# LETTER FROM Paul J. Stellato, Head of School

Director of College Counseling Sarah Graham always has one eye trained on the next big thing. Several years ago, as she prepared to offer the first in a string of college nights for junior parents, she asked herself this question: Instead of providing for our parents and their children the best, most up-to-date advice from college admissions deans on how to gain admission to their hallowed institutions, what might we learn if we used the night to gain some insight into what colleges are seeing and experiencing once our students pass through their ivy-covered gates? Sarah fashioned an answer to her own question with her choice of speaker for the night: the director of health services from a local, highly selective university.

For nearly an hour, this remarkable health professional told a tale of joy and sorrow: of welcoming to her campus the best and brightest young men and women our country - and the world - could offer to its universities, only to see them undone by the sheer weight of expectation, competition, and .... lack of sleep! She described, in sharp detail, a generation of students who had organized their young lives around achieving one goal: gaining admission to one selective university or another; who filled their resumes with AP courses, extra-curricular and community service activities, internships, world travel, and one club after another; and who, having won the prize (a fat envelope in November or May), dragged themselves to the threshold of those ivycovered gates, unsure of what to do next and unable to recall why they had labored so long and sacrificed so much. A standing-room-only, eager and boisterous audience fell silent, as the canvas painted before them was not of the freshman class at Princeton, Columbia, or Stanford, but of their own sons and daughters.

Several months before, in the accreditation report issue by the visiting team from the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools, we found this potentially transformative recommendation: *The School should establish a system of curricular coordination so that the School's program can reach its full potential.* Of course, the recommendation was directed at our academic program and the opportunities present in a curriculum that stretches across 14 grades. But given the Middle States charge; and sensitive to the reality that our children travel a path as much emotional and spiritual as it is academic, we expanded our interpretation of the committee's charge: to build a PreK to 12 health and wellness curriculum to strengthen and support every child, and provide for the balance and perspective they would need to



manage disappointment and enjoy success. Conquering the daunting task became the work of our health/wellness/human sexuality task force. Its efforts and inquiry are the stuff of this *Journal*'s focus.

As I look back to that college counseling program and reflect upon the work completed last year by the task force, I am struck by both the progress we have made and the questions we have struggled to answer. Perhaps my disquiet comes from the uncomfortable truth washing over every word of the task force's first-year report: looking always to their teachers, parents, friends, and peers for guidance and direction, our students may feel that the only answer is to try harder, work longer, and sleep less. Or, to paraphrase Walt Kelly's *Pogo*: we have met the taskmaster, and he is us.

So you see the dilemma. The work of the task force thus far has been to understand, as fully as we can, our students' lives. We have asked them to tell us a great deal about themselves, and they have done just that. Armed as we are with this trove of information and insight; and dedicated as we are to growing and graduating bright, productive, curious, and *healthy* young adults, we now endeavor to build a curriculum – and a school culture – that does just that.

#### Sustainability at Princeton Day School: An Update

As part of Princeton Day School's sustainability initiative, the cafeteria operated by Flik Dining Services received a three-star certification from the Green Restaurant Association. Only 15 other schools below the college level nationally have received this certification and only five schools have three stars.

Princeton Day School and Flik have partnered for the past several years to create a more sustainable food service to provide delicious, healthy, fresh cooked meals in a way that is less harmful to the environment. "Every part of a student's experience at Princeton Day School should be educational," said Liz Cutler, Sustainability Coordinator and Upper School English teacher, "and lunch is no exception."

The Green Restaurant Association certifies restaurants all over the United States and grades institutions in the areas of water efficiency, waste reduction and recycling, sustainable furnishings and building materials, sustainable food, energy, disposables, and chemical and pollution reduction. Ms. Culter went on to note, "We live in a world where fewer and fewer children sit down to a family meal and where at least a quarter of all Americans eat fast food every day. We have an opportunity here to model healthy eating habits and help students understand that everything we do, including how and what we eat, has an effect on the environment."

Among the many reasons Princeton Day School received this certification are the high percentage of locally purchased foods, the successful composting program, the many recipes that are nutritious, but low on the food chain, the reusable utensils and dishware, the daily food cooked from scratch, and the green cleaning supplies. The School achieved 177 out of 200 possible points.

"The next goal is to achieve four stars," notes Ms. Cutler.

In addition, Ms. Cutler and Chef Brian Mochnal of FLIK announced a new source for all beef served in the cafeteria: Meyer Natural Angus (http://meyernaturalangus.com/ourpromise). Ms. Cutler remarked, "The beef now served in our cafeteria will be from animals who are raised more healthfully, treated more humanely, and processed more carefully than most American beef. It should also taste better."

