## Price tag drops for school expansion plan

Old Bridge school officials say project could cost \$10M less than expected

he price tag for the school expansion plan introduced last year is estimated to cost \$66 million, \$10 million less than Old Bridge officials anticipated.

At a special meeting at the Patrick A. Torre Administration Building Monday night, school officials introduced the latest refinements to the expansion plan, which would affect the district's 12 elementary schools, two middle schools and two high school campuses.

The original plan has undergone some changes. The changes were implemented, in part, due to public response elicited during several public meetings, according to Superintendent of Schools Daniel Rodriguez.

Rodriguez said he welcomes public input.

"We are pleased with the refinement process," he said.

A final plan will be introduced to the public on Feb. 22 at 7:30 p.m. at the school board offices, and the Board of Education is expected to conduct a final vote on the plan during a televised session on Feb. 26 at 7:30 p.m. That session will be held at the east campus of the high school, according to Rodriguez.

If the plan is approved by the board, a Sept. 25 date has been set for a referendum vote.

The school district is entitled to

receive millions of dollars in state aid for the proposed project, which will reduce the total cost to taxpayers.

The Spiezle Architectural Group, Trenton, introduced the second phase of the expansion plan, which focuses on the elementary schools, on Jan. 8.

Under the plan, \$7 million is slated for districtwide technology upgrades.

The plan will increase student capacity in the district's elementary schools by more than 350 students over the next five years, according to school administrators

Raymond E. Voorhees, Alan B. Shepard, Madison Park, Memorial and Miller elementary schools will also be renovated under the plan.

Kitchenettes and storage areas will be added to schools that do not already have them.

Each all-purpose room serves as a gymnasium and a lunchroom. Newly constructed all-purpose rooms will be approximately 7,000 square feet.

Added to Voorhees will be a new all-purpose room with two classrooms and two smaller group instruction rooms being formed out of the old gymnasium. The K-5 school would then be equipped with four sections for each grade level. The \$3.1 million upgrade will increase student capacity by

Upgrades to Miller school are expected to cost \$1.7 million, and the school will house 150 additional students with four new classrooms.

Shepard school will increase

### Shooting claims life of man

Girlfriend, family mourn the loss of Mark Cardullo

good man lost his life in the early-morning hours of Friday.

Mark Cardullo, 47, of East Brunswick met an unfortunate end to what loved ones and friends say was "a life filled with kindness and generosity toward others."

Cardullo was killed Friday during what police say was an argument with his girlfriend's ex-boyfriend. Police arrested and arraigned James Cobb, 38, of Milltown for the murder.

According to police, Cardullo was shot four times with a high-

caliber handgun. The shooting took place at the home of Mary Alice Cicerale, 12 Cottage Ave., Milltown.

"To say this came as a real shock is an understatement," said Joe McKevitz, corporate controller, Greater Media Newspapers' corporate office.

Cardullo was a former employee of Greater Media Inc., working as a manager in the management information systems (MIS) department. He worked for Greater Media from September 1984 until August 1999. Most recently, he worked in a similar capacity at Rutgers University, New Brunswick.

"Mark was a great guy. He was quiet, but also had a reputation for being a practical joker," McKevitz said.

"He was well-liked and respected by everyone, not to

mention being the mastermind behind our computer system," McKevitz said.

McKevitz worked with Cardullo for about five years, "every day of which was a pleasure," he said.

Harriet Grier, a business manager at Greater Media's corporate office, was working with the company when Cardullo first started.

"He was very private, but also very generous," Grier said.

"I remember one time, in particular, when my young son was working on a school project and Mark volunteered to help out with that," she said.

"He scanned and printed pictures, and would even e-mail my son — signing it Uncle Mark," she said.





### owners feel sting of 2 a.m. closing t

t's been two weeks since Sayreville passed an ordinance changing the closing time at taverns and clubs to 2 a.m.

And local bar and club owners say the rule has been difficult.

"It's very frustrating with a full bar at 1:45 a.m. telling them to leave," said Nick DeBiase, owner of Connie's Bar.

DeBiase, who is also president of the Sayreville Licensed Beverage Association, said the new closing time has definitely had an impact on taverns and clubs in

According to DeBiase, businesses throughout town have lost between 20 and 35 percent of their gross revenue on the weekends due to the change in closing

The ordinance officially amending the closing time of taverns and nightclubs from 3 a.m. to 2 a.m. seven days a week went into

effect over the weekend of Jan. 27, Super Bowl weekend.

The change has had an impact not only on local tavern owners, but also on the two remaining major nightclubs in town Hunka Bunka Ballroom on Jernee Mill Road and Club Abyss on Route 35.

Prior to the amendment, those clubs were allowed to remain open on Friday and Saturday nights until 3:30 a.m.

The owners of the Hunka Bunka Ballroom were not available for comment for this story. David DeLisa, a manager of Club Abyss, declined comment.

