Tens of thousands of Iraqis were killed by the United States and its allies after Saddam Hussein invaded Kuwait in January 1990. Hussein's soldiers retreated from Kuwait. leaving the country in shambles, but the Iraqi leader remained in power.







Rap star Vanilla Ice was discovered in a Dallas, Texas nightclub. It didn't take long for the 22-yearold rapper to hit the top of the charts. His debut album, "To the Extreme," hit the six million mark. "Extremely Live!" was another of his hits. During the war in Iraq, Saddam Hussein's forces ignited hundreds of oil wells in Kuwait. Smoke belched from the torched wells for many months afterwards. Satellite photos showed a black-grey plume swept south from Kuwait as far south as the Arabian Sea — equal to the distance from Manhattan to the tip of Florida. Meanwhile, the invasion of Iraq caused destruction estimated to be in the hundreds of millions of dollars. Months after the American military forces freed Kuwait City, the effects of war were still evident.

The Way It Was: Jan. 1991-Jan. 1992



Civil war broke out in Yugoslavia in the summer of 1991. Croatia and Slovenia declared independence from the federation in June, 1991. In the past, all six were held together under the leadership of President Tito, but Tito's death in 1980 and the crumbling of Communism's powerful cement throughout Eastern Europe allowed the forces clamoring for democracy and ethnic self-determination to break into uncontrolled violence.

The coup in the Soviet Union began on August 19, 1991. An eight-man committee led by Vice President Gennady Yanayev took power from President Mikhail S. Gorbachev. Tanks and other military gear moved into Moscow as Russian President Boris Yeltsin called on Russians to resist the coup.

On Tuesday, August 20, President George Bush was joined by the European Community and demanded Gorbachev's return to power. Three of the leaders of the new eight-man ruling committee were said to step down.

On Wednesday, August 21, the leaders of the coup were reported to have fled Moscow. Tanks and armored personnel carriers moved away from Russian Parliament and leaders of the national legislature demanded that Gorbachev be returned to power. The Communist Party denounced the takeover.



On Thursday, August 22, Gorbachev returned to Moscow before dawn and reassumed his position as President of the Soviet Union. He was not able to regain his previous authority, however. Gorbachev disbanded the Communist Party and throughout the republics of the USSR, nationalist movements took advantage of their new freedom. One by one, the republics declared their independence from the Soviet Union.

In Moscow, Boris Yeltsin, President of the Russian republic, commanded


vast popular support after his brave protests to the August coup. Riding a wave of popularity and nationalist fervor he continually challenged Gorbachev's authority as more and more of the republics abandoned the crumbling central government.

On December 6, President Yeltsin of Russia and the presidents of the Ukraine and Byelorus announced their intention to create a new Commonwealth of Independent States. The Commonwealth would be open to all of the previous Soviet republics and possibly to other nations, as well. Gorbachev and his Soviet government were left out as negotiations began between the former republics. The main issue under consideration was the distribution of the USSR's nuclear missiles located within the boundaries of the new independent republics.

In the Russian republic, Yeltsin demanded that Gorbachev step down from his position as leader of the USSR and give the Kremlin to Russia's national governnment. As 1992 began on January 1, the hammer and sickle flag of the Soviet Union was lowered for the last time over the tsar's old fortress. In its place, the new Russian flag fluttered over the Kremlin in Moscow.

President Bush nominated Clarence Thomas, a 43-year-old conservative Republican, to the Supreme Court. Nearly three months later he was confirmed by the U.S. Senate by a vote of 52-48, after a series of tumultuous and fiery public hearings. Just days before the full Senate was to vote, some serious allegations of sexual harassment were raised. Professor Anita Hill, a 35-yearold law professor from the University of Oklahoma and former assistant for Thomas at the E.E.O.C., claimed she was the victim of sexual harassment while the two worked together about 10 years earlier. The Senate committee reconvened and heard about three days of riveting testimony from Thomas and Hill and a group of supporters from both sides.





Barbara Bush was constantly in the public eye as the wife of the President of the Unites States. But in quieter times, the 66year-old grandmother says she yearns for the day when she and the president can spend more time doing "selfish things" with one another and their grandchildren. However, for now she is content to be the First Lady of the United States.






Students Among First to See New Soviet Union

The PDS Russian Exchange trip will take place in spite of the world-shaking overthrow of power in the Soviet Union and the disintegration of communism. Mr. Skvir, an upper school Russian teacher and the director of all exchange programs, will take a group of ten PDS students to Moscow from November seventh to November thirtieth. This trip was originally scheduled for late August and early September.

Mr. Skvir went to Washington Friday, October 4, to confer with group leaders of other student visits to the former USSR and with State Department officials. We now have a staff of three American administrators in Moscow to supervise all student programs.

This will be the PDS's third exchange visit under the guidance of Mr. Skvir. In previous years he had conducted five tours of the Soviet Union, which often included faculty members.

The delegation of students will stay in the homes of various Moscow students and will be hosts to these young people next April. The PDSers will be attending classes in the same school (No. 84) as in previous years. A memorandum from the US-USSR High School Academic Partnership Program states that teachers and local schools are gaining increased control over the curricula and in setting educational goals.