#### "Our Future, Our Challenge" Eco-Conference at PDS

The Upper School student club, Environmental Action Club (EnACT), organized their second eco-conference on campus in May for fellow students and community members. EnACT assembled an impressive line-up of speakers, including

The Middle and Upper School science and arts classes also took advantage of Barn Week and connected it to their studies.

## Commencement and Carlton Tucker h'13

On Friday, June 7, the rains came, and commencement was held in the Lisa McGraw '44 Ice Rink for the first time in many years. It was a wonderful ceremony, celebrating the class of 2013, and Head of Upper School Carlton Tucker, who retired after twenty years in the role. Mr. Tucker was presented with a diploma as an honorary member of the Class of 2013 by Head of School Paul Stellato to the delight of everyone in the packed house.

#### Dr. Cornel West at PDS

#### Princeton Day School Visual Arts & Design Faculty — Extravagant Media

October 15 through November 15 Addressing several contemporary themes in painting, drawing, photography, ceramics, sculpture, woodworking and video will be inspirational work created by Princeton Day School faculty members David Burkett, Eileen Hohmuth-Lemonick, Jerry Hirniak, Chris Maher, Susan Reichlin and Stephanie Stuefer.

#### Adam Welch — Deconstructing the Local

November 25 through December 20 Ceramicist Adam Welch uses the brick as a primary object. For Mr. Welch, the brick is characteristic of postmodern appropriation and the marriage of concept and form. His work has a number of metaphorical implications in that he creates sculptures where the brick can be more critcally engaged. Mr. Welch is a Lecturer in Ceramics at the Lewis Center for the Arts, Princeton University.

January 13 through January 30 While evidence of origami goes back to the Sung Dynasty in 1000 CE, contemporary interpretations of *ori* "folding" *gami* "paper" will be exhibited. This exhibition will feature a loan of juried work from 2013 Origami USA Collection, folded cardboard furniture created by Zach Rotholz from New Haven, Connecticut, and folded paper installations from PDS students.

#### Ritter, Aanrud, Pirello — East West: A Remix of Social Progress February 10 through March 6

After graduating from the Lewis Center at Princeton University in 2013, Samantha Ritter moved to New York to pursue her career. At Princeton Day School, she will construct sitespecific armatures, or skeletons of wood, that project from the wall. Los Angeles artist Liv Aanrud creates soft sculptures out of fabric — her abstractions are woven into irregular shapes using flannel, burlap, wool and felt. Samantha Pirello is a painter studying at Yale University's Graduate School of Art.

#### Paul Zelinsky — In Search of (Im)Possibilities March 31 through April 25

Imagine the Possibilities artist Paul Zelinsky studied at Yale University where he took a course on the history and practice of the picture book taught by renowned author Maurice Sendak. Zelinsky also studied in Rome and received a master's degree from Tyler School of Art in Philadelphia. Among his awards, he has received a Caldecott Medal for *Rapunzel*. He will be a visiting artist at the school for two days.

#### The Student Exhibition May 5 through May 23

This exhibit will be shown in the gallery, arts atrium, Upper School, Middle School and Lower School hallways. It will feature highlights from work created by students throughout the year in painting, drawing, printmaking, sculpture, photography, ceramics, woodworking, video, architecture, collage, installation and assemblage. In her iconic programs, she has both woven words and gathered words. Language – woven or gathered – is the tie that binds her to them and them to her, as it is clear that while her third graders may be with her for just short of nine months, they never really leave her, nor she them.

Through the support and generosity of the Wallace Family, Bev launched — and has been the guiding force behind — one of our school's signature programs: *Imagine the Possibilities*. Through her efforts to bring to all of us — students and faculty alike — artists, writers, and poets of renown, she has revealed to us the artists' hands and heart in the act of creation.

For her work at Princeton Day School, she has been honored with both the David C. Bogle Award for Excellence in Teaching; and a year-long sabbatical, during which she committed herself to one of her favorite professional pursuits: being a teacher to teachers.

She was selected as the 1999-2000 New Jersey Non-Public School Teacher of the Year by the Council for American Private Education. And, in that same year, she received the Barbara Juster Esbensen Award, a national award presented in recognition of the poetry produced by students in her classroom, and for outstanding teaching in the field of poetry.

An essential resource in the graduate schools of education at the University of Pennsylvania, Columbia University, and Rider College, Bev has presented often at both Teachers' College and at annual meetings of the National Council for Teachers of English; and she has been honored for her classroom achievements by her alma mater, Penn State University. Congratulations on this well-deserved award."

