
Richard was a great friend. I will miss him, and I will always remember him.

A Leader Reminiscient of Miss Fine Herself, Mrs. Lohr Ushered Princeton Day School into its Second Century Upon a Wave of Increased Spirit, Community Involvement, and School Pride.

Dear Mrs. Lohr,

Students come and go every year at PDS, leaving an indelible mark on friends and perhaps a few teachers.

Faculty pass through more slowly, inspiring forever the students they teach before moving on.

A Head of School like you, whose guidance has forever changed an entire institution, comes around only once in a blue moon, and we all pray the blessing never has to end.

In its hundred years (though 141 years' worth of Heads of School), PDS has been blessed with five truly amazing Heads of School, of whom you, Mrs. Lohr, are one. Most recently, Doug McClure's enthusiasm and love for the school made the merger work in the first few difficult transition years. You also have helped us transi-

all know you to be as savvy in business and pleasure as Miss Davis. In the first few years of her tenure, Miss Davis enjoyed working with James Howard Murch, one of our school's founders. The first Head of PCD, Mr. Murch turned an up-start venture by a group of local professors and businessmen into a premiere school for boys in this area. Your administration, Mrs. Lohr, has similarly seen this school take the lead, with student and faculty applications booming, and the community support which was held as such a virtue by this school's greatest leader...

May Margaret Fine started it all in 1899, when she opened Miss Fine's School for girls. An avant garde idea at the time, Miss Fine knew that girls deserved the same educational opportunities as boys, and could achieve the same heights if offered the same support. Miss Fine began a tradition that we still hold a century later of educational excellence above all else. So it is fitting, Mrs. Lohr, that you were here to preside over the Centennial, as you have given the school a new beginning, secured its place as a leader, and left a mark as profound as that left by Miss Fine herself - your love will never be forgotten.





In September and October, powerful earthquakes strike around the globe, killing 15,000 people in Turkey, 1,450 in Taiwan and at least 122 in Greece.




On December 31, the U.S. returns control of the Panama Canal to Panama. Opened to the world in 1914, the canal is considered one of the greatest construction achievements in American history.



The drought of 1999 causes severe damage to Northeastern and mid-Atlantic farms. Several states impose mandatory water use restrictions and emergency federal loans are made available in Maryland, Pennsylvania, Kentucky, Ohio, Virginia and West Virginia. Lewis and Clark's Native American guide Sacagawea is featured on a new gold-colored dollar coin released into circulation in early 2000.

Beginning in 1999, the U.S. Mint releases specially designed state quarters, the first five representing Connecticut, Georgia, Delaware, Pennsylvania and New Jersey. By 2008, each state will have its own quarter.



President Clinton announces the removal of the American bald eagle from the endangered species list. In 1999, there are over 5,800 breeding pairs, an increase from 417 in 1963.







Researchers announce in July the creation of a cancerous human cell by genetically altering a normal one. This significant breakthrough is an important step toward developing drugs that could potentially wipe out cancer.

In December, IBM announces a \$100 million research initiative to build a supercomputer 500 times more powerful than current models.



On August 11, the last total solar eclipse of the millennium crosses the globe. Thousands of people from Canada to India experience daytime darkness during which the moon completely covers the sun.



Parents, with help from their doctor, select the gender of their baby using a technique called MicroSort, which separates X-bearing (female-determining) and Y-bearing (male-determining) sperm. The success rate is about 92 percent for females and 69 percent for males.



Researchers report they have successfully altered the learning and memory behavior of mice by inserting a gene into their brains. This genetic-engineering breakthrough may be helpful in treating human learning disorders and Alzheimer's disease. Researchers at Massachusetts General Hospital reveal in July that they have successfully regenerated the central nervous system of lab rats with severed spinal cords. Applications for human paralysis treatment are very encouraging. The jawbones of two kangaroo-sized dinosaurs are discovered in Madagascar in October. Dated to the early Triassic period, 230 million years ago, the bones could be the oldest dinosaur fossils ever found.






