While other schools students were sharpening their pencils and gathering school supplies, PDS Lower School students were beginning to pick ripe tomatoes, cucumbers and other vegetables off the plants many of them started from seed in the classroom. One child stood in the bright sun eating a plum tomato while her classmates picked cucumbers and squash in nearby garden rows.

The new Lower School garden developed last spring under the direction of LS Science teacher and curriculum coordinator Aaron Schomburg, with the Ostro Grant In Support of Interdisciplinary Education, gives every grade in the Lower School the opportunity to foster interdisciplinary learning. Students work in the soil and write in journals about their garden discoveries. "It's a great teaching tool and working in the garden builds character," said Mr. Schomburg. The Lower School faculty hopes to take the garden from seed to harvest each year, with children planting the seeds harvested from each crop.

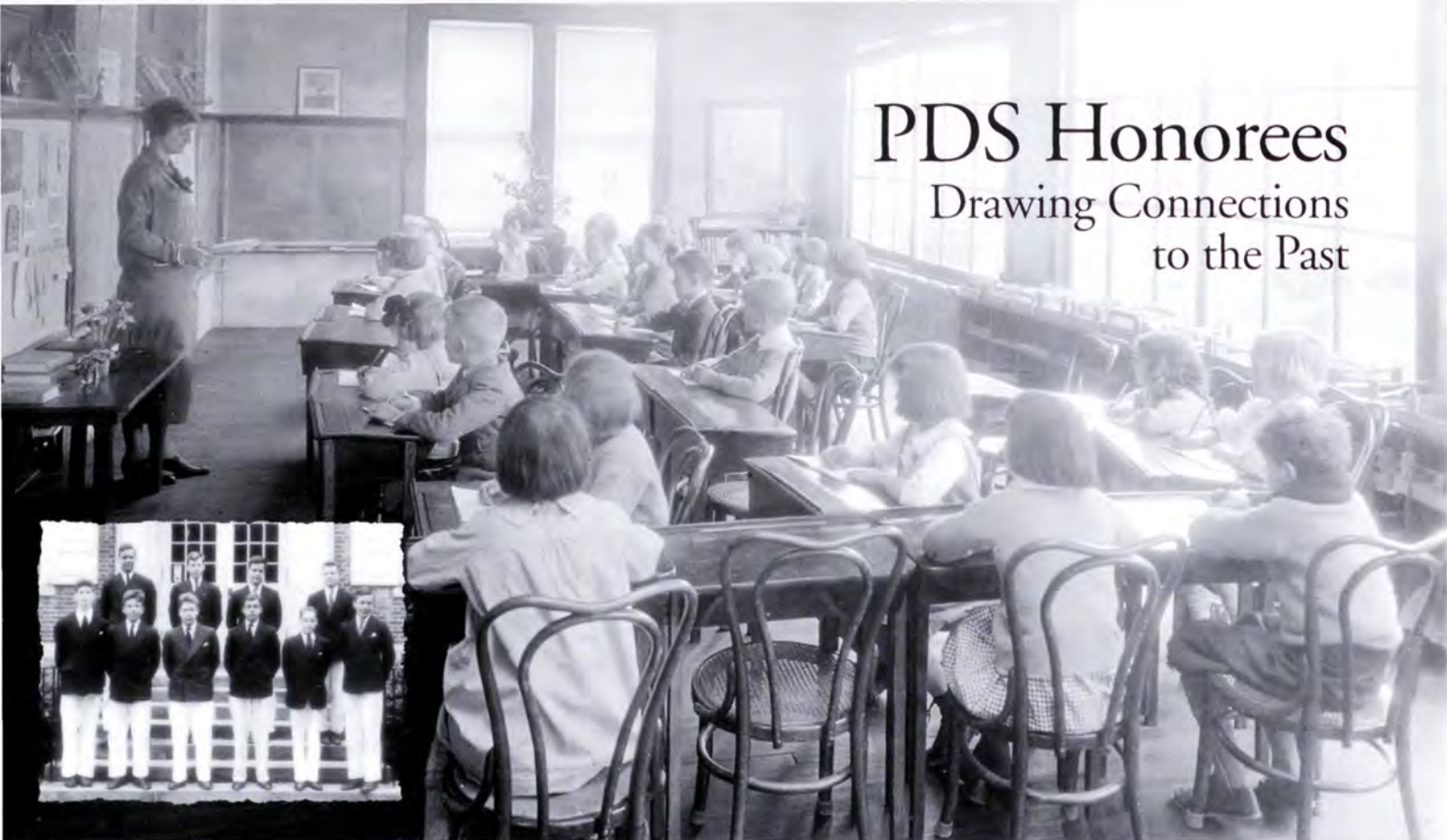

Middle School Students Discover the Heroes & Heroines of PDS

Out of the study of Greek history and collecting words in a “word bank” evolved a Middle School humanities writing project called “PDS Honorees,” a collection of brief biographies about some of the heroes and heroines of our school. MS Humanities and computer teacher Paul Warms wanted to bring PDS history home to students. “It’s important to remember those who gave so generously and enriched our school through their good deeds, and various acts of kindness,” he said. As part of the curriculum, his fifth-grade class was challenged to find and write about men and women who are remembered in special ways for their contributions to the school while students, parents, faculty, or administrators.

With the help of school Webmaster Matt Bockol, the biographies are now showcased on the PDS Web site.

If drawing connections to the past helps children envision paths for their own lives, then the following stories, written in the words of fifth graders, offer many possibilities.

❖ May Margaret Fine

Miss May Margaret Fine was the founder and the first head of Miss Fine’s School which opened in 1899. It was a school for the sons and daughters of professors teaching at Princeton University. Originally this school was a school for boys and girls, but it changed later on and only girls were allowed to attend past 3rd grade. Princeton Country Day School opened in 1925. The boys went there after grade 3. In 1965 Princeton Country Day School and Miss Fine’s School merged to form Princeton Day School.

Miss Fine was a lively spirited person. She loved teaching, and began her career in education tutoring three girls in her own home. Many people thought she was a great teacher and started sending their children to her. Her home was not big enough to house all the children. So as more and more students started attending she moved to bigger places like other people’s homes, inns and other public buildings. In fact, Miss Fine’s School once occupied rooms in the Princeton Inn.