DeBiase said his customers "haven't been fully acclimated to the earlier closing.

As a result, he has been working on various ways of drawing his crowd in earlier.

His band now begins playing a half hour earlier than before, and he plans to possibly sell more food during business hours to make up for the financial loss:

DeBiase said the other businesses that he has spoken to are also making attempts to draw in a crowd earlier through a variety of advertisements such as ladies nights, happy hours and free admission before certain hours.

But DeBiase said those gimmicks will never make up for what will be lost because of the earlier closing

And DeBiase said the situation is worse for the two nightclubs in town.

"I'm afraid that the larger businesses will lose their customers altogether," said DeBiase.

In other nearby towns such as Woodbridge, Perth Amboy and Old Bridge, bars and clubs remain open until 3 a.m., while in nearby Staten Island, N.Y., doors close at 4 a.m.

"The playing field is not even anymore," DeBiase said.

The borough has said that one of the reasons for changing the time was a lack of manpower on the police force.

But advocates for keeping the closing time argued that the borough should be focusing on hiring new police officers or changing the police shift, not closing the bars and clubs earlier.

A major impetus for the earlier closing time was a May 2000 drug raid at Hunka Bunka, Krome (the former Club Bene) and Club

The investigation, Operation XTC, which was headed by the Middlesex County Prosecutor's Office and borough police, led to the arrest of 31 individuals for drug possession and other serious

Officials also cited several problems last year at Krome, on Route 35.

In one incident, police subdued a gunman after he allegedly shot several times into the air while standing in the parking lot of the club.

That incident was the last in a series of incidents at the nightclub, which led to a hearing

against the renewal of the club's liquor license.

The club has since lost its liquor license and functions only for nonalcoholic parties and

With the closing of Krome, local business owners argued that the problems in the neighborhoods have been solved and said they saw no reason for the early closing time.

The early closing time could be rescinded by borough officials at a later date, or the borough could allow for a referendum asking voters whether they want to bring back the 3 a.m. closing.

DeBiase and other bar and club owners have said that they would be willing to compromise with a 2 a.m. closing time Sunday though Thursday and a 3 a.m. closing time on Friday and Saturday nights.

'Hopefully, in due time, the council can see that they overreacted and repeal the decision. DeBiase said.





### **Application** to build 139 homes denied

Township Council considers condemning the land for open space

OLD BRIDGE — The Planning Board turned down an application to build 139 homes near Geick Park because the applicant was a no-show at the board's Feb. 6 meeting.

The board was set to vote on the application, known as Cedar Ridge II, at its Jan. 23 meeting. At that meeting, however, Councilman Larry Redmond recused himself from the vote. And on the advice of Board Attorney Thomas Norman, Mayor Barbara Cannon recused herself as well. which left only four members to vote on the application — not enough members to form a quorum.

Redmond and Cannon recused themselves because the night before the Township Council voted to begin condemnation proceedings on the property and proposed a \$5.5 million bond ordinance, which would allow the town to borrow money to purchase the property itself. That action would have taken the property out of the developer's hands.

"I feel I would have been able to make an impartial decision," Redmond said, "but I thought it was in the best interest of the town for me to recuse myself."

However, Jonathan Heilbrunn, Old Bridge, attorney for the applicant, stated at the Jan. 23 meeting that because a vote could not be held, it was his opinion the application would automatically be approved, according to law.

Despite Heilbrunn's opinion, the board did decide to adjourn the matter until Feb. 6, but no one representing the applicant showed up at that meeting; therefore, the board denied the entire application.

"In our opinion, we gave the applicant every opportunity to be heard," said George Koehler, chairman of the Planning Board. We denied the application because they did not appear."

The owner of the property, Marvin Schmelzer, is seeking approval to build 139 homes on 200 acres near Geick Park between Morganville and Ticetown roads, but the application has been riddled with problems, Koehler noted.

Some of the lots have steep slopes, and the location and access to the development are also concerns. Koehler also questioned the accuracy of wetlands delineations, and noted that uses for certain areas of the property were not identified by the applicant.

After 13 hearings on the matter, the applicant brought the matter before a judge in state Superior Court, New Brunswick, in 1999 in efforts to expedite the hearing process. The judge decided to remand the case back to the board to continue hearings, which began again in August 2000.

During the last several months, the council has taken significant steps toward purchasing the property in an effort to stop overdevelopment in the township.

"The days of giving carte blanche to developers in Old Bridge is over," Redmond said. "We will use the tools available to us to preserve open space.

The township offered to purchase the land from Schmelzer for approximately \$5.2 million. The township appraised the

#### **County hazardous waste** drop-off days scheduled

land on two occasions using appraisers certified by the state. The \$5.2 million figure represented the higher appraisal of the two. Redmond said that the figure reflects the fair market value of the property

However, Schmelzer is asking about \$14 million for the property.