#### Theater Director Stan Cahill Creates Stories in Haiti

Theater Director Stan Cahill spent the first few weeks of summer in Haiti developing and implementing a workshop he designed called "Building Community through Storytelling." # **Teaching Wellness, Teaching Balance**

Princeton Day School attracts some of the most intelligent, highly motivated, and ambitious students in the country. Among the many things PDS students share with their peers in top independent schools across the country are the demands of gaining admission into the most highly selective colleges and universities in the nation. As Head of School Paul Stellato mentions in his letter in this issue, this focus can lead to extremely busy schedules packed with AP courses and extra-curriculars, such community service clubs and sports teams. This charge to succeed comes at a high cost (notably, the cost of sleep) to our students, and may ultimately and unfortunately lead to a "what now" moment upon arrival at the college of their dreams.

> The answer at Princeton Day School is a resounding yes. The School is more committed than ever to truly nurturing the mind, body, and character of each student—as our mission states—and is in the process of implementing a full-scale, state-of-the-art health, wellness, and sexuality initiative.

when he attended an event several years ago organized by Director of College Counseling Sarah Graham, who was curious to hear from a director of health services at a top university about student life after admission. Mr. Stellato noted, "The response to this college night was powerful and unanticipated. The statistics were stark and the responses were dramatic. It dawned on me that what we were seeing was the future of our students. I could feel the concern of the parents, and it made me think about the responsibility of the school."

Once the idea was in motion, things came together quickly and fortuitously. Mr. Stellato explained, "I had been speaking with former Head of the Upper School Carlton Tucker about creating a Dean of Students position as I felt that, as a school, we needed to address the non-academic, non-athletic side of our students' lives. We were fortunate to have US Spanish teacher Doug McLane step into this role." In 2012, Mr. Stellato formally asked Mr. McLane (who is currently Upper School Division Head at Saddle River Day School) to serve as Health, Wellness & Sexuality Chair and to assemble a committee across divisions and departments to begin work on the initiative.

In addition, the Academic Advisory Council of PDS had been reviewing the school's academic schedule and made the recommendation to reduce the requirement of PE from four years to two years. Mr. Stellato explained, "It became reasonable to ask: what program should we be implementing now?" This too became an impetus for a wide-ranging change in the school-wide health and wellness curriculum.

#### Building an Innovative Curriculum at Princeton Day School

Mr. McLane assembled the Committee members from across the divisions of the school, as well as from the counseling, health, and deans' offices. The

Committee included School Counselor Rob Tuckman, MS Spanish teacher Rachel Kamen, Garden Coordinator Pam Flory, PE Department Chair Mark Adams, MS Math teacher and Dean Donna Zarzecki, School Nurse Nina Keller, MS & US Music teacher Andrew Schmidt, US Science teacher Barbara Maloney, LS 1st grade teacher Heather Maione, and LS 2nd grade teacher and Math Coordinator Susan Ferguson.

The Committee immediately set out to accomplish the following tasks: to examine the PreK-12th grade health and wellness curriculum at Princeton Day School; to determine where the school was excelling in these topics, and where it could improve; and, ultimately, to build a leading, innovative curriculum at Princeton Day School.

The group decided to take three steps toward achieving the goals set before them. First, they met together and with faculty and staff to gather information and examine the priorities, strengths, and needs of the current program. Next, they wrote a survey to send to other independent, coeducational, PreK-12 schools across the nation to find out how they handled health and wellness at their schools. Finally, they researched national student surveys and administered the Independent Health Survey Check (IHSC) survey to students in grades 6-12.

Mr. McLane noted of the Committee's work: "Through meetings and conversations we had throughout the year, these faculty and staff members became more informed of the programs in place in each division, some of which they may not have known about before. This interdivisional collaboration was really something to celebrate."

#### The Current Core Curriculum

The Committee reviewed the current curriculum and determined that PDS has solid health and wellness curricula in all three divisions. In the Lower School, wellness topics such as nutrition, self-esteem, hygiene, online etiquette, bullying, and sleep are discussed in the general classrooms with students. In addition, LS students take classes in the PDS organic garden, learning about healthy eating habits, sustainability, and stewardship of natural resources. In the Middle School, 5th and 6th grade students take a RAP class, which addresses topics such as conflict resolution, binge drinking, peer pressure, sex education, social media, and nutrition. Princeton Day School 7th and 8th graders take an H.E.V. (Health, Education, Values) class which provides age-appropriate information on topics ranging from self-esteem to the prevention of substance abuse. In the Upper School, all 9th graders participate in Peer Group program, which pairs dedicated faculty and carefully selected seniors to mentor and guide the new US students on issues like peer pressure, academic stress, drug and alcohol abuse, and relationships. There is also one trimester of health class required for all 10th graders, which includes an introduction to the concept of health, substance abuse, human sexuality, sexually transmitted diseases, contraception, and nutrition. In addition to

these courses, there are other scheduled health andwellness programs throughout the year, including as the Hi-Tops seminar on substance abuse for Upper School students, and guest lecturers who often speak on topics of race, gender, ethnicity, religion, financial circumstance, and sexual orientation.

