PCBs. Surface water contains arsenic. Potential health threats include direct contact, accidental ingestion or inhalation of airborne contaminated dust, groundwater or soil.

Monroe likely to hire interim superintendent

MONROE — The Board of Education has decided it cannot quickly replace Dr. Stuart Schnur and will instead appoint an interim superintendent of schools.

Schnur will leave the school district at the end of the month to assume his duties as superintendent of the Montgomery school system in Somerset County.

Board of Education member Carol Bjornsen said the search has been narrowed to two interim candidates from a pool of four.

The board is now waiting to receive the candidates' proposed conditions for service so it can make a final decision.

Bjornsen would not release their names at this time. The board hope to release the temporary administrator's name on Feb. 21.

"When Dr. Schnur announced that he was leaving, he notified the Superintendents Association. They gave us a list of retired administrators who were willing to take the position. There were maybe 13 people on the list," Bjornsen said.

She added that a retired administrator can serve for up to six months without coming out of retirement.

Bjornsen said the board expects to pay the temporary superintendent between \$500 and \$700 a day and hopes to have the position filled permanently by Sept. 1.

Bjornsen said the board has appointed the New Jersey School Boards Association to find candidates qualified to run the township's schools.

Carol Larsen, the association's field representative, said she will meet with the board to set a hiring criteria for the new superintendent. She did not have a specific date for the meeting.

Larsen said after she meets with the board, she will reach out to number of groups in the community, including the PTA and the Township Council, to get their input. She will then place advertisements in local newspapers and on a number of Internet sites.

Larsen believes that the board will meet its goal of filling the position by Sept. 1.

"It is probable that the process will be finished over the summer," Larsen said.

Milltown gets tree grant

Hazardous trees to be removed; seedlings to be distributed for Arbor Day

MILLTOWN — The borough has received a \$15,000 grant from the New Jersey State Forestry Service to be used for the maintenance and removal of trees.

In order to receive the grant, the borough had to provide \$5,000 for tree maintenance. The Borough Council authorized Business Administrator Richard Rydstrom to provide the money at its Jan. 22 meeting.

"We're going to use it to remove hazardous trees and stumps as well as for pruning," said Jim Strimple, head of the borough's Shade Tree Commission. He said a hazardous tree is one that is dead and in danger of falling, one that blocks motorists' line of sight or one that has disrupted sidewalks.

The borough will employ a certified tree expert to determine which trees are hazardous. "This will allow sidewalks to be repaired," said Strimple.

Residents are held responsible for the sidewalks in front of their homes. According to Strimple, residents who have trees removed in order to repair their sidewalks will be billed on their real estate tax over a three-year period. Residents also have the option of paying the town in a lump sum.

"The Shade Tree Commission plans to replace any trees that are removed," Strimple said.

Strimple said the borough applied for the grant last fall. The money will likely be received in March and the project

should be completed in a few weeks. The borough is currently looking for a contractor to perform the labor.

Strimple added that the borough intends to fulfill part of its \$5,000 obligation by providing borough employees to work on the project.

Strimple also noted that April 27 is Arbor Day. The commission will plant a seedling at the Joyce Kilmer School and will also distribute 100 seedlings to children which are to be planted in residents' yards.

The program will include presentations by the students about trees. "The idea is to teach the children about the proper care and benefits of trees," Strimple said.

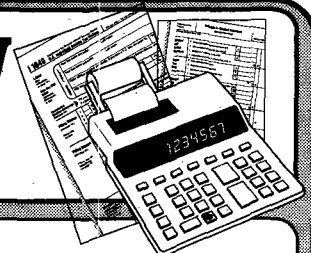

TOOTH TALK

AN ORANGE A DAY



It seems that gum benefit from adequate vitamin C intake. According to recent research, men and women who consume less than 60 milligrams daily of vitamin C (about the amount found in an orange or a half-cup of broccoli) have one and a half times the risk of developing severe gingivitis as those who eat three times that amount. Currently, the recommendation for daily vitamin C intake is 90 milligrams for men, and 75 milligrams for women. Gingivitis, the mildest form of gum disease, causes the gums to become red and swollen and to bleed easily. If left untreated, it can progress to periodontitis, in which the bone and tissue supporting the teeth are destroyed, resulting in tooth loss.

Knights finish a close second to Tigers at GMC tourney

South Plainfield outscores Old Bridge by 8.5 points for fourth straight title

Going into Saturday's Greater Middlesex Conference Wrestling Tournament, it was expected that the Red Division's top three teams would be vying for the team title by the end of the day.

A fourth Red Division team surprised everyone by getting into the mix, before leaving the tournament with an impressive third-place finish.

As for the championship, it was a familiar face standing above the rest by day's end as the South Plainfield Tigers won their fourth consecutive GMCT title, although this one was tougher to get than past titles.

