DR. PARKHURST WOULD RATHER BE A MALAY.

Hon. T. J. Morgan, ex-Commissioner of Indian Affairs, tells how much worse the Indians would be if they were a Yellow Slave of Spain.

Dr. Parkhurst of New York recently preached a sermon in which he said: "I would rather be a Malay subject to Spain than be an American Indian subject to the United States Bureau."

It is an understood thing that office is spoils we may well pray to be delivered from the responsibility of governing dependencies.

Hon. T. J. Morgan versus the Tribune as the Indians as follows: "By 'Malay' I suppose he meant any inhabitant of the Philippine Islands; and by 'Indian' he meant any inhabitant of the United States."
