HISTORICAL

Sketch of Plainfield, N. J.

The purpose of these outline sketches of Plainfield, is to recall some interesting incidents of the past, and collect a few important facts of the present. The practical business man may perhaps be more anxious to know about the place as it *is* and what it is likely to *be*, than to be told what were the early scenes and reminiscences of generations ago. ~~There are no doubt some inquisitive minds~~ that will not be satisfied in going back simply to the early days of the aboriginal settlers in 1700, when a few log huts and wigwams, were scattered here and there, on this level plain. Such persons would not be contented with the statement that about 1684 industrious Hollanders or Scotchmen, came into possession of the land on which Plainfield is now built, nor with the more remote incident that the shore land now called New Jersey (but then designated by the King of England as "heathen and barbarous regions") was first discovered by white men in 1497. To such antiquarian minds nothing short of some pre-historic facts from the testimony of the rocks will give entire relief; not until they are assured that many thousand years before the Mosaic creation, these mountains on the north-west of Plainfield formed the coast line of the continent, and gigantic reptiles left their monstrous foot prints on the sands of time; that ages afterwards a luxuriant forest of mammoth vegetation existed on these plains

for centuries, with no human being to admire the unsurpassed grandeur or walk among the magnificent flowers and foliage.

But as a chronicle of early times, it must suffice if reference is made to no more distant events than those of a comparatively modern period; such events as are found in historical records, or unwritten incidents, handed down by tradition, and verified by the accurate memory of some of the oldest inhabitants. These facts correctly narrated will afford a connected outline view of this locality from the days of our earliest forefathers, and may be of interest to many readers.

The beginning of our civilized history commences in 1735, with the erection of the first frame dwelling house. The first grist mill was put up about 1755 near what is now the Up-town pond, and their remained for 35 years, when it was moved to the present site of the "City Mills." The first school house in 1760 was built on the east corner of the main road and the road to Rahway, now Peace street. Till about this period ox-carts were the only vehicles used, but now occasionally wagons were brought into service. In 1764 the water power of Green brook was further utilized by another grist mill in the lower part of the town.

During the Revolutionary days some skirmishing occurred here and in this vicinity. In the summer of 1777 General Washington is said to have visited the place and frequented the mountain heights to watch the movements of the enemies' troops. His head quarters with his army of about 8000 had recently been moved from Morristown to a securely entrenched position near Bound Brook on the ridge overlooking and commanding the country around New Brunswick, where the British were encamped to the number of 15,000, under General Howe. Tradition says that "the rock," a prominent projection on the brow of the mountain just south-west of Plainfield, was a favorite place of rendezvous to which the Father of his Country very often resorted to inspect the operations of the enemy on the plains and watch the reconnoitering parties of the American forces.

A few years after peace was declared, the first meeting house was built by the Society of Friends. It was in 1788 and the same building is now occupied by them on Peace street. Up to this time the population had not

reached one hundred, and the few scattered dwelling houses were located along the main road. The only other thoroughfares were the roads to New Brunswick, now Plainfield avenue, one to Rahway, present Peace, street and Broadway, and the mountain road or Somerset street.

At the opening of the nineteenth century Plainfield was still a thinly settled neighborhood with about 200 inhabitants. It was not till 1803 when a hat shop was built in the rear of the first dwelling house, that any thing like business life was manifest. A few years later in 1808 the United States government established a post office here and the old stage line, now running for several years past, left its occasional passenger and meagre mail list. A two story Academy was built in 1812 which served its double purpose for a day school and public hall, till the upper part was destroyed by fire a short time afterward. The First Baptist church was organized and their house of worship erected in 1818 nearly on the site of the present edifice. The population of the village in 1820 is reported to be 450 to 500. The First Presbyterian church was built in 1825 on the same ground the society now occupies, and in 1832 the Methodist Episcopal church was constituted and their meeting house erected, nearly where the new structure now stands. In 1833 the Plainfield Seminary, a frame building 40×36 feet, was built on the land adjoining the Presbyterian church on the south-west, and the Plainfield Classical Institute, a rival educational interest, was organized the following year and the building 60×35 feet commenced in 1834 on a lot opposite the Baptist church. Both buildings are still standing having been converted into private dwellings. This same year the Plainfield Mutual Assurance Fire Company was organized. In 1835 the first newspaper was established, called the *Plainfield Herald*, with three of its sides printed in New York and said to be the largest paper in the state. It soon suspended for want of patronage and in 1837 was founded *The Plainfield Union* which still exists in the weekly journal of the Central New Jersey Times. The same year the first bank was chartered, and a new church organization established, the Seventh Day Baptist Society. In 1838 steam power was introduced on the new strap railroad running through the place from Elizabethtown to Bound Brook and Somerville, to take the place of horse power in use for two years previous. This decade from