The Tigers were the pre-tournament favorite; however, it was generally believed that the slightest slip-up at a couple of weights could allow either Old Bridge or South Brunswick (who upset South Plainfield earlier this year) to squeak out the team title. Added to that, the Tigers were somewhat short-handed, with two wrestlers dropping out with injuries, leaving only 13 wrestlers entering the tournament. Both Old Bridge and South Brunswick had to like their chances.

The Tigers proved once again why they are the class of the field, pulling off a 218-209.5 advantage over the Knights in the final team standings.

In third place was a surprising Perth Amboy team (147.5) which posted its highest finish ever, topping South Brunswick, who finished fourth with

136 points.

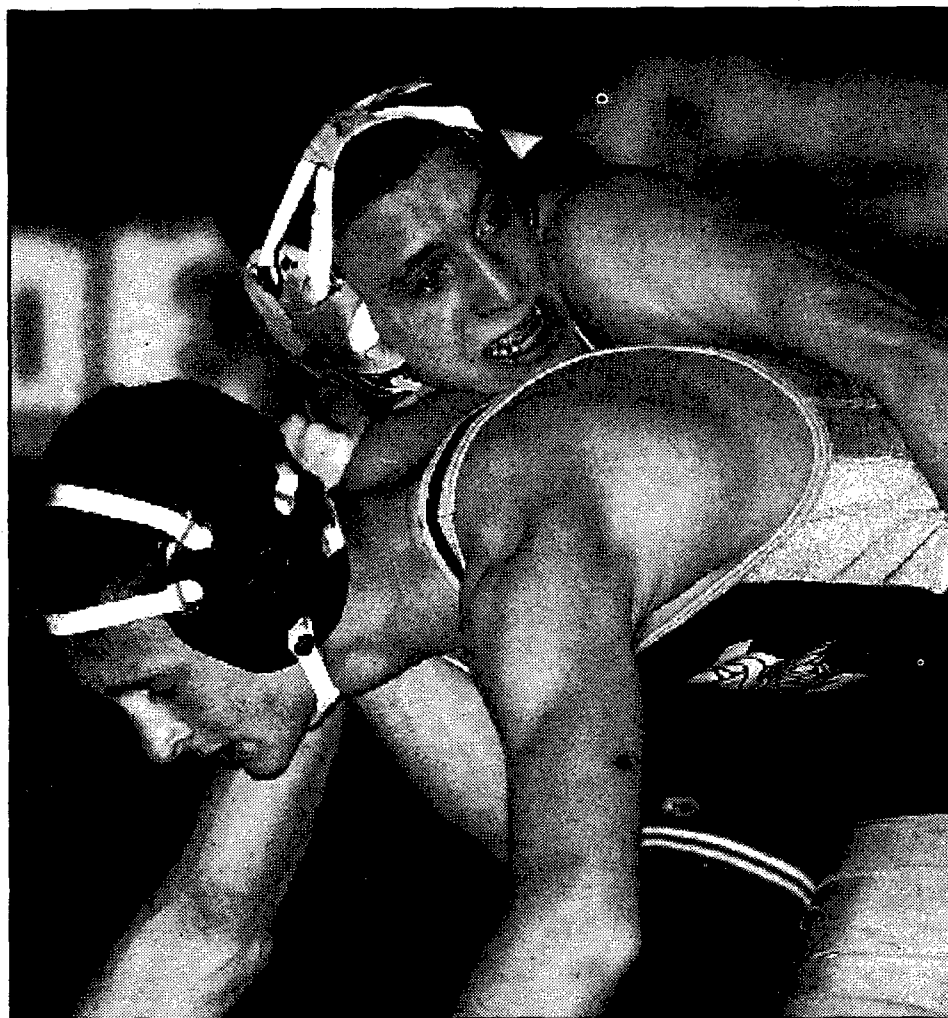
In the finals, held Saturday at Piscataway, Old Bridge got off to a good start at 103 pounds when senior Justin Smigelsky, the top seed coming in, major decisioned Perth Amboy's Mike Rodriguez. Smigelsky was dominant in the final, posting a takedown and two near fall points in the first period of action. Later in the match, Smigelsky added a reversal and four more takedowns to seal the win.

But South Plainfield came storming back at 112, where Rich Gebauer got by Old Bridge's Ian Gorham with a 4-3 decision in a very close match. Gebauer scored first with a takedown, and added an escape in the second before Gorham scored a takedown of his own. Gebauer's subsequent escape gave him the narrow victory and put the Tigers back on track.

At 119, the Tigers got another win, this one in the form of a major decision (9-0) from returning state champ Matt Anderson, who controlled his match with Woodbridge's Marcello Medini. Anderson was in control from the start, as he won his third GMC title in three years.