The head of the English Department of school No. 84, Mrs. E.M. Burova, a woman of remarkable intellect, warmth and charm, who made many friends among our faculty on her first visit here, will be of great help to the students.

Mr. Skvir hopes that the PDS group will also be able to go to St. Petersburg (formerly Leningrad) for a few days.

In order to insure that things go smoothly during the exchange, Mr. Skvir has visited the state department in Washington D.C. to secure visas for the PDS students.

EnAct's Efforts Benefit School and Community

Participation, sponsorship, and education have been three major parts of the Environmental Action Club this year. While keeping in mind global environmental issues, the club has succeeded in solving several local environmental problems both here at PDS and in the Princeton community.

Recently the club organized a project to plant trees in the area. They were planted in places where previous trees had been cut down to build sewer lines. All of the trees which were planted were bought by the club. EnAct also held a tree raffle as a fund raiser at the PDS Panther Party. These trees were donated by nearby nurseries. The patrons included: Frank's Nursery which donated a Sweet Gum, Obal's Garden Market which donated a Carolina Silver Bell, Klockner's Nursery which donated a River Birch, Peterson's Nursery which donated two apple trees, Makrancy Garden Center which donated a Ficus, and A & C Nursery which donated a hemlock and a blue spruce.

In addition to planting trees, the club has also recently sponsored a recycled paper co-op. This enabled over 100 families to purchase recycled paper goods such as napkins, toilet paper, facial tissue, and paper towels. All of the products which were sold were made out of actual paper which had been recycled, and not bits of sawdust.

A third major project which the Environmental Club has initiated is a shift from paper plates and plastic utensils in the cafeteria to ceramic plates and metal flatware. The tentative switch from disposable plates and utensils was soon made permanent and the Environmental Club succeeded in finding a solution to one more environmental problem at PDS.

Another action which took place was the writing of approximately 120 letters to the Senate. These letters supported bills protecting old growth forests and protested those opening the Arctic refuges for oil development.

The goals of the Club this year have been primarily to educate the faculty and the student body at PDS, and to make actual environmental reforms in the school and the community. In the future, the club plans to have a low energy day when each student will try to find a way to get to school that saves energy. (i.e. car pool with a friend, walk to school, or ride a bike to school instead of taking a car.) Also, the club would like to expand the co-op to a monthly service.

By participating in these projects this past school year and making PDS students aware of environmental issues, the club hopes to establish, stated faculty Ms. Cutler, "PDS as a model for the community."

Students Appear on National TV

HiTOPS makes presentation on "Growing Up in the Age of Aids"

What were you watching last Sunday evening (February 2) from 6:30 to 8:00? Were you among the hapless victims of the Home Shopping Club's Groundhog's Day Bonanza Sale? That's unfortunate because ABC was airing a special ninety-minute live program entitled "Growing up in the Age of AIDS: a National Town Meeting." The audience, which played an active role in the program, reflected a broad spectrum of opinions and beliefs concerning the AIDS epidemic. Among the participants were several faces familiar to the greater Princeton community: namely, the HiTOPS Teen Council. HiTOPS, which stands for Health Interested Teens' Own Program on Sexuality, is a program "dedicated to promoting the sexual health of young people." The Princeton based organization is comprised of twelve area seniors: seven from Princeton High School and five from PDS. The Students were asked to be on the "Town

Meeting" following their January 25 appearance on WABC's TV show "Making It." "It was an amazing experience," says HiTOPS member Rebecca Hart XII. "Teens are the ones who should be talking to teens about AIDS and the Town Meeting gave us a chance to do just that." Rebecca was joined by classmates Tricia Frank, Suzanne Dolan, Matt Hurford, and Dave Wise. At one point in the program Matt and Dave performed a skit in which a concerned father (Matt) demonstrates the proper way to use a condom to his teen-aged son (Dave). The skit, which marked a network first, was intended not only to teach people about condoms but also to stress the importance of communication. "People have to learn how to talk to each other," insists Dave. "How can we expect to combat this problem if we can't even discuss it?"


Mrs. Wise and Mrs. Hurford, mothers of Dave and Matt, also made important comments during the show.


On January 27, six HiTOPS members had lunch with the host of the Town Meeting, Peter Jennings. The purpose of the meeting was to plan the teen role in the prime time show. HiTOPS teamed up with another peer sexuality education group from Manhattan's Mt. Sinai Hospital, in an attempt to convince the ABC anchor that teenagers are ready, willing and able to educate their peers about subjects like AIDS. The end result was a redesigned program schedule with a stronger emphasis on peer education.

Although the bulk of the airtime was dedicated to other guests such as the Surgeon General of the United State, Dr. Novello, several HiTOPS members had a chance to express their opinions about various AIDS related issues. The audience, six million strong, was slightly larger than the thirty person workshops that HiTOPS members were accustomed to addressing. "We tried our best to ignore the fact that millions of people were watching us," said Dave.

Although grateful for their national exposure, the HiTOPS members shared the hope that more will be done. In my opinion, as a member of HiTOPS, it would be truly naive to think that a crisis of this magnitude could be solved by ninety minutes of television.
