Health-care measure tabled by councilmen

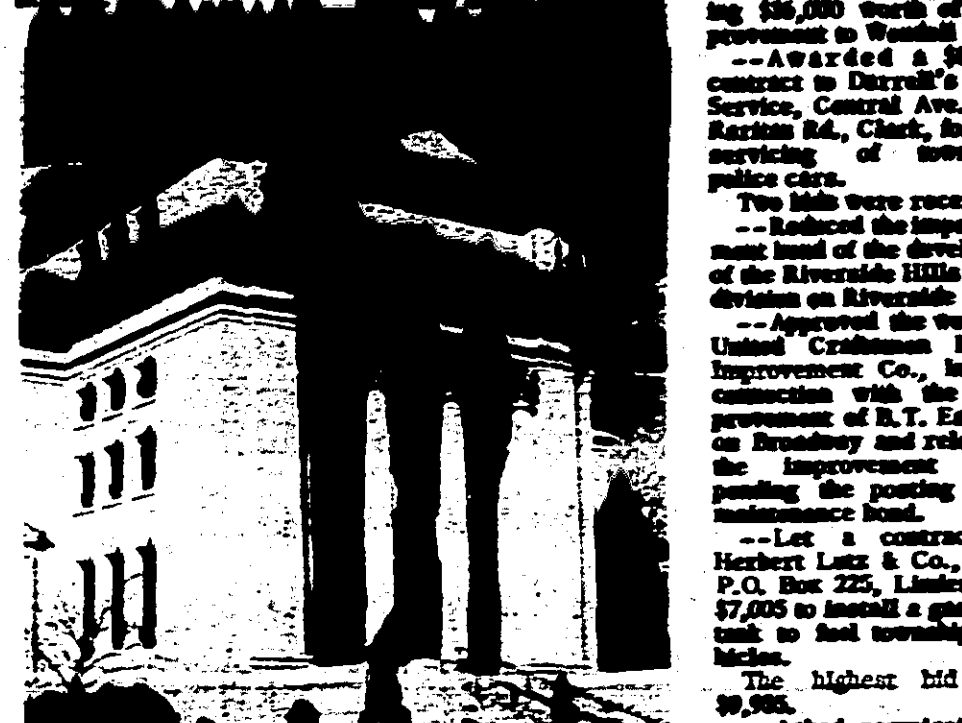

Local governments take many forms

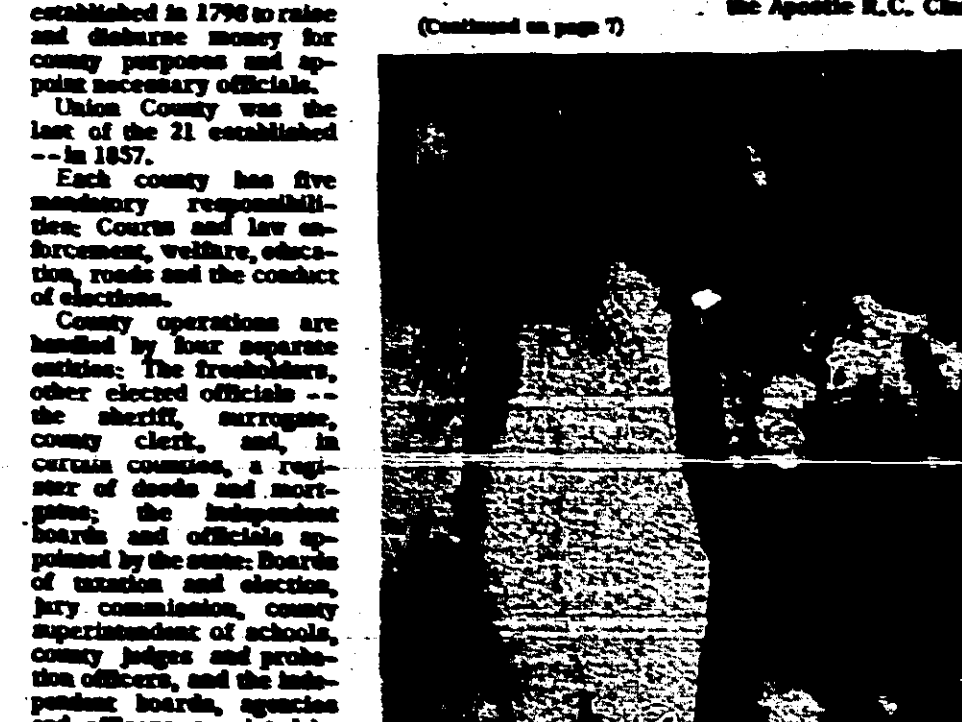

The jury, which was selected from the townships of Clark and Rahway, found Taylor not guilty of the charge.

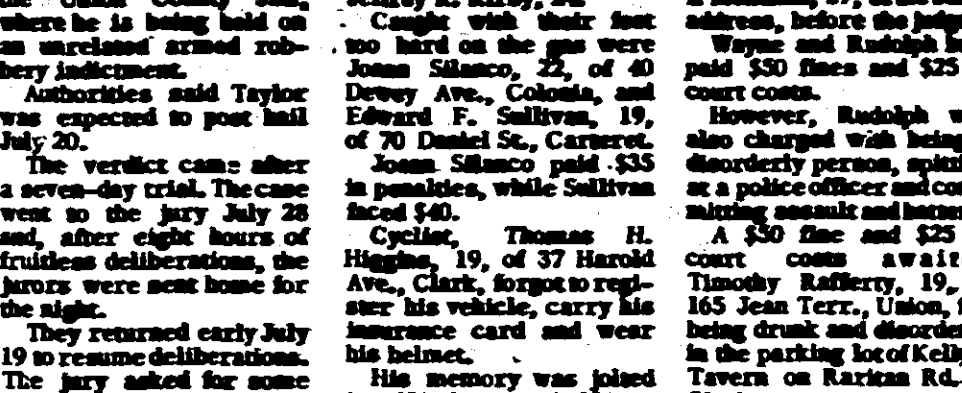

March preaches negotiation in City Hall attacks: Martin
