The Clark Board of Education met Tuesday night at the Board of Education auditorium for its 10th annual meeting. For the first time, the board met for a special meeting to discuss four matters, announced prior to official publication of the Board.

**Mrs. Mezzo, Ehrenberg,
Krauss on 'reform state'**

Three persons announced Clark Board of Education candidacies on what they are calling a "reform ticket."

The candidates are Mrs. Ellen Mezzo, a former candidate who served on study committees for developing curricula and on transportation committees; William Krass, president of the Clark Recreation Baseball League and associated with other youth activities; and Donald Ehrenberg, involved in activities including tennis instruction.

According to the slate, a need for reform has been underscored by recent revelations that the present board has "mismanaged" the school system and "overemphasized" such activities as meals, parties and trips.

They said their elections would restore integrity to the educational process.
