



## Schools need to stress

The Rev. Jesse Jackson, the controversial Civil Rights activist, is heading up a program called "Push for Excellence" in the 12 public high schools of Los meles, which aims to improve the quality of education nd at the same time reduce the rate of crime in the schools, especially those in the inner city, through a revival of authority and discipline.

While "Push for Excellence" emphasizes mastery of basic reading, writing and arithmetic, of even more significance are the strong moral tones of the curriculum. The values of hard work and self-discipline are ntimuously strenged. Students and parents are asked to sign a "home-andachool moral contract." Under this, each student promises to attend achool regularly, to study to the heat of his shilley and to avoid drugs, promisecuous sex, violent television shows and desparalleling, "acid-such" type music,
The Rev. Jackson calls these diversions the "mois of decadence." Parents signing the contract agree to provide "a quiet, uninterrupted time each evening for school work" and to come to school in person to pick "Push for Excellence" is being underwriging by Los Angeles exapsyers to the time of \$400,090 and is thus the first such publicly-supported project in the nation.


