RESULT OF THE NEW YORK CONVENT.

The result of the action of the New York Legislature upon the question of the selection of successors to Conkling and Platt, gives a promise that no harm will come to the Republican party. Such a bitter contest never was forced upon any party as that caused by the resignation of those gentlemen, coupled as it was with their immediate solicitation for reelection. Of course every one knows that Conkling was elected by Conkling. From the inception till the end of it, Platt was simply his shadow. Now that it is over we can measure the strain it has given to the party organization. Certainly no better demonstration of the loyalty to the party can be given than that furnished by Conkling's supporters at the close of, and since the struggle. When they found themselves fairly beaten in the contest, they manfully stood by the man who had been elected by the party and unanimously voted for Leffingwell. That portion of the Republican Press which stood by Conkling to the end now adopts the situation with a contented and sincere love for the party and its principles. The New York Commercial, which is a stalwart of the stalwarts, in commenting upon the result says:

"We accept the result at Albany in good faith and with some degree of satisfaction. It comes in good season, for the first election following that for the President is an important one, and the watchword of the Republican party should, from this time forth, be peace, union, harmony and success."

It is true Conkling's friends only yielded to the inevitable. Admitting he was wrong from the beginning, the grief-stricken of that final yielding is deserving of respect. The only answer to this is that he made a blunder so terrible as to threaten the disruption of the Republican party—therefore he should now be reckoned an enemy. That he committed a blunder is conceded by his own friends. The same paper from which the above extract is taken by implication admits it. In speaking of the day of the party in reference to Conkling's course, it says: "It was once liberal enough to forgive and overlook what it regarded as errors of judgment. When it fails to do this it is no longer the party of liberty and progress, and cannot command the votes of a majority of the men of this country."

A party so huge as the Republican party, necessarily contains within it an immense amount of individual ambition. No ambitious man can be a leader of a great party any more than a steam engine can run without oil. The ambition which is required to develop and sustain an immense political party naturally makes the possessor of it jealous of position. Conkling certainly has exhibited this jealousy. He evidently looks upon Blaine as his rival. They seem to be to him eternally warring to ride one home. When "two men" ride of a horse, one must ride behind, and somehow Conkling is unwilling ever to be that one. This is the cause for the blunder. Yet there is no evidence that he or his friends now propose to support that blunder by attempt to disrupt the harmony of the party. Those who defeated them can afford to be magnanimous. They have elected their men and compelled Conkling's influence to subject itself to them in the final contest.

The success of the Republicans in New York for this time requires entire harmony in the party. Leffingwell and Miller are very respectable people, but the worst of Conkling must admit that his influence to the Senate would be ten fold more than that of both of them. He is acknowledged as a man of wonderful power by every one in the entire nation. In his whole political career there never was a man who could cut out so much influence with so little. During both the Hayes and Garfield campaigns his entrance as a political speaker was reckoned as an epoch in the struggle. We do not know what is the precise thing he wants, nor do we object to this instant. But we do know that Conkling shall not be President. Those who defeat him will think the best interests of the party and the country will be subserved by forgetting the Albany fight and its authors.

The Republican party is big enough for all its leaders, if they work together. It is this party's history in this time that the reasonable ambition of the whole party. It is not big enough to continue if the leaders fight, nor can it develop sufficiently for any of them to exercise their powers of statesmanship. As matters now stand the people have heard about as much of this Conkling fight as they can stand. The contest is settled. No true lover of the party will desire to revive it. There should be no longer stalwarts, half-breds, or feather heads. The only name that should be recognized in the party is that of Republican.

The great duty of the Republican party is to see to it that no harm shall come from this quarrel. Disfranchisement among the Democrats have often been the cause of Republican success. Had the friends of Breckinridge and Douglas united in 1860, Lincoln would not have been elected. The fight between Kelly and Tilden clearly said Garfield. What now is needed is to "keep the peace" in the party. The practical statesman does not demand what is individually wanted, but what under all the circumstances he can reasonably expect a majority thinks is proper. Mr. Burke in his declaration of a patriot described the duty of the Republican party as to "keep the peace in the party." We trust the Republicans will not repeat the blunders of the Democrats.