Though the Committee was heartened by the programming in place in the three divisions, the group observed the curriculum, as a whole, needs a unifying force and vision. Mr. McLane noted, "The good news is that we have space carved out in the schedule in each division—the challenge is how best to use these spaces. We need to ensure that the programs progress naturally between divisions."

#### Working with Other Independent Schools

Several of the schools the Committee contacted responded and some had great information to share on their health and wellness curricula but most schools, interestingly, wrote asking for help to build or strengthen their existing programs.

Mr. Stellato was struck by how little work was being done in other independent day schools in this area. "The bad news and the good news is that the field is wide open. When we heard back from our colleagues, we realized that we will have to find our way on our own," he said.

Mr. McLane concurred, and added, "PDS, in conducting this work, is poised to be a leader in the independent school world for asking these questions and doing this work. Few day schools that we heard from are giving serious consideration to their programs and to developing new, innovative ideas, so we have the opportunity to share the good work we are doing here." The Committee made a recommendation for Princeton Day School to possibly spearhead a consortium of day schools that could work together to collaborate and exchange ideas and information on the topic of health and wellness programming.

#### How Do Our Own Students Rate Us?

Princeton Day School students responded to the two surveys (one for students in grades 6-8, and one for students in grades 9-12), and the results were illuminating. Mr. Stellato noted, "I knew how important the survey results were going to be—we really needed to hear directly from our students. The Committee went about it in the right way: we set aside the time to conduct the surveys and we prepared our students. And we were rewarded by really honest answers."

Mr. Stellato went on, "I learned three things from the survey results: one, our students are healthy, happy, and high-functioning—there was a lot of optimism present in the results; two, starting as early as 6th grade, our students are feeling enormous pressure to perform at the highest level; and three, nobody is getting enough sleep."

The results also illustrated to the Committee that many aspects of the school's current program are effective. The student survey indicated favorable marks in the areas of maintaining strong relationships with friends, parents, and adults at school; broad participation with volunteering; high levels of academic achievement; relatively low participation in smoking and sexual activity in comparison with national averages; and positive physical fitness. The results from the students also highlighted areas that need further attention in the Middle and Upper Schools. These issues included difficulty getting enough sleep, dealing with stress and academic pressure, handling bullying (both in school and online), receiving proper nutrition, and substance abuse.

The Committee gathered several times to discuss the student survey results and determined that they were invaluable in helping identify gaps in the curriculum and assessing how to address these critical wellness themes with students in an effective way.

#### Where We Are Heading

Once the Committee compiled all of the results of their work, they presented these findings to the entire faculty and staff, as well as the Board of Trustees, and made recommendations for the future, such as beginning work tying together the curriculum through divisions, drafting a mission statement, and hiring a health and wellness coordinator to oversee the program.

Mr. Stellato is greatly encouraged by the work of the Committee and emphasizes the short-term goals: "We want to accomplish two important things in the next year: we want to create a state-ofthe-art health, wellness, and sexuality curriculum for grades PreK-12, and we want to develop student, faculty, and parent programming on topics of health, wellness, and sexuality." He adds, "Though this initiative has proved to be tougher than it initially seemed, we are forging a path and making our way toward something powerful."

# The I and the iPhone

It has been about a decade now, but I still recall the happy anticipation with which I entered Mr. Freedholm's Sacred Tradition's class to meditate. For the first five minutes we turned off the lights, closed our eyes, and found ourselves in a guided meditation. During a hectic school day those precious moments taught me to slow my mind's rapid pace. In a constantly moving, college preparatory environment where the stakes felt so high, I enjoyed those moments of peace that forced me to be present and take a real look at how I was doing. Now as an adult, I realize that in those moments of meditation I was beginning to practice mindfulness. While finishing my Master's degree in Counseling for Mental Health and Wellness at New York University, I developed a theoretical program using Mindfulness-Based Stress Reduction (MBSR) for improving mental health. MBSR can serve a role in educational settings because it forces students to learn how to be present in the moment. This awareness, in turn, creates positive outcomes for overall wellbeing. In a world of iPhones, instant email access,

As a snarky, intellectualizing teenager, I thought I knew all the elements of a "healthy lifestyle." I recognized the importance of plenty of sleep, small and frequent meals, exercise, and positive interpersonal relationships. Yet, how often did I stay up late studying for an AP test, finishing a paper, or gossiping on instant messenger? Can I even count the number of times I ate quickly and mindlessly to run off to the next activity? The threat of a B+ or being left out felt much more urgent than some illness in middle age. My few moments of meditation were perhaps so welcome because they combated these daily stresses.

and a preference of texting over talking, being present is not a high priority. Yet from what I have seen in my work with adolescents, perhaps it should be.