1830 to 1840 was marked by considerable activity in general business, and the erection of many new dwellings. The population in 1830 being a little less than 700 had increased in ten years to something more than 1200. During this period several new streets were laid out and opened, the growth of the place demanding more "front lots" than the main thoroughfare afforded and the three old intersecting roads. The last chronological occurrence of importance which will be mentioned in this connection is the organization of the Public School in 1847, the year after the formation of Plainfield Township, and the erection of the school building in 1848.

With the succeeding events for the next twenty-five years in the history of the place, many now living are personally familiar. From a population of about 2500 in 1850 there was a rapid increase to 10,000 in 1875, a date which brings the record down to the modern city of many churches, schools, hotels, stores, markets, banks, gas works, telegraphs, macadamized roads, lighted streets and moderate taxes.

PLAINFIELD of 1879 is situated on the line of the Central Railroad of New Jersey, 24 miles south-westerly from New York city, and on the new through line to Philadelphia, about 90 minutes ride therefrom. It is pleasantly located on a gently sloping plain at an altitude of 100 feet above tide water. The underlying geological formation of this section of country is red sandstone and shale, and the superincumbent drift material is composed of gravel and sand to a considerable depth, covered with a rich surface loam which affords a fertile soil and a quick healthy drainage. Plainfield has a population of nearly 12,000 including the inhabitants on both sides of Green brook. Of this number, less than 2000 are foreigners. It covers an area of 7 square miles or about 4500 acres as embraced in the territory enclosed by Terrill avenue on the north-east, the city limits on the south-west, and extending from Mountain avenue on the north-west to the eastern limits of the city and township line.

Plainfield was incorporated a city in 1869. The city proper is divided into two wards, and is governed by a Mayor and Common Council. The municipality is free from any bonded indebtedness. The assessed valuation of personal property and real estate in the limits described (including North Plainfield) is \$5,000,000 which is about

one-fourth of the true value. There are 1,598 legal voters in the corporate limits, and about 550 in the North Plainfield district mentioned.

The Fire Department, under the control of a board of managers, is a volunteer organization composed of 200 men, having two good steam fire engines, one hand-engine, each with hose carriage, one hook and ladder truck, and one hose company. The water supply is from 17 large never failing fire-wells and the two streams of Green brook and Cedar brook. The city is lighted with gas and gasoline. Several miles of the main thoroughfares are graded. The railroad passes through the place on an artificial embankment, crossing the streets on substantial iron bridges.

There are two weekly newspapers and one daily. The *Central New Jersey Times*, *The Constitutionalist*, and *Daily Bulletin*. There are three public halls: Van Deventer Hall with a seating capacity of 700, Assembly Hall seating 500, and Laing's Hall which seats 400. There are two National Banks with an aggregate capital of \$350,000, one Savings Bank, and three Fire Insurance Companies.

The Hotels of Plainfield will do credit to many a city of much larger pretensions.

"The Netherwood," situated on a charming elevation in the eastern part of the city, is a massive five story brick building with 200 rooms elegantly furnished throughout and complete in all its appointments. It was recently built, 1878, at a cost of \$150,000 and is designed for a luxurious summer resort for New York business men and their families.

The Park House erected in 1872 is a large frame structure affording accommodations for 125 guests. Having been thoroughly renovated and re-furnished this year, it is now under the efficient management of a popular caterer, and is a house well worthy of the first class patronage which it receives.

The Mansion House, a four story brick building built in 1854, is one of the oldest hotels in the place. It is situated in the business part of the city and conveniently located for transient trade, offering excellent accommodations to families as well as temporary patrons.

