Sen. DiFrancesco blasts Dems on corporate tax increase

The Democratic legislators were blamed for "bodily political" action and the firm administration's newly passed corporate income tax increase was called "a bad idea" by Sen. DiFrancesco, R-N.J., in a speech before the Senate on Monday.

DiFrancesco, a member of the Senate Finance Committee, said the increase in the corporate tax rate from 48 to 50 percent was "a bad idea" and "a bad precedent."

Board of Education tentative budget of \$4,774,916 adopted; up 6.891%

A tentative 1968-1969 school budget of \$4,774,916 was adopted by the Clark Board of Education on Jan. 15.

The budget, which is subject to final approval by the State Board of Education, represents an increase of 6.891 percent over the 1967-1968 budget of \$4,473,350.

The budget includes a provision for a 10 percent increase in the salary of the superintendent of schools, which will be \$25,000 per year.