The lack of presence in today's students often aggravates issues of insomnia, eating disorders, sexual health concerns, and academic and social pressures. Learning how to slow down thoughts and actions could curb many teen distresses. In my work as a counselor of young adults, I see how they struggle with the issue of identity. Who am I and what are my values? Who do I want to spend time with and why? How do I want to spend my time? What are my goals? Do the "should's,"



"must's," and "have to's," that plague me originate in my own mind; or do they belong to my parents, teachers, or peers? Young adults often enter my office with these questions. Youth who can begin to answer them are more likely to reach a state of wellness. Yet, especially for high school students, I wonder who has time for such questions, when SATs loom and the lacrosse scout is coming to watch the next tournament?

In my role as a mental health provider, I have found it useful to introduce concepts of mindfulness and self-awareness as a long term lifestyle. This proves difficult when modes of communication change more rapidly than a middle school boy's voice! The introduction of the smartphone means that adolescents have constant updates on the status of their friends and family. There is pressure to share thoughts and emotions on Facebook, Twitter, and even through photos on Instagram, without processing them

first. Students have many modes to express themselves but little means of face-to-face feedback. Without this processing, feelings of anxiety, sadness, and anger are left to disrupt identity development. These feelings, as I often tell clients, are not inherently bad yet they do need to be explored. The best way to do this is to begin by slowing down and actually naming the emotions.

Practicing mindfulness in this way is not easy as an adult, yet imagine the effect if we began teaching it in preschool? Princeton Day School has the unique opportunity to follow young people from the time they are barely learning their ABC's to the moment when they cross the stage to receive their diplomas at Colross. The privilege of having students throughout their primary and secondary education makes a case for consistency in education on physical and mental health throughout the Lower, Middle and Upper schools. Dialogue between the division heads and teachers can ensure that information on physical and mental health is being dispersed through an age-appropriate and comprehensive health curriculum.

In addition, although it may cause some to blush, critical to this curriculum is a discussion of sexual health. As a former intern at the Sexuality Information and Education Council of the US (SIECUS), I pored through dozens of sexual health curricula. I realized that what was missing most from these curricula was accurate information. Many health curricula detour from basic facts due to social stigma. A core component of MBSR and of another therapeutic modality, Cognitive Behavioral Therapy, is the belief that people live healthier lives when they understand the way their bodies and minds work. There is so much political hoopla around the culture of perfection (in bodies and in grades) and shame surrounding sexuality that many students go through school with unanswered questions.

As an alumna, I am pleased that Princeton Day School is now working hard to create a health and wellness curriculum that can span the divisions, bring continuity of knowledge, and challenge students to learn to relax and think about who they want to be. In a culture where even supposedly meditative practices such as yoga can become competitive and unhealthy, it is essential that students be given the academic space to question and explore their minds and bodies. Growing up is ultimately about creating an adult identity. In order to help students create this whole and comfortable sense of self we must begin where PDS always does: in the classroom.

## From the Archives: Dress Code Mirrors Attitudes

The struggle to define just what constitutes appropriate dress for students has been an issue ever since Miss Fine's School opened well over a century ago. It is a debate that still excites strong feelings about taste, style, independence, and personal choice. "Nothing ever works perfectly," says former Head of Upper School Sandy Bing, who was part of many spirited Community Council meetings in the seventies and eighties. "No matter what the dress code is, there will always be a small percentage of students who try to take advantage and stretch the spirit of the code. The reason discussion about the dress code (and the Honor Code for that matter) continues to come up is because there will always be questions about whether either is really working. For me, the real value of those discussions was the dialog among students, faculty and administrators concerning responsibility: personal responsibility for one's own actions, responsibility to and for one's peers, and responsibility to the institution."

#### **Miss Fine's School**

In the December 1921 *Link*, junior Dorothy Reeves made a similar point when she cautioned, "We should be careful about our dress, too. Silk dresses and fancy stockings may be correct for afternoon social affairs but they are certainly not created for school. The real lady wears quiet and inconspicuous clothing and above all avoids the use of cosmetics. This greatly cheapens a girl and, of course, cheapens the school she attends."

While the use of cosmetics gained acceptance after World War II, girls continued to wear dresses or skirts and blouses, most in materials that required dry cleaning or ironing. On cold days they added sweaters or school blazers and wore stockings or knee socks with flat-heeled shoes. Sneakers were reserved for gym and team sports. School uniforms were an option that was often considered but never adopted.