Laing's Hotel, established in 1828, is one of the most popular country rendezvous in New Jersey. The house has always been the favorite resort of excursion parties

from neighboring towns for miles around, and noted throughout the state for its cleanliness and comfort. Connected with the hotel is the largest livery establishment in the city.

Besides these there are the "Farmer's Hotel" and "Somerset House," both well kept and affording good accommodations for man and beast.

The educational advantages of the place are of an excellent order and furnish first-class instruction to both sexes. The private schools are several in number and under the care of experienced teachers. The Plainfield Public School is regarded the banner school of the state and is in charge of a Board of Education and a competent corps of popular instructors. The primary, grammar and high-school departments have enrolled for 1878-79 the names of 1,327 pupils and the average attendance has been over 900. The amount appropriated for school purposes for 1879-80 is \$24,900.48 (\$5,000 of which is set apart for paying school bonds and interest thereon). \$7,244.09 of the appropriation is by the two mill tax from the state. The Public School in North Plainfield is in the hands of an able and efficient principal with good assistants, and a board of trustees who see the pressing need of enlarged accommodations for the growing list of school children, which numbers this year within ten of 600 and about 300 in average attendance. The amount appropriated for school purposes, though not all used, is \$5000.

The city is not deficient in its religious and charitable institutions. There are fourteen churches with a membership of about 3,500, besides two or three independent bodies: viz.: 4 Baptist, 2 Presbyterian, 2 Episcopalian, 1 Methodist Episcopal, 1 Congregational, 1 German Reformed, 1 Roman Catholic and 2 Society of Friends. Some of the church edifices may claim considerable architectural pretension. Two of the largest buildings are of stone, having a seating capacity of 1000 each, are costly in their construction, and provided with many conveniences for the different departments of church work.

The Young Men's Christian Association organized in 1867, has a numerical strength of 221. They have a circulating and reference library of nearly 2000 volumes and a free reading room containing many of the best religious and secular publications. Under the auspices of the Y. M. C. A., is given every season an excellent course of

literary and scientific lectures and musical entertainments. The Sabbath-school Normal Class, with the main object of pursuing a systematic Biblical study and the consideration of practical methods of religious instruction -- is one of their most influential and important branches of Christian activity, having given to Plainfield a national reputation as a Sunday-school centre. Under its management the first Congress of Sunday-school workers of the United States was convened in this place, during the spring of 1876, when 160 delegates were present representing 13 states and twelve different denominations. The efforts of the Association in philanthropic as well as religious ways are designed to help and elevate the young men of Plainfield.

The Relief Association looks after the needy poor by furnishing help, through an Employment Bureau, to those who are able to work, and dispensing clothing, food, medicines, etc., through a scrutinizing Executive Board of self-denying ladies.

The Children's Home is organized for the care and support of little ones, orphans; half orphans or those whose parents are incompetent to provide for their necessary wants.

The Holly Tree Inn, is a well patronized resort for the youth of our city where they can find a home-welcome, good promiscuous reading matter and a simple lunch without any evil temptations. It is nearly self sustaining, though needing the sympathy and assistance of a charitable public. It exists in the interests of temperance and is doing a good work under the direction of the Women's Christian Temperance Union.

The Muhlenberg Hospital is a new enterprise organized in 1878. The Board of Governors have already funds in the treasury sufficient for building purposes. The plans for the proposed hospital have been accepted and active operations will be begun as soon as suitable grounds are decided upon.

The manufacturing interests of Plainfield are increasing slowly, though not on such an extended scale as to give a distinctive character to the place. Encouragement is generously held out by the citizens for the introduction of new departments of labor, and with the growth of the city no doubt the number will be augmented. The largest establishment is the clothing manufactory of Schepfflin,

Baldwin, Tweedy & Co., which ranks among the first of this class of industry in the United States, both with regard to capital and credit, and the quality and quantity of goods made and sold. The concern employs a great many skilled work men at the factory and affords steady occupation to scores of others in the neighborhood around.

The Potter Printing Press Works, just erected by C. Potter, Jr., adds another valuable branch of manufacture which will furnish remunerative employment to about 100 first class mechanics. The machine shop, foundry, work shop and other necessary buildings built of brick are already completed covering nearly an acre of ground. The firm is an old and well established concern, having had their works in Rhode Island for many years. The business is now moved to Plainfield where with increased facilities they will continue to manufacture a printing press that is unexcelled by any other in the country.

