

My annual report of the receipts and disbursements of the County of Union for the past year, I have the honor to herewith submit.

The tax levy made by the present Board was \$120,000; the bonded indebtedness was reduced \$18,000. Leaving \$102,000 to be expended for the running expenses of the county. The renewal bonds of the present year sold as high as one hundred and four.

All obligations of the county now outstanding (except bonds) are in the shape of temporary loans, which amount to \$33,000. To meet this indebtedness, there is to the credit of the county from taxes past due, claims due from sheriff, and cash on hand \$52,645.92, which amount does not include interest on delinquent taxes.
