An urban coalition sponsored by Elizabeth Demorett applied Union County Democratic Chairman William MacCarrell to the job.

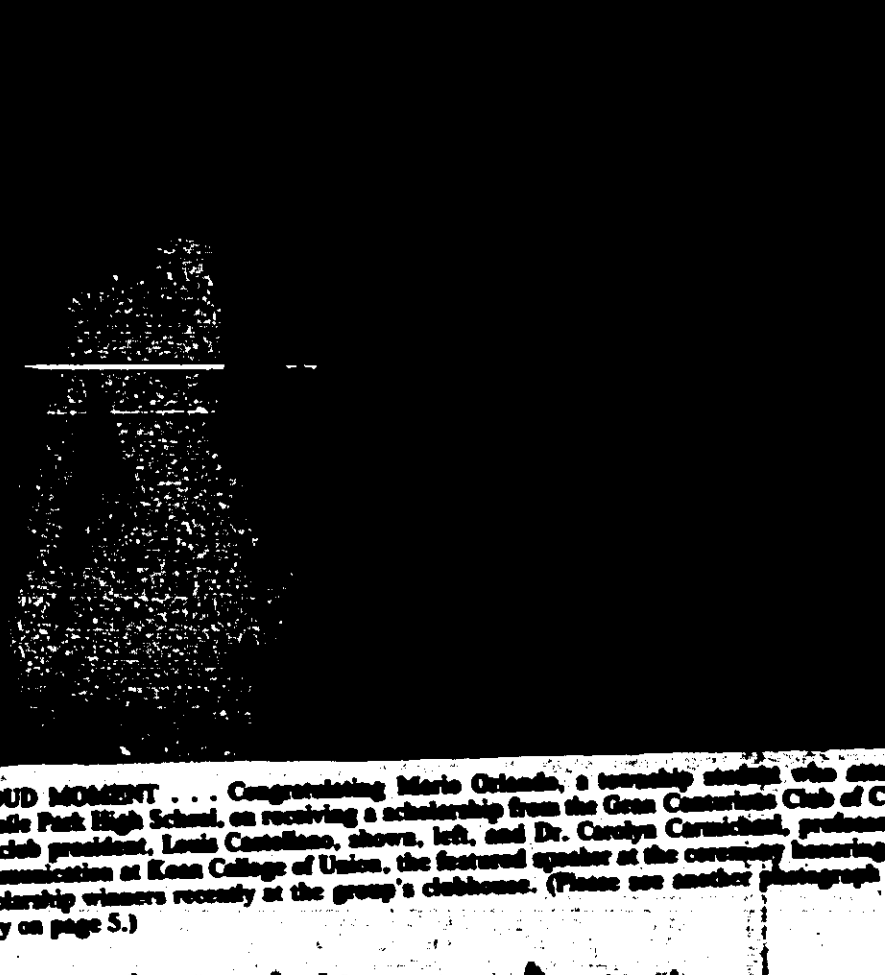
MacCarrell was elected to a third one-year term as Union County Republican Chairman at the El Francisco Restaurant in Raleigh, Pa.

Councilmen also introduced a new law which would require junk cars to be removed within 10 days of their registration.

When it has been accepted, the normally is authorized to issue property and it moves the vehicle, machinery or equipment to the property owner or tenant with the reasonable cost of removal.