When Miss Fine’s and Princeton Country Day School merged, they built and moved into our current school on the Great Road. Our school is 103 years old and has been a great school since the start.

❖ Colross

A house was built in the year 1799 in Alexandria, Virginia and named “Belle Air”. The second owner of the house, Jonathan Swift, used to visit a small village in Ireland named Kulros. Mr. Swift chose to change the name of his new home from “Belle Air” to “Colross” in honor of that village.

During Colross’ rich history, it served as a hospital during the Civil War, was part of the under ground railroad, and was once wagered and “lost” in a game of cards by its gambling owner.

The wings of the house were added sometime around 1850. The area of Alexandria, Virginia that Colross was in, was hit by a cyclone on November 17, 1927. The home was partially destroyed. Colross was abandoned for two years until someone purchased the land it was built on. The new owner did not want the partially ruined historical masterpiece and was going to destroy it completely. A man named John R. Munn made an offer to buy only the house for \$5,000. The landowner accepted. Mr. Munn then spent an additional ten thousand dollars to have the house moved to its present location on the Princeton Day School campus. It was moved by freight train from Alexandria to Princeton in 1929.

The house was put on an 18 acre plot of land. The house and land were eventually bought by Princeton Day School and used as the headmaster's house. Today Colross is used for the Admissions Office, Development Office, Print Shop, and the classroom of Reverend Dan Skvir.

❖ William Stanley Smoyer '60

William S. Smoyer was in the Princeton Country Day class of 1960. He was a great athlete. He played soccer for Princeton Country Day School in the years 1958, 1959 and 1960. Mr. Smoyer also played hockey and baseball during those same years. He was the captain of both the

❖ Dean Mathey

When Dean Mathey graduated from Princeton University he became a successful investment banker. He married Gertrude Winans and they had 3 sons who all attended Princeton Country Day. When his first wife died Mr. Mathey remarried a woman by the name of Helen Behr. He moved with his new family to what is now called Pretty Brook Farm. The Mathey's added on to Pretty Brook Farm.

Mr. Mathey loved to play tennis. He helped found the Pretty Brook Club. He donated money to Princeton University. In the 1950s Miss Fines School and Princeton Country Day school needed more space. The administration thought of merging the two schools into one. Mr. Mathey offered the land around Colross for the new school. The trustees accepted the offer and began planning the project. The new school opened in September 1965 renamed Princeton Day School.

Dean Mathey died in 1972. He willed more property to PDS as well as his house. Mr. Mathey wanted Princeton Day School to become one of the best schools in the country.