#### **Princeton Country Day School**

Founded in 1924 and modeled on the English public school, PCD required that older boys wear jackets and ties. Alumni recall that if a boy forgot his tie, he was sent home — on foot — to retrieve it and had to make up the lost class time after school.

A 1963 letter to parents included the following guidelines: "All boys are requested to dress neatly and sensibly for class attendance. Boys in Forms IV, V, and VI (grades 7, 8, and 9) should wear coats and ties; younger boys (grades 4-6) may wear sweaters, 'shorts,' or gray and khaki 'longs.' No blue jeans, please! A school blazer may be bought but is optional. We expect high but reasonable standards of dress at all times."

#### **Princeton Day School**

Dress codes from the founding schools carried over to PDS but were soon challenged by changing attitudes. The first three years of the seventies saw the most significant changes to students' appearance in the School's history. The turbulent national mood and the birth of the youth movement coincided with an increased number of boys in the Upper School, causing Community Council to lobby against jackets and ties. In 1970, after much thoughtful discussion among administrators, faculty and students, and two parent polls, the rules were modified as follows.

"Boys . . . are expected to dress as gentlemen – neatly and cleanly. Boys are required to wear shirts with collars, slacks (not blue jeans - dungarees), socks, and shoes each day to school. Ties and jackets are recommended, but not required.

"Girls' dress should correspond in formality to that of the boys. Traditional skirts, sweaters, blouses and simple dresses are recommended. Extreme jewelry or makeup or play clothes are prohibited.

"Boys' (and girls') hair should be neat and clean and out of the eyes. Beards, mustaches and sideburns must be kept neat, clean and trimmed. Each athletic coach has the right to establish the hair length of team members for reasons of personal health. Shoes will be worn at all times that a student is on school grounds."

The next year, 1971-1972, saw another radical change when Council's proposal to allow girls to wear pants in school was accepted without opposition.

By the school's centennial, regulations had loosened again and attempted to avoid specific prohibitions that only seemed to challenge students' creative circumvention of the rules. The 1999-2000 Handbook & Directory gives the following guidelines for the upper school.

"The objective of the dress code is to maintain an atmosphere conducive to learning. Appropriate dress is neat and clean. Neat clothing is not ripped or frayed. It does not strain the bounds of modesty, nor does it exhibit lewd or otherwise objectionable material. T-shirts advocating tobacco, alcohol and drug use, and T-shirts with messages specifically demeaning to any group of people may not be worn. Shoes must be worn at all times." (Again, that admonition to students longing to go barefoot!) This year, Community Council is once again wrestling with the issue of acceptable school dress. "The dress code figures prominently in many conversations I have with students," says new Head of Upper School Jason Robinson. "Dress code issues are inseparable from our core values. That's really where the conversation needs to begin. What do we value as a school? What are our aspirations for our students? And how can we create a dress code that reflects and reinforces our mission? I can't be sure where such a debate might lead, but feel that Princeton Day School is a place where we're serious about building a certain type of community."

# REPORT FROM THE Chair of the Board of Trustees

Head of School Paul Stellato came to Princeton Day School in the summer of 2008 with enormous energy and optimism. Within his first few months, however, the recession had arrived and its repercussions were broadly felt. Mr. Stellato responded quickly and thoroughly and, along with the Board of Trustees, developed a five-year financial sustainability plan that significantly reduced the school's operating budget without cutting faculty jobs, salaries, or programs. In addition, these changes were made without substantially increasing tuition. This was not the case at many other independent day schools around the country. Remarkably, while many schools were cutting back and struggling, he implemented administrative and curricular changes that have strengthened the institution and positioned the School to be able act strategically while adapting to a changing environment. Because of Mr. Stellato's foresight, and planning, PDS has emerged stronger and better than ever before.

Building on the tremendous work of his first few years, Mr. Stellato presented the Board of Trustees a bold 10-year vision plan for the School in the fall of 2011. Since then, he has dramatically enhanced the student experience through PreK-12 curriculum development and integration of the academic divisions, and he has maintained our deep commitment to faculty professional development and financial accessibility for our families. In short, the leadership, vision, enthusiasm, and energy that he brought to our school five years ago is undiminished.

#### So, what is next?

Mr. Stellato and the Board began the work of exploring numerous transformative plans for the school in the fall of 2012, which will form the capstone to the broad curricular and cross-divisional initiatives that have been implemented. As I reported in the spring issue of the Journal, we began the fall with a two-day retreat in November, which set the tone for thoughtful deliberation for the rest of the year. We approved a campus-wide Master Plan, the first of its kind, and also did extensive work on evaluating the need for increased funding for need-based financial aid. For the remainder of the year, using the Master Plan as a guide, we advanced ambitious plans for a new school-wide community facility for athletics and fitness, a state-of-the-art outdoor tennis complex, and a reconfigured Lower School traffic circulation and drop-off pattern. In June, we held a special meeting where we endorsed the very early stages of a campaign to support these initiatives.