The Plainfield Gas Light Co., is an incorporated organization established in 1857. They have several miles of mains laid in the principal streets and are constantly extending them as demand increases.

The City Mills, a four story frame structure, have four run of stone with steam and water power. With their new process machinery just put in, they are manufacturing large quantities of flour of an excellent brand, and other products such as oat meal, corn meal, etc., used in home market and the surrounding suburbs.

There is an Iron and Brass Foundry recently built in 1878, the first of the kind where excellent castings are made by practical mechanics.

There are two machine shops for the manufacture of stationary engines, machinery of various sorts, mechanics tools and other work in iron and steel.

Among other industries requiring more or less of capital, employing labor and developing the local resources of the place may be mentioned the three planing mills, manufacturing sash, doors and blinds, three grist mills, consuming the cereals of the farming district of this locality, and other establishments for the manufacture of carriages, confectionery, hats, segars, soap, harness, oil, etc., besides a Steam Laundry, a Fruit Preserving Co., and the Steam Movie Works.

The mercantile business of Plainfield is as extensive as will be found generally in cities of this size so near to a

large commercial metropolis. There is a fair stock of goods of all kinds in the various retail stores and prices compare favorably with other inland cities.

There is a Board of Trade composed of active men of the place, whose influence is used to encourage the growth of home manufactures and the development of a healthy local business.

The miscellaneous organizations of the city are numerous enough to meet the wants of all persons. The societies are well officered and generously sustained. The Free Masons have just occupied their new rooms which are said to be seldom equalled by any in the state. The Odd Fellows also have a fine lodge room, and the other fraternities are favored with convenient and commodious apartments with good, working harmonious membership.

The Washington Monument Association exists with a determined purpose in no distant future, to honor the memory of our Great American Chieftain, by erecting a suitable memorial upon the summit of the mountain eminence near the notable rock that bears his name.

The Athletic Club is an institution of the city and has grown in popularity and influence by its successful sports among the youth, and by the well managed annual games with liberal prizes, which draw together many of the most celebrated athletes as well as amateur competitors in the country.

The Caledonian Association is a newly organized society of resident Scotchmen, which is devoted to benevolence and the popular sports peculiar to the Highlander.

A Water Supply Co., was chartered in 1869 which will some day develope the needful improvement so easily secured by a mountain reservoir. As the city enlarges, this will be of great benefit for fire purposes, domestic and manufacturing uses, and as an additional sanitary measure.

The Agricultural Association of Union and Middlesex counties, is now regularly organized and moneys subscribed to purchase Fair Grounds just outside of the city limits. Prospects are favorable of their being in view in order this fall.

The distinctive characteristic of Plainfield is no its manufacturing nor commercial interests; but rather its elegant residence property, and the interesting drive on level shaded streets, under continuous archways of maples and elms made delightful by the well kept, tasteful lawns.

The drive on Netherwood heights affords a charming pleasure of endless variety over serpentine roadways, on an undulating surface covered with a natural growth of oaks and chestnuts, passing an unusually attractive class of dwellings and beautified grounds.

The Johnston Drive is a macadamized road along the brow of the Blue Ridge range extending from the notch through which Somerset street passes to the picturesque gap in the mountains at Scotch Plains. Some of the highest points on the drive are 300 to 350 feet above the adjacent plain and through many of the clearings the eye can feast upon the magnificent valley, replete with quiet and gentle beauty. And lastly the ride to Washington Rock is another attractive pleasure and well repays any one to visit that upper region of invigorating mountain air, and expansive panoramic landscape. Here too is situated a first rate hotel, well patronized, and a popular summer-resort. These things with the natural advantages of location have gained for Plainfield the reputation of being a sanitarium free from all epidemics or malaria, where many have checked the progress of physical decay and won back declining health by the genial influence of an exhilarating atmosphere, pure, wholesome water and enlivening surroundings. These circumstances in connection with the local improvements afforded, and the unsurpassed railroad facilities have attracted a larger percentage of New York business men than any other suburban city along the eighteen or twenty lines of travel from the great metropolis.