The county has offered \$2 million in funds to help with the purchase of the land, and legislation backed by Assemblyman Samuel Thompson (R-13) should secure another \$1 million. The town is also relying on funds generated from its open space preservation fund.

In November, residents passed an open space referendum. An annual tax of 2 cents per \$100 of assessed property value is expected to raise \$600,000 annually.

The council is expected to vote on the bond and condemnation ordinances at its Feb. 13 meeting after public comment is heard.

Heilbrunn was unavailable for comment prior to press time.

### **Council should stay the** course on 2 a.m. closings

nly two weeks into the new regimen in Sayreville that forces bars and clubs to close at 2 a.m. instead of 3 a.m. and already local bar owners are complaining the regulation is cutting their business by 20 to 35 percent on weekends.

While two weeks hardly seems a reasonable amount of time to judge the real impact of earlier closings, we have no reason to doubt tavern keepers when they say their sales figures are off. Take a few hours off the weekly time during which liquor can be served and less money comes in.

Simple economics.

During the last year, the Suburban was vocally supportive of the council's battle to regulate inappropriate activity at the community's nightclubs, because like many residents of Sayreville, we were frustrated by reporting, week after week, one incident of unsafe, unruly and outright illegal behavior after another at the clubs.

And because the clubs seemed incapable, or unwilling, to control the behavior themselves, we staunchly advocated the council's need, and duty to the area's citizens, to control it for them.

But while we, and we suspect the Sayreville Borough Council, had the community's nightclubs — Krome, Club Abyss and Hunka Bunka — in mind when we pressed for earlier closing times, it was never our intention to suggest anything that might harm law-abiding bar and restaurant owners who run clean shops and work hard to earn their livings.

Nick DeBiase, who owns Connie's Bar and is also president of the Sayreville Licensed Beverage Association, expresses the association's frustration this week and notes that although local proprietors are trying many new ways to draw patrons in earlier, gimmicks will never make up for the lost

We suspect he's probably right, and it's unfortunate that a few trouble spots caused problems for everyone — but at the present time we're reluctant to advocate amending the regula-

There simply hasn't been enough time to judge its effectiveness or its potential consequences.

In spite of the pressure, we urge the council to stay the course and keep the 2 a.m. closing time.

Lives were at stake in Sayreville and surrounding communities because of problems at these clubs, and it was time for something to be done.

Now let's see if it works.

If it does, then perhaps next year would be a reasonable time to take a fresh look at the ordinance and perhaps consider a compromise like the one DeBiase suggests.

And in the meantime, if it is true, as DeBiase says, that Sayreville bar owners are playing on an uneven field because other nearby communities Old Bridge among them have 3 a.m. closing times, then maybe it's time for Old Bridge to follow Sayreville's lead.

If bars in Old Bridge closed at 2 a.m., at least that part of the field would be level.

### **Animal lovers send in donations** for injured dog's medical bills

More than \$1,000 raised to help pay for Anderson families bills

OLD BRIDGE - A dog injured in a hit-and-run accident is on the road to recovery, thanks to a loving family and gen-

erous donations from the community.
"Bullet is doing great," said Donna Anderson this week. "She's turned out to be a

really nice dog."

Bullet, a 2-year-old pit bull-Labrador mix, nearly lost her leg after being struck by a car in December.

Jack and Donna Anderson looked after the stray after she wandered into their home, while the Old Bridge Animal Shelter tried to locate the owner.

The Andersons brought her to a local veterinarian who recognized the dog. However, the owner said he no longer wanted the dog and that the vet should put her to sleep.

The Andersons were stunned at the owner's response and decided to take Bullet to the Sayrebrook Veterinary Hospital in Sayreville for surgery. The Andersons were billed thousands of dollars for medical procedures including X-rays, medical

care and emergency surgery.

After an article appeared in the Jan. 4 issue of the Suburban, concerned residents reached into their pockets and donated money to the New Jersey Animal Rights Alliance, Englishtown, to help pay for Bullet's medical bills.

We received \$1,092 in donations," said Janine Motta, office manager at the animal alliance. "But we still have a long way to go because surgery is expensive and because Bullet has had recurrent visits to the vet to have her bandages changed."

According to Motta, there is still an outstanding bill of \$2,000, even though Bullet's original medical bill was significantly reduced.

The doctor in charge of Bullet's recovery, Joseph Chiosi of the Sayrebrook Veterinary Hospital, significantly cut his bill, as did Dr. Dan Stobie, the surgeon who operated on the dog.

The dog is doing remarkably well, and her leg should be fully functional," said Chiosi. "She's a wonderful dog." At first, the Anderson family was hesi-

tant to adopt the stray.

"I have two children and a dog, and every morning I put food outside for 10 stray cats," said Donna Anderson in the Jan. 4 article.





