About once in a generation appears a book that is at once and universally accepted as a marked element in the life and literature of the world. In the Eighteenth Century, a period of much cultivated talent but little gestias, DeFoe's "Strange Adventures of Robinson Crusoe" startled the reading public with a narrative so apparently real that it was received with intense enthusiasm as truth, and for a hundred and fity years has remained one of the unfading Eaglish classics. In our own most fertile age, Walter Scott's "Waverly" first burst the bonds of stitted fiction and created the historical novel. 