At 125, Old Bridge got some much-needed points as Vinny Iodaci beat South Plainfield's Roberto Ramos, 8-5, to take the title. Iodaci took the early lead in this bout with a takedown, but found himself behind after Ramos came back with two of his own in the second period. Trailing 5-4, Iodaci took him down and threw him in a cradle for two back points with 20 seconds left to pull off the win.

Old Bridge's Rob Cook was unable to keep the Knights' momentum rolling, however, as he lost the 130-pound final to top seed Ed Gutnik from J.F. Kennedy via a technical fall (17-2). But Cook wrestled well to get to the final, where he found

Gutnik anxiously awaiting his third straight GMC title.

The 130-pound final gave South Brunswick its only GMC champ as Kyle Nasdeo major-decisioned Woodbridge's Jason Bone 15-2. This match-up between region champs was one of the more anticipated matches of the day, but quickly turned into a mismatch as Nasdeo pulled off five takedowns while allowing only two escapes by Bone.

At 140, J.P. Stevens' Gene Zannetti made up for a previous double-overtime loss to South Plainfield's Scott Doerr by beating Doerr 3-2 in Saturday's final. A late escape was the difference in this one.

South Plainfield got another win at 145 when Glenn Gross topped Metuchen's Matt Hale, 12-11, after a questionable stalling call with 21 seconds left, putting a halt to Hole's furious comeback, which started when he was down 9-4.

Old Bridge got another win at 152 when Kevin Quinlan topped Piscataway's Derek Tranchian, 13-6, after using a cradle for two near fall points to secure the match in the third. It was Quinlan's second GMC title in three years.

The 160-pound match-up was easily the most anticipated bout of the day, with Bishop Ahr's Anthony Cavico (17-0 coming in) squaring off against Spotswood's Jason Mar (12-2) in a battle between two former GMC Champs. This match came down to the last five seconds, when Cavico dropped Mar to his back to break a 1-1 tie. It was a disappointing loss for Mar, but it

certainly lived up to its expectations.

Woodbridge got a win at 160, when Rudy Medini beat Jared Terrell of Perth Amboy 6-3.

That set up the 189-pound final, which turned out to be the turning point in the team championship battle. South Plainfield's John Foscola had beaten Old Bridge's Sal Iodaci earlier in the year in a bout which turned out to be the clincher in the Tigers' regular season win over Old Bridge. And on Saturday he was asked to do it again. He did not disappoint.

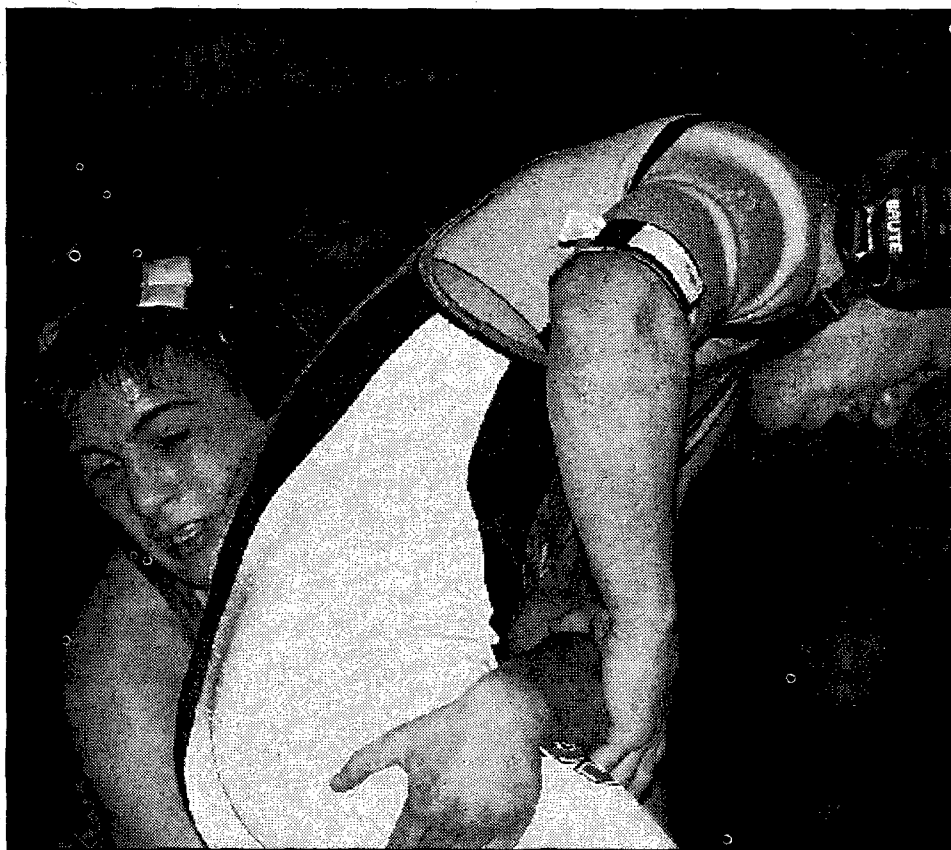
Foscola was in control from the beginning as he beat Iodaci 16-7 to sew up the team title for the Tigers.