### **Municipal employees petition** for pension benefit increase

Proposal will most likely be heard by Legislature

Municipal employees throughout the state are seeking an increase in pension ben-

The proposal, which is being supported by the League of Municipalities, would benefit those government employees and retirees enrolled in the Public Employees' Retirement System (PERS).

The PERS pension fund contains monies supplied via municipal employee contributions and is generally affected by market conditions, which have been good for the last few years, according to state officials.

As a result, there is a reported excess of about \$3.5 billion dollars in the fund to date an amount which the league feels should be returned to the employees who paid or

Spearheading this initiative is L. Mason Neely, chairman of the Pension Committee, League of Municipalities, and chief finance officer, East Brunswick Township.

Since 1944, the pension formula has involved dividing the number of years worked (n) by 60," Neely said. "However, that was when the average person still worked to 70 or 75

'Changing the formula to divide (n) by 55 would allow for a flat 9 percent increase in benefits for retired employees, as well as a 9 percent increase for those approaching retirement," he said.

The cost for this increase, added Neely, would be shouldered by working employees in the way of an additional one-half percent paycheck withholding, with no added cost to employers or taxpayers.

In fact, employers have benefited with complete cessation of contributions since 1997, when market conditions and the Pension Bond Act created excess assets.

Likewise, younger employees have benefited from significant reductions in contributions since that time.

We [the employees] would be paying into our own benefits. Plus, the plan provides for a financial cushion adequate enough to sustain for at least 15 years — even if the

market were to not show any gain from this point on," Neely said.

More specifically, the one-half percent withholding would account for approximately \$46 million per year, the total necessary for maintaining the "normal cost" of the increased benefit, added Neely.

"Those employees who have contributed most to this system should be allowed to benefit from the excess assets accrued over the years," he said.

In a letter displayed on (East Brunswick) township letterhead, dated Jan. 5, 2001, Neely addressed fellow PERS members asking that those interested in an improved pension package begin calling or faxing the state Senate Majority Office to request the bill be

Neely wrote, "When you call, tell them who you are, what county or municipality you are from, what organization you repre-

"Let them know you support the "n" over 55 (equation) which would increase the multiplier ratio from the current 1.66 percent to 1.819 percent," he wrote.

"I am confident this is going to pass through legislation," Neely concluded. "It is a reasonable and well-executed plan."

While Neely is an employee of the township of East Brunswick, Mayor Bill Neary maintains that Neely's involvement with the league's proposal in no way reflects the township's opinions or position on the mat-

"(Lou Neely) is not acting for East Brunswick, but rather the league. Those two things are separate," said the mayor. "We do not know enough about this proposal either way to say we support it or not.'

### Feb. 14 now Congenital Heart Defect Awareness Day in O.B.

Approximately 40,000 babies are born each year with heart disease

OLD BRIDGE — Starting this year in Old Bridge, St. Valentine's Day will also be recognized as Congenital Heart Defect (CHD) Awareness Day.

On Feb. 13, Mayor Barbara Cannon was expected to read a proclamation commemorating the event. In doing so, Old Bridge joins 44 U.S. states, including New Jersey, that have had their governors sign similar proclamations.

The proclamation was requested by Councilman Larry Redmond.

'My 8-year-old son, Lawrence, was born with a rare congenital heart defect," Redmond said. "My goal is to try to raise awareness regarding CHDs, educate the public and medical practitioners, and promote research.

It is estimated that approximately 40,000 babies are born in the United States each year with CHDs, according to the Children's Health Information Network, Yardley, Pa.
"One child in every hundred births has a

congenital heart defect," Redmond said. "Yet less money is spent on CHD research than most other diseases, such as cancer or

In the United States, children born with CHDs account for approximately 1 percent of births each year, with heart defects being the most common type of birth defect, according to the Children's Network

Statistics from the National Institute of

Health indicate that of the children born with a heart defect each year, approximately 10 percent die before their first birthday, and another 10 percent will die before their 15th birthday.

According to the Children's Network, there are 1.2 million American children and adults with CHDs and Childhood Onset Heart Disease alive today.

Some babies are diagnosed at birth, but sometimes the diagnosis is not made until weeks or even years afterwards.

Many cases of sudden cardiac death in oung athletes are caused by undiagnosed CHDs and Childhood Onset Heart Disease.

Congenital Heart Disease is the leading cause of birth-defect related deaths.

Despite these statistics, newborns and teen-age athletes are not routinely screened for CHDs, and a proportionally small amount of funding is available for research and support, according to the Children's Network

Parents should be alert to the following signs and symptoms of CHD during infancy: babies who tire easily during feeding (i.e. falls asleep before feeding finishes); sweating around the head, especially during feeding; fast breathing when at rest or sleeping; pale or bluish skin color; poor weight gain; babies that sleep a lot and are not playful or curious for any length of time; puffy face, hands and/or feet; and babies that are often irritable and difficult to console.

