



And tearful at the falling of a star.



And the seasons they go round and round

Dear Seniors:


As I write this letter you and I have been at PDS together for less than half a year, yet for me there has been time to get to know many of you and to develop strong feelings for your class.

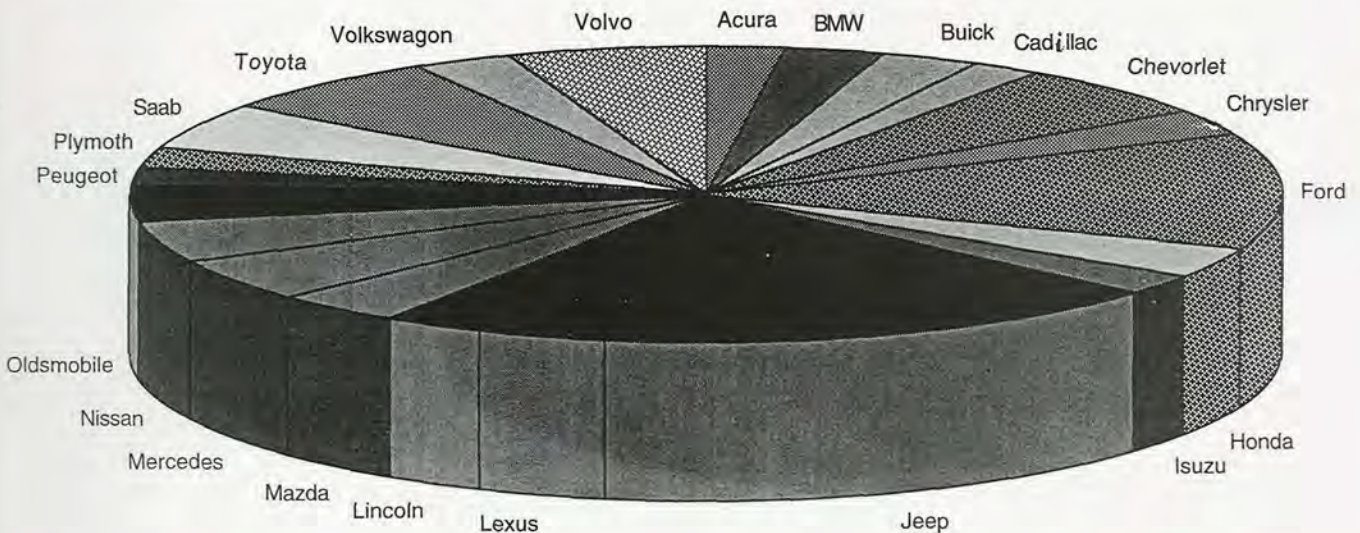


Transportation