I am pleased to report that we have now begun the early stage of the campaign and are in the process of exploring financial support. We anticipate that the scope and size of the effort will be determined in the next twelve to eighteen months. We will spend this year seeking the advice and support of key members of our community about the priority of the initiatives. As we gather information and move forward with specific plans, Mr. Stellato and I will update the community.

We seek to build a bold future for Princeton Day School, based on our tradition and great institutional strength, through the advancement of the initiatives outlined above. The Board is enthusiastic about the opportunities that lie ahead and, with the visionary leadership of our Head of School, we are anxious to embark on the next five years of his tenure.

## From the Classroom to the Boardroom: Jack Wallace '48 Retires as Longest-Serving Trustee

When Jack Wallace walked into Kindergarten at Miss Fine's School on his first day of classes, he could not have imagined he would still be going to the school 75 years later. During that time, he has made an impact in almost every constituency, from Princeton Country Day School coach to Princeton Day School grandparent. His long affiliation was celebrated in June when he retired from the PDS Board of Trustees after two rotations totaling a record 23 years, and was named a Trustee Emeritus for all he has done to enrich the school's programs and shape its identity. In addition, the Alumni Association recently named its highest volunteer service award after him in recognition of his contributions to PDS and the greater community. He personifies the qualities the school seeks to instill in its students and his dedication and loyalty illustrate the enormous difference one person can make to an institution.

"Jack's greatest role, which he seems to play so naturally and effortlessly, has been that of steward of the institution," says Head of School Paul Stellato. "Although he has kept a close eye on the daily life of the school, his keenest focus has been on its long-term health and success. Jack understands and appreciates the greatness of this place, and, while he would grow uncomfortable at the mere suggestion, he has embodied that greatness."

#### A Team Player with a Wealth of Experience

Mr. Wallace first served as a trustee from 1978 to 1984 and was persuaded to return to the Board in 1996 by then Head of School Lila Lohr. "At some point I was probably on every committee they had," he laughs. He brought a wealth of experience from his volunteer work at the local, county and state level. In addition to chairing several area boards, he served as mayor of Princeton Township for three years and was one of the founders of the Princeton Area Community Foundation. In 1993, he received the alumni award that now bears his name.

"I love all my various activities," he says. "It's fun. I have met so many wonderful people that I admire deeply that I would have never, ever have met otherwise — people from all over. That's the real joy of getting involved, particularly with the PDS Board."

One person he may never have met if not for his volunteerism is Trustee Andy Okun, who says, "Jack has a dedication to family, friends and communities that is unequaled. Furthermore, there is a kindness to him that we should all aspire to have. It has been one of the great gifts of my life to get to know him and to be considered his friend."

Board Chair Barbie Griffin Cole '78 has a much longer history with Mr. Wallace. "His mother and my grandmother

were great friends, and he and my father were in the same class at Princeton," she says. "His son John and I were classmates at PDS, and now his grandson and my youngest son are in the freshman class together. It's really rare to have that kind of continuity within a community. It's been a great privilege to work with Jack so closely on the Board and get to know him from a new perspective.

"One of the extraordinary things about Jack is his selfless devotion to PDS," she continues. "His work on the Board has been tireless. He's a mentor and a great leader who has been a guiding light for the school over many years. He continues to think of ways to help the school and plan for the next generation of students. Jack is an extraordinary human being, and while we will miss his wry sense of humor and thoughtful questions at board meetings, we are very pleased he has agreed to continue to play a key role on our Finance and Development committees."

Treby McLaughlin Williams '80 has a similar link to Mr. Wallace as a classmate of his younger son Chris. During her 13 years on the Board, and especially during her tenure as Chair, she relied on his advice and encouragement, offered during countless phone conversations and breakfast meetings.

"Jack has left an extraordinary legacy, part of which is the way he has fostered people to grow as leaders and colleagues," she says. "He enhances the performance of everyone around him. There is so much to learn from him. We affectionately call him 'Jack the Elder.' He is never led by ego. It's always about what he thinks is best for the institution. One of the best parts of working with Jack is receiving his incredibly frank and candid feedback. He delivers it in a way that is heard and internalized. I think it's because it's said with respect and true affection for the person he's directing it toward. He starts with people by trusting and respecting them."

"We've been fortunate at PDS. We've had great chairs of the Board," Mr. Wallace says. During his tenure, he has also worked with six heads of school and four interim heads and is well aware of the challenges they face. "How fortunate we are at this point in our history to have such a dynamic, visionary head as Paul Stellato. Under his leadership, PDS is in great shape."