The Children's Network recommends that if your child has two or more of these symptoms, you should talk to your pediatrician about a referral to a pediatric cardiologist

#### Residents raising cash for skate park

"There's a lot of enthusiasm," said Pilecki. She added that the group meets on the first Friday of each month at 7 p.m. in the municipal building. Everyone is welcome to attend the meeting.

Some CHDs may not require treatment, other than periodic visits to a pediatric cardiologist. Others can be treated with medications or repaired with surgery and/or other procedures. Complex defects may require several surgeries and are never really cured, according to the Children's Network.

A day recognizing CHDs already exists on the national level in New Zealand. Campaigns in the United States, India, France, Australia and Canada are working for CHD Awareness days as well, Redmond said in a press release.

"Already, 44 states have indicated support in the United States and, with national recognition in Canada, Feb. 14 could conceivably be CHD Awareness Day across North America," he said.

Redmond added that CHD Awareness Day is also a day to celebrate the life of every survivor, and honor the memory of those who have been lost.

capacity by 150 students at a cost of \$3.4 million. The school will receive a new allpurpose room. The old gymnasium will be converted into two new classrooms and two small group instruction rooms. Three sections for each grade level is expected.

Madison Park will house 50 additional students at a cost of \$3.8 million, which includes a new all-purpose room and will convert the old gymnasium into a library/media center.

Memorial School will receive a new allpurpose room and four new class rooms two new ones and two from the existing gymnasium at a cost of \$4.1 million.

The first phase of the expansion plan, which was introduced late last year, is

pus. Currently, Old Bridge High School has two campuses, the east campus and the west campus, which are approximately two miles apart on Route 516.

Under the plan, the east campus of the high school would be connected by an uncovered walkway with Carl Sandburg Middle School, which is located at the same facility as the administration buildings, forming a single high school campus.

The west campus of the high school would be converted into a middle school and Jonas Salk Middle School, on West Greystone Road, would remain a middle school, with a capacity of 1,000 students.

Under the plan, Sandburg would house high school freshman students, while sophomores, juniors and seniors would attend classes at the east campus facility.

Parents have expressed concerns about eparating ninth-graders from the rest of the high school population.

However, scheduling problems and fiscal constraints are the main reasons why all four grades can not be housed in the same building, according to Rodriguez.

"Movement of students between the buildings presents a weather and time problem," Rodriguez said. "Students will require outdoor clothing when passing from Sandburg to the main building, thus necessitating increased passing time.

Locker assignments would add to confusion and frequency of lateness would increase, he said.

Rodriguez believes that by housing ninth-graders separately, the students would exist in a less intimidating environment and would be more easily eased into the high school mind set.

The high school expansion will include a student activities' center, which will house offices for the principal, administrators, guidance counselors, attendance and a bookstore.

"He really went above and beyond the call of duty, not just with my son, but in his everyday routine," Grier said.

Grier also recalled the wonderfully funny cartoons that Cardullo would design for employees' birthdays.

"He was very clever in terms of wit," she said. "He would put our heads on a cartoon body, and set it up as our computer's wallpaper for when we got in in the morn-

"He always gave of his time and had so much to share with everyone, but it never distracted him from his work either."

Mary Jane Nagy, corporate administration for Greater Media, East Brunswick, remembered Cardullo most for the way he treated other people.

"No matter how busy he was, he never made you feel as if you were bothering him or that any question you had was a stupid one," said Nagy.

He always had a smile on his face and a sweet, friendly disposition," she said.

"When you hear about something like this that has happened to such a good person — one that you knew well — it's almost unfathomable," she said.

Nagy said she will long remember Cardullo for his great sense of humor, patience and kindness, "even when his job proved to be thankless at times.'

Gay Galgano, who worked as Greater Media's employee services coordinator from 1984-94, said she worked closely with Cardullo to implement a new payroll system.

Her fondest memory of Mark involved a trip to Minneapolis for training.

We had a free Sunday, and so Mark insisted we roam the city to check out the art," Galgano recalled. "I witnessed Mark's appreciation for living life and enjoying new adventures.

"At dinner that night, we also discovered our shared interest in wines and microbrews, and to this day, I credit him for with my reliance on certain brands," she

Beyond all of these things, Galgano remembered the extreme measure of intelligence and kindness Cardullo displayed toward his co-workers.

"I am really upset about this but am at least grateful for the time I had to get to know Mark," Galgano concluded.

Cardullo left Greater Media in August 1999 to accept a job as systems programmer for the Rutgers University Li-

There he was also well-liked and appreciated for his hard work.

Marianne Gaunt, university librarian, said, "Mark was highly regarded as an employee, and we are stunned by his loss.