Smoyer was nominated for the school's Hall of Fame for his three years of soccer, hockey and baseball play. He won the ancient history prize; the mathematics prize; and received high commendation for academic excellence while at PCD. William S. Smoyer was both athlete and scholar.

William S. Smoyer's plaque is located by the Pagoda next to the playing fields dedicated in his honor.

After PCD, he went to boarding school before he attended Dartmouth College. He enlisted in the military after graduating college. He thought it his duty to serve. Mr. Smoyer was killed in action a short time after arriving in Vietnam. Mr. Smoyer was a man who lived by his principles.

Mr. Elbot was the head of the Princeton Day School Middle School from 1993 to 1996. He was a very energetic and lively man who smiled a lot. He enjoyed speaking to the middle school and specialized in stories about his past adventures. Before he was head of the middle school he had been a merchant marine working on an ocean freighter. He had also been a very successful precious gem trader. Diamonds, rubies, opals, and sapphires were part of his stock and he traveled extensively between gem wholesalers and stone cutters. Later, he became interested in education.

As the Head of the Middle School he lived by the creed that we are never finished with learning. Education is a journey not a destination. In Mr. Elbot's view everyone was encouraged to shine. He said that he wanted everyone to feel safe in their school. If a student misbehaved he could be very strict. Mr. Elbot had very little patience for people that lied. He once said that his philosophy of life was all about the pursuit of "truth and fun". One of his goals was to have everyone in the middle school respect everyone else. Mr. Elbot's wife missed her home in Colorado so Mr. Elbot and his family left Princeton Day School in 1996 to return to Colorado.

❖ Harriette Hollis McLoughlin

Ms. Harriette McLoughlin was born on March 13, 1954 and died on January 12, 1974. She was only 20 years of age. Jody Erdman who has a son in the First Grade was one of her classmates. She had long reddish hair. Ms. Hollis McLoughlin came to PDS in the Fourth Grade and left after

the Eleventh Grade to go to a school called Simon's Rock. Simon's Rock combined the last years of high school with the first two years of college.

During her time at Princeton Day School Ms. McLoughlin was known for taking care of her friends. She also had a deep love for nature and animals. She volunteered in her free time at the Whole Earth Center in Princeton. Tragically she was killed in a car accident in 1974. Her parents made a gift to PDS, in her memory, which was used to build Astronomy Hill. One of Ms. McLoughlin's favorite pastimes was star gazing.

In 1992, Ms. Harriette McLoughlin's classmates decided they wanted to make a gift to the school in her memory so they purchased the Noah's Arc sculpture. The sculpture can be found outside the theater entrance of the school. There was a dedication ceremony for both Astronomy Hill and Noah's Arc. She is just one of many we remember on the PDS campus.

The school now stands and the children of Vinh-Hy hamlet are attending the Shepherd School.

In the days following the terrorist attacks, an Upper School photojournalism class captured the proliferation of flags and patriotism proudly displayed as messages of hope for passersby. Many headed just down the street in their own neighborhoods, while some witnessed the aftermath in New York City. Upper School photography teacher Eileen Hohmuth-Lemonick knew that after 9/11 "the landscape was forever changed," and she instinctively folded the tragedy into her curriculum, sending students out to record history with their cameras. This gallery of black and white images is a sample of the work students completed for the project. Students developed their film and made archival-quality prints in the photography lab on campus. The project helped students deal with the tragedy as they began to absorb the magnitude of the loss. Some of the images were included in a memorial special on a local television network, and inspired the producers to talk with students as part of the program.

SELECTION CRITERIA

Alumni Awards

- The **Alumni Service Award** is given to an alumna/us whose efforts to give back to the community and/or Princeton Day School reflect the highest ideals of the school. The recipient is someone who inspires others by his or her example of sensitivity or generosity.
- The **Alumni Achievement Award** is given to an alumna/us who has achieved excellence in his or her chosen field and who has made a commitment to helping others. The recipient is someone who inspires others by his or her achievement.

