The mugging was a warning shot. My assailant tossed my wallet back with the understood message that life is frail and a wasted moment is a horrible thing.


I must accomplish. As much as I possibly can, for as long as I am able. I must work to do my best until the rug is pulled out from under me, or else I will fall silently and unnoticed.