Our deepest sympathies go out to his family during this difficult time," she

Pam Orel, who works for Rutgers Office of Media Relations and Communications, said, "Everyone is still quite shaken up about the news. It's just so hard to be-

Also greatly pained by the loss is Cardullo's girlfriend, Mary Alice Cicerale.

"I told Mark that I've waited 44 years to meet a man like him, and he used to say, 'I can top that. I've waited 47," Cicerale

"I thought we were going to get married. He was the kindest, gentlest man I've ever known.

"I don't want Mark to be remembered for his murder, but rather for the wonderful soul that he was and the goodness he brought to my life," Cicerale said.

Cardullo was allegedly killed by Cobb shortly after midnight on Feb. 9.

Cicerale and Cobb had dated a few years, breaking up recently.

Cobb called Cicerale on Feb. 9, asking to come over. Cicerale refused to see him.

He allegedly showed up minutes later with a .45-caliber handgun and shot Cardullo four times in the chest, stomach and hands.

Cicerale attempted to call 911, but Cobb allegedly hung up the phone.

The call, however, went through, and Milltown police officers Chris Witt and Robert Keating were dispatched to the

Police said they never received a call from the Cicerale residence before this incident, nor had any complaints against Cobb been filed.

There was also no record of prior arrest for Cobb in Milltown, but police recently turned down his request for a handgun permit because he failed to report previous arrests elsewhere.

Upon arrival at the Cicerale residence. police arrested Cobb and confiscated the handgun.

Cardullo was taken by ambulance to Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital, New Brunswick, where he was pronounced dead at 1:04 a.m.

Cicerale was not injured.

Members of Cardullo's family were not available for comment.

Funeral arrangements are pending.

### **Councilman says police station** structurally sound, interior OK

SOUTH RIVER — Initial reports regarding the structure of the Main Street police station say the building is structurally sound.

Councilman Tele Koukourdelis said that although the borough is still awaiting a final report from the structural engineer on the building, based on initial reports, the interior is fine.

Koukourdelis said he is confident that the \$4.5 million renovation of the former police station on Main Street will be completed on time.

Borough residents voted down a referendum in 1999 that would have allowed for the construction of a new municipal

Once complete, the renovated building will house police, a new courtroom and a council chamber, among other things.

Until the completion of the renovation, police are being housed in three temporary trailers located in the Lincoln School parking lot, William Street.

borough plans to renovate its Gordon Street offices.

According to Koukourdelis, the interior demolition of the police station is complete. Asbestos and lead within the structure have been removed.

The next step in the renovation project will be to frame the interior of the building, Koukourdelis said.

Steel for the framing has already been ordered.

Koukourdelis said that although there has been a slight delay in construction due to poor weather conditions, borough officials are confident that they will keep the middle summer completion date.

Residents in the area have expressed their concerns over a number of rumors regarding the renovation project over the past two years.

One concern recently brought to light the structural integrity of the building, which is almost 100 years old.

In January, borough officials were questioned about the structural integrity of the building at a council meeting.

#### Plans submitted for age-restricted development

HELMETTA — The borough has finally received plans for the age-restricted community that received preliminary approval in 1999.

Alden Development II Inc. of the Clarksburg section of Millstone submitted plans for 70 residential homes which would be available only to buyers age 55 and older. The proposed development is called The Regency Manor.

Planning Board Chairman Jim Lutz said borough officials have expected the plans for 14 months.

"I'm all for the project," Lutz said. "I'm surprised they've delayed so long.'

Lutz said that in their prior hearing, the developer was granted a number of concessions.

He was unwilling to comment on the application because he has not had a chance to study the plans.

The plans call for 70 homes on lots that average 6,740 square feet.

They are to be built on a parcel of about 17 acres along Maple Street.



### Handicapped High Riders Club to buy area farm

llentown resident Barbara Isaac made a promise to her father shortly before he died. She told him she would create a therapeutic riding program, and that would be her legacy.

Her father had always encouraged her to make something of her life and to follow her dreams.

In 1979, Isaac founded the Handicapped High Riders Club at her Riding High Farm, and now, with the planned acquisition of the farm by the HHRC Board of Directors, the continuance of the program is assured.

Born and raised in Brooklyn, N.Y., Isaac said she was "born with the pony gene," although she had no exposure to horses until she was in high school.

She and a high school friend took riding lessons at Tee Vans Riding Academy at Prospect Park in Brooklyn. At the time, Isaac recalled, a bridle path ran all the way from Prospect Park to Coney Island.

After high school, Isaac married and she and her husband, Hanen, adopted three children, Joseph, Paul and Sue Ann. They moved to New Jersey in the mid-1950s, and eventually built a house in Colonia in Woodbridge Township.

Isaac worked as a bookkeeper for a law firm, but wanted to have a business of her own. Her young son, Paul, was interested in horses, and one day she saw a classified ad: "Partners Wanted — Horse Ranch — Trail Riding — Snack Bar."