Athletic Hall of Fame

- **Athletes**
Player nominees must have attended Miss Fine's School, Princeton Country Day School, or Princeton Day School for a minimum of two years. Athletes become eligible for consideration five years after the graduation of their class. Inductees will have compiled an exceptional interscholastic athletic career or otherwise distinguished themselves through outstanding athletic achievements and exemplify the highest ideals of the school.
Selection is based primarily on athletic accomplishments while at Miss Fine's School, Princeton Country Day School or Princeton Day School. Subsequent achievements in athletics and other areas are also taken into consideration.
- **Coaches**
To be eligible for consideration as a coach, nominees must have retired from coaching at PDS after working at the school for a minimum of five years. Selection is based upon an exceptional coaching career, which brought great credit to the school.
- **Extraordinary Achievement**
The Selection Committee also considers for induction those nominees:
 - a) who have achieved extraordinary success in athletic endeavors or programs not offered by the school;
 - b) whose distinguishing athletic achievements occurred subsequent to their time at school;
 - c) whose example of uncommon commitment, dedication, and support of our athletic program is worthy of special recognition.

Nominations are due by January 1, 2003

In the summer of 2001, we here in the Development Office at PDS were wrapping up the details on a record-setting year of support. We were enthusiastic about how this success would likely set the school on track for an even more successful upcoming year - which has been the pattern at PDS for ten consecutive years.

However, in the weeks and months following the events of September 11, we were deeply concerned about meeting our budgeted fundraising goals. We speculated that giving to the school might fall off by 20%, 30%, or even 40%. The economic climate was very uncertain and, perhaps more significantly, we felt that everyone's attention was rightly focused on issues and needs larger than those confronting Princeton Day School.

But when the dust settled on the end of this fiscal year, the fundraising results were much different than we ever imagined. New record levels of support were received from both parents and alumni. The number of people who gave at the Colross Society level had never been higher. The Annual Fund goal of \$1,000,000 was surpassed by over \$25,000. To put that in perspective, of thirteen well-established independent schools we surveyed, only two reached their Annual Fund goal last year.

As you might expect, I have speculated on the reasons for this remarkable expression of support for PDS in such a difficult year. Surely, it is powerful testimony to the commitment that our alumni and parents have for the work that we do here on campus. In difficult times, people turn their attention to those individuals and institutions they care about most, and for many, PDS fell into that category. Perhaps people just felt grateful for the stability that PDS brought to their lives, or maybe they all simply focused a bit more on how very fortunate we are to have this special educational opportunity available to the children of this community.

In the end, it is unlikely that we will ever know precisely what factors conspired to engender this broad support. What we do know for certain is that each gift was an individual decision, an individual choice to make a difference at Princeton Day School.

And so, we are pleased to acknowledge on these pages the names of those who gave generously to PDS last year. We will never take their choice to support PDS for granted and will do everything we can to use their gifts in ways that best serve our current and future students and their families.

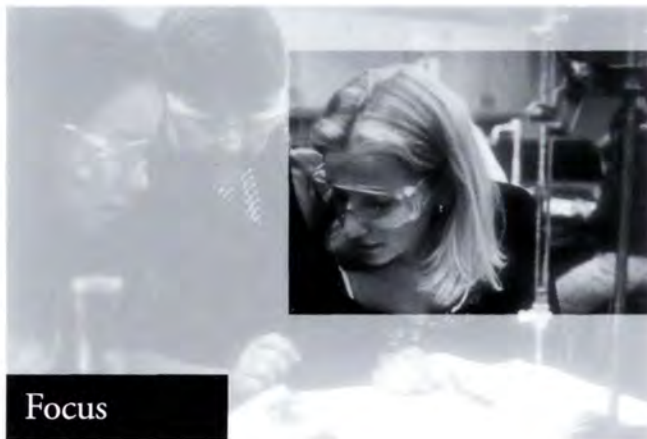

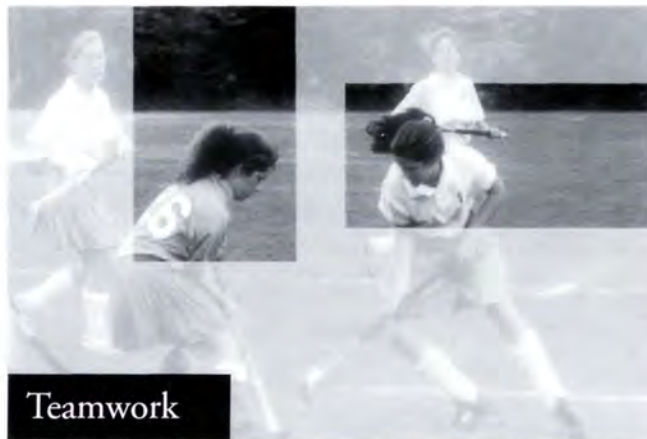
