

Mr. Landsborough, an explorer of ripte, adds to the evidence in favor of this nesion, by his observation in Australia Keuping simep is no longer as profitable there as it should be, but on the other hand, large tracts of land that were worthless before have latterly become fit for agriculture. There is a decided increase of forests and moisture in parts of Australia, giving hope that eventually the whole interior desert may be reclaimed. The direct effect of sheep-raising lins been to keep lown the tall grass which hus formerly afforded material for destructive fires. The rees, young and old, have been periodically burnt by these fires, until the country, booming almost treeless, its climate had been rendered arid and its soil sterile. 