She answered the ad and a career was

Isaac admitted she knew next to nothing about horses when she started running Silver Saddle Ranch in North Branch. She persuaded the previous owner to stay on as the stable manager while she ran the business. Meanwhile, she read everything she could about horse care, nutrition and saddlery, and accompanied the vet and blacksmith on their rounds.

The property had beautiful trails and originally horses were rented for rides. After an unfortunate incident, however, in which a group that had rented horses whipped them, Isaac stopped hiring them out and instead started a riding club in which qualified members paid a fee for regular riding privileges.

Planting the seed

The riding club grew to 300 members,



who could use the facilities for birthday parties and other events. At one birthday party, a family brought in a clown to entertain who would plant one of the seeds for what would become the Handicapped High Riders Club.

The woman doing the clowning was so impressed with Isaac's horses and the atmosphere of the farm that she asked if she could bring some developmentally disabled children she worked with to the farm to ride. Isaac agreed and was moved by the

kids' response to the horses.

The North American Riding for the Handicapped Association (NARHA) had been founded in 1969, and in 1975, as Isaac's interest was being piqued, riding was just beginning to be recognized as a valuable form of therapy for the handicapped. She read an article in the magazine Horseman's Yankee Pedlar about Octavia Brown, founder of the Somerset Hills Riding Club. An early proponent of therapeutic riding, Brown became Isaac's mentor, and together they founded Horseback Riding for the Handicapped (HRH), the umbrella organization for therapeutic riding in New Jersey.

About that time, Isaac and her husband realized they would have to find another farm if they were to realize their dream. It took them one and a half years of looking, until a colleague at the Princeton law firm where Isaac was working showed her an ad for a farm in Allentown.

It was just what they needed — 26 stalls, an indoor ring, three paddocks and a nice Cape Cod on 12.85 acres. In August 1978 they moved to Riding High Farm, and by 1979 a board of directors had been formed for the Handicapped High Riders Club. In 1980 the club received IRS accreditation as a charitable organization.

#### Community involvement is key

For over 20 years, Isaac and her family have been involved in the community. She has served as treasurer for both NARHA and the Special Olympics, as well as acting as a state Equine Advisory Board delegate for HRH and a trustee of the Horse Park of New Jersey, Upper Freehold.

She also has been active with the Allentown-Upper Freehold Drug Alliance. Over 50 individuals required to complete community service have fulfilled their obligations at the farm. The Isaacs also have had several foster children staying with them over the years, and are especially close to their foster son, Alan, whom they consider part of the family.

Every year on the first Sunday of June (June 3 this year), they hold their Family and Friends Day, welcoming all for a day of fun and an opportunity to learn about the program with demonstrations, pony and carriage rides, music, games and their famous chance auction for children and adults

A personal crisis recently showed Isaac and her husband, Hanen, how devoted the HHRC "extended family" is to them and the program. Several months ago, Hanen

was diagnosed with a serious illness and spent 27 days recuperating in a Philadelphia hospital. Barbara was at his bedside the entire time, but worried about the farm, horses, students and program she had supervised on a daily basis for two

Tears welled in her eyes as she related the outpouring support of family, friends, instructors and volunteers. She knows the HHRC will continue to thrive. She plans to remain as executive director, and she and Hanen, who just celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary, will move into an

apartment on the property.

Handicapped High Riders is an NARHA Premier Accredited Center, giving 50 private lessons per week to people with disabilities, as well as group lessons to students from Eden Programs of Princeton; Gateway, which is based in Carteret; and Indian Fields and Cambridge elementary schools in South Brunswick.

Project Freedom, a group home in Robbinsville, also sends clients for lessons. HHRC also offers beginner lessons for the able-bodied, driving classes for the disabled, hippotherapy, and an inclusive summer camp for both disabled and ablebodied children. Hippotherapy is a specialized former serior of the control o cialized form of physical therapy which uses the horse as a therapy tool to address movement disorders associated with various neurological and neuromuscular conditions such as cerebral palsy, cerebral vascular accident, multiple sclerosis and traumatic brain injury.

The farm is open seven days a week year-round. There are currently eight parttime instructors and 12 horses.

HHRC does not receive state funding and relies on fund-raising to cover many of its expenses. Events include an annual benefit carriage driving show, sponsored by the Garden State Horse and Carriage Society, which is scheduled for Oct. 14 at the Horse Park; the Cycling Tour from Cream Ridge Winery, to be held Oct. 6; the Night at the Races on March 30; and a golf tournament.

HHRC also needs volunteers for its regularly scheduled concession stand work at the Sovereign Bank Arena in Trenton, which donates part of the proceeds to charities. A capital campaign is also under way for purchase of the farm by the board of directors.

### **Pool plans will wait another year**

MILLTOWN - Plans to replace the borough's swimming pool will have to wait another season.

