





By last year, however, the Federal Register had increased its annual output to 65,603 pages -- enough new rules, regulations and notices to keep an army of bureaucrats working overtime.

But this is only the tip of the iceberg. If all the forms and other paperwork generated by Washington in a single year were piled into Yankee Stadium, they would fell the playing field to the top of the stadium roof 51 times. The cost of all this paperwork is \$64 billion a year -- which works out to more than \$300 for every man, woman and

child in the country.
