New Jersey Water for New York.

New York city is again turning its attention to New Jersey for a water supply.

The Herald says the Conton sizes of the Herald says the He The Herald says the Croton river cannot meet the future demand and a new source must be obtained, and New Jersey is looked to, as it is much nearer than any other. It says:

The New Jersey Legislature of 1880 considered a number of bills, and some of them passed, looking toward the transfer of the water rights of a number of corporations. It was conjectured that some of these bills were in the interest of New Yorkers who designed to get control of some of the many sources of water supply in Northern New Lorsey intending to conduct the water to Jersey, intending to conduct the water to New York city through pipes under the

Hudson, and then to make it an article of merchandise. There is no doubt of the value of the lakes and rivers of New Jersey for water supply. The Croton river has a drainage area of 339 miles. There are several sources of supply in New Jersey that have double that and within thirty miles of New York, much nearer than the Croton river. The subject has been investigated by several experts, among whom Mr. Croes and Geo. W. Howell, civil engineer, at the instance of the Newark Water Board. Among the schemes examined was one for using the draining area of the Passaic Valley at Little Falls. The area is 832.75 square miles and the conduit for reaching New York would be about twenty miles long. There is no doubt of the value of the York would be about twenty miles long.

The plan included a reservoir, with pumping works, near Montelair, over three hundred feet above tide level. It has been estimated that pipes under the North river could be laid with little engineering difficulty. The Little Falls area would yield one bundred millions of gallons a day. To secure it there, would have to be an extinguishment of the rights of certain corporations. The Little Falls supply would be sufficient in itself for the future needs of be sufficient in itself for the future needs of The Rocknway river at Boonton, Morris county, N. J., has been suggested as a

source of immease supply, and the purity of the water is beyond criticism. It would cost more to reach it, as the distance is thirty miles. The supply would be about 72,000,000 gallons daily from an area of 126 square miles. The Pequannock river and the Ringwood river, near Pomptoi, Passale county, would furnish 15,000,000 gallons daily, and, with Ramapo river, the three would furnish an abundant supply. When the Newark people were looking about for a supply there was a proposal to buy the Morris canal and its water rights. for \$3,000,000. The sources of the Morris canal's supply are Lake Hopatcong and Greenwood Lake, two sheets of water of great beauty and purity. With those could be used a smaller lake than ofther, known as Great Power lake than ofther, known about for a supply there was a proposal to buy the Morris canal and its water rights for \$3,000,000.