Of the faculty he has come to know so well and admire so deeply, he says, "I can't conceive of any greater group of people than the PDS faculty. The thing that's incredible to me is that 98% of the staff and faculty give to the Annual Fund. I doubt that there's any other corporation or school that has that kind of support from its personnel."

#### Path to Success

For all his recent honors, Mr. Wallace's educational career got off to a shaky start. After just one year at MFS, he found himself repeating Kindergarten at Nassau Street School. He does not recall the reason for the move or why he was held back, but he absorbed the setback with his usual good humor and took advantage of the chance to make new friends. He entered Princeton Country Day School in fourth grade, maintained high academic honors, captained the White Team, and won the Headmaster's Cup for leadership at graduation in 1948. He went on to Hotchkiss and then Princeton University where he majored in international and public affairs. In his senior year, he returned to PCD as coach of the JV soccer team and led them to a 3-0-3 record. He then retired, earning a place in history as the school's only undefeated coach.

After a naval career in which he rose to become an aide to the vice admiral in command of the entire Atlantic amphibious fleet, he attended law school briefly. Then he interviewed at the State Department, the Central Intelligence Agency, and at PCD for a position teaching history.

"After much thought, I didn't accept the teaching position because I was concerned I wouldn't be able to keep the course interesting year after year," he says. "That's an ability I admire in so many PDS teachers."

Instead, he became an analyst for Morgan Stanley in New York. Some years later he moved to the Princeton area and joined First Trenton National Bank (the predecessor of New Jersey National and CoreStates/New Jersey National) where he advanced from assistant cashier to CEO before his retirement in 1993.

#### Family Ties

Mr. Wallace met his wife Happy in October 1958. Their first date spanned a weekend that included the Princeton/Dartmouth football game, "lunch on a snowy day" at the Stockton Inn, and a Rangers hockey game. They were engaged six weeks later and married within 10 months. Fifty-four years later, they still radiate a special glow in each other's company.

The Wallace family history has been interwoven with that of the school for four generations. Mr. Wallace's mother, Margaret Cook, was a 1927 MFS alumna who co-founded The Outgrown Shop to fund scholarships. Her husband, John H. Wallace, became a PCD trustee and raised money for the school's first gymnasium/auditorium during the years their sons, Jack and Bill '50, were students there. Jack's three children attended PDS: John, Jr. '78, Chris '80, and Margie Wallace Gibson '84, who now teaches third grade there. Three of his grandchildren are alumni: Christopher '10, Katie '11, and Connor Gibson '12, all currently students at Dartmouth, their parents' alma mater. Their brother Coby is a PDS freshman. Ever the banker, Mr. Wallace calculates the family will mark an unenviable milestone this year when 33 it pays its 100th tuition to the school.

The quiet generosity of the Wallace family has enriched the educational experience of MFS, PCD, and PDS students in ways that cultivate the mind, body and spirit. The greenhouse, which underscores the school's early commitment to the natural environment, was given in memory of Mr. Wallace's sister Penny '69, who passed away in 1959. After the tragic death of their son in 1990, Mr. and Mrs. Wallace created the John D. Wallace, Jr. '78 Memorial Guest Artist Series Fund that supports "Imagine the Possibilities," an innovative program that annually brings creative artists to school to work with students in all three divisions. In addition, John's classmates and friends donated funds toward the amphitheater that bears his name at the entrance to the Lower School. A sampling of other gifts includes the Wallace Family Scholarship, music practice rooms in memory of Mr. and Mrs. Wallace's mothers, and new lighting in the art gallery donated by Chris to honor his parents' 50th wedding anniversary. Mr. Wallace may have "cycled off" the Board, but his influence is apparent every day.

#### A New Role

"Jack knows the critical role our school has played in the lives of countless children and families, and he understands its vital presence in our community," Mr. Stellato says. "He has constantly reminded us of our strength, our purpose, and our duty. Personally, I will miss terribly his optimism, courage, and broad perspective."

Fortunately, Mr. Stellato may still be able to draw on those qualities. With a glint in his eye, Mr. Wallace reminds Ms. Cole and Mr. Stellato not to rest too easily since, as Trustee Emeritus, he is still entitled to attend Board meetings. After so long, he may find the opportunity irresistible.

The University of Pennsylvania's news release stated: "Nancy Bonini, Lucille B. Williams Professor of Biology, was elected as a member of the National Academy of Sciences, an honor considered to be one of the highest a United States scientist or engineer can receive. Members were chosen for their achievements in original research. The 2012 Academy class consists of 84 members and 21 foreign associates. She was also awarded a five-year David and Lucile Packard Fellowship grant in the amount of \$500,000 in 1998 and was selected as an Investigator of the Howard Hughes Medical Institute in 2000."
