In those days it was an old fashioned town indeed, To be sure the rival coaches drove up in fine style with a flourish of trumpets to their respective lnns once a day, and the circus or a company of strolling actors would now and then visit the town; but of local enterprise and improvement, there were but little. The old time sleepiness and old fogylam about which George Eliot so amusingly writes, are fast passing away, although there are still to be found a few families who reside in antiquated houses, and who pride themselves upon living in the good old times, and are ever fond of . regaling the listener with tales of Nuncaton as it was. Three railroads now pass through the town, which boasts of a firstclass station on the greatest railroad in the world, and another less pretentious on the second greatest. About 200 trains pass through the town every day. Cotton and woolen mills and factories of various kinds employ liosts of operators, and the hum of industry is heard on every hand. The shops and inus put on airs which would not have been dreamed of in the days when old Mr. Crewes held forth to his dozing but appreciative flock. The crowning triumph of Milby, however, in these latter days, is its two weekly newspapers, which are really deserving of the estimation in which they are held by the Nuneatonians. 