Milltown's community pool, for residents only, has been deteriorating and the town has known for some time that it needs to be upgraded. The borough attempted to hire contractors to replace the pool on the existing site in time for the coming season, but both of the bids officials received were well over the \$900,000 available for the project.

Engineer Trevor Taylor has been working with Borough Engineer Greg Vallesi at CME Associates on the plans for the proj-

"That pool has been around since the '60s," said Taylor. "They're looking for one that requires less maintenance."

Councilman Mike Skarzinski, who oversees the borough's recreational programs, believes the delay will not prevent residents from enjoying the pool this sum-

"I'm confident that the Public Works Department can get the pool in order for another year," said Skarzinski.

He said the bids were unacceptably high because the contractors were given too little time to come up with their estimates. He believes that the additional time the borough has to seek bids for the project will sufficiently lower the price.

Mayor Gloria Bradford said she hopes construction on the pool will begin in September and be complete in time for the 2002 season.

"We feel that we'll have more reasonable bids," said Bradford.

The plans will be discussed during a public meeting at 7 p.m. in the municipal building on Feb. 21.





"Then I just write a prescription, and the infrared signals send it to a printer in the office," he said.

"It's saving me up to two minutes on each patient, and I also take it home with me and have instant access to my patients' records in case they have to be seen by another doctor," he said.

Vaninov said he has become a staunch advocate of the device.

"I was reluctant to use it in the beginning because it was one more thing to learn, but it was so easy, and now it's a saving grace. I don't know how I got along before without it," he said.



## Borough to appeal decision that returned officer's job

SOUTH RIVER — The borough has begun procedures to appeal a 1999 court decision that allowed a borough police officer to return to work after he was accused of assault.

Christopher Monek was suspended with pay from Dec. 8, 1997, until April 1, 1999, following allegations stemming from an Aug. 8, 1997, incident in which he and then-Patrolman Richard Benedict were accused of assaulting Main Street resident Gary Brown while he was in police custody.

Brown claimed that he was assaulted by Monek in a holding cell at the South River Police Department on Aug. 3, 1997.

On Monday, the Borough Council authorized Borough Labor Attorney Richard Bauch to begin appeal procedures to take Monek's job away again.

Bauch was not available for comment on the matter.

Borough Council President David Sliker would only say that the borough was not in agreement with the initial decision that allowed Monek to return to work.

Monek's attorney, Joseph Benedict, no relation to Richard Benedict, was not available for comment.

The incident with Brown began after he was arrested for a disorderly persons charge following a domestic violence dispute.

He maintained that while he was in the police precinct he suffered several cuts which required seven stitches.

At the time, the Middlesex County Prosecutor's Office charged Monek with one count of official misconduct, one count of aggravated assault and one count of tampering with a witness — Patrolman Richard Benedict.

Monek was later cleared of the official

misconduct and tampering with a witness charges.

The charge of aggravated assault was downgraded to simple assault.

In March 1999, Monek was found guilty of falsifying a police report and recording false statements in a police report.

Although he was found guilty for those charges, Monek was acquitted of six of the 10 charges brought against him in state Superior Court, New Brunswick.

At the time of the Brown incide Monek had been a sergeant on the forceight years.

Richard Benedict, who had only on the force for nine days at the time ( Brown incident, was also charged v failure to conduct himself in accordance with high ethical standards; knowingly and willfully making a false police report; acting in a manner that was subversive of the good order and discipline of the department; failure to take police action when necessary and in uniform, and failure to make a written report of the same to a commanding officer; failure to comply with the chief's orders, and rules and regulations; failure to take appropriate action concerning illegal activity; neglecting his duty as a sworn officer of the South River Police Department; and, failure to give a truthful statement when questioned in regard to an internal investigation.

In May 1998, Benedict was found guilty of seven of the eight charges against him and was fired by the department.

In July 1998, Benedict appealed the charges and filed a civil action lawsuit against the department and several police officials.

However, state Superior Court Judge Phillip Paley upheld the borough's decision to terminate Benedict on Jan. 28, 2000.

Old Bridge coach Jack Campbell said that it took a total team effort to secure the victory, as the determined Sayreville contingent hung in and would not let the Knights pull away.



No major upsets as higher seeds move on to second round

ith the seedings for this year's pair of Greater Middlesex Conference high school basketball tournaments set on Sunday, the action got under way Monday night with the tournament's higher seeds playing for the right to advance to the second round.

On the boys' side of play, St. Joseph's of Metuchen is the overwhelming favorite to take home the coveted title, although competition promises to be tight among the

'We have to stay sharp," he said.







It is preferable for buyers to come up with 20% of the purchase price of a property as a down payment. Lenders will ask for a gift letter stating that no repayment of the gift is expected. In addition, the lender may ask for two to three months of statements for the account where the down payment funds are located. If the funds were recently placed in the account, the lender may ask where they came from and request verification of the source.
