Louis Office of inspector General in 12 federal agencies that each year spend \$100 billion has lit a fire under a number of departments. The U. S. Dept. of Labor, for instance, has acknowged that more than \$1 billion has been misspent in ing Act and other job training programs. The General Accounting Office is investigating charges of widespread fraud, kickback, bribes and im-proper hidding in the summer flood service program that provided meals for 2.4 million children at more than 16,000 locations throughout the country. Investigations by the Inspector General of the Dept. of Health, Education and Welfare show about \$7 billion has been lost in a variety of programs because of theft, mismanagement and inefficiency. The Veterans Administration, which has only one auditor for every \$238 million provided to the VA by Congress, also has a new inspector general looking into the \$17 billion veterans programs to ferret out waste and fraud. waste and fraud. Because of the size and com-plexity of the thousands of federal programs, no one knows precisely how much is lost, but corruption, mis-management, poor judgment, errors and bribery in these federally-assisted programs are very substantial by anyone's estimate. One question needs to be raised above all others: Are One question needs to be raised above all others: Are corruption, waste, error and minimanifement inevitable by-products of the interal government's efforts to be all things to all people? In abort, is stealing entenic in a hurentucratic form of government in which those who pass the laws cannot pos-sibly keep abreast of their administration until some-thing goes wrong or billions of dollars are squandered and the tatpayers are ripped off? Unless Congress appropriates hundreds of millions of dollars more to hire an army of sufficers to police the thousands of programs operated by the fotheral gov-ernment, it seems virundly inconsulte to stop all the ernment, it seems virually impossible to stop all the waste that is now going on in government. But an effort must be made to curb fraud, stealing and gross mis-management, otherwise it can corruptour whole society and corrode public trust in government. As one of the sponsors of a hill to create an indepen-dent office of imspector General in each of the depart-ments, I believe that Congress and the Administration can minimize the losses that are taking place. Cer-tainly we cannot ignore even 1% of the losses in a hud-get that is at the half-trillion-dollar mark. In isunching this internal andit of federal programs, Congress should warn the American public to be ready for some disturbing news. As more and more cases of fraud are uncovered and pronectured, the dimensions of this waste should lead to widespread public support to re-examine many of the programs and the assumptions behind them. ## Truth in lending okays

## sumer credit choice

The federal Truth in Lending Law is designed to help The sederal Truth in Lending Law is designed to help consumers to slop around for "the best buy in money." By requiring creditors to tell consumers exacting how much a credit transaction will cost, it more readily al-lows consumers to make comparisons of the charges from different credit sources. In addition, by knowing exactly how much credit will cost, commers can avoid over-extending their personal finances and living beyond their means their means.

There are two important elements in the cost of credit consumers must understand. The indersal Truth in Lending Law requires these two elements -- the finance charge and the annual percentage rate (APR) - must be displayed prominently on the forms and statements used by a creditor. The finance charge is the total amount of money paid

used by a creditor. The finance charge is the total amount of money paid by a consumer to obtain credit. It is the total cost of "resting" the money. For example, if a consumer horrows \$100 for a one-year period and pays a total of \$6 in interest, the annual percentage rate would be 6%, if the consumer has use of the sentire amount for one full year. If the consumer repays the \$106 in 12 equal monthly installments, the consumer does not have use of the entire \$100 for the full year. The consumer only has the use of only about half of the full \$100 over the year. So the \$6 charge for credit would actually become an annual percentage rate of 11%. Consumers should be aware some creditors have a service charge or carrying charge instead of, or in addition to, interest charges. The total of all such charges, including the interest, is the finance charge. Consumers are protected by the law against unauthor-ized use of their credit cards. The maximum liability is \$50. If the consumer notifices the card issuer of the loss or theft hefore any unauthorized charges are made, the consumer is not liable at all. When credit terms are used in advertising, all rele-vant and significant features of a credit offer must be mentioned. For example, if an advertiser mentions a "low, low down payment," there must also be mention of the number, amount and period of the payments which must follow the "low, low down payment." A home is commonaly used in a credit transaction as security when money is loaned for a major repair or improvement on the home or when a "second mortgage" is taken on the home. The credits of is designed to make sure the con-sumer is aware of the full implications of the credit transaction and actually wants to proceed. The creditor is required to give the consumer writ-

transaction and actually wants to proceed The creditor is required to give the consumer writ-ten notice of the consumer's right to cancel such a transaction. If a consumer does elect to exercise the cancelation right, the creditor must be informed in

When a home is used as security in a credit trans-action for repairs or improvements on a house, the contractor is not permitted to start the job until after the three-day cooling-off period. The consumer can waive the wising period, if he or she notifies the contractor is writing there is a gun-uine financial emergency which requires credit to finance the repairs or improvements immediately to avoid danger to the consumer, his or her family or property. Such a situation may occur where the roof of a consumer's home is in danger of collapsing and needs immediate repair work. needs immediate repair work. It should be noted the cancelation right during the three-day cooling-off period does not apply to a first mortuage which is used to finance the actual purchase of a home.