At 215, J.P. Stevens' Tim Karmazsin outlasted East Brunswick's Adam Fleischhauer 6-3, while Piscataway's Brian Bishop won the heavyweight title, topping Colonia's Wilmot Harris 1-3 in the final.

But in the end, it was the South Plainfield Tigers who were celebrating, overcoming the loss of two of their starters to win another conference championship. For Old Bridge, that meant a close second-place finish, despite wrestling well throughout the tournament.

For South Brunswick, the result had to be somewhat disappointing, considering it showed earlier this year that it could not only hang with the top-ranked Tigers, but could beat them.

With the district and region tournaments around the corner, Old Bridge and South Brunswick will have plenty of chances to make some noise before season's end.

South River's Pearson to be inducted to N.J. Hall of Fame

Football great a member of 1970s All-Decade Team

Every year, the Sports Hall of Fame of New Jersey selects a handful of the state's finest athletes to be inducted into the hall based on their achievements at both the amateur and professional levels. This year's crop of inductees includes some of the biggest names in sports over the last 50 years.

On the local level, one of South River's greatest football heroes will be inducted this year, after going on to a successful professional career. Born in raised in South River, Drew Pearson was a star from the moment he began playing football at South River High School. The 1969 graduate was an All-American quarterback for the Rams. After going to Tulsa University in 1970, where he started four games at quarterback before switching to flanker. Pearson was picked up by the Dallas Cowboys as a free agent in 1973.

Over the course of his 10-year career, Pearson caught 489 passes for 7,822 yards and 48 touchdowns. He was named an NFL All-Pro in 1974 and 1977. On Oct. 1, 1976, Pearson caught the first touchdown pass in Giants Stadium history.

But perhaps Pearson's greatest achievements were being named to the All-Decade Team of the 1970s and one of the Top 20 Pro Football All-Time Leading Receivers.

This year's induction into the New Jersey Hall of Fame is just the latest in a long line of accomplishments that Pearson attained since his childhood days in South River.

And Pearson joins an impressive list of athletes earning their inductions this year. Atop the list is the man who is believed to be the United States' all-time greatest freestyle wrestler, Bruce Baumgartner. Over the course of his career, the Haledon native captured 13 world and Olympic medals, more than any wrestler in history. The 15-time U.S. National champion is a graduate of Manchester Regional High School.

He shares the spotlight with Willingboro High School graduate Carl Lewis, who is listed No. 12 on ESPN's SportsCentury's list of the 100 greatest athletes. Lewis, who shot to fame when he won four gold medals at the 1984 Summer Olympics in Los Angeles, is widely recognized as the United States' greatest male track and field star since Jesse Owens.

Also on this year's list of inductees are Joe Black, a Plainfield High School graduate who became the first African-American pitcher to win a World Series game; Al Blozis, a Dickinson High School, Jersey City, graduate who held all but one record in the shot-put during his days at Georgetown University and was selected as an All-Pro football player in 1943; Richie Regan, a West Orange native who went on to be an All-American player at Yale and one of the nation's most respected college football head coaches; Paul Tagliabue, a Jersey City native who became the commissioner of the National Football League in 1989 and has helped it expand from 28 to 32 teams during his tenure; and the 2000 Stanley Cup Champion New Jersey Devils, whose inspired play last year led to the franchise's second NHL championship in five years.

According to Ray Bateman, the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority chairman, this year's class ranks up there with some of the top groups in the hall's history.

"This is another fine class of inductees for the New Jersey Sports Hall of Fame," he said. "We are proud that New Jersey's rich sports history includes the lasting achievements of these outstanding individuals."

Added Sports Hall of Fame Chairman Aubrey Lewis: "The nomination committee and the board are grateful to have such a vast collection of athletes to choose from. One has to be truly special in order to be considered for induction."

The Sports Hall of Fame was established by the N.J. Legislature and is a non-profit organization operated in conjunction with the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority. A gala induction dinner will be held May 17 at the Pegasus Restaurant in the Meadowlands Race-track.

The Hall of Fame honors amateur or professional athletes, deceased or alive, who have resided in New Jersey or who have a significant connection to the Garden State. Since the first induction ceremony in 1993, the hall has enshrined 63 legendary athletes in nine special events. Their plaques are on permanent display in the Continental Airlines Arena at the Meadowlands Sports Complex.

The Sports Hall of Fame also will recognize six outstanding high school scholar athletes with \$1,000 academic scholarships. For ticket information and sponsorship opportunities, call (201) 507-8134.
